#### TYNGSBOROUGH TOWN CLERK NEWS

2017 DOG LICENSES are available at the Town Clerk's office. Licenses can be renewed either in person or by mail. Male/female licenses are \$11.00 and spayed/neutered licenses are \$7.00. Current rabies vaccination is required. If renewing by mail, please enclose a stamped envelope for the license. Annual license renewals are required by both State and Town laws. Remember that there is a \$25.00 late fee for any registration after March 1!

**VOTER REGISTRATION.** The last day to register to vote for the Presidential Election is October 19<sup>th</sup>. The office will be open until 8:00 pm to accommodate registrations. You can also register by going online to www.mass.gov. There is an online registration available through the Secretary of the State's web page.

If you will be 18 years old on or before November 8<sup>th</sup>, you are eligible to vote in the Presidential Election. But you must register before the October 19<sup>th</sup> deadline!

**ABSENTEE BALLOTS** will be available early in October. If you will not be in Town on Election Day, you may request an absentee ballot. You must complete an application that you can receive by coming into the office or by going to Tyngsboroughma.gov to the voter and election information page.

**EARLY VOTING** is now available in Massachusetts. The early voting period begins on October 24<sup>th</sup> and continues until 12:00 noon on November 4<sup>th</sup> during normal business hours. Additional hours will be offered on Wednesday, October 26<sup>th</sup> from 4:00 until 8:00 pm and on Saturday, October 29<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm.

**Presidential Election** is November 8<sup>th</sup>. Polls will be open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM.

Place all yard waste in barrels or yardwaste bags. Twigs and sticks (less than 4 inches in diameter) may be tied and bundled.





#### MORE ABOUT ANNUITIES

Annuities can pay a fixed rate of interest (like a savings account) or the rate of return can be variable and based on some standard. Many newer annuities are "indexed" which means the rate of return is tied to a stock index like the S&P 500 or the Dow Jones. Often there is some sort of rate cap (upper limit) and usually the rate cannot go below zero (the bottom limit). Some indexed annuities even have a bottom limit higher than zero. With an indexed fund the upper limit is usually several percentage points below what the real index rate of return is. This allows the annuity company to make a profit.

The trouble with indexed annuities is that they are very complex and often beyond the understanding of people who don't know the stock market well. Some brokers will push these options and minimize any problems or downsides, especially since the products often pay large commissions to the broker. This may be changing with newer rules that hold brokers to a higher ethical duty towards customers. There is nothing wrong with indexed annuities, so if you understand them and feel comfortable with the terms, they are worth considering.

Fixed rate annuities are less complicated and easier to understand. They pay a fixed rate of return like a CD at a bank. You can be assured of steady growth with no down-side risk. With a life-time annuity you can be assured of the monthly payment for the rest of your life without the risk of outliving your income. With longer life expectancies these days, you may want to elect a deferred annuity for now and allow your funds to grow for a period of years, and then take payments in the future which will be higher based on your older age and the growth in your funds.

As with any investment decision, the options and choices are complex and it's very important to get it right. You need to consider your feelings about risk and return, your need for income or for growth of assets, and your probable life expectancy. You should consult with a financial professional who is under the new "fiduciary" standard to ensure that you get the advice that is best for you. You shouldn't rush into anything without understanding it fully, and your portfolio of investments should diversified with annuities as only part of the mix. And, don't forget to ask for a second opinion on anything you don't fully understand. Your Elder Law Attorney may not be an investment specialist but may be able to spot a bad idea or give you some tips on how to proceed with retirement planning.

## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS FROM THE TYNGSBOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

Trick or Treating will be on October 31st, 2016 from 6-8 pm. **ADULTS** 

· Welcome trick-or-treaters with your porch lights and any exterior lights on. • Patrol your street occasionally to discourage speeding motorists, acts of malicious mischief and crimes against children. Report any suspicious or criminal activity to your police department immediately. For Tyngsborough call 911 from a land line or 978-649-7504 from your cell. • Do not give homemade or unwrapped treats to children.

#### **MOTORISTS**

• Exercise extreme caution when driving a vehicle. Be on the alert for excited youngsters, whose vision may be obscured by masks, darting out into traffic.

## TRICK OR TREAT TIPS

#### Make sure your kids dress up safely

· Make sure costumes are flame retardant so children aren't in danger near burning jack-o-lanterns. • Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls, and other bumps in the night. • Try make-up instead of a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable, and they can obstruct a child's vision, a dangerous thing when kids are crossing streets and going up and down steps. • Make sure kids wear light colors or put reflective tape on their costumes.

#### Make trick-or-treating trouble free

- Create a map of a safe trick-or treating route and set a time limit for your children to "trick-or-treat". • Trick-or-treaters should always be in groups so they aren't a tempting target for real-life goblins. Parents should accompany young children. • Make sure older kids trick-or-treat with friends. Together, map out a safe route so you will know where they are going. Tell them to stop only at familiar homes where the outside lights are on. • Try to get your kids to trick-ortreat while it's still light out. If it's dark, make sure someone has a flashlight and pick well-lighted streets. • Do not go inside anyone's home. Remain on the porch at all times. • Do not accept rides from strangers. • Remind kids to keep a safe distance from moving cars.
- Cross only at street corners, never between parked cars, and never diagonally across an intersection. • Look in all directions before crossing the street, and obey all traffic signals. Walk, never run, across the street, and use sidewalks, not the street, for walking.
- Do not take shortcuts through back yards, alleys or parks.
- Do not eat any treats until parents have inspected them. Discard any homemade or unwrapped treats.

#### Check all treats before eating

What to eat? Only unopened candies and other treats that are in original wrappers. Don't forget to inspect fruit and homemade goodies for anything suspicious. By all means remind kids not to eat everything at once or they'll be feeling pretty ghoulish for while! Halloween can be a lot of fun for parents and kids alike--if everybody remembers the tricks and treats of playing it safe. Check online resources for additional safety information!

#### A TALE OF TWO RICH MEN

By Nathan Combs

Without a doubt, Jesus of Nazareth preached a message that was both comforting and challenging. When He talked to potential followers about the cost of being His disciple, He always insisted on complete and unconditional devotion to His cause above any human relationship, desire, or personal goal (Luke 9.23-27, 57-62; 14.25-33). The gospels are filled with accounts of people who whole-heartedly accepted this, flirted with it, or rejected it outright. Two such examples are found right next to each other in Luke 18 and 19, in two accounts of wealthy men who interacted with Jesus.

In Luke 18.18-23, an unnamed rich ruler approached Jesus and asked a good question about how to reach eternal life. After Jesus quoted several commandments, the man replied that he had kept them since childhood. Jesus then called on the man to surrender what he held most dear - his money. Upon learning that he must liquidate everything he owned and give it to the poor, the rich ruler left in sorrow, unwilling to meet the high cost of becoming Jesus' disciple.

In the very next chapter, Luke 19.1-10, we read about another rich man with a very different reaction to Jesus. Zacchaeus. a vertically-challenged chief tax-collector wanted to view Jesus as He passed by on the road and climbed a sycamore tree. Instead of silently ignoring him, Jesus approached the tree, looked up, and to the shock of the astonished crowd, promptly invited Himself to Zacchaeus' house. During the course of their meeting, the tax-collector declared to Jesus that he would donate half of his possessions to the poor and restore stolen money fourfold. Jesus announced that Zacchaeus had been saved from sin and thus illustrated Jesus' mission of searching for lost people and saving them.

Which man's situation most resembles yours? Perhaps you're like the unnamed rich ruler. Can you point to a long list of good things you've done and commandments you've kept, but have a hidden secret sin lurking in your life that you're unwilling to surrender? Perhaps you've remained faithful to your spouse and lovingly cared for your aging parents, but the bulk of your waking hours are bent towards accumulating and maintaining your money and possessions. Or, perhaps you're like Zacchaeus. Maybe there's no doubt in your mind (and everyone else's) that you're a sinner. Perhaps you've lived years of your life in unabashed selfishness and cannot list any spiritual accomplishments. Perhaps you've concentrated your life on taking from others instead of giving.

Regardless of which man you're like, regardless of how well we've previously chosen to use our lives, Jesus' good news can reach us. The greatest lesson we learn from these two men is this: our salvation from sin depends on our willingness to surrender our entire lives to our benevolent Lord. God help us to do so.



Recently a study came out looking at behavioral changes in cats on a diet. The study showed that the cats were actually more friendly to their owners, sitting on their laps more and purring more. So your cats may not actually be happier on a diet, but they will act happier.

A company in Texas successfully cloned a puppy. ViaGen can preserve genetic material for \$1600 and \$150 annual storage fee. Then the actual cloning costs \$50,000 for dogs and \$25,000 for

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife found that 52 % of Mountain Lions killed (legally by hunters) in 2015 had eaten cats, dogs and other domestic animals.
