Mosquito season is still in effect. Eastern Equine Encephalitis virus activity has been detected in Barnstable, Bristol, Essex, Franklin, Hampden, Hampshire, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties. Four human cases of EEE have been confirmed so far this year. Residents are urged to take personal protective activities like using EPA approved repellents and avoiding mosquitoes at peak times. 



NEW! TYNGSBOROUGH SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE NEW!

The Board of Selectmen formally established a Sustainability Committee on June 10, 2019. The Sustainability Committee is tasked with (a) supporting efforts to reduce contamination in the current recycling program and reduce future costs through the consideration of new programs and public outreach, (b) working with town departments to support recycling initiatives at public events and buildings, (c) assisting the Conservation Commission with public engagement and awareness regarding storm water management, and (d) serving as a resource for both town residents and businesses in the areas of improving and implementing waste reduction and energy saving initiatives. The Sustainability Committee meets on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6:30 PM in Meeting Room 1 at Town Hall. Please come and share your ideas for how we can help Tyngsborough become greener and cleaner.

BEYOND RECYCLING: Did you know that Tyngsborough now must pay for every pound of recycling brought to the curb? This is due to increased contamination of recyclable materials in our co-mingled recycling bins, which has diminished markets and the value of recyclable materials. Reducing contamination in your recycling will help strengthen markets for recyclables in the long run, but the new, immediate challenge is to reduce your trash AND your recycling tonnage.

Reduce Contamination in your recycling:

No Plastic Bags in your recycling! This includes ALL plastic bags, small to large. Plastic bags are the biggest problem because they jam the sorting machines. *Please put all recyclables into your toter loose, without putting them into a plastic bag first.* You can bring your plastic shopping bags back to most department and grocery stores, where they have recycling containers. Better yet, avoid having so many plastic bags by bringing reusable bags to the store.

Are you sure that item can be recycled? The shifting recycling market has changed the recycling landscape. Putting items that recycling processors can't handle increases contamination. If you're not sure whether something belongs in your bin, visit RecycleSmartMA.org.

Reduce your trash AND your recycling tonnage:
Simple Recycling (the pink bags): Put clothing, shoes, jackets, jewelry, purses, hats, toys, blankets, drapes, curtains, pillows, sleeping bags, tools, silverware, dishes, pots, pans, and backpacks into the pink bags and leave them out a few feet away from your recycling toter. Your unwanted items will either be reused or recycled and you will save the town money. Visit SimpleRecycling.com or call 866-835-5068 to get your free bags or if your bags are missed when you do put them out.



SIN NOT LEADING TO DEATH

By Nathan Combs

John's first letter contains a fascinating section on praying for others in 5.16-17. "If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask, and God will give him life - to those who commit sins that do not lead to death. There is sin that leads to death; I do not say that one should pray for that. All wrongdoing is sin, but there is sin that does not lead to death."

What is the difference between sins that "lead to death" and those that don't? John does not have a list of really bad transgressions in mind, like the man-made distinction of "seven deadly sins." John clearly states that "all wrongdoing is sin" in vs. 17. Also, no one is unforgivable because they've committed a certain kind of evil. For example, Jesus told the condemned criminal on the cross that he would be with him in paradise that day (Luke 23.43). Indeed, the gospel was first preached in Acts to the original murderers of Jesus himself - "You crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men" (Acts 2.23, 36).

Sins that "lead to death" are sins that are not cleansed by Jesus. If a Christian intentionally "keeps on sinning" (1.18) and knowingly "walks in darkness" (1.6), their sins remain. Therefore, it is pointless for Christians to ask Jesus to forgive other brothers who are not interested in forgiveness. This is similar to God's blunt instruction to Jeremiah the prophet to not pray for the Israelite people to which he prophesied because of their stubborn pursuit of idolatrous sin (Jeremiah 7.16, 11.14, 14.11).

On the contrary, sins that "do not lead to death," are sins in the life of one who is committed to "walking in the light" with Jesus (1.5-10). For one who is openly confessing sin, acknowledging to God and others that they are in need of Jesus' blood, forgiveness is continually given to that brother. John's words fall right into line with James 5.16: "Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another that you may be healed." It is entirely appropriate to offer intercessory prayers on the behalf of sincere Christians. In doing so, we imitate the actions of our Lord. For example, he prayed on behalf of Peter when he knew Satan would attack him the night Jesus was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22.32). Jesus calls for this kind of love in the lives of his disciples. Instead of passively watching the weaknesses of others in pride and cynicism, the Lord desires us to watch our brothers for the purpose of actively helping them take their transgressions to him.

TRUSTEE'S DUTIES

When you create a Trust for Estate Planning purposes, you appoint a Trustee to conduct the business of the Trust. You may be the Trustee during your life, but you must appoint a successor for when you no longer can do that job. When choosing a Trustee, choose someone who can properly handle the task. Here are some of the things that a Trustee must do.

The Trustee should thoroughly and carefully read the Trust document itself. The Trust document contains the rules. The Trustee should consult with a lawyer if help is needed to understand the terms of the Trust.

The Trustee has a "fiduciary" duty to the beneficiaries of the Trust. That means the Trustee must act in the beneficiaries' best interests at all times. This is a high standard that must be faithfully followed. A Trustee can get in trouble if this rule is disregarded.

The Trustee should set up a bank account for the Trust and handle all trust business through that account. The Trust may have other assets such as Real Estate or stock investments which should also be in separate accounts in the name of the Trust. The Trustee must not mingle any other assets with Trust assets. A Trust is a separate "business" that must be kept apart from personal business of the Trustee and others.

The Trustee also has a duty to keep the beneficiaries informed of the status of the Trust and its assets. Usually a Trustee provides an annual "accounting" to the beneficiaries that details the financial affairs of the Trust. This is like an annual report issued by a corporation, but not quite as detailed.

If the Trust is for the benefit of a person who is receiving government benefits, the Trustee must understand the rules of that program and avoid taking any actions that will jeopardize the benefits of the trust beneficiary.

Some Trusts are not considered a separate taxpayer and don't have to file any returns. This usually takes place during the life of the person who created the Trust. Many Trusts are separate taxpayers and should have an ID number issued by the IRS (called an EIN) and file annual tax returns just like any other taxpayer. The Trustee must make sure that all tax returns are properly filed and any taxes due are paid. Reporting requirements must be met. The Trustee may have to send tax forms to the beneficiaries in a timely fashion so they can report income on their own returns.

If you follow the terms of the Trust and comply with tax laws, you should not get in trouble when fulfilling your duties as a Trustee. But, if you don't do what you are supposed to do, any of the beneficiaries can sue you for your failures and you might have to pay them damages. Act carefully and it is easy to be a Trustee. But if you act recklessly, it can cost you. Consult an Attorney if you need help with your duties as a Trustee.

TOWN OF TYNGSBOROUGH ELDERLY AND DISABLED TAXATION AID FUND

- What is it and how can you contribute? -

by the Citizens Taxation Aid Committee

If you have ever looked at the bottom-third section of your quarterly real estate bill, you would have seen a chance to donate to the Elderly and Disabled Taxation Aid Fund. This fund was established at a Special Town Meeting back in October 2003 when the voters of Tyngsborough adopted Massachusetts General Law Ch. 60, Sec. 3D which authorizes voluntary contributions to defray a portion of the real estate taxes of the town's elderly and/or disabled persons of low income. No tax dollars support this fund. All monies are obtained through the generosity of caring and concerned town residents.

The Aid Fund is controlled by a five-member committee consisting of the Chair of the Board of Assessors, the Town Treasurer, and three citizens at large appointed by the Board of Selectmen. The committee meets twice a year to consider confidential applications submitted by residents of Tyngsborough who are elderly or disabled. Elderly applicants must be at least 60 years old. Disabled applicants are those who have suffered an income loss due to illness or accident. All applicants must be the titled property owner and must file a form along with their birth certificate, a copy of their last income tax return, and a physician's letter if appropriate. The applicant's gross income must be less than \$40,000. The committee considers all applications that meet these criteria and selects those with the greatest financial need. Those taxpayers receive a partial tax credit on their real estate bill and money from the Taxation Aid Fund is used to offset the difference to the Town.

The ability of the committee to approve applications for aid is subject to the availability of funds. Unfortunately, contributions to this fund have dropped off in the last 7 years to only about one-third of previous levels, drastically limiting the number of families receiving help.

How can you contribute? In previous years voluntary donations could only easily be made by townspeople who paid their real estate tax bill by check. This past January the Town Treasurer added the voluntary donation message to the excise bills as well. More recently, tax payers who prefer online payments were allowed to contribute when paying their bills through the town's web site. Now, when you click on "Pay your Town Fees Online" a new contribution option appears; donations of any amount are allowed. A receipt for you contribution will be emailed to you.

Please consider supporting this worthwhile fund. It is a great way to help those in need at the local level. Know that every cent of your generous donation goes directly to help elderly and disabled Tyngsborough residents.



CAT Vs KITTEN

So you have decided on getting a new feline friend, but can't decide cat vs kitten. First of all congratulations, felines make great pets. Second of all make sure everyone in the family is ready emotionally and financially for a potentially long commitment. It is not unusual for a cat to live into its late teens or even early twenties now a days. Now, let's decide cat vs kitten. Both have positives and negatives so think carefully and be honest about which would fit into your lifestyle better.

KITTENS: PROS

- They are cute.
- Can be easier to train to use a scratching post or have their nails trimmed or even have their teeth brushed.
- They are super entertaining. You really don't need a television for a few months after getting a kitten, or even better get two.
- Generally an adult cat is more likely to accept a kitten rather than another adult cat.

CONS

- They can be quite destructive, they love to climb and therefore scratch curtains and furniture, not to mention your pant leg.
- They need to play and if they are left alone all day they tend to sleep all day and are up all night.
- Their inquisitive nature can lead to trouble, like eating things they shouldn't or getting stuck in the couch.
- It's hard to predict their adult personality, so if you need a super friendly or super lazy or super tolerant cat you won't really know if that's what you've got until they grow up.


