If you are voting absentee and returning your ballot by mail, here are a few recommendations from the Postal Service. Mail collection times vary - USPS Blue Collection Boxes - if you deposit your ballot after the printed collection time on November 8, the ballot will not be postmarked until the next day. For home mailboxes - your ballot will be postmarked the day the Postal Service mail carrier collects it. Local post office - if taking your ballot to a local Post Office on November 8, confirm with the counter representative that the ballot will be postmarked that day. *Mailed ballots must arrive by November 8.*

It's time once again to reserve your personal dog tag number for 2017! Do you have a special number you'd like for your dog – maybe a lucky number, your dog's birthday, your house number, badge number? If so, you can reserve it by completing this form OR emailing to CSkerrett@dunstable-ma.gov. You must license your dog by January 30 or you will lose the number. The deadline to submit your request is December 8, 2016. 2017 tags are purple.

STRETCHING AN IRA

You may have heard about a "stretch IRA" but didn't know what that meant. It's a term coined by financial professionals to describe the benefits of taking lifetime distributions from an inherited IRA. Under the tax code, if you inherit an IRA from someone (like your parent) you have several options for how to deal with it. You can take the money out all at once, you can take it out over five years, or you can take it out over your lifetime (actually your actuarial life expectancy). The first two options usually result in higher taxes being paid. The last option is the one that gets referred to as a "stretch." It means the money stays in the IRA for as long as possible and continues to take advantage of the deferral of incometax so it can grow bigger over time.

You may have heard that there is an extra 10% tax penalty if you take IRA distributions before age 59½. This is for your own IRA. The penalty does not apply to an inherited IRA. If you use any of the three options above, you will pay ordinary tax on the withdrawals, but you won't have to pay the 10% penalty no matter what your age.

There is one other option when it is a surviving spouse who is named as the IRA beneficiary. A surviving spouse may "roll over" the IRA to a new IRA in the surviving spouse's name. This is often best if the surviving spouse was younger than the deceased spouse, as more years will be added for withdrawals, and if it is later inherited by the children, future withdrawals can be deferred over their lifetimes too.

One of the best strategies to increase the length of the tax deferral period is to name the youngest possible beneficiary. For example, instead of naming your 50 year old child as a beneficiary of your IRA, you could name your two 20 year old grandchildren. They will get to defer withdrawals and taxes for 50 to 60 years, while your child can only defer it for 20 to 30 years. Of course, those young beneficiaries need to agree to leave the assets in the IRA in order to benefit from the "stretch." You cannot control what they do, so they might just take the money and spend it. You must educate any young beneficiaries so they do the best with inherited IRA funds.

A Roth IRA is a great tool for "stretching" out tax benefits. With a Roth IRA the owner puts "after-tax" assets into the IRA. All future growth and income can later be withdrawn with no income tax whatsoever. That's a great option for those who are not trying to reduce current income and save current tax. The beneficiaries have the great advantage of being able to take withdrawals without any tax being due. Since all growth is tax-free as well, it makes sense to "stretch" a Roth IRA as long as possible too.



MESSAGE FROM THE DUNSTABLE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR

The Town Administrator's Office has been very busy lately. Aside from the day to day operations, there are many projects that should be of interest to the community. Some of those projects include:

- The Affordable Housing Feasibility Study in the MUDistrict that was approved at the last Town Meeting. The study is near completion and the Town Administrator's Office is preparing to write an RFP for a developer to bring the project to fruition. This project would be completed by a private or non-profit developer, assisted in small part by CPA funds.
- The Public Safety Building Feasibility Study, approved a few Town Meetings ago, has been progressing along well. The consultant, the two public safety Chiefs, representatives from the Community and myself have been reviewing room layout, adjacency maps, and most recently locations for a proposed building. All of their meetings are posted on the Town web calendar and usually occur on Tuesday afternoons.
- The Master Plan Committee is working towards a vision for Dunstable. They have had two public sessions with more to come. All of their results and working documents are available on the Town website.
- The Personnel Board has been working hard to create job descriptions for all of the Town employees. They have also been working on a Wage and Classification chart and Personnel Policy. The Personnel Policy has been recommended to the Selectmen for approval. All of this work is being implemented at the direction of the Personnel Bylaw adopted at the May 2015 Town Meeting.
- Main Street (Route 113) Transportation Improvement Project design exception report has been transmitted to MassDOT for approval. This would allow for the design of a roadway with 11 foot travel lanes, 3 foot shoulder and a 5 foot sidewalk on the cemetery side of the road. This project extends from the end of the McGovern wall project to the intersection of High Street.
- The Town has received a grant from MassDOT to complete a Complete Streets Prioritization Plan. This will be coming this fall/winter. Keep an eye out for public input meeting on how and where to develop road amenities for all modes of transportation.
- The Town received a grant from the Lt. Governor's Community Compact Program for technology improvements. This will include the tax maps and assessor's data being available on the Town website.
- The Capital Planning Committee has been working on the 2018-2022 plan. This will be completed this fall to help the Advisory Board with the budget process this winter/spring.
- The Town Departments and Advisory Board have already started planning for the 2018 budget. The Advisory Board meets at a minimum the first Monday of the month at 7pm. The public is always welcome.



O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. Recycling permits only require a copy of your registration (up to 2) and one first class stamp.

2016 permits and bag tags may be used at the large item dropoff in October 2016 or submitted to the town hall to enter a lottery. One name will be drawn at the Board of Health Meeting on November 15, 2016. Winners will receive a free permit and set of bag tags for the following year. Please remember that only the first round of bag tags purchased are eligible for the lottery. Please put you name and telephone number on each tag and drop them at the town Hall.



· SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

WHAT IS IT? Senior citizens in Massachusetts may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on their state income taxes for real estate taxes they paid on the Massachusetts residential property they own or rent and which they occupy as their principal residence. The maximum credit allowed is \$1,050 for the tax year beginning January 1, 2016. Eligible taxpayers who own their property may claim a credit equal to the amount by which their property tax payments in tax year 2016 (excluding any exemptions and/or abatements), including water and sewer debt charges, exceed 10% of their "total income" for the same current tax year. Taxpayers residing in communities that do not include water and sewer debt service in their property tax assessments may claim, in addition to their property tax payments, 50% of the water and sewer use charges actually paid during the tax year when figuring their credit. Renters may claim a credit in the amount by which 25% of their annual rental payment is more than 10% of their total income. For purposes of the tax credit, a taxpayer's "total income" includes taxable income as well as exempt income such Social Security, Treasury Bills and public pensions. NOTE: If you received any federal and/or state rent subsidy, or you rent from a tax-exempt entity, you do not qualify for the Circuit Breaker Credit. You must be 65 or older before January 1, 2017. Total income cannot exceed \$57,000 for single \$71,000 for head of household or \$85,000 for taxpayers filing jointly. Property value cannot exceed \$693,000. 





PET HEALTH **DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC** SO YOU WANT TO BE A **VETERINARIAN** by Tara M. Sacramone, DVM



First off – great choice. Veterinary medicine is an interesting, rewarding, and noble profession (if I do say so, myself). Many people think about becoming a veterinarian at some point in their lives, but only a few see it through to the end. You need to prepare yourself for a long, and sometimes challenging road, and, also know you will never be wealthy.

Becoming a veterinarian involves a lot of schooling. After high school you will need a bachelor's degree from a four year college. You can major in anything in undergrad, but you do need to take a few required classes in order to get into a veterinary college, like calculus, physics, and chemistry. Then you need to complete four years of veterinary school. Currently there are only 31 veterinary schools in the US, compared to around 125 medical schools. Therefore, the competition to get into veterinary school is fierce, so you will need to do very well in collage, and some people need to apply multiple times or get another degree in order to get in. Then depending on your specific career goals you may need to do an internship (1 year), residency (3 years) or continue on to get a PhD or master's degree.

There are actually many different specific careers in veterinary medicine, from small animal to large animal, zoo or wildlife, research, industry, public health, teaching, and a few more I can't recall at the moment. Actually being a veterinarian is not exactly what most people expect. In general its a good idea to actually go shadow someone in the career you think you would like. My job can be smelly, dirty, and stressful at times. Most people who want to become a veterinarian love animals, but veterinarians often have to do things the animals don't like, and we can't even explain to them how or why. For the most part being a small animal veterinarian is great. You truly never know what could walk through the door. Every day is an adventure. And Dunstable Animal Clinic has the best clients anywhere - TRUE - you know who you are. But there are some not great things too - like not knowing what's wrong with a sick pet, or having to give someone bad news. But where else can you play with cute puppies and kittens, but not have to housebreak them or keep them from scratching the couch? So if your good at science and math, prepared for at least eight years of school after high school, and want a fun, rewarding, but not an especially lucrative career veterinary medicine might be right for you.

A MAN WITH THE HEART OF GOD

By Nathan Combs

When we think about the King David of the Old Testament, our minds often jump to his biggest mistakes - his seduction of a married woman and the subsequent murder of her husband. David is frequently held up as an example of the depravity of man and the grace of God, and rightly so. However, while God certainly did not conceal David's terrible choices, He also clearly identified David as an exceptionally special person. Not only did God take the youngest son of Jesse and make him the second King of Israel, but He also promised David in 2 Samuel 7 that his family line would be secure and established forever. After David's death, he became the standard by which future kings were judged - for example, "Asa did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, as David his father had done" (1 Kings 15.11).

In fact, David was so highly regarded by God that in Acts 13.22, as the Apostle Paul was preaching in an Antioch synagogue, he referred to David as "a man after God's heart," a quotation of 1 Samuel 13.14. David is the only man in Scripture to ever receive that description! Why? What made David so special to God? At least part of the answer lies in the next statement in Acts 13.22 - where God stated that David did "all My will." This is a sharp contrast to Saul, the king David succeeded. Saul was commanded to wait until Samuel joined him before he sacrificed to God and he did wait - but not long enough (1 Samuel 13). Saul was commanded to kill the Amalekites for their attack of the Israelites during the days of Moses, and he did - but not completely (1 Samuel 15).

David, however, was whole-heartedly consumed by a desire to follow his Lord. The many psalms he wrote are filled with insights into his personal devotion. David prayed and prepared sacrifices in the morning (Psalm 5.3) and meditated on God at night before falling asleep (Psalm 63.6). He made a point of telling his fellow Israelites about the amazing things that God had done in his life (Psalm 22.22, 34.11) and his heart was filled with the words of God's law (Psalm 40.8).

Yes, David committed shocking sins that created horrible long-lasting consequences for his family, but his tender and repentant heart must not be forgotten. Again, in contrast to Saul, who responded to confrontation with anger and aggression, David humbled himself, poured out his guilt to the Lord, and earnestly sought His forgiveness after his conversation with the prophet Nathan (Psalm 51). Just as the law commanded (Deuteronomy 6.5), David loved the Lord with all his heart, soul, and might. His heart was "wholly true to the Lord his God" (1 Kings 15.3). Can the same be said of us? Could God describe you and me as people after His own heart?

THE BLUEBIRD LADY

Lillian Lund Files, 91 passed away September 28. Lil was a vivacious dynamo and a good friend also known as the Bluebird Lady. She was the only child of Swedish immigrant parents and grew up in Belmont and Waltham. In the 50s she moved into her parent's camp in Tyngsborough. Lil loved wildflowers at the time, and said she knew very little about birds. But when friends visiting the Tyngsborough camp exclaimed that she had bluebirds, Lil investigated the bluebird intrigue.

She learned that the gentle bluebird was becoming endangered due to loss of habitat, but there was a way to help bluebirds. Lil herself built 114 bluebird boxes in 3 days and started her bluebird trail. She found out about the North American Bluebird Society and obtained their slide program to use in lecturing about the bluebird plight. she became a life member of NABS and later president of the group for a year. Lil traveled countrywide with her bluebird conservation program and for NABS. She also became a life member of the Massachusetts Bluebird Society, the Brookline Bird Club, the Thoreau Society, Tyngsborough Bird Society for which she had served as president and program chair. She had Boxes up at the Louisa May Alcott house, the Emerson House and the Thoreau Lyceum in Concord.

"In the spring the telephone jangles off the hook" she often said, with the familiar question "Have they come yet?" Her backyard was crowded with members of the Audubon society, Garden Clubs and bird clubs... binoculars in hand. Thus began her career as Bluebird Lady. She was known far and wide and often interviewed for newspapers, television and radio. Back in the eighties, she was interviewed on the radio program the Big Mattress on WBCN. The show's emcee Charles Laquidira often ended his show with the promise the show will be back if the creek don't rise...if the bluebirds come back to Mass. Listeners of the show knew about Lil and told him the bluebirds were increasing and about Lil's programs. So Charles had Lil on his show.

Lil was amazing at gathering like minds together, even though they were from different walks of life. She gathered these friends to her home for breakfast and conversation. She was the 'hostess with the mostess", and it was always a treat to be invited to her gettogethers. Beside good food and good topics of conversation, Lil went all out in decorating for the season. In the fall her living room rug would be covered in autumn leaves raked from the yard and she would be bedecked in a witch's hat. One summer she took the Breakfast Club, as we became known, for a dinner cruise on the Concord River. The Breakfast Club friends have remained together for decades.

Lillian's friendship enriched my life, and she was a friend to be counted on. The morning after my family and I had spent the night watching flames billow through the house we called home, Lillian was there. With concern on her face, she handed me an envelope of money. She said you're going to take this because you're going to need it. Later she had a surprise party for me of the Breakfast Club where I was the honored guest.
