





### HOW JESUS REVERSES BABEL

The beginning of Genesis 11 unfolds an unusual situation. After God told Adam and Eve (Genesis 1.28) and then Noah to "fill the earth" with people (Genesis 9.1), we see their descendants rebelliously banding together in one place to build a city and tower in the land of Shinar. Their goal was self-glory: "let us make a name for ourselves." Ironically, as they built up towards the sky, the text says that "the Lord came down" to view this new construction project with displeasure. He saw that the people were one, used only one language, and possessed an arrogant spirit that would not stop with the completion of the city. He therefore confused their languages, causing them to scatter from each other. The unfinished city was called Babel, which means confused. Even today in English, someone who speaks nonsense is known as a "babbler."

Did God orchestrate that division because he dislikes unity? On the contrary, God's entire plan for the world revolves around His desire to "unite all things in him [Jesus Christ], things in heaven and things on earth" (Ephesians 1.10). Through the sacrifice of Jesus, God is reversing the breakdown of unity at Babel and bringing all things together again - in the right way and for the right purpose. Instead of aimlessness and confusion and discord which comes from exalting self, there is purpose and understanding and harmony in a collective focus on Jesus. Through Jesus, human beings can all speak the same language again.

These are not mere lofty words that have no real effect on our personal lives. Instead, understanding Jesus' reversal of Babel changes everything for us. In the church, God's family, how are people of vast differences going to effectively work together? It is only possible when Christians speak the same language of Jesus. As Christians grasp how Jesus has reconciled every kind of person to God through the cross, hostility between people is put to death (Ephesians 2.16). Despite the many differences that exist between people, every one of us is guilty of rebelling against God (Romans 3.23) and can only be rescued by the saving work of God, not ourselves (Ephesians 2.8-9). Therefore, all cause for arrogance, bitterness, resentment, jealousy, selfish anger, or any other source of division, completely melts away in the face of Jesus' sacrifice.

Likewise, in a marriage, how are two people of different genders, family cultures, expectations, etc., going to effectively function as a unified team? It will only happen through speaking the same language of Jesus. Husbands and wives are told to think of their relationship as a living, breathing picture of Jesus' relationship to His saved group of people. As in God's family, a home of love, respect, submission, and leadership is only possible when people are communicating the words and thoughts of Jesus to each other. All other unity is built on a cracked foundation that cannot endure.

# THE THREE ESSENTIAL ESTATE PLANNING TOOLS

By Edward H. Adamsky There are three essential Estate Planning tools that everyone

needs to have in place. These are the Will, the Power of Attorney and the Health Care Directive.

A Will is a written document controlling the disposition of an individual's property at death. It must be written, signed, and witnessed by two competent people. It may be changed at any time, but the formalities must always be followed. You should review and update your Will at regular intervals (every three to five years) and upon major life changes (marriages, births, deaths).

In your Will you get to say who will receive your property after you die. You may give specific items to specific people ("my stamp collection to my nephew George"), or general gifts to groups ("all of my property, in equal shares, to my children") or any combination that you choose. In your Will you nominate the person that you want to oversee your estate after your death (executor or "personal representative") and if necessary the person that will take care of your minor children (guardian). When there is no Will the *intestate* formula in the law determines who receives the decedent's property. These rules are inflexible and do not allow for any special circumstances.

A Power of Attorney is a written authorization, granting power to act for another. The "Principal" designates an "Attorney-In-Fact" or "Agent." It is like hiring an employee, however an "Attorney-In-Fact" is usually an unpaid friend or relative. A Power of Attorney is "durable" when it is written so that it remains in effect even if you are incapacitated, and your Attorney-In-Fact can still carry on your affairs; personal and business (to the extent you granted those powers).

If you become incapacitated without an Attorney-In-Fact your family will have to go to court to have a Guardian or Conservator appointed to handle your affairs. This may cause delays and significant legal costs. With a Power of Attorney, you share your rights and powers with an Agent. In a Guardianship, you lose all your rights and powers to the Guardian.

A Health Care Directive is a special Power of Attorney that names someone to make health care decisions for you if you cannot. Massachusetts law calls this a *Health Care Proxy* while the New Hampshire term is *Power of Attorney for Health Care*. The power granted includes authorization to allow or refuse all medical procedures. You put your life in the hands of the person you name as your health care agent, but this is preferable to leaving it uncertain or up to the court system. Your agent's power only comes into effect when you cannot make health care decisions for yourself. If you can communicate a preference, your wishes will be followed. The person you name in your Proxy will have authority to make life and death decisions for you, if you cannot do so yourself, so you must trust this person with your life.

CANNABIS FOR PETS Tara M. Sacramone, DVM

As the first recreational marijuana shops are opening in MA, we all need to start preparing for either intentional or accidental exposures to marijuana and or CBD oil. We have had a few accidental exposures via edibles in dogs at Dunstable Animal Clinic lately. Dogs will seek out and eat edibles if they can get them. While exposure to marijuana can be quite harmful, CBD might actually be useful in veterinary medicine.

Marijuana is a leafy plant containing many active compounds including THC and CBD. Each strain has different concentrations of these cannabinoids. THC (tetrahydrocannabinol) is the most widely known component of marijuana and the one that causes the psychoactive effects, and has been said to be useful for analgesia, anti-nausea, appetite stimulation and antiepileptic in humans. CBD (cannabidiol) is a different component that does NOT have psychoactive effects, but may be useful for analgesia, antiepileptic, anti-nausea, anti-vomiting, anti-inflammatory, and anti-psychotic. In order for the components of marijuana to become active they need to be heated up or vaporized.

Marijuana is classified as a schedule 1 drug by the DEA, meaning that it has no recognized medical benefit and that it is illegal to prescribe. Because of this classification it is very hard to get reliable studies done on it's use and safety. Every state has it's own laws regarding marijuana, from how to allow certain people to get it (medicinally) to what it can actually be used for.

There have never been any clinical studies done for the use of cannabis for animals. The veterinary community can see potential benefits of the CBD component used orally. Currently there are companies selling products containing CBD to pet owners over the internet. This is still actually illegal, but it happens. Most of the stories you hear about successful use of CBD in pets are totally anecdotal, therefor approach them with a healthy dose of cynicism. None of the products available are regulated by the FDA, so anyone can put anything on the label. Interestingly the FDA does randomly test some of these products every year and if you google FDA/CBD you can find out which products actually contain the CBD they claim on the label. Another potential problem with these products is that they can be contaminated with pesticides, mold, heavy metals and bacteria.


In pets we also have to worry about accidental exposure, especially as edibles become more readily available. Edibles are more toxic than eating the plant itself because they have been heated up and mixed with fat which speeds up absorption. Apparently marijuana never causes death in humans, even with large exposures, but the same cannot be said for animals. Animals do not enjoy the psychoactive effects and an overdose can cause urinary incontinence, respiratory failure, drooling, tremors, and coma. Severely affected dogs have to be placed on a ventilator and need prolonged stays in ICU. So just be sure to keep your edibles away from your kids AND your pets.
