TOWN CLERK NEWS

Notice of Increase in Fees for Vital Records. Mandates from the Department of Health, Registry of Vital Records, have resulted in increased costs to issue birth, death and marriage certificates. These costs include the purchase of special security paper and the current fee of \$5.00 is no longer sustainable. In accordance with MGL Chapter 40, Section 22F, effective July 1, 2019 the cost will increase to \$10.00 per copy which is comparable to many other towns. Fees are deposited to the General Fund. The cost to file your notice of marriage intentions will remain at \$25.00 and include one certified copy. Additional copies will now increase to \$10.00 per copy. Reminder that all dogs, 6 months and older, are required to be licensed by state law. You can download an application from the town website or here at town hall. Please remember to enclose a SASE if you want it mailed back to you.

The town has upgraded its voting tabulator to the new state-approved voting tabulator called "Imagecast ICP" which will replace the Accuvote. The purchase was approved by the voters at the 2018 annual town meeting and widely used in Massachusetts and throughout the country. This is thermal imaging and has a couple of unique features for the voter that I love. If there is an overvote or if a voter casts a blank ballot, there is a screen which will direct the voter and the voter can decide whether to spoil their ballot or cast their ballot as is. You'll continue to cast your vote as you normally do. We will have a training later in April and the technicians will be on hand for both the test deck and town election.

Dunstable Residents, do you know that we have a **CURBSIDE TRASH AND RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM?** The subscription runs from July 1st 2018 to June 30th, 2019

You may join any time. The fee is pro-rated monthly. For May 2019 thru June 30, 2019 it is \$50 and for June 1 thru June 30, 2019 it is \$25. You will receive a trash cart and recycling cart included in the cost.





HOSPITAL OBSERVATION STATUS

Many elders have had the bad experience of going to a hospital then being transferred to a nursing home, and later finding out that Medicare would not cover the cost because they were not "admitted" to the hospital. Medicare rules require a three-day admission to a hospital prior to covering medically necessary nursing care. Hospitals often classify patients as "under observation" rather than "admitted" and this causes severe financial problems for many elders.

Because of this Congress passed a new law (the NOTICE Act) that requires a hospital to notify patients if they have not been officially admitted to the hospital. The notice must be given orally and in writing for patients who are under observation for more than 24 hours and within 36 hours of being placed on that status. This new law may help, but it may not fix every problem associated with this issue.

This problem has been occurring for years and reflects the tension over payment status and hospital choices. Patients can be classified as an "outpatient" or an "inpatient" and the reimbursement process and consequences differ. There seems to be financial incentives to classify as outpatient due to audits of inpatient reimbursements. The problem is that what benefits the hospital may be detrimental to the patient's financial situation. Early court cases turned on whether patients had any rights with respect to the hospital decisions and how those were made but found generally against the patients, however there is one class-action suit still proceeding.

Although the new law requires notification of observation status and its consequences, it still does not stop hospitals from using that status. The payment rules still apply so if the patient is under observation then a subsequent nursing home stay will not be covered. The financial incentives have not changed in any way so the processes may remain the same except to hopefully inform patients of the consequences of the current process. At least the rules require a written explanation of the decision which may give the patient some room to argue about whether or not it was the right decision.

Additional consequences of observation status include higher co-pays and costs to those patients. The NOTICE Act may let them know this is coming, but they still have to pay the higher costs of non-covered items during their stay at the hospital as an outpatient. This may result in some patients choosing to return home sooner than is medically advisable to avoid costs they cannot afford. We hope that this situation will be addressed with future changes to the law, but until then, patients and their families should ask the status at the hospital and inquire as to future costs and options for the patient. It is annoying to have to consider expenses when you or a loved-one is in the hospital, but under our current system it is necessary to ask and be informed.

DWELLING IN THE LORD'S HOUSE

By Nathan Combs

Psalm 23, one of the most beloved chapters in Scripture, ends unusually. After David affirms the various ways the Lord protects, leads, and blesses him, he confidently predicts he will "dwell in the house of the Lord forever" (Psalm 23.6). Similarly, in Psalm 27.4 he writes about the "one thing" he's asked of God: to "dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in his temple." The only "house of the Lord" that David knew personally was the physical structure of the tabernacle (later, the temple). As every godly Israelite understood, no one could actually live within the walls of the holy structure, nor even in its courts (Nehemiah 13.7-9). Dire consequences befell unordained Israelites who waltzed into God's house (2 Chronicles 26.16-21). The priests from Levi's tribe could minister within it and camp around it, but no one dwelt inside it except God himself. Therefore, David's desire to live with the Lord expressed a future reality, ultimately realized in Jesus Christ.

In John 14, Jesus was only hours away from experiencing his brutal murder. In the remaining time he had with his closest disciples, he prepared them for their future work and reassured them of God's care. In vs. 2, he declared, "In my Father's house are many *rooms*. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?" (ESV). Other English translations less accurately translate the verse, "In my Father's house are many *mansions*," (KJV, NKJV, ASV) giving the idea that every Christian will inherit a personal palace someday in heaven. Jesus' real point is that his people will dwell safely in the *house of the Lord* after their work is accomplished. Rather than the two room space of the tabernacle/ temple, God's eternal home will not lack space within it - there are "many rooms." Also, all Christ-followers are welcomed inside it, the true fulfillment of David's dreams of human and divine unity.

A few personal applications arise from these two connected passages. First, where do we desire to dwell? Are we primarily concerned with planning, stressing, and working on houses made of earthly materials, which are all destined to be destroyed when the Lord returns (2 Peter 3.8-10)? Or do we place a greater amount of struggle and attention on the house of the Lord? As the prophet Haggai said, "consider your ways" (Haggai 1.5, 7). Second, with whom do we desire to dwell? The typical king was intent on dwelling with beautiful women, attentive servants, and protective soldiers, yet David desired the Lord beyond any other. Are we primarily focused on improving our human relationships? Or do we crave worshipping the Lord and ache for his presence as David did? Only within our Father's house do we find the full scope of pleasure and contentment we seek.



PEPPERELL FOOD PANTRY NOW OPEN TO DUNSTABLE RESIDENTS

PACH, Pepperell's food pantry, is now open to Dunstable residents in need. *The pantry, located at 66 Hollis Street in Pepperell, is open on Tuesdays from 5 to 7 p.m. and Thursdays from 2 to 4 p.m. and 5 to 7 p.m.*

PACH provides food and personal care items to residents of Pepperell and Dunstable in need of assistance. The pantry provides canned and boxed foods, frozen meats, and depending on availability, fresh fruits, vegetables, breads and dairy products. PACH clients may receive assistance from the pantry twice per month.

If you are interested in becoming a PACH client, please contact the office at 978-925-9770 or visit PACH's website, www.pachoutreach.org to learn how to receive assistance, and the required documentation for proof of residence in Pepperell or Dunstable.

Food Assistance Programs PACH also distributes food monthly on behalf of the USDA (U.S. Department of Agriculture) Food and Nutrition Programs, MEFAP (Massachusetts Emergency Food Assistance Program), and the Greater Boston Food Bank. Some of these programs have eligibility requirements, which can vary from year to year. PACH volunteers can help you determine whether you are eligible.

Resource Referrals PACH connects residents with public and private resources that can provide additional assistance – including SNAP (Supplementary Nutritional Assistance Program – aka Food Stamps), WIC (Women, Infants, and Children), the Salvation Army, local churches, and town departments. Our volunteers can help navigate applications and other paperwork. PACH is currently a designated TBD site for the SNAP program. Our trained volunteers will help you initiate the application process with the designated state agency. Referrals are available on an as-needed basis – please contact the office for more information.

Fuel Assistance The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides income-based assistance for heating costs. Assistance is available for all fuel sources, including electric, oil, gas, and firewood.

Trained PACH volunteers help clients with the application and documentation process. Applications are then submitted to the designated agency for approval.

About PACH PACH, formed in 1974 as Pepperell Aid Church to Home and whose acronym now stands for Pepperell Aid Community to home was first housed in the Knights of Columbus and local churches. As the demand for the food pantry has grown, PACH has had to move from location to location, relying on other organizations, such as Friends of the Seniors, to provide space and support. In 2017, PACH purchased the building at 66 Hollis Street in Pepperell and began the lengthy process of complete renovations. The new space allows clients to "shop" for their groceries in a clean, bright building with ample storage and parking. PACH's new home officially opened in November of 2018 and is now available to Dunstable residents. It is an entirely volunteer-led 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization.

PACH serves over 300 individuals and families each month. Its clients include senior citizens, veterans, and children. High unemployment, the rising cost of food and fuel and reductions in state and federal aid have had a major impact on families.

PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC

MAY FLY DERMATITIS

May fly dermatitis is actually caused by gnats, those tiny black swarming bugs hat annoy us and our pets in early spring and summer; hence the common name "May fly".

These pests usually attack the ears, around the eyes, and the bellies of dogs and, sometimes, cats. Most commonly we see bright red circular lesions on the belly. They tart as red rings and then the redness fills in forming a circle. Usually the pets are not itchy and the lesion(s) will go away on their own with no treatment. Many owners think these red circles are either ringworm or a bulls-eye rash associated with Lyme disease. Ringworm in animals is rarely a ring -more often it occurs as patches of scaly hair loss, and animals do not develop the classic bulls-eye rash that does develop in humans bitten by Deer ticks carrying the Lyme organism. So, if you are seeing one or more bright red rings on your pet's belly and it's springtime, you're probably dealing with May fly bites.

They will go away on their own. There are other, sometimes more serious, conditions hat can cause red rings on the skin, or your pet may even be allergic to gnat bites. Therefore if you notice that the lesion(s) become itchy, larger, scaly, have a discharge, or don't go away, bring your pet to your veterinarian for an exam.

Two other locations commonly attacked by gnats are the ears and around the eyes. These areas will have tiny bumps, hair loss and sometimes swelling. Animals that develop these lesions will sometimes be itchy. Also, these areas can become infected and require treatment with oral antibiotics that your veterinarian will prescribe after an exam.

You can help your pet avoid these annoying pests by keeping them inside as much as possible. Alternatively, you can use most fly repellents that you use for yourself -just be careful to avoid their mouth and eyes when applying. We do have a gel at the Dunstable Animal Clinic made specifically for animals called Pet Guard Gel. It works fairly well and because it's made for animals it is tolerated very well by them. It repels gnats, mosquitoes and other flies, and even contains sunscreen.


