TOWN CLERK NEWS

- Happy New Year! With the beginning of a new year also comes a new absentee ballot period which means that all 2016 absentee applications have now expired. SO FAR, the only election is the Annual Town Election on May 16, 2017.
- Massachusetts is now a three party state. As a result of the last election, we have lost 2 parties and gained a new one. The Green-Rainbow and United Independent Party have reverted back to being political designations. Libertarian is now a party.
- The Annual Street Listing (aka the town census) has been mailed to every household. In case you are new to Massachusetts, this is a legal document required by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and you must return it to remain on the active voter list. Failure to return the annual street listing will designate to you inactive voter status and may result in your name being removed from the voter list. Please call me if you did not receive one.
- This is a good time to check the status of your Business Certificates if you have one. They are good for 4 years.
 Massachusetts law requires that all business owners file a Business Certificate with the Clerk in the town where the business is registered.
- It's time to license your dogs! I can only return the license to you by mail IF you include a self-addressed postage paid envelope. Massachusetts law requires all dogs over 6 months be licensed. Failure to license is a \$50 fine and failure to vaccinate is \$100 fine pursuant to Massachusetts law. The most popular dog names in 2016 were Bella and Buddy. The most popular were Labrador Retriever (black first followed by yellow and chocolate, nearly tied) followed by Golden Retriever and German Shepherd and Boxers. Dunstable continues to be a huge friend to rescue dogs, adoptions continue to soar. Whatever your furever friend is, please remember to license AND tag, to keep them safe and help us return if they get out and about.

BABCOCK SCHOLARSHIPS ATTENTION 2017 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!
We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene
Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and
invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your
education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one time basis. Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.

DUNSTABLE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Dunstable Conservation Commission would like residents aware of Massachusetts General Law Chapter 90B, Section 26. paragraph (e) which states: "No person shall operate a snow vehicle or a recreation vehicle on privately-owned property unless: (i) the operator is the owner or lessee or an immediate family member of the owner or lessee of the property; (ii) the operator has in his possession either a document, signed by the owner or lessee of such property or his agent, authorizing the operation of a such vehicle on the property by the operator or valid proof of current membership in a club, association or other organization to which express authorization for the operation of such vehicles on the property has been granted; provided, however, that such operation shall be consistent with the express authorization granted and any restrictions imposed therewith; or (iii) the owner or lessee of the property has designated the area for use by such vehicles by posting reasonable notice of such designation in a manner approved by the director.

No person shall operate a snow vehicle or recreation vehicle on publicly-owned property except on trails marked and designated for use by such vehicles, or without the express permission of the owner.

OPEN BURNING SEASON BEGAN SUNDAY, JANUARY 15[™]

Dunstable Fire Chief, Brian Rich announced that Open Burning season has begun and will end on Monday, May 1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.



SPECIAL NEEDS TRUSTS

By Edward H. Adamsky

Special Needs Trusts (often called Supplemental Needs Trusts, or just SNTs) are a great tool for helping plan for the needs of a person with a disability or other issues. There are several reasons why your family might want and need an SNT.

An SNT can preserve public benefits. Certain government benefits like SSI and Medicaid have strict financial eligibility rules. As little as a few thousand dollars will make a person ineligible for these, often vital, benefits. Medicaid is often the only possible provider of Long Term Supports and Services that allow an individual with a disability to live in the community and avoid institutionalization. An SNT can make assets available to satisfy needs or wants without having those assets be countable for benefits eligibility purposes.

An SNT can ensure that the assets are used in the way you wish. With an SNT you put in charge of the funds the person (or people, or entity) that you trust to wisely and properly use those funds. Things are not left up to chance and your instructions on how to use the funds are in writing and enforceable. It is often much better to use an SNT than to merely "trust" that someone else will "do the right thing" with money intended for the person with a

SNTs can be funded in many ways and there are different types of SNTs that you can use. You can set up an SNT with your own funds for the chosen beneficiary and with this type of trust you can allow others to contribute to the assets, either during life, with a beneficiary designation, or a gift in a Will. The SNT can be used by older generations for purposes of estate-tax planning and Medicaid planning (sometimes).

Some SNTs are set up with funds of the beneficiary. These are often called "first-party" trust and sometimes they go by the designation "(d)(4)(A)" trusts which comes from the Social Security law section that allows the assets in such a trust to be "noncountable" for SSI eligibility purposes. This type of trust can be used to "shelter" assets won in a lawsuit or assets which inadvertently come into the hands of the person with a disability.

A recent change in the Federal Laws regarding SNTs now allows them to be set up by the person with a disability. The older rules only allowed the parents (and some others) to set up such a trust. This older rule was predicated on the old-fashioned concept that a person with a disability had no capacity to do things individually. We know that is not correct and those persons with a disability who do have the intellectual capacity can now set up their own SNTs, if necessary. This allows for greater flexibility and future planning for many people.







Cerenia

Cerenia (maropitant citrate) is a relatively new medicine used to prevent/treat vomiting in dogs and cats. It can be given as a shot or as an oral medication. It works in the vomiting center in the brain and it works very well, almost too well in certain situations.

One of its most common uses is to prevent car sickness in dogs. It is also commonly given to pets receiving medications (such as chemotherapy) known to cause vomiting as a side effect. Another common use is with animals with diseases such as kidney failure, pancreatitis. liver disease or even puppies with parvo virus.

The main problem with Cerenia is that it works too well. It stops vomiting period. The problem arises when a vomiting animal is given Cerenia and the cause of the vomiting is unknown, which is very often the case. If the cause turns out to be a foreign object or a tumor blocking the gastrointestinal tract Cerenia will stop the vomiting, and the owners might assume their pet is better, but the problem persists and can even get worse. Because the intestines are moving all the time they will continue to move and put pressure on the blockage which can eventually make a hole in the GI tract, which is a life-threatening emergency situation.

When used properly Cerenia is a wonderful medication that improves the lives of pets and their owners. By far it is the most effective option to prevent car sickness in dogs, very rarely does it not work. Cerenia is well tolerated and has little potential side effects. However, because it is such an effective medication, it needs to be used cautiously in animals where the cause for vomiting is unknown.



The God of My Father Has Been with Me By Nathan Combs

The book of Genesis was originally written to the first generation of Israelites who came out of their Egyptian slavery. God taught them about their special identity by reminding them of their forefathers. In the accounts of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, a major lesson that's constantly emphasized is that God is the origin of blessings.

First, we see a repeated pattern of divine protection. When Abraham traveled to the the city of Gerar and his wife Sarah was taken into the harem of the local king, God appeared to the man who took her and said "You are a dead man because of the woman whom you have taken..." (Gen. 20.3). After Isaac attempted to dig wells of water for his household and was stopped repeatedly by the Philistines, God appeared to him and declared, "Fear not, for I am with you..." Afterwords, Isaac was able to find water without further conflict and resolved his disputes with the Philistines (Gen. 26.23-33). When Jacob obeyed God's instructions to travel to the city of Bethel after his sons mercilessly slaughtered and plundered an entire Canaanite city, "a terror from God" fell upon the surrounding cities and Jacob's family traveled the land without pursuit (Gen. 35.5).

Secondly, we also observe that the material wealth they accumulated was due to God. After we're told that Isaac sowed crops in the land of the Philistines, the text says that "The Lord blessed him, and the man became rich..." (Gen. 26.13). In a conversation Jacob has with his two wives, Leah and Rachel, he plainly acknowledged that "The God of my father has been with me," (Gen. 31.5). Because of the Lord's presence in his life, he obtained large herds of livestock despite his father-in-law's best attempts to rob him of his proper wages.

Third, the patriarchs repeatedly learned the lesson that children are a gift from the Lord. Abraham's wife, Sarah, was unable to have a child until the age of 90 (Gen. 16.15-17, 21.6). Isaac's wife Rebekah was also infertile until "Isaac prayed to the Lord for his wife" and she conceived two sons (Gen. 25.21). After Jacob married Rachel, she was without children until "God listened to her and opened her womb" (Gen. 30.22).

The men and women who were used by God to create the Jewish nation understood that their blessings were not random strokes of luck and freely recognized Him as their benefactor. Do we do the same? Do we intentionally praise God for our children or simply take it for granted that they exist in our family? If we're blessed with physical wealth, is it merely a product of our skill or of the Lord's hand? If we're protected from dangers, what is our attitude? Whatever success we've gained in our lives, what do we attribute it to? There is nothing we have which the Lord did not give to us.

Decadent Dreams Through February 26, 2017
This February, thirteen Greater Boston Metal Clay Guild artists have collaborated to unveil unique "metal clay" jewelry masterpieces at the Decadent Dreams exhibit, opening on February 1st and running through February 26th at the Loading Dock Gallery at Western Avenue Studios in Lowell. You may be wondering..."What is metal clay?".Londonderry artist Michela Verani offers a simplified description of this relatively new medium: "Nanoparticles of metal (gold, fine silver, sterling silver, copper, bronze, steel) are held in a moist (water) organic (cellulose product) binder, worked like clay and fired in a kiln. After firing, the product has all the abilities of standard metal".

The artists in **Decadent Dreams** share a common experience; after working with other metals and art forms, the properties of metal clay have opened the door for new artistic expression. Amherst, MA artist Ruth Levine sums it up this way: "My aesthetic focus is to find new ways to bring out and enhance natural patinas, to create mixed metal pieces, and to combine new techniques and art forms into my work. The sculptural process and the technical challenge allow me to produce unique, one of-a-kind designs."

The wonders of nature have served as inspiration for many of the pieces in **Decadent Dreams**. Woburn's Rosa Elena Rivera's "Orquidea" ("Orchid") was designed after visiting anextraordinary exhibit of orchids: "I decided to make an orchid that would be able to bloom at any time of the year." Nature also inspires Leominster artist Paddy Marcotte to "replicate nature or work from patterns to build something entirely new", while, at the same time, "capturing a sense of organic growth". Her "Dogwood Blossom" necklace design originated as a gift for her mother after her father's death using actual blossoms from the dogwood tree he had planted for her. Nantucket light, colors and textures inform the creations of Bretworth Apthorp, who lives on the same island where the artist's love of jewels and jewelry began years ago. Loading Dock Gallery artist Laura Doran, also a member of the Greater Boston Metal Clav Guild, has orchestrated **Decadent Dreams** as a means to introduce local artistsand the public to the art of metal clay.
