**2018 DOG LICENSES** are available at the Town Clerk's office or by mail. Male/female licenses are \$11.00 and spayed/neutered licenses are \$7.00. Current rabies vaccination is required. If renewing by mail, please enclose a stamped envelope for the license. <u>Licenses are now overdue and will require an additional \$25.00 for the late fee!</u>

**2018 CENSUS** forms were mailed. Please look around your home to make sure that you returned the form. Check the information for accuracy, make necessary corrections, and return promptly to the Town Clerk's office. If you do not receive a census form, please call the office and we will mail a form. Please note that the census does <u>not</u> register you to vote. You can register by going to mass.gov and completing an online voter registration form. Completing and returning the census keeps your voter status current and there will be no need to fill out a proof of residency form at the polls.

**ANNUAL TOWN ELECTION will be held May 8th.** Polls will open at 7:00 am and close at 8:00 pm. Polling locations are the Tyngsborough Middle School and the Tyngsborough Elementary School.

# MEMORIAL DAY PARADE

MAY 28, 2018

The annual Memorial Day Parade will begin at exactly 11:00 A.M. from the Old Town Hall on Kendall Road, Monday, May 28, 2018. The Parade will follow the traditional route, ending at the American Legion Post No. 247 on Pawtucket BLVD. A memorial celebration will be held at that time and refreshments served. All Town Employees, Committees, Boards and Associations are encouraged to march. If you would like to participate in some way please contact the Tyngsborough Veterans' Services Department.

This year we will have a "Decorate your bike or wagon" contest. All participants are invited, beginning at 9:30am to the Littlefield library where you will have the chance to decorate your bike or wagon with supplies provided. You may also arrive to the parade with your bicycle or wagon already decorated at 10:30 for judging. All contestants will proceed to the Old Town Hall to enter the procession.

\*\* Helmets must be worn by all bicyclists.

At 8:30 A.M. Memorial Day morning a motorcade will depart from the old Town hall visiting all of the Town's cemeteries to salute the fallen. This is a very solemn and moving tradition. All are welcome to take part in the motorcade. Town monuments, municipal buildings and Veterans' graves will be decorated with new American flags. Also, the parade route will be fully dressed, proudly displaying our country's flag.




Our last meeting on **June 5th** will be a season wrap up, planning next year's agenda and a pot luck dinner at a members house.

### ALLOW FOR GROWTH IN OTHERS

Our impression of someone's character is quickly formed and not easily changed. If we're not careful, we can permanently pigeon hole a person based on immature mistakes we saw him make in one phase of his life. I have heard Christians say, "I can't believe that person is doing (some good spiritual work), because he wasn't like that when I knew him in college" or, "How can that person be qualified to be an elder? When I knew him 10 years ago, he sure wasn't ready!" It's possible that our previous opinions of someone's qualities are still true years down the road, but love believes and hopes all things (1 Corinthians 13.7). Love compels us to fair-mindedly evaluate people's spiritual lives based on where they currently are and where they could be given time and maturity, not on where they were in the past. In short, we must allow for growth in others.

When we look at the New Testament, the relationship between the apostle Paul and John Mark is a helpful illustration of allowing for spiritual growth. We're first introduced to Mark as a Jewish Christian living in Jerusalem, where his mother had a house (Acts 12.12, 25). After traveling to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas, he accompanied them on their first missionary journey but left them for unstated reasons and returned to Jerusalem near the beginning of the trip (Acts 13.13). As they prepared for their next journey, Barnabas wanted to take Mark again (his cousin, according to Colossians 4.10), but Paul "thought best not to take with them one who had withdrawn from them in Pamphylia and had not gone with them to the work" (Acts 15.37-38). Although it seems like Paul's negative impression of Mark was settled, references to Mark scat

tered through Paul's letters give us a different picture. From his Roman prison cell, Paul stated in Philemon's letter that Mark was with him and sent his greetings (Philemon 24). In Colossians 4.10, Mark also sent his greetings to the Colossian church through Paul's pen, and Paul indicates that he had previously given instructions about Mark's potential visit to that church. At the end of Paul's life, in his second letter to Timothy, he instructed his younger coworker to "Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is very useful to me for ministry."

Although he was thoroughly unimpressed with Mark's endurance for ministry in Acts 15, Paul allowed Mark room for spiritual growth, and Mark became an effective fellow worker. Eventually Mark would pen the gospel of Mark, which many scholars believe is the earliest of the four canonical gospels. May we all imitate Paul in our relationships with other Christians, looking past mistakes and helping each other press forward to future growth.

### COMMUNICATION TIPS WITH ELDERS

An issue that strikes a nerve with many Elder Care advocates is the way some caregivers and family communicate with dementia patients. There is a tendency to view them as child-like. As a patient, you may have experienced someone treating you "gently" as if you were an ignorant little child. This is poor behavior and should not be tolerated.

The relationship between medical professionals and patients can sometimes be analogous to a parent/child relationship. This is not the way it should be, but it is common given our society's custom of treating doctors as important while patients are a cog in the healthcare process. We all need to work hard to make sure that the patient is in control of the care and is not subservient to the medical professional or caregiver.

Patients who are talked to with "baby talk" do not respond well to treatment. They often resist treatment and may even fight with their caregivers. This may be a normal human response to being treated without respect. It may also have something to do with the nature of dementia and the elder's ability to properly understand communication.

Older adults and patients who require assistance may feel disempowered. They may feel that caregivers are giving orders with which they have to comply. We should strive to avoid the use of authoritarian language when dealing with elders. Do not give orders ("you must bathe today"), instead ask questions such as, "when would you like to bathe today?"

The words we choose can frame our thinking. Instead of saying a person "suffers" from a condition, say that they are "living" with the condition. Instead of focusing on what a person cannot do, pay attention to what they can do and give help where it is needed without highlighting that the person needs the help. Try not to degrade their sense of worth by pointing out that they cannot do certain tasks.

Dementia makes communication more difficult. Elders often have trouble finding the right word, and may have difficulty following a detailed discussion. They may respond with an incorrect word or with a statement that makes no sense in relation to the discussion. This is usually unanticipated by a younger person who might struggle for an appropriate response. This leads either to the habit of ignoring the elder, or to treating the elder as a child and to the use of baby talk.

You should try to communicate with your loved-one as an adult person (which they are) and avoid treating them as a child or leaving them out of conversations altogether. Refer to them by name or title rather than diminutives like "honey." Do not talk about the elder as if the elder were not there. Do not counter the emotions of the elder with facts. If the elder is unhappy or anxious, acknowledge the feelings and try to empathize rather than try to "help." Better understanding and communication leads to better results for the Elder and the family.





# PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC PET GRIEF

### HOUSEBREAKING

We see a lot of puppies at the Dunstable Animal Clinic (just a little perk of the job), and we also see adult or senior dogs that have had a break in housebreaking. We have a few pieces of advice to help get everyone going outside. First and foremost be consistent and patient. Some dogs learn really quickly, while others can be quite frustrating.

The next thing to do is to decide where you want your dog to go to the bathroom. If you want your dog to go outside begin by going outside on day one – no pee pads. It is very confusing to a dog if you let them go to the bathroom inside, then expect them to switch to going outside. If you are going to use pee pads forever, then obviously start with them. Also use the times you know they have to go – after they sleep, after they eat and after they play.

Dogs/puppies need positive reinforcement, they need to be told where to go, not where NOT to go. If you come into the room and find an accident it is too late - you cannot correct the dog. If you catch the dog mid accident startle him/her with a shriek or their name to stop them, get them right outside and praise them when they finish going outside. Also consistency is key, use the same door, the same leash, go to the same spot, use the same words, and lots of praise when they go. You must go outside with them every time, even in the winter, even in the rain, even if you have a fenced in yard, dogs really do respond better with immediate positive reinforcement.

We hear about the same problems from multiple people. One is the dog doesn't ask to go out. Our solution is sleigh bells attached to the door. Use the dog's nose or paw to ring the bell every time you go out, soon they will be ringing the bell to ask to go out (hopefully to go to the bathroom and not just to play). Which brings me to another common complaint – the dog gets distracted and forgets to go to the bathroom. Some dogs are very easily distracted, these dogs will do better if you have two separate doors to go outside – one to go the bathroom and a different door to play. If you go out the bathroom door and the dog gets distracted go back into the house, but leave the leash on and follow the dog around and at the first sign of sniffing/squatting go back out the bathroom door, and praise when they go.

This brings me to my last point – you must follow your dog/puppy around and watch them like a hawk. If your puppy is not in the room with you s/he is either eating something they shouldn't or they are going to the bathroom. With a lot of patience, praise and consistency your dog will be going outside in no time. Good luck!
