TOWN CLERK NEWS

The Secretary of the Commonwealth has announced a new date for the September primary which will be held on Tuesday, September 4. More information will be coming forward on deadlines.

Are you interested in running for an elected town board? A list of openings is on the town website, or feel free to contact me. Nomination papers will be available no later than February The deadline to obtain blank nomination papers is Thursday, March 22. Papers must be returned by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, March 27. Pursuant to MA General Laws, the Town Clerk shall not furnish blank forms for nomination of candidates for town office to any person other than a candidate seeking such nominations or a person presenting the signed authorization of a candidate to secure said forms on his/her behalf. (53:17). A minimum of 20 signatures from registered voters within the town are required though it is recommended you obtain more.

The annual street listing (aka the town census) was mailed in December. We respectfully ask that you return it no later than January 31, 2018. In case you are not familiar with the street listing or new to Massachusetts, this is a legal document issued by the Commonwealth to ensure that your name remains on the active voting list; failure to respond can result in your name being placed on the inactive voting list and may result in removal from the voter registration rolls. Please contact me if you did not receive one or misplaced the copy.

Dog licenses now available! We must have a current rabies certificate on file. The fee is \$6.00 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$10.00 for those not altered. Please feel free to order by mail (allow 2 weeks) by downloading an application from the Town Clerk's page on the town website, www.dunstable-ma.gov, enclose the correct fee and a check made payable to "Town of Dunstable" and remember to enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope. 


WELL ADULT CLINIC

COME FIND OUT ABOUT CAPTION TELEPHONE SERVICE

There will be a short presentation, on ClearCaptions by Becky Bushey, February 7th, 11:30 a.m. at the Dunstable Library. Becky is the title IV ADA Specialist in the area. She works for ClearCaptions, a federally certified provider of the Caption telephone service. Her job is to educate seniors and groups about the federal law and their civil right to receive a caption telephone when they have a hearing loss. Title IV of the American Disabilities Act established the Telecommunications Relay Service, which requires all the internet and telephone companies in the United States to pay a fraction of their fees into this fund and that is how she gets paid. If you take a look at your internet or phone bill, you will see an item called the Universal Service Fee. Her job is to educate people on this entitlement at no cost. This is their civil right. In order to qualify you need to meet the following requirements. The person must have some type of hearing loss, a home phone number and internet. This is a no cost Federal Program with FREE Phone, Caption Service and Installation. You must have a land line and Internet Service. Since our last update to our Dunstable neighbors we have hit a big milestone number in our box top collecting efforts. During the month of January we are officially 2/5ths of the way towards our school year goal as we hit the 20,000 collection mark during the month of January. That means we've raised \$2,000 for our local elementary school just by clipping box tops and taking advantage of all of the great promotions that reward us with extra box tops via the Box Tops for Education app (if you haven't downloaded this app to your smartphone yet please take a few minutes to do so ... it's so easy to use and the box tops add up fast by using the app).

We are approaching an important date in the box top world and that date is March 1st. March 1st is the second submission deadline date for box tops which means that the more box tops that we can mail in by March 1st the bigger the check is that the school will be paid out in June to end the school year. If you have box tops in our house or a collection tin in your workplace that you have been meaning to drop off to one of our local collection sites please drop them off sometime during the month of February so we can include them in our mailing that we will put together on March 1st.

FALL PREVENTION

Falls are the leading cause of injury and hospitalization for elders (often followed by entry into a nursing home). Fall-Prevention is a great tool to keep you out of a nursing home and safe at home where you want to be. The National Alliance for Caregiving along with the National Council on Aging has released a new Fall-Prevention guide that can help. You can find it at www.caregiving.org/resources/falls/. Here are some highlights from the guide.

A common risk factor for falls involve the declining physical abilities of an elder. Medical conditions such as arthritis, diabetes and heart disease can increase the risks. There are also activities and behaviors that increase the risk of falling, such as failing to use a walker or cane. There are also some medications that can cause dizziness, and folks with vision problems may not be able to see tripping hazards. Environmental factors include homes that are not set up safely for older people.

Family members and caregivers need to evaluate the situation to determine if falling is a hazard for their loved-one. The guide has a checklist to look for risk-factors such as needing to rush to the toilet, taking sleep medications, needing to push with hands to stand from a chair (which indicates weak legs) needing to steady one's self often, and whether or not there has been a recent fall.

After determining the risks of falling it is necessary to have a conversation with the elder and all other caregivers about the issue and the need for prevention. This conversation should clearly include the elder and be respectful and helpful. A common mistake is for family and caregivers to treat elders like children who need to be controlled. This always backfires. You must treat elders with respect and dignity and seek to help, not control.

Your Fall-Prevention plan might include a determination that health issues need to be addressed. Some risk factors can be mitigated with proper treatment and medications. You will also want to ensure that the elder has had a recent eye exam and is provided with the right glasses for good sight. Physical fitness is a major issue, so you want to see if you can help the elder to get the right exercise. Many senior centers have programs for elders that increase their fitness and reduce the risk of falling and other illnesses. A thorough review of the living conditions is also necessary. Home lighting needs to be adequate and readily available. Motion detector lights can really help. Stairs should have two secure rails. There should be grab-bars in bathrooms near the shower and toilet. Floors should be clutter-free and small rugs should be secured or removed.

No one wants to end up in a nursing home. A major reason people go to nursing homes is due to injuries from a fall. Fall Prevention can keep you out of a nursing home. You should work hard to reduce your risk of falling.

BABCOCK SCHOLARSHIPS ATTENTION 2018 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!
We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene
Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and
invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your
education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one time basis. Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.





Dunstable Fire Chief, Brian Rich announced that Open Burning season will soon begin and will end on May1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION
You must follow all the rules and regulations
that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited


- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.



PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC FEBRUARY IS PET DENTAL HEALTH MONTH by Tara M. Sacramone, DVM



It's that time of year again.....Pet Dental Health Month. And in honor of dental health month, we at Dunstable Animal Clinic are once again offering a special discounted rate on professional cleanings

It is important to remember that your pet has teeth too, and while cats and dogs don't tend to get many cavities -- their diet doesn't include the candy and soda that ours does -- they do develop plaque build-up, which leads to tartar and gingivitis. Gingivitis causes inflammation of the gums, and the bacteria responsible may spread to the kidneys, heart, liver, and lungs. Additionally, animals can develop abscessed or fractured teeth which are very painful. It is up to you, as a responsible pet owner, to monitor your pets for these problems, because they can't tell you when something hurts!

Give your pet a simple, at-home, dental check up. Your animal's teeth should be white, and their gums should be pink and healthy, not red and swollen. S/he should not have bad breath. If your pet passes this dental check up, keep their teeth healthy by brushing with pet toothpaste every day if possible. If your animal will not tolerate this, you may be able to use one of the available mouth rinses. There is prescription diet food available from Hills which is designed with larger, harder chunks which help to chip off plaque and tartar. Dunstable Animal Clinic also carries a special line of treats for both cats and dogs to keep mouths clean and healthy.

If your pet's teeth or gums appear unhealthy, bring them in to your vet for advice and treatment options. Your animal may need to have his teeth cleaned professionally. This option does require general anesthesia -- even the best of pets don't understand the words "sit still" when their teeth are being picked at -- and older pets should receive bloodwork before undergoing the process. A professional cleaning will ultrasonically scale off any build up, polish the good teeth, and extract any with abscesses or fractures. Any pet with a bad tooth will feel better without it. Animals have very strong jaw bones and muscles, and even those who lose all of their teeth can eventually return to hard food.

Remember that dental health is an important factor in your pet's well being, and that their tooth aches are just as painful as yours. Bring your pet into Dunstable Animal Clinic this month and insure that they stay healthy and happy.



HOW I GOT THE SHOT: THE SCHOONER SURPRISE, CAMDEN MAINE

Please join me for a free photography workshop February 21, 6:30-8:00 PM, at the Tyngsborough Public Library. Using images from five of my recent gallery exhibits, I'll share tips and techniques for getting great shots in different scenarios (sunrise, sunset, bright sun, landscapes, family gatherings, sporting events, portraits, groups, etc.). I'll also explain how to travel with camera gear and maximize readiness for capturing great shoots while on the go.

Using reflections in a photograph can quickly change the image from a simple snapshot to a work of art. There are many types of reflections all around us: reflections in ponds, reflections in windows, reflections in buildings, reflections in puddles, reflections in mirrors, to name a few. Reflections provide a unique view of the subject matter and a unique perspective. For a landscape, the reflection of trees and flowers in a lake produces an attention-grabbing mirror image. Store fronts let you capture two worlds at once: customers shopping inside the store while the outside world, reflected in the window, goes its own way. Reflections also create opportunities to shoot interesting images in poor conditions, for example, when it's raining or during bright sunshine.

I used the reflection technique early one summer morning on a summer get-away in Camden, Maine:

I had gotten up nice and early to shoot the morning sunrise over Camden Harbor. I had been told that as the sun comes up. the steeple of the church in downtown Camden slowly illuminates before the rest of the town. I was hoping that this would create interesting images of contrasting light and shadows, with reflections in the harbor. But the best laid plans are often thwarted: a big cloud bank blew in at the critical moment, blocking the sun as it came up. My chance for the shots I had been hoping for was blown, and I started wondering how soon a diner would open for breakfast.

Before hunger got the better of me, I remembered a little maxim of one of my teachers: "Where there's water, there are always reflections." I started walking around the docks looking for reflections in the water and noticed a schooner called Surprise that was docked for engine work. The clouds cooperated by opening up, and the sunlight shining through painted a wonderful reflection of the schooner in the water: a surreal image of nautical shapes and colors. Ignoring the schooner itself, I shot only its reflection, creating an interesting abstract. Here are my settings for this shot: Canon 5DMKII; Canon 70mm-200mm lens @ 70mm; ISO 400; F8 @ 1/80.

I resumed walking around the docks and discovered many more interesting reflections. So the morning turned out to be quite fruitful for me. You might have similar luck as you walk through your day, if you start noticing all the reflections around you, consider how you might photograph them, and start shooting.
