ESTATE PLANNING TERMS

There are many odd terms used in Estate Planning; names taken from a court case or a law section number. Some people will use a formal term while others use a nickname. This can cause confusion.

Your banker may suggest a **Totten Trust**. It is an easy way to transfer assets at death without going through probate (but only for that account). The account remains yours while you are alive, and it isn't really a trust. What it means is that your bank will transfer the funds in your account to your named beneficiary upon your death. **Totten** comes from a 1904 New York case where the Court said it was acceptable for the bank to use such an arrangement. The main problem with Totten Trusts is that there is no clear rule for what happens if your named beneficiary doesn't survive you. Some other terms used to describe this are **Pay on Death (POD)** or **Transfer on Death (TOD)**.

Another odd term is a **d4a Trust**. This is a type of trust created by a disabled person with that person's own money. The is allowed under Social Security and Medicaid rules and the assets in the trust are non-countable for benefits eligibility purposes. The trust is named after the section in the Federal Law that allows this. They are sometimes called **First-Party Supplemental Needs Trusts**. When parents create a trust for a child with a disability we call that a “third-party” trust and sometimes use the term **Special Needs Trust**.

I get push-back sometimes when talking about using a **Power of Attorney**. People don't want to give any powers to their lawyer and object to the idea. But this isn't what this means. A Power of Attorney is a document whereby you grant authority to someone else to act for you, either right away, or only in case of your incapacity. An older word for someone who works for you is an **Attorney**. I prefer to use the term **Agent**. Your Agent under your Power of Attorney is officially called your **Attorney-in-Fact**. An Agent who can represent you before a Court of Law is called an **Attorney-at-Law**, or a **Lawyer**.

You should have a **Health Care Directive**, so someone can help make your medical decisions if you cannot do so yourself. Directives are known by various names around the country. Massachusetts calls it a **Health Care Proxy**. New Hampshire uses the term **Power of Attorney for Health Care**. Many people call them **Living Wills**, but that is not really an accurate term as that means a document that only states your wishes. A Proxy or Health Care Power names a person and grants them the power (under state law) to make medical decisions for an incapacitated person.

It helps to know these legal terms. If you are confused, you should see your local Elder Law Attorney.

DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH

Dunstable started a curbside trash collection and recycling program September 7, 2018.

The cost is \$300 per year and will include 2 carts (one for trash and one for recycling.) There is no Senior Discount. The Board of Health will consider requests for delayed or reduced payment support from any household experiencing financial hardship. Residents should contact the Board of Health to discuss available options.

Each participating household will receive 2 carts; a 35 gallon for weekly trash and a 64 gallon for weekly recycling. Each week, on Thursday, trash and recycling will be picked up at the curb of each participating household. Dunstable is participating in a state-wide effort to reduce the amount of trash to be disposed of through a variety of measures including increased recycling, composting and good consumer decision making. Less trash is better for our town, our state and the environment as a whole.

Overflow bags will be available for an additional fee of \$3.00 per bag (which will be available in rolls of 5 for \$15.) The fee is to cover the cost for the added disposal and added administration of the bag. Overflow stickers will be available for purchase at the Town Hall.

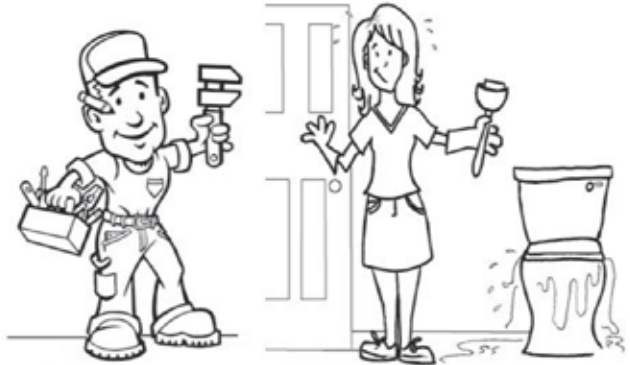

DON'T ADD OR TAKE AWAY

In Deuteronomy 4.2 and later in 12.32, Moses issued a stern warning in the law to the Israelites about the careful respect God's words deserved. In words that the apostle John echoed in Revelation 22.18-19, Moses instructed the people to "not add to the word that I command you, nor take from it." Since many more books of the Bible had yet to be recorded, Moses was obviously not speaking against future revelations from God being added to the collection of divinely-inspired Scripture. Instead, he was probably speaking against the same problem that Jesus dealt with in Mark 7.1-13.

In addition to the divinely-inspired law of Moses, the Jews of Jesus' day had access to a large body of teaching from various rabbis about the law. These teachings, which were mostly orally transmitted, formed an extensive daily code and were regarded by the Pharisees (though not the Sadducees) as very nearly equal in authority with the Scriptures themselves. When the Pharisees and scribes reproached Jesus in Mark 7 for allowing his disciples eat without going through ceremonial hand-washing that the "tradition of the elders" prescribed (7.5), they were referring to this body of oral tradition which Jesus and his men supposedly violated.

In response, Jesus revealed their hypocrisy in actually neglecting parts of Scripture they did not find convenient. Instead of honoring their fathers and mothers as the ten commandments commanded, they gave their financial resources to God, considering them "Corban," (devoted to God). By doing this, they were repeating the same mistakes as their ancestors in the time of the prophet Isaiah, "teaching as doctrines the commandments of men." Therefore, not

only were the Pharisees adding to the law by treating their own oral traditions as Scripture, they were also taking away from the law by refusing to keep it.

Since multiple generations of God's people fell to the same problem, we must be vigilant to not repeat their mistake. The only traditions we are obliged to keep are the ones handed down directly by Jesus' apostles (2 Thessalonians 2.15, 3.6). Before leaving earth, Jesus bestowed His authority on this special group of messengers, granting them authority to teach and reveal Him to the world (Matthew 28.18-20). In the first century, those gospel traditions were orally presented as well as written down, many in letter form. Although some churches claim to be keepers of the oral traditions of the apostles, the New Testament documents are the only trustworthy source we have to understand Jesus and His will for our lives. Oral traditions can change very quickly based on the mistaken memories of the transmitters. Written documents, however, are frozen in time. Therefore, let us shun the example of the Pharisees. We must obediently bind our minds and hearts to what we've been given in Scripture and not regard extra-biblical traditions as deserving of our full allegiance.

BEHAVIORS ARE SYMPTOMS UNDERSTANDING BORDERLINE PERSONALITY

According to the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Borderline Personality Disorder (BPD) is "marked by an ongoing pattern of varying moods, self-image, and behavior" that can result in problematic conduct and relationships. Individuals with BPD can experience intense mood swings and significant impulsivity – often engaging in self harm and other risk-taking behaviors as they oscillate between rage and adoration...

Personally, I am wary of describing any group of symptoms as a "disorder". Rather, I view the pattern behaviors associated with BPD as expressions of pain and as evidence of extraordinary efforts to self-soothe in the face of fear and hopelessness.

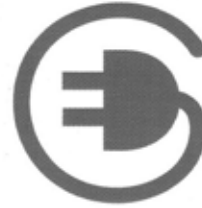
The authority, Dr. Marsha Linehan, has likened BPD to third degree burns of the "emotional skin". In my own work, I'm struck time and again by three themes that emerge from suffering clients:

- Existential Emptiness
- Impaired Sense of Self
- Feeling Unlovable

I believe that all three can lead to shame and the fear of abandonment, further eroding self-esteem and triggering behaviors that threaten to undermine relationships. It can feel hopeless; studies have shown that 70% of the millions of people with BPD (an estimated 1.5% of all adults) make at least one suicide attempt. Fortunately, as with other mental health disorders (including Post-Traumatic Stress which often co-occurs with BPD), there is help. Psychotherapy is associated with symptom relief and improved outcomes, both as stand-alone treatment and in conjunction with prescription medicine. Talk Therapy helps individuals heal and grow through the development of insight and trust.

In my psychotherapy practice, I collaborate with clients – with and without BPD, and their loved ones – as we all come to understand that people are always more than just their symptoms and behaviors. With compassion for self and others, we identify and navigate the emptiness and shame, empowering clients' self-worth and self-love in ways that can lead to permanent change.

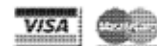

GATHERS COMMUNITY PROFESSIONALS TO DISCUSS EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR FORMER INMATES

LOWELL, Mass. - Professionals from five community organizations convened in Lowell for three days last month to discuss ways to better support former inmates seek and retain employment.

Twenty employees from the Middlesex Sheriff's Office, MassHire Greater Lowell Workforce Board, the MassHire Lowell Career Center, the Massachusetts Probation Service, and Phoenix Multi-sport participated in the September 11-13 training. The program was sponsored by, and facilitated through, the Offender Employment Retention Initiative offered by the U.S. Department of Justice's National Institute of Corrections (NIC).

"We know employment is a core component of successful reentry," said Middlesex Sheriff Peter J. Koutoujian. "With the assistance of this NIC program, we hope to enhance the efforts we and our partners undertake everyday seeking to assist individuals gain meaningful and steady employment, reduce recidivism and enhance public safety."

The program involved classroom instruction in the principles of motivational interviewing and cognitive behavioral therapy, as well as group discussions focused on how these agencies can work collaboratively to build long-term employment opportunities for individuals returning to the community.

At the Middlesex Jail & House of Correction, the MSO offers several educational, vocational and treatment initiatives designed to help individuals prepare for a successful re-entry including culinary arts, custodial training, OSHA certification and ServSafe certification, as well as the Medication Assisted Treatment and Directed Opioid Recovery (MATADOR) program. Individuals nearing the end of their sentences who have completed individualized treatment plans may also be eligible to participate in community work and work release programs.

CAT VS KITTEN

So you have decided on getting a new feline friend, but can't decide cat vs kitten. First of all congratulations, felines make great pets. Second of all make sure everyone in the family is ready emotionally and financially for a potentially long commitment. It is not unusual for a cat to live into its late teens or even early twenties now a days. Now, let's decide cat vs kitten. Both have positives and negatives so think carefully and be honest about which would fit into your lifestyle better.

Kittens: Pros

They are cute. Can be easier to train to use a scratching post or have their nails trimmed or even have their teeth brushed. They are super entertaining. You really don't need a television for a few months after getting a kitten, or even better - get two. Generally an adult cat is more likely to accept a kitten rather than another adult cat.

Cons They can be quite destructive, they love to climb and therefore scratch curtains and furniture, not to mention your pant leg. They need to play and if they are left alone all day they tend to sleep all day and are up all night. Their inquisitive nature can lead to trouble, like eating things they shouldn't or getting stuck in the couch. It's hard to predict their adult personality, so if you need a super friendly or super lazy or super tolerant cat you won't really know if that's what you've got until they grow up.

Cats: Pros
