TOWN CLERK NEWS

In October, Massachusetts becomes the 33rd state to offer Early Voting for the State Election. What is early voting? In simple terms it is no excuse absentee voting. Under the law, you can only vote absentee due to (1) absence from the town during normal polling hours (2) physical disability prevents you from going to the polling place or (3) religious belief. The absentee application requires that you sign attesting to one of these 3 reasons under penalty of perjury. Early voting allows you to vote during the designated period for any reason. Early voting begins October 24 and is at the Town Hall during my business hours. It ends on Thursday, November 3 at 1:00 pm when my office closes. The deadline to file an absentee ballot application is NOON on Monday, November 7.

If you are voting absentee and returning your ballot by mail, here are a few recommendations from the Postal Service. Mail collection times vary - USPS Blue Collection Boxes – if you deposit your ballot after the printed collection time on November 8, the ballot will not be postmarked until the next day. For home mailboxes – your ballot will be postmarked the day the Postal Service mail carrier collects it. Local post office – if taking your ballot to a local Post Office on November 8, confirm with the counter representative that the ballot will be postmarked that day. Mailed ballots must arrive by November 8.

The deadline to register to vote for the November 8th election is Wednesday, October 19. If you hold a valid driver's license or non-driver ID issued by the Massachusetts RMV you can do this online at www.sec.state.ma.us/ovr/. It is really easy!

Often, I am asked as to whether we count absentee ballots. The answer is "YES". I'm not sure why, but many people think they are only counted if there is a tie. That is not the case; I can assure you they are inserted into the Accuvote on Election Day.



· SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

WHAT IS IT? Senior citizens in Massachusetts may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on their state income taxes for real estate taxes they paid on the Massachusetts residential property they own or rent and which they occupy as their principal residence. The maximum credit allowed is \$1,050 for the tax year beginning January 1, 2016. Eligible taxpayers who own their property may claim a credit equal to the amount by which their property tax payments in tax year 2016 (excluding any exemptions and/or abatements), including water and sewer debt charges, exceed 10% of their "total income" for the same current tax year. Taxpayers residing in communities that do not include water and sewer debt service in their property tax assessments may claim, in addition to their property tax payments, 50% of the water and sewer use charges actually paid during the tax year when figuring their credit. Renters may claim a credit in the amount by which 25% of their annual rental payment is more than 10% of their total income. For purposes of the tax credit, a taxpayer's "total income" includes taxable income as well as exempt income such Social Security, Treasury Bills and public pensions. **NOTE:** If you received any federal and/or state rent subsidy, or you rent from a tax-exempt entity, you do not qualify for the Circuit Breaker Credit. You must be 65 or older before January 1, 2017. Total income cannot exceed \$57,000 for single \$71,000 for head of household or \$85,000 for taxpayers filing jointly. Property value cannot exceed \$693,000. For more details about Eligibility, How to Claim this Credit, please contact Anne Fenochetti at her office 978-649-4514 ext 223.



MORE ABOUT ANNUITIES

Annuities can pay a fixed rate of interest (like a savings account) or the rate of return can be variable and based on some standard. Many newer annuities are "indexed" which means the rate of return is tied to a stock index like the S&P 500 or the Dow Jones. Often there is some sort of rate cap (upper limit) and usually the rate cannot go below zero (the bottom limit). Some indexed annuities even have a bottom limit higher than zero. With an indexed fund the upper limit is usually several percentage points below what the real index rate of return is. This allows the annuity company to make a profit.

The trouble with indexed annuities is that they are very complex and often beyond the understanding of people who don't know the stock market well. Some brokers will push these options and minimize any problems or downsides, especially since the products often pay large commissions to the broker. This may be changing with newer rules that hold brokers to a higher ethical duty towards customers. There is nothing wrong with indexed annuities, so if you understand them and feel comfortable with the terms, they are worth considering.

Fixed rate annuities are less complicated and easier to understand. They pay a fixed rate of return like a CD at a bank. You can be assured of steady growth with no down-side risk. With a life-time annuity you can be assured of the monthly payment for the rest of your life without the risk of outliving your income. With longer life expectancies these days, you may want to elect a deferred annuity for now and allow your funds to grow for a period of years, and then take payments in the future which will be higher based on your older age and the growth in your funds.

As with any investment decision, the options and choices are complex and it's very important to get it right. You need to consider your feelings about risk and return, your need for income or for growth of assets, and your probable life expectancy. You should consult with a financial professional who is under the new "fiduciary" standard to ensure that you get the advice that is best for you. You shouldn't rush into anything without understanding it fully, and your portfolio of investments should diversified with annuities as only part of the mix. And, don't forget to ask for a second opinion on anything you don't fully understand. Your Elder Law Attorney may not be an investment specialist but may be able to spot a bad idea or give you some tips on how to proceed with retirement planning.

A TALE OF TWO RICH MEN

By Nathan Combs

Without a doubt, Jesus of Nazareth preached a message that was both comforting and challenging. When He talked to potential followers about the cost of being His disciple, He always insisted on complete and unconditional devotion to His cause above any human relationship, desire, or personal goal (Luke 9.23-27, 57-62; 14.25-33). The gospels are filled with accounts of people who whole-heartedly accepted this, flirted with it, or rejected it outright. Two such examples are found right next to each other in Luke 18 and 19, in two accounts of wealthy men who interacted with Jesus.

In Luke 18.18-23, an unnamed rich ruler approached Jesus and asked a good question about how to reach eternal life. After Jesus quoted several commandments, the man replied that he had kept them since childhood. Jesus then called on the man to surrender what he held most dear - his money. Upon learning that he must liquidate everything he owned and give it to the poor, the rich ruler left in sorrow, unwilling to meet the high cost of becoming Jesus' disciple.

In the very next chapter, Luke 19.1-10, we read about another rich man with a very different reaction to Jesus. Zacchaeus. a vertically-challenged chief tax-collector wanted to view Jesus as He passed by on the road and climbed a sycamore tree. Instead of silently ignoring him, Jesus approached the tree, looked up, and to the shock of the astonished crowd, promptly invited Himself to Zacchaeus' house. During the course of their meeting, the tax-collector declared to Jesus that he would donate half of his possessions to the poor and restore stolen money fourfold. Jesus announced that Zacchaeus had been saved from sin and thus illustrated Jesus' mission of searching for lost people and saving them.

Which man's situation most resembles yours? Perhaps you're like the unnamed rich ruler. Can you point to a long list of good things you've done and commandments you've kept, but have a hidden secret sin lurking in your life that you're unwilling to surrender? Perhaps you've remained faithful to your spouse and lovingly cared for your aging parents, but the bulk of your waking hours are bent towards accumulating and maintaining your money and possessions. Or, perhaps you're like Zacchaeus. Maybe there's no doubt in your mind (and everyone else's) that you're a sinner. Perhaps you've lived years of your life in unabashed selfishness and cannot list any spiritual accomplishments. Perhaps you've concentrated your life on taking from others instead of giving.

Regardless of which man you're like, regardless of how well we've previously chosen to use our lives, Jesus' good news can reach us. The greatest lesson we learn from these two men is this: our salvation from sin depends on our willingness to surrender our entire lives to our benevolent Lord. God help us to do so.


