DUNSTABLE FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVES GRANT

The Dunstable Fire Department received official word today that we have been awarded a Firehouse Subs grant for a new fire gear washer and dryer in the amount of \$17,390. This grant will protect our firefighters by properly washing and drying gear.

This is the first time our department has been able to purchase a gear washer and dryer. Our current firefighters would have to bring our gear to neighboring departments to utilize their machines. This takes time away from being on duty and being available for calls. This new equipment will ensure our firefighters are protected from carcinogens and other toxic items that our gear can hold.

The DFD and its members would like to express our sincere appreciation to Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation and our local Firehouse Subs restaurant in Nashua for their support and funding!

In 2005, the **Firehouse Subs** founders established the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation with the mission of providing funding, lifesaving equipment, and educational opportunities to first responders and public safety organizations. Through the non-profit 501(c)(3), Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation has granted more than \$40 million to hometown heroes in 48 states, Puerto Rico and Canada, including more than \$124,000 in Massachusetts.

TOWN CLERK NEWS

The 2019 Annual Street Listing has been mailed, if you did not receive one or misplaced your copy, please contact me. The Annual Street Listing, also known as the annual census, is a legal document of the Commonwealth which requires each household return annually to remain on the active voter list. There is a misprint in the date of the Annual Town Meeting – it should be Monday, May 13.

Are you interested in running for an elected town office? Nomination papers will be available during my business hours beginning February 4. You can find a list of expiring terms on the town website or contact my office.

Notice is given the pursuant to state and federal law, I am required to purge the voter list of voters who are no longer qualified to remain on the list. This includes (1) (a) voters who have failed to answer the annual street listing since 2016 and thereafter failed to respond to a confirmation notice OR (b) they registered to vote on or before 2016 and the acknowledgement notice was returned as undeliverable AND (2) voters who failed to vote from the period beginning on the date of the confirmation notice when registered and ending on November 6, 2018.

Dog Licenses expire December 31, 2018. An application will be enclosed with the annual street listing for your convenience. If ordering by mail, we need a self-addressed stamped envelope to return the license.

GOD MEANT IT FOR GOOD

The story of Joseph (Genesis 37-50) is remarkable for many reasons. Its storyline is rich in detail, its characters are relatable, and its message is appealing. Joseph was the firstborn son of Jacob's favorite wife Rachel, was given a multicolored coat by his father, and enjoyed a privileged status among his many brothers. He was, however, hated by his siblings for capturing their father's affections. At the earliest opportunity, Joseph was sold by his brothers to Ishmaelite slave traders and eventually ended up in an Egyptian prison for holding to the principles of his God. Although Joseph rose to become the assistant warden of the prison and eventually the right hand of the Egyptian king, the events that brought him to Egypt must have lived vividly in his memory. Such unthinkable evil might easily have twisted the heart of a lesser man into bitterness.

Joseph, however, had a different perspective. After his brothers came to Egypt for food in a time of severe famine, Joseph eventually revealed himself to them and shared his thoughts about their horrific shared past. "As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today" (Genesis 50.20). How did Joseph maintain such a godly attitude towards the people who hated him?

First, Joseph kept his gaze on the bigger picture of how God was able to work with sinful people. Obviously, the Lord did not approve of the evil actions of Joseph's brothers or cause them to sin. He did, however, use their hatred for His own purposes: to save the world through Abraham's family. In the short term, that was accomplished by Joseph's distribution of grain to a starving world in famine, including his own family (Genesis 41.57). In the long term, the family of Abraham would save all the families of the earth through Jesus Christ (Galatians 3.8). In following Joseph's example, we must be more alert to the work of God than our own personal hurt if we desire to rid our lives of bitterness.

Secondly, Joseph left vengeance in the hands of God. After their father's death, Joseph's brothers feared delayed retribution and pleaded with Joseph to forgive them. After weeping at their distress, Joseph assured them that he had no plans for revenge. "Do not fear, am I in the place of God?" (Genesis 50.19). Joseph's actions mirror the commandment of Jesus to "love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil" (Luke 6.35).

Regardless of how we are unjustly treated by others, there is no degree of evil that justifies bitterness of heart or action. Joseph relied on God to work through his difficult circumstances and was used by Him to save many lives. May we follow the same pattern!



OPEN BURNING SEASON BEGAN JANUARY 15TH

Dunstable Fire Chief, Brian Rich announced that Open Burning season will soon begin and will end on May1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.

- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS AND DIVORCE OR MARRIAGE

You must keep your beneficiary designations up-to-date for life insurance and retirement accounts. If something changes in your life, you may need to update them. Changes include births, deaths, marriages, and divorces. If you got divorced, it would extinguish any rights that your ex-spouse had in your estate. A Will clause that left assets to "my wife, Jane Smith" would be voided by a divorce. In Massachusetts, the law has been updated so beneficiary designations to a spouse are also voided by a divorce, but New Hampshire has not adopted this newer rule. No matter where you live, it is best for you to update the beneficiaries on life insurance and retirement funds if you get divorced. If you left an ex-spouse as a beneficiary that person could try to make a claim and if you never informed the financial institution of your divorce, they would pay out to the named beneficiary (even if it was technically voided by law). This could result in lengthy and costly litigation among your family and ex-spouse. If you had moved to a new state after your divorce, the rules in that state might govern and that could change the result.

This shows that it is very important to review all assets and file new beneficiary designation forms so that your assets will pass as you want. You should not rely on agreements or court decrees to make those changes. You should inform financial institutions if you do get divorced, and if your divorce order requires you to name your ex-spouse as a beneficiary of some asset, then you need to inform the financial institution of this, so they will honor your designation. (It's common for parents of young children to keep life insurance in place with the ex-spouse named as beneficiary).

You should also consider the effects of getting married on Estate Planning. You will want to decide if you should change beneficiary designations on certain assets. Also, keep in mind that a spouse has rights in marital assets including a general claim against the estate of a deceased spouse, even if not named in the Will. New estate planning documents should be completed if you get married. Also, for Medicaid purposes, all of the assets of the couple are counted in making a determination of eligibility for benefits, regardless of the origin of the assets. Pre-nuptial agreements cannot change this rule no matter what they say, because the Federal law of Medicaid and public policy overrule the agreement. This means that a well-off person who marries a less-well-off person will be responsible for the spouse's cost of nursing home care, no matter what. Estate Planning should not overrule love, but the consequences of marriage and divorce must be considered when making your Estate Plan.

ATTENTION 2019 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!

We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one time basis.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).







PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC

A FEW TIDBITS

I went to a continuing education meeting at Tuft this past Sunday and I learned many things, so I thought I would pass some on to all of my loyal readers.

We often see dogs who were adopted from the Southern USA or other warm climates. My own little dog is from Tennessee. Most of these dogs have had a negative heartworm test. The problem is that it can take 6 months for a heartworm test to convert to positive. Therefore all rescue dogs should be put on heartworm prevention and retested six months after arriving in New England. Also, recent studies have shown that Avantage Multi (a topical monthly flea/tick medicine) might be the best preventative to use with a dog who is in that category and can even be used as a long-term therapy to kill adult heartworms in positive dogs if your dog cannot handle the standard adulticide therapy.

Lyme disease continues to be researched, however what to do in animals is still unclear, even with the researchers. A few facts remain the same. The annual heartworm test that looks for tick borne diseases proves exposure only. About $10-20\,\%$ of exposed dogs become ill. In order to say the dog has Lyme disease the dog has to have clinical signs and a positive blood test. The two things all of the experts agreed upon are that clinically ill dogs should be treated for 28 days, and that all dogs should be on some sort of tick control. The deer tick does not hibernate through the winter. Snow can physically block them, but if there is no snow on the ground your dog should continue to use tick control.

After they have lost their housing their next step is to find space in a shelter. At the same time they can apply for food stamps, they will be approved for those quickly because they want you to eat. Cash assistance can take a month to receive. Food stamps can only be used to purchase food. If you have a child in diapers, food stamps can not be used to purchase diapers or shampoo. Shelters don't provide personal care items, primarily because they don't get enough donated. NOW IMAGINE that on Mother's Day these same women receive a gift bag from The Wish Project containing new toiletries, soap, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, feminine care products, a hair brush, a pair of socks and deodorant.
