MEDICAID PLANNING WITH CAREGIVER CONTRACTS

One option when someone needs care, is for a family member to provide that assistance. Most folks do it for free without any thought for the legal, emotional and financial consequences of that decision. Some elders promise an extra inheritance or perhaps a house in exchange for the care. These are reasonable options that can work, but the rules of Medicaid may stop you from doing what you thought was right. You need to plan ahead with an understanding of the Medicaid rules.

One of the best options is to use a caregiver contract (sometimes called a personal care agreement). A written contract has many benefits. It details the compensation the family member will get for doing the work. It will alleviate tension between family members by making the terms of the arrangement clear and specific. It can be a be a vital part of Medicaid planning, by engaging in a spend-down of assets so the elder will eventually qualify for Medicaid long-term care coverage.

You should meet with an Elder Law Attorney and perhaps your Accountant to discuss the terms and issues of the care contract. If Medicaid Planning is the goal, the contract has to be written very carefully. You should detail the caregiver's duties which might include driving to doctors and grocery shopping as well as personal services like medicine management, bathing and dressing. The contract can be modified over time if necessary, but you want to cover of all the essentials so no one is short-changed.

The terms of payment must be considered. Will it be a lump-sum up front or a periodic payment? The payment must be reasonable and in line with the services to be provided. A lump sum payment must be calculated carefully if future Medicaid eligibility is at issue. You also need to think about taxes and insurance. The elder may well be considered an "employer" under state law and will need to withhold taxes and Medicare and carry worker's compensation insurance. You do not want your family member to run afoul of state labor laws. The caregiver may have to report income (whether as an employee or an independent contractor) and properly pay taxes on the income. In some cases, a room and board agreement may only cover shared housing expenses of a family member and may not be taxable income. You will want to consult your tax professional on those issues.

If you have a loved-one who needs care, and that care will be provided at home by a family member, then your family should consider using a written agreement to detail the terms of the arrangement. See your Elder Law Attorney today!

FROM THE TOWN ADMINISTRATOR

There are several significant projects with financial impact facing the town of Dunstable. These projects include improving the water infrastructure, the mixed use district (MUD), reconstruction of Main Street and a new Public Safety building. Although it may seem like things are coming up suddenly and simultaneously, all of these projects have been under consideration for several years and will likely come to realization at different times. Here is an update and some background, as well as an attempt to show how they all fit together and are manageable, both financially and from a project management perspective.

The water infrastructure has been struggling for years. You can read more about the current infrastructure online at http://www.dunstable-ma.gov/Pages/DunstableMA_Water/profile.pdf. The town administrator has been working extensively with the Water Department to get guidance and recommendations from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) in order to ensure a successful plan and bid. Many of you will remember that this project has come before the town for financial support and failed twice. Involving DEP gives us a stronger, better plan that is likely to meet the town's current needs as well as future growth.

The goal is to have bid-ready plans and project cost estimates for the Annual Town Meeting, May 2018. You may recall that the last time the project went to Town Meeting, it was with conceptual estimates in 2014 dollars. This time we will have more precise and up-to-date estimates, which makes for better financial planning and decision-making.

The proposed MUD is located behind the post office on Pleasant Street. An Affordable Housing committee has been meeting for the past two years to define the goals of this space and to create a preliminary blueprint. The proposed MUD would include 40 units, some rental some owned. The rental units would be age restricted, but not the two-family resident owned units. This project can go out to bid once we have secured funding for the water project. The RFP would likely ask the developer of the space to finance the cost of laying larger pipes for water service from Pond Street to the post office. Developing this space requires no financial input from the town beyond Community Preservation Funds.

The town is also looking at moving Fire and Police services into a Public Safety building, which puts all first responders in one location and offers more room for training those responders as needed. The walls of the current fire station building are bowing and are not providing adequate support. There is also insufficient space for supplies, especially as more supplies are needed to keep up with demands on fire departments. The Police department has lacked storage space for years and has no space for onsite training. The Public Safety building is also designed to include a Community Room, which would provide space for community training and events, such as scout meetings and senior luncheons. This building also requires the upgrade to the water infrastructure. At this time, estimates on the cost of the building are extremely preliminary and have many variables such as site costs and building design/ construction. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the Town Administrator's Office at 978-649-4514 X224. Not all of these events will occur simultaneously. The water need is most urgent and town officials hope to begin that project after Annual Town Meeting in May 2018. The financial impact would hit residents in FY2020. Plans for the MUD are already drawn up so the bid can go out once the water infrastructure project is approved. The Public Safety building is a few years out – the land is expected to be accepted as a donation this fall, the next step will be to approve design funding. Much of the town's current debt is scheduled to end by 2022, making these projects more feasible from a financial perspective.

Currently engineering is underway on the Rt. 113 (Main Street) Reconstruction Project. Please contact the Board of Read Commissioners at 978-649-4514 X227 for more information.

ADEQUAN

Adequan is an injectable medication used for the treatment of arthritis in dogs. It is a Polysulfated Glycosaminoglycan (PSGAG). It works by improving three different things in joints. It helps improve flexibility and resiliency of connective tissues such as cartilage. It reduces inflammation by decreasing an inflammatory chemical called prostaglandin E2. And lastly it increases joint fluid viscosity. Adequan is injected into the muscle of dogs, therefor it treats every joint in the body.

Arthritis is often treated with NSAIDs and pain relievers, both of which can have side effects, while Adequan has hardly any, so it is the safest treatment available. Adequan can help with every joint, but works best on joints with cartilage, like the knees and elbows. Adequan involves an initial commitment of time and money because it requires a loading phase of twice a week injections for 1 month. It can take a month for the dog to improve, so we ask that owners commit to the first month. Then, if the dog improves, we wean them down to a maintenance dose of 1 injection per 4 to 8 weeks depending on how the dog is doing. Sometimes we use Adequan if surgical repair for things like a torn cruciate ligament or elbow dysplasia is not an option. We can also use Adequan in conjuncture with surgical procedures.



HAVE YOU NOT READ?

On four separate occasions Jesus answered the questions and accusations of His opponents with an intriguing counter-question: "Have you not read?" (Matthew 12.3, 5; 19.4; 22.31; Mark 12.10). The question implies Jesus' disappointment and surprise at the immature Biblical understanding displayed by the reputed experts of the law. Not only did Jesus assume his fellow Jews would have a thorough knowledge of what Scripture said, He also expected they could connect dots together to make thoughtful inferences. Let's briefly explore an occasion in which Jesus asks this question and be challenged to understand our Bibles more deeply.

In Matthew 22.23-33, Jesus faced a verbal attack from the Sadducees, an upper-class Jewish religious sect which did not believe in the resurrection. They asked Jesus to untangle a ridiculous thought-experiment, in which a woman marries seven brothers in succession after each one dies without offspring. "Whose wife will she be in the resurrection?" they impudently inquired. In Jesus' masterly response, He directed their minds back to Exodus 3.6 (the Sadducees only accepted the first five books of Moses as God's inspired Scripture) to prove that there will be a resurrection. "And as for the resurrection of the dead, have you not read what was said to you by God: 'I am the God of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob'? He is not God of the dead, but of the living" (Matthew 22.31-32). Jesus quoted from a passage in which God appeared to Moses in a burning bush and commissioned the reluctant shepherd as the Exodus leader. Since God identified Himself as the God of three patriarchs from Genesis, He implied that although their bodies died, they're still alive with Him and awaiting their resurrection.

It is easy to scoff at the Scriptural blindness of the Sadducees, but put yourself in their place. Without the benefit of Jesus' explanation, would you have understood that resurrection is a valid inference from Exodus 3? Yet He expected them to have already grasped this point without His commentary! How many of us feel that we've mined all there is know about a particular Scripture after a cursory glance? How many of us immediately read over the Old Testament quotations in the New Testament, not bothering to go back and understand the whole context of the brief snippet the writer is bringing into his inspired message? How many of us breeze through our Bible readings but fail to meditate for any length of time on the significance and meaning of what we've just read? How many of us forget that the Bible wasn't written to us, but to different kinds of audiences over the span of thousands of years? I am personally guilty of every problem I've just identified. Let's resolve to be better Bible students. No doubt the Sadducees had read Exodus 3 many times before their conversation with Jesus, vet He incredulously asked, "Have you not read...?"

Since 1981, every President of the United States has proclaimed December "National Drunk and Drugged Driving (3D) Prevention Month" to help underscore the public's commitment to preventing impaired driving and promoting the use of designated drivers and sober ride programs. The month of December and the New Year's Eve holiday are also often highlighted by significant increases in state and local law enforcement efforts to combat impaired driving such as the use of sobriety checkpoints and saturation patrols. Driving impaired or riding with someone who is impaired is simply not worth the risk. The consequences are serious and real. Not only do you risk killing yourself or someone else, but the trauma and financial costs of a crash or an arrest for driving while impaired can be really significant and not the way you want to spend your holiday season.



Of course I have to mention that the next deadline is December 10th for the January issue. I look forward to hearing from you.



Many of my best photos have been taken just after sunset during the "Blue Hour" when the camera sees an incredible range of colors. The Blue Hour starts about 10 minutes after sunset and lasts about 30 – 40 minutes, until the sky goes dark. The photo that I took of II Duomo – the cathedral in Florence, Italy – was taken during the Blue Hour. Please visit my website for the full-color version.



Joyce and I traveled to Tuscany in early autumn 2014. Before leaving home, I had researched the best locations to shoot in Florence (very important), which directed us to Piazzale Michelangelo, a hill to the east of the historic center. So late one afternoon on an unseasonably warm day, we trekked from the rear of II Duomo through crowds and many squares, over the Ponte Vecchio, and then through backstreets until we arrived at the base of the Piazzale. Carrying some of my gear as she always does, Joyce jackrabbited up the long steep hill, leaving me gasping for breath at the bottom. I finally made it to the top and was blown away by the panoramic view. It was now about 90 minutes before sunset (very important to arrive early) so there was plenty of time to get my bearings, find the perfect spot, and shoot test shots to determine the best composition. Here are three rules I've developed for myself that contributed to the excellent result:

- 1. I always shoot this time of the day using a tripod with a cable release; this eliminates any chance of a blurry image.
- 2. I always shoot on manual mode and use settings that will provide the sharpest image for the camera and lens that I am using. In this case I was using my Canon 7D with a 24mm 105mm lens set to ISO 100 and F11.
- 3. I always bracket my shots: shoot one image lighter and one image darker than what the camera is telling me. The resulting exposure was 10 seconds. The best starting point to determine the correct exposure is the sky around your subject.

Once I got my shots, I noticed that a photographer next to me did not have a tripod. We learned that he and his wife were newlyweds on their honeymoon, a long way from Singapore. I offered to lend him my tripod, which he accepted. His wife offered us an apple, which we accepted, and he got his shots of a lifetime. Then Joyce and I trekked back down the hill and had dinner at one of the little restaurants that we had passed on the way up. Fabulous pasta and a fabulous bottle of wine. The walk back was much more relaxed than the walk out and I had gotten a great shot. Join me for a class or a couple of hours of one-on-one tutoring.
