The town has upgraded its voting tabulator to the new state-approved voting tabulator called "Imagecast ICP" which will replace the Accuvote. The purchase was approved by the voters at the 2018 annual town meeting and widely used in Massachusetts and throughout the country. This is thermal imaging and has a couple of unique features for the voter that I love. If there is an overvote or if a voter casts a blank ballot, there is a screen which will direct the voter and the voter can decide whether to spoil their ballot or cast their ballot as is. You'll continue to cast your vote as you normally do. We will have a training later in April and the technicians will be on hand for both the test deck and town





WHERE DO I FIT IN -- HEALING CIRCLES

I have been reading lately about native cultures and indigenous tribes which remarkably have had many similar customs or traditions even though the communities have spanned across the globe. One common tradition has been the medicine wheel which was used for many celebrations as well as initiations and healings.

The medicine wheel is a circle that is most often made up of various natural items such as stones, pine cones and or sticks. The stones and sticks are placed on the ground in a circle with about an 8-10 foot diameter. The medicine wheel is also used in vision quests where the seeker will sit, sleep, stand or dance inside the medicine wheel during the quest. This offers a point of focus and is also thought to offer protection as well.

I loved this idea. So often I hear clients talk about feeling like an outsider. We all have experienced feeling "outside" a circle. That circle could be your own family, friends, the PTO, the work place, the gym -- anywhere. And think of when we were kids and the painful feelings of not being good enough to be "picked", liked or "chosen." So how wonderful is the idea of placing ourselves inside our own circle?

A few years ago, I read a very touching article where the author was at the airport and witnessed a mom who was alone with her toddler and her baby. The toddler was very ancy and active and not listening to the mom. It was getting close to time to board the plane when the toddler had a complete meltdown. The mother, exasperated and exhausted, sat down on the ground and cried while she had her other baby in her arms as the toddler screamed. At this point, women who were strangers circled the mother and the children. One woman started playing with toddler, another rubbed the mom's back, another got a snack for the toddler, and another picked up the toys that had been strewn about. Within just a few moments, this mother had a village around her. She was inside the circle.

I was so moved reading this. I imagined how this mom might have initially felt embarrassed by the support but then I hoped she relaxed and embraced the love and care. She was no longer alone. These women "got it" and they "got" her.

Our psyches are not built to be alone or to feel alone. This is actually detrimental to our psychological health and makeup. Yes, solitude can be healthy and longed for or warranted. This is not the same as feeling alone. Feeling alone is when we feel like people don't understand us, see us, or even want to try and hear us. We may be around lots people but still feel alone. We have become the "odd man out" and we feel abandoned and deserted. It may feel as if we don't matter or don't even exist. This is an unbearably painful place to sit.

Some of us may find this to be a temporarily transient place because we have our tribe even when we don't fit in at the PTO or the gym. So we can rest assured that this is where our village is. For those who don't feel like they fit in anywhere, or for all of us at those times when we need extra care, I invite you to consider some solace in the medicine wheel. Make your own sacred wheel among nature or in the corner of your bedroom or sitting room. Lay out important items and trace your own circle. Step inside the wheel with reverence and know you have sacred ground before you. As you sit inside, perhaps imagine your ancestors (as the native tribes did) or some wise, caring people (like the women at the airport) surrounding your circle. See if some comfort might come to you as you see yourself wrapped, cocooned and nestled by something bigger than you that understands you, cares for you and loves you.

OPEN BURNING SEASON BEGAN JANUARY 15TH

Dunstable Fire Chief, Brian Rich announced that Open Burning season will soon begin and will end on May1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.

ESTATE PLANNING AND GIVING TO CHARITY

There are several reasons to give to charity. The most important is because you want to benefit the cause. You also get income-tax and estate-tax deductions for giving to charity which some people think is important too. You might prefer your assets going to a charity rather than someone in your family. Whatever, your reasons, some ways of giving are better than others.

The first tip is not to name a charity in your Will. The Probate system has been modernized making it faster and cheaper. There are several steps you can skip when all of the heirs agree. However, you cannot skip those steps when a charity is named in a Will. That slows things down and costs more money. There are better ways to give than through your Will.

Charitable Annuities are a way to give and get something in return. Your chosen charity will help you set this up through their systems. You give them a lump sum of money (usually a fairly large amount such as \$20,000 to \$100,000) and they set up the annuity. It gives you an income for the rest of your life, and when you die, the balance goes to the charity. You get an immediate income-tax deduction in the year you set it up (assuming you itemize your deductions) and you continue to benefit from your assets (income) while the charity benefits in the end by getting the proceeds of the annuity.

Another tax-advantaged method of giving is through a Charitable Trust. If you have sufficient assets to make this complex tool worth-while it can be very beneficial. It works best when you have highly appreciated assets that would trigger a large capital-gains tax if you sold them. Instead, you donate the appreciated assets to the Trust and when it sells them there isn't any income-tax due as the trust will qualify as a non-taxable charity. You can set up the charitable trust like an annuity. You get income for life and the remaining trust assets go to the charity when you die. This method is really for those with quite a lot of money that they want to give to charity.

A fairly simple method for those with retirement funds in tax deferred plans (IRAs, 401k's and the like) is to have your RMD sent to the charity. You have to coordinate this with your fund custodian, but if you have your yearly required minimum distribution sent directly to the charity you don't have to recognize the income. You don't get a tax deduction, but it's often even better to not to have to recognize the income at all, the charity will get more in the end and you will pay less tax. If you don't itemize this will be better for you.

Speak with your Estate Planning Attorney to get advice on giving to charity as part of your planning.

THE PROMISED LAND

By Nathan Combs

As I can now attest from personal experience, Israel is a truly beautiful country. Despite its diminutive size (it's roughly the area of New Jersey), it contains diverse landscapes and microclimates. Its plains and mountains, its lush greenery and rugged wilderness all prove the truth of God's promise in Exodus 3:8 to bring the Israelites to "a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey..." The importance of the promised land, however, mainly lay in what it signified to the Israelites, not just in its topography.

God repeatedly promised Abraham that his family would occupy the land of Canaan (Genesis 12:7, 13:15, 17:8). To ancient peoples like the Israelites, owning land meant far more than simply possessing a particular clump of dirt. Instead of the transient nature of nomadic life, land provided a sense of established permanence, a location where generations could come and go in peace and security. It meant regular access to water and a place to cultivate crops to sustain your family and animals with consistent food. By God's design, Israelite law supported this security - families were forbidden from permanently selling their land to others (Leviticus 25:23, 1 Kings 21:3) and boundary markers were protected (Proverbs 22:28, 23:10). Possessing land meant having a safe place in this world.

When Jesus preached about His new kingdom, I believe He alluded to Abraham's land promise when He famously said in Matthew 5:5: "Blessed are the meek, for they shall *inherit the earth*" ("earth" can also be translated "land"). The practical implications of this are manifold. We live in a fiercely competitive culture where security is granted based on your unique merits. There's unspoken pressure to be the smartest in the room, or the funniest, or the most musical, to distinguish yourself in a special way. You're expected to fight for the position you want in your employment and your social circles. You have to carve out a place for yourself in this world and make others respect you. And once you've climbed your mountain, you still have to look over your shoulder to ensure that no one else surpasses what you have achieved. There is no true security in such a wilderness of misery and stress.

Jesus is the only escape from this kind of life. In God's land, our value is determined by the already accomplished work of His Son, not by our own paltry abilities or accomplishments. Although Christians are not promised a particular plot of physical land like the Israelites of old, we have our own brand of promised security which far eclipses the benefits of the old covenant. We possess a heavenly land, in which we are perfectly and completely loved by a gracious Father who has seated us at His side (Ephesians 2:1-7). Through the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are promised the power of indestructible life (Romans 8:11). Thanks be to God for the promised land we have!

PET HEALTH **DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC**

TICKS, TICKS, TICKS Tara M. Sacramone, DVM



Will we ever be done talking about ticks? No. Never. Every journal I read seems to have something about ticks and tickborne diseases. Here's some information from the veterinary perspective.

At the Dunstable Animal Clinic we have been running a heartworm test on dogs that also looks for exposure for 3 tickborne disease for many years now. In 2017 we had 2% exposure to a disease called Ehrlichia, 15% exposure to Lyme and 32% exposure to Anaplasmosis. In 2018 all exposure rates went down, 1% Ehrlichia, 8% Lyme, and 21% Anaplasmosis. Ehrlichia is carried on the dog tick and most of the dogs that are positive at our clinic originally came from somewhere else in the United States. Both Lyme and Ana are carried on the deer tick. Lyme is the most problematic for dogs and the one most likely to cause clinical signs and therefore is the only one we have a vaccine for. It is also true that dogs that have a positive exposure to more than one disease are more likely to develop clinical signs. I'm hoping the exposure rates in dogs in this area will continue to decrease, especially if we continue to use tick control and continue to vaccinate dogs against Lyme disease.

We now have more options than ever for tick control. We have had good luck with the Seresto collar, which lasts 8 months and can also be used for cats. There are multiple once a month topical medications but we like Advantix and Vectra the best. There are even oral medications that work on ticks, Nexgard is once a month and Bravecto which lasts 3 months. It is also important to realize that the deer tick dose NOT hibernate over the winter. They can, however, be covered with snow. So if there is no snow on the ground you need to continue treating your pets.

There also seems to be new ticks coming to America. The most recent one to be found is called the Asian longhorned tick. It hasn't been found in Massachusetts yet, but all signs seem to say it will eventually be here. It seems to carry diseases that bother humans and cattle more than dogs or cats. If you find an unusual looking tick on your pet we have a place we can send it to have it identified. This tick is a rusty brown color with no white or black on it. However when ticks become engorged it is harder to identify them.

Humans continue to be the most susceptible to tickborne diseases and the CDC recently announced that more and more people are becoming sick. In 2017 there were 27,000 cases of tickborne disease reported and in 2018 that number increased to 59,000, 70% of those cases were Lyme disease. The CDC can't say for sure why the numbers are rising but list possible factors such as changes in temperatures, rainfall, humidity, host populations, tick population densities, and health care provider awareness.

RAIN BARREL PROGRAM

Tyngsboro, MA. "It is that time of year again to start thinking about water conservation and saving rain water" says Danielle Mucciarone, Conservation Director and Town Planner, Town of Tyngsboro. "Rain fall is hard to gauge. Harvesting rain water with a rain barrel can mitigate the irregular patterns of rainfall. To help homeowners and the town manage their water supplies Tyngsboro and Pepperell are offering residents the opportunity to buy discounted rain barrels.

Each year homeowners face higher prices for water and sewer. The wholesale rate of water from the MWRA has increased 49% over the 10-year period from 2008-2018. Saving rain water helps homeowners hedge against the rising cost of water. Rain water is a free healthy alternative; it is organic, has no chlorine, no fluoride and no chemicals. It is an excellent water source for plants, gardens, lawns and any non-potable use. Regular use of a rain barrel can pay for itself in one season. One tenth of an inch of rain on a 1000 square foot roof --about 25 minutes of moderate rainfall-- will fill a 60-gallon Rain Barrel. New England typically receives 17" of rain during the growing season from May through September. This provides enough water to fill 170 Rain Barrels. At 2 cents a gallon homeowners can expect to save \$204 worth of water.

Droughts stress residential landscaping and town water facilities. In 2016, 168 communities in Massachusetts faced restrictions on non-essential outdoor water use - 47% of the Cities and Towns in the state. There is no restriction on rainwater use.

Tyngsboro and Pepperell chose to work with the Great American Rain Barrel Co., a local food importing company that has been repurposing shipping drums into Rain Barrels since 1988. Last year 30% of Massachusetts Cities and Towns partnered with The Great American Rain Barrel Co, selling over 3000 barrels. Great American Rain Barrel Co has been approved vendors by the MASSDEP for the state since 2010. **Barrels are being offered for \$69**. Barrels will be available for pick up on date on Saturday, April 6th from 10:00am-12 noon during the Tyngsboro Health Fair at The Elementary School at 205 Westford Road Tyngsboro, MA. 01879
