TOWN CLERK NEWS

Notice of Increase in Fees for Vital Records. Mandates from the Department of Health, Registry of Vital Records, have resulted in increased costs to issue birth, death and marriage certificates. These costs include the purchase of special security paper and the current fee of \$5.00 is no longer sustainable. In accordance with MGL Chapter 40, Section 22F, effective July 1, 2019 the cost will increase to \$10.00 per copy which is comparable to many other towns. Fees are deposited to the General Fund. The cost to file your notice of marriage intentions will remain at \$25.00 and include one certified copy. Additional copies will now increase to \$10.00 per copy. Reminder that all dogs, 6 months and older, are required to be licensed by state law. You can download an application from the town website or here at town hall. Please remember to enclose a SASE if you want it mailed back to you.

132 Voters Checked into Town Meeting. Voters approved an article to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of by sale, easement, license or otherwise, to the Evangelical Church of Dunstable approximately 8,274 square feet of land currently part of the Town Common (68 – 26). Voters approved various amendments to the Zoning Bylaws, all of which will be submitted to the AG for approval. These are included within Article 23. Voters also approved an Adult Entertainment Facilities Bylaw (Zoning), a Memorials and Monuments Bylaw (General) and amendments to the Dog Control Bylaw (General) to define kennels and fees for kennels, and amendments to the General Wetlands Bylaw (General). Voters rejected a Roadway Intersection Sight Triangle Bylaw and Town Seal Bylaw.

There were 240 ballots cast representing a 10% voter turnout at the Annual Town Election. Question #1 passed (Water Infrastructure Project) Yes: 162 No: 66 Blanks: 12. All candidates on the ballot were elected as nominated. Jon N. Crandall, Jr. and Spencer Vrahous were elected Constables as write in candidates. 



PEPPERELL FOOD PANTRY NOW OPEN TO DUNSTABLE RESIDENTS

PACH, Pepperell's food pantry, is now open to Dunstable residents in need. *The pantry, located at 66 Hollis Street in Pepperell, is open on Tuesdays from 5 to 7 p.m. and Thursdays from 2 to 4 p.m. and 5 to 7 p.m.*

PACH provides food and personal care items to residents of Pepperell and Dunstable in need of assistance. The pantry provides canned and boxed foods, frozen meats, and depending on availability, fresh fruits, vegetables, breads and dairy products. PACH clients may receive assistance from the pantry twice per month.

If you are interested in becoming a PACH client, please contact the office at 978-925-9770 or visit PACH's website, www.pachoutreach.org to learn how to receive assistance, and the required documentation for proof of residence in Pepperell or Dunstable.

Food Assistance Programs PACH also distributes food monthly on behalf of the USDA (U.S. Department of Agriculture) Food and Nutrition Programs, MEFAP (Massachusetts Emergency Food Assistance Program), and the Greater Boston Food Bank. Some of these programs have eligibility requirements, which can vary from year to year. PACH volunteers can help you determine whether you are eligible.

Resource Referrals PACH connects residents with public and private resources that can provide additional assistance – including SNAP (Supplementary Nutritional Assistance Program – aka Food Stamps), WIC (Women, Infants, and Children), the Salvation Army, local churches, and town departments. Our volunteers can help navigate applications and other paperwork. PACH is currently a designated TBD site for the SNAP program. Our trained volunteers will help you initiate the application process with the designated state agency. Referrals are available on an as-needed basis – please contact the office for more information.

Fuel Assistance The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) provides income-based assistance for heating costs. Assistance is available for all fuel sources, including electric, oil, gas, and firewood.

Trained PACH volunteers help clients with the application and documentation process. Applications are then submitted to the designated agency for approval.

About PACH PACH, formed in 1974 as Pepperell Aid Church to Home and whose acronym now stands for Pepperell Aid Community to home was first housed in the Knights of Columbus and local churches. As the demand for the food pantry has grown, PACH has had to move from location to location, relying on other organizations, such as Friends of the Seniors, to provide space and support. In 2017, PACH purchased the building at 66 Hollis Street in Pepperell and began the lengthy process of complete renovations. The new space allows clients to "shop" for their groceries in a clean, bright building with ample storage and parking. PACH's new home officially opened in November of 2018 and is now available to Dunstable residents. It is an entirely volunteer-led 501 (c) 3 non-profit organization. PACH serves over 300 individuals and families each month. Its clients include senior citizens, veterans, and children. High unemployment, the rising cost of food and fuel and reductions in state and federal aid have had a major impact on families.



HAVE THE HUMILITY TO REVEAL YOUR SINS

Ever since Adam and Eve hid in the bushes after eating the forbidden fruit, people have tried to conceal their sins. David impregnated the wife of a trusted soldier, then tried to cover it up by secretly murdering him so he could take her into his harem. Judas secretly went to the Jewish leadership to betray his Lord and acted the part of a faithful disciple until the moment he approached Jesus in the garden with the temple guards. In considering these Biblical examples, the harm of papering over sin is clearly seen. But sin concealment is not just an ancient problem - we personally face it as well.

The reality is that all of us are dealing with sinful struggles. The apostle John bluntly tells Christians that "if we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us" (1 John 1.8). It's one thing to agree with this Scripture in principle, but it's quite another to actually live like we believe it. When we take the time to actually look carefully at our own sinful attitudes and deeds, we probably don't feel like sharing those things with other people! It's much easier to keep our problems hidden, put on our clean Sunday clothes, smile artificially, and pretend like we have spotless lives.

James, the brother of Jesus, writes in James 5.16 - "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working." Have you obeyed this verse recently? Have you approached a strong Christian, opened up about a sin, and asked him to pray for you? There are many excuses we might offer, such as "I just don't have strong relationships I can trust." Although the verse certainly implies that we would approach a "righteous person" to intercede on our behalf, there is no human relationship so strong that it removes the painful sting of revealing sin. Regardless of how trustworthy another person is, confession is *inherently* uncomfortable. Consider Adam and Eve: they had every reason to trust their Creator, yet they did not immediately run to God and only divulged their sins when forced.

Rather than delaying confession until we can feel entirely comfortable with the situation (which will never happen), we need to embrace humility and get busy opening ourselves up. Just a chapter before James 5.16 is James 4.10 - "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you." Interestingly, when God rebuked Job's sinful three friends (Job 42.7-9), he didn't tell them to directly pray to him for forgiveness, he told them to go to Job and have him pray for their souls. How humbling it must have been for them to ask the man they had bitterly argued with to intercede on their behalf! But then, humility was the point. Are we more interested in preserving an illusion of spotlessness, or allowing the Lord to heal us through obedience to his words?



PERSONAL POSSESSIONS CAUSE THE MOST FIGHTS

You cannot always prevent your kids from fighting. But you can minimize the problems by leaving clear directions. Most fights are not about money, they are about personal possessions. Money is easily divisible and has no sentimental value, but jewelry, silverware, china and memorabilia cannot be divided. Someone wins, and someone loses when dividing up the stuff. The best way to reduce the chance of fighting is to make your wishes clearly known.

Lifetime gifts are a great idea. But make sure to do it in front of witnesses and consider including a letter that says you made the gift. Sometimes you can even give something away while still keeping it. You could tell everyone that you are giving a certain household item (like a painting or antique piece of furniture) to someone and provide that person with a written letter stating so, while also entering into an agreement with that person that you can hold that item for them in your own home until you die.

If you have really important or valuable items that you want to go to a specific person, consider putting them in your Will. It is a legal writing that is binding on everyone and hard to argue against. "If it's written in the Will it must really be what mom wanted." You might want to check with children and others to ensure they really want what you are giving to them.

You can also direct that certain items be sold, and the money divided among your children. Your children might be pleased at how much money certain items may get at auction. If a child really wants an item, they can buy it at the auction knowing they will get a part of the proceeds.

If you feel that none of your personal possessions have much value and it's not worth noting them in your Will, then you can make a separate list or writing that your family can follow. With a specific clause in your Will, this separate list can be legally binding. Or, you may leave a list as guidance and hope that your children follow it or diverge from it with mutual agreement.

You may want to get items appraised now or direct your executor to get an official appraisal after your passing. This can be important for tax purposes and can also give everyone a clear sense of value when dividing items. If everyone gets a similar value, it may be less disappointing to someone who gets fewer items.

You can also suggest that your children engage in a lottery of sorts when dividing personal property. Names can be placed in a hat with the slips pulled out in order of who gets to make the first choice of items. You may want to limit the items up for a lottery and also have the appraised values handy. This can be done in person (which is easiest) or remotely with pictures and lists. You can also reverse the order of choices so that the last person to choose is the first person to make a second choice.

You can also have an internal "auction." You can use tokens, points or even real dollars and have the family members bid on and buy items. With points or tokens, each person would have a limited amount with which to bid so they have to make a choice of how much they want something. With real money, it can be divided among the family after the auction.

Leave your family with clear directions, good suggestions, and the tools to reduce stress and disappointment and you will be doing them a bigger favor than just leaving them a bunch of stuff to divide.



ESSEX COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT PARTNERS WITH MIDDLESEX SHERIFF'S OFFICE TO COMPLETE INTERACTIVE TRAINING

MIDDLETON, Mass. – 87 members of the Essex County Sheriff's Department (ECSD) have completed an interactive firearms training organized in conjunction with the Middlesex Sheriff's Office (MSO), Sheriffs Kevin F. Coppinger and Peter J. Koutoujian announced today.

The training was held on the MSO's Mobile Training Center (MTC), a specialized trailer that allows officers to practice their responses to critical incidents. MSO officers who operate the MTC can offer unique scenarios for each user to test their firearm, communication and de-escalation skills.

"We are proud to share this resource with our law enforcement colleagues at ECSD. Our agencies regularly participate in trainings together, from our Crisis Intervention Training program to continuing education opportunities for staff, but this represents a new avenue for partnership," said Sheriff Koutoujian. "This training allows officers to work through real life scenarios and practice their responses to a serious incident, all while receiving constructive feedback from ECSD instructors and MSO officers."

The MTC was stationed at the Middleton House of Correction from April 22 – May 3. ECSD staff practiced scenarios specifically tailored for the environments that deputies operate in, such as construction details which may involve a traffic encounter and inmate transportation.

"Providing the most advanced training to our correctional officers is a priority of our department. We continually strive to provide high quality, situational training to our officers. Sharing this interactive training platform is an example of how Sheriffs' Departments in the Commonwealth collaborate for the benefit of public safety," said Sheriff Kevin Coppinger.

In 2018, 19 police departments were trained through the MTC. So far this year, nine agencies – including the Essex County Sheriff's Department – have utilized the MTC for at least one week of training.

TIPS FROM THE RED CROSS

The American Red Cross wants everyone to enjoy the season and offers safety tips you can follow all summer long.

WATER SAFETY

Before going in, on or around the water, every family member should become "water smart." This starts with learning to be safe, making good choices, and learning to swim to at least achieve the skills of water competency. Everyone should be able to enter the water, get a breath, stay afloat, change position, swim a distance and then get out of the water safely. A variety of water safety courses and resources are available at redcross.org/watersafety.

- Prevent unsupervised access to water. Fence pools and spas with adequate barriers, keep a constant eye for any water dangers such as portable splash pools/slides, buckets, and bathtubs.
- Adults- actively supervise children and stay within arm's reach of young children and new swimmers. Kids-follow the rules.
- Always wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a boat and if in a situation beyond someone's skill level.
- Swim as a pair near a lifeguard's chair everyone, including experienced swimmers, should swim with a buddy in areas protected by lifeguards.
- Designate a 'Water Watcher' to keep a close eye and constant attention on children and weaker swimmers in and around the water until the next Water Watcher takes over.
- Download the Red Cross Swim App for kid-friendly games and activities and water safety information for parents and caregivers of young people learning how to swim. Download the app for free by searching for 'American Red Cross' in your app store or at redcross.org/apps.
