The deadline to register to vote for the November State Election is Wednesday, October 17 by 8pm. You can register online if you have a valid MA Driver's license. Visit www.sec.state.ma.us/ovr/ Registration forms are also available at Town Hall.

Last day to file absentee ballot application for State Election (noon) Monday, Nov. 5

State Election (polls open from 7am to 8pm Tuesday, Nov. 6
The Board of Selectmen have adopted a Policy for campaigning during Early Voting Periods (which will be October 22 – Nov. 2 during my hours for the November election). Please remember this office is closed on Fridays. It reads "During the period of Early Voting, no political signs for attempts at political persuasion are permitted within all levels of the Town Hall. In addition, no political signs or attempts at political persuasion are permitted within 150' of the main, back or side entrance." This is similar to the 150' rule at polling locations; because EV takes place at the Town Hall, it was recommended by the Elections Director of the SOC office that towns and cities adopt a policy.



HOW JESUS REVERSES BABEL

The beginning of Genesis 11 unfolds an unusual situation. After God told Adam and Eve (Genesis 1.28) and then Noah to "fill the earth" with people (Genesis 9.1), we see their descendants rebelliously banding together in one place to build a city and tower in the land of Shinar. Their goal was self-glory: "let us make a name for ourselves." Ironically, as they built up towards the sky, the text says that "the Lord came down" to view this new construction project with displeasure. He saw that the people were one, used only one language, and possessed an arrogant spirit that would not stop with the completion of the city. He therefore confused their languages, causing them to scatter from each other. The unfinished city was called Babel, which means confused. Even today in English, someone who speaks nonsense is known as a "babbler."

Did God orchestrate that division because he dislikes unity? On the contrary, God's entire plan for the world revolves around His desire to "unite all things in him [Jesus Christ], things in heaven and things on earth" (Ephesians 1.10). Through the sacrifice of Jesus, God is reversing the breakdown of unity at Babel and bringing all things together again - in the right way and for the right purpose. Instead of aimlessness and confusion and discord which comes from exalting self, there is purpose and understanding and harmony in a collective focus on Jesus. Through Jesus, human beings can all speak the same language again.

These are not mere lofty words that have no real effect on our personal lives. Instead, understanding Jesus' reversal of Babel changes everything for us. In the church, God's family, how are people of vast differences going to effectively work together? It is only possible when Christians speak the same language of Jesus. As Christians grasp how Jesus has reconciled every kind of person to God through the cross, hostility between people is put to death (Ephesians 2.16). Despite the many differences that exist between people, every one of us is guilty of rebelling against God (Romans 3.23) and can only be rescued by the saving work of God, not ourselves (Ephesians 2.8-9). Therefore, all cause for arrogance, bitterness, resentment, jealousy, selfish anger, or any other source of division, completely melts away in the face of Jesus' sacrifice.

Likewise, in a marriage, how are two people of different genders, family cultures, expectations, etc., going to effectively function as a unified team? It will only happen through speaking the same language of Jesus. Husbands and wives are told to think of their relationship as a living, breathing picture of Jesus' relationship to His saved group of people. As in God's family, a home of love, respect, submission, and leadership is only possible when people are communicating the words and thoughts of Jesus to each other. All other unity is built on a cracked foundation that cannot endure.

MAJOR CHANGES IN VETERAN'S BENEFITS

The Department of Veterans Affairs (commonly called the VA) has just released new rules for its Pension program. This is a needs-based benefit for older veterans who need care at home or in a facility. There are no changes to the entitlement programs for those with a service-connected disability nor for regular military retirement benefits. The new rules are borrowing from some of the Medicaid rules, such as the limit of assets for eligibility and a "lookback" period for transfers of assets. These new rules take effect October 30, 2018.

The Pension program is known by various nick-names such as Aid and Attendance and Enhanced or Improved Pension Benefits. The VA now just calls it Pension Benefits, which can be confusing because some might think of it as an earned benefit. This program is actually a needs-based program that can provided additional monthly income to veterans of wartime service who need certain assistance that exceeds their ability to pay with their income.

The new rules will now use the Community Spouse Resource Allowance (CSRA) amount from the Medicaid rules for a bright-line limit of assets for eligibility. The VA claims this will eliminate inconsistent rulings and probably allow more veterans to qualify for benefits. The CSRA is currently \$123,600. The CSRA under the Medicaid rules is adjusted annually due to inflation, it is not clear if the VA rules will do the same in the future as they only reference the CSRA when the rules are promulgated which would mean only this year's amount.

The new rules also institute a three-year look-back for transfers that is similar to that used by Medicaid. If the applicant for VA benefits had given away assets within three years of applying for benefits, those assets would be added back in to the amount of current assets to determine the total assets for eligibility purposes.

The VA rules also will consider the use of certain tools such as balloon annuities and disqualify applicants based on whether or not the applicant will get full value for using the annuity. If the applicant has engaged in a transaction that is more like a transfer of assets that will be disqualifying.

Another minor tweak is that the home of an applicant it not considered as an asset for eligibility purposes but that only applies to a regular size home and lot. Bigger parcels such as farmland or those bigger than other parcels in the area may have some of that value counted as an asset.

If you are about to apply for VA benefits you might want to get your application in prior to the change if the older rules are more beneficial to you. These new rules may go through some adjustments and litigation so there is always the chance of more changes. Also, those who assist Veterans in applying for benefits will need some time to learn the new rules. You should check with your advisors before you make any changes that might not work for VA benefits under the new rules.

DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH

Dunstable started a curbside trash collection and recycling program September 7, 2018.

The cost is \$300 per year and will include 2 carts (one for trash and one for recycling.) There is no Senior Discount. The Board of Health will consider requests for delayed or reduced payment support from any household experiencing financial hardship. Residents should contact the Board of Health to discuss available options.

Each participating household will receive 2 carts; a 35 gallon for weekly trash and a 64 gallon for weekly recycling. Each week, on Thursday, trash and recycling will be picked up at the curb of each participating household. Dunstable is participating in a state-wide effort to reduce the amount of trash to be disposed of through a variety of measures including increased recycling, composting and good consumer decision making. Less trash is better for our town, our state and the environment as a whole.

Overflow bags will be available for an additional fee of \$3.00 per bag (which will be available in rolls of 5 for \$15.) The fee is to cover the cost for the added disposal and added administration of the bag. Overflow stickers will be available for purchase at the Town Hall.






PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC GIARDIA

Tara M. Sacramone, DVM



Giardia is a one celled parasite that can infect any animal's intestines. It can cause diarrhea, especially in young and immune compromised animals. Dogs and cats get Giardia by ingesting cysts in other animal's feces, or the cysts can be ingested from the environment or infected water. Many animals get exposed, but not all of them will develop clinical signs.

Giardia can be diagnosed by finding microscopic cysts in a fecal sample, but the cysts can be hard to find, especially if you are not used to looking for them. This is one of the reasons the Dunstable Animal Clinic has been sending our fecal samples out to the laboratory for a few years now. There is also an antigen ELISA test that is much more sensitive. It is also run on feces, but it looks for cell proteins, rather than the entire organism. These proteins can be found even when the cysts are not actively shedding.

There are two medications commonly used to treat Giardia. The first is a dewormer (anti-parasitic) called fenbendazole, and the second is an antibiotic called metronidazole. Sometimes a combination of the two is used.

After treatment if the pet is clinically normal I run the routine microscopic fecal test rather than repeat the ELISA. Because it is so sensitive, the ELISA can stay positive for months. If the animal has no clinical signs and there are no cysts in the microscopic fecal exam they have cleared the infection.





MIDDLESEX SHERIFF'S OFFICE HOSTS NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF CORRECTIONS

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) TRAINING

26 correctional professionals from 12 agencies complete week-long program

CHELMSFORD, Mass. – 26 Correctional professionals from a dozen agencies recently completed a week-long crisis intervention team (CIT) training course, Middlesex Sheriff Peter J. Koutoujian announced today.

The training – offered by the U.S. Department of Justice's National Institute of Corrections (NIC) – is designed to provide officers and other correctional staff with the skills necessary to successfully interact and respond to individuals in custody with mental illness.

Nationwide, the prevalence of individuals with mental illness in local county jails is one of the most significant challenges facing correctional agencies. In Middlesex County in 2017, 48 percent of all new individuals entering the Middlesex Jail & House of Correction reported a history of mental illness.

"I want to thank the National Institute of Corrections for bringing this vital training program to Massachusetts," said Sheriff Koutoujian. "The expertise and resources NIC brings to the table in this area are second-to-none and we continue to be appreciative of the valuable assistance they have provided with this and other critical efforts we have undertaken to not only train our staff, but assist those we are charged with caring for by the courts."

The training was presented by NIC through a technical assistance grant secured by the Middlesex Sheriff's Office and was opened to offices from across New England. It included classroom presentations on items ranging from understanding mental illness to de-escalation skills. Participants also took part in a lived experience panel moderated by NAMI Massachusetts, as well as scenario-based exercises.

As a result of this course, participants have been provided with the skill and knowledge to help develop and implement CIT training at each of their respective agencies.

In total, personnel from 11 sheriffs offices from Massachusetts and Maine, as well as one department of correction completed the training held at the Middlesex Sheriff's Office Training Academy in Chelmsford.


