## HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS FROM THE TYNGSBOROUGH POLICE DEPARTMENT

<u>ADULTS</u>: Welcome trick-or-treaters with your porch lights and any exterior lights on. Patrol your street occasionally to discourage speeding motorists, acts of malicious mischief and crimes against children. Report any suspicious or criminal activity to your police department immediately. For Tyngsborough call 911 from a land line or 978-649-7504 from your cell.

**Do not give homemade or unwrapped treats to children. MOTORISTS:** Exercise extreme caution when driving a vehicle. Be on the alert for excited youngsters, whose vision may be obscured by masks, darting out into traffic.

#### TRICK OR TREAT TIPS

Make sure your kids dress up safely • Make sure costumes are flame retardant so children aren't in danger near burning jack-o-lanterns. • Keep costumes short to prevent trips, falls, and other bumps in the night. • Try make-up instead of a mask. Masks can be hot and uncomfortable, and they can obstruct a child's vision, a dangerous thing when kids are crossing streets and going up and down steps.
• Make sure kids wear light colors or put reflective tape on their

Make trick-or-treating trouble free • Create a map of a safe trickor treating route and set a time limit for your children to "trick-ortreat". • Trick-or-treaters should always be in groups so they aren't a tempting target for real-life goblins. Parents should accompany young children. • Make sure older kids trick-or-treat with friends. Together, map out a safe route so you will know where they are going. Tell them to stop only at familiar homes where the outside lights are on. •Try to get your kids to trick-or-treat while it's still light out. If it's dark, make sure someone has a flashlight and pick welllighted streets. • Do not go inside anyone's home. Remain on the porch at all times. •Do not accept rides from strangers. • Remind kids to keep a safe distance from moving cars. • Cross only at street corners, never between parked cars, and never diagonally across an intersection. • Look in all directions before crossing the street, and obey all traffic signals. Walk, never run, across the street, and use sidewalks, not the street, for walking. • Do not take shortcuts through back vards, allevs or parks. • Do not eat any treats until parents have inspected them. • Discard any homemade or unwrapped

Check all treats before eating • What to eat? Only unopened candies and other treats that are in original wrappers. • Don't forget to inspect fruit and homemade goodies for anything suspicious. •By all means remind kids not to eat everything at once or they'll be feeling pretty ghoulish for while!

Halloween can be a lot of fun for parents and kids alike--if everybody remembers the tricks and treats of playing it safe.

Mosquitos are still active. Eastern Equine Encephalitis virus activity has been detected in Barnstable, Bristol, Essex, Franklin, Hampden, Hampshire, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties. 10 human cases of EEE have been confirmed so far this year. Residents are urged to take personal protective activities like using EPA approved repellents and avoiding mosquitoes at peak times. Mosquitoes will probably be around until the first hard frost. 

#### AGING IN PLACE

Aging in place is the "gold standard" for seniors, at least according to many working in the senior care fields. But, is it really a viable alternative to retirement homes, assisted living, nursing homes and other care options? It is appealing to consider staying in the home you have known and loved for all of your life, but most homes and communities are not designed to provide for the needs of people as they age. There are some options and ideas that are working, so you might want to consider these concepts as you get older.

You might want to lobby your town to reduce or eliminate some of the costs for projects to adapt homes. In Sausalito, California an advocacy group worked with municipal officials to start a program where building permits are free or reduced-cost when the project is under \$10,000 in total and its goal is to provide accessibility for elders or the disabled. This can save many people hundreds of dollars on the cost of making a home elder-friendly.

In Porto, a town in Portugal, they have a program where they match up older residents with students who need a place to live. The older people get companionship and some assistance, and the younger people get free housing in exchange for their help to the senior. This system works to reduce social isolation and loneliness among elders, which can be tied to poor health and decline. This program could work anywhere so consider trying to start one in your community.

There are several programs around the US and the world where not-for-profit agencies coordinate repairs and upgrades to seniors' homes. Sometimes for reduced cost and sometimes for free. You should look around to see if there are any near you, or advocate for them in your area if none are available. Sometimes the difference between staying home and having to go to a nursing home is some simple home repairs or alternations.

Another program idea that can really help people stay at home is having assistance with some of the normal household chores such as cleaning, repairs and safety enhancements. In northern New Jersey a program (cleverly called "CHORE") helps older residents continue living in their homes by providing volunteers to make minor home repairs. In addition to actually making repairs, the volunteers often just chat with the elder and provide a level of companionship and look out for other problems (physical, social, or medical) that might otherwise be overlooked.

In most towns around here, your local Senior Center (sometimes called a Council on Aging) is the first place to look for any programs that might help you. Also, our Area Agency on Aging (Elder Services of Merrimack Valley) is a larger agency that has many programs designed to help seniors stay at home. If you are planning to stay at home as you age, you need to do a lot of research and planning to make sure you remain healthy and happy at home as you Age in Place.

#### **INVASIVE PLANTS ARE A SERIOUS ISSUE!**

by Sustainability Tyngsborough member Amy Pozerski Invasive plants are not typically on most people's radar. However, as climate change continues to progress, now is when we need to start taking this topic seriously. Invasive plants are always nonnative to our area and most times very aggressive. These plants are prolific in large part because their natural predators don't live here. If nothing is feeding on these plants, their population can explode quickly and crowd out native plants that are so important to our local wildlife, mammals, and insects.

<u>Black Swallow Wort (Cynanchum Louiseae)</u>: A perennial climbing vine that flowers in early summer and produces seed pods late July and early August. The seeds are spread by the wind. Monarch butterflies mistake the plant for milkweed and lay eggs on it, but the larvae cannot feed off this plant and end up dying.

Japanese Knotweed (Reynoutria Japonica): A perennial that can grow from three to fifteen feet tall, it has bamboo-like stems and can tolerate many different soils and levels of shade. The seeds spread by wind, water, animals, and humans. Japanese Knotweed also spreads by underground roots and can even sprout from a piece of stem the size of a fingernail. Once it gets a foothold somewhere, it spreads like wildfire and can be nearly impossible to eliminate. It creates a mono-culture that makes an area uninhabitable to our native wildlife.

Purple Loosestrife (Lythrum Salicaria): Mainly found in damp areas and wetlands, it has showy purple flowers arranged on flower spikes. The plant spreads primarily by seeds. Each mature purple loosestrife plant can produce up to 2.7 million seeds annually! This plant creates dense thickets in wetlands, crowding out habitat for wetland wildlife and altering the movement of water within the wetlands.

Oriental Bittersweet (Celastrus Orbiculatus): A woody vine that grows rapidly and clings to anything up or down that it comes in contact with. It can easily climb trees up to 100 ft tall! It is spread by seed and fruits, eaten by birds and deposited. It also spreads by un derground roots. The vines grow in diameter as they twine around tree trunks and literally chokes the plant that it is clinging to. Due

to the weakened plant and the weight of the bittersweet vine, tree canopies can come crashing down when you least expect it.

#### GOD GIVES US MORE THAN WE CAN HANDLE

I have often heard it said by other Christians (and have often repeated it myself) that "God never gives us more than we can handle." In other words, we will not face overwhelming physical and emotional experiences that are beyond our amount of strength. God always ensures that our pain, sorrow, and stress is kept at a manageable level. Although our lives might prove challenging, everything happens within our scope of control.

This perspective sounds reassuring at first glance. However, since the Bible doesn't teach it, God must have a healthier perspective that's better for us and more glorifying for him. Yes, God does promise a way of escape from every temptation to sin (1 Corinthians 10.13), but he absolutely allows us to face situations that far exceed our limited capacities to understand or cope with them. Let's first prove this from Scripture before we discuss why he does so.

As he begins the letter of 2 Corinthians, the apostle Paul wrote that he and his companions were given more than they could handle. "For we do not want you to be unaware, brothers, of the affliction we experienced in Asia. For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength that we despaired of life itself. Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death." (2 Corinthians 1.8-9). Paul is probably referring to his ordeal in Ephesus, when the entire city was stirred up against him, causing his quick departure after living there for three and a half years (Acts 19.23-41). Although Paul was moved by God's Spirit to speak the message of Jesus, possessed the ability to perform mighty miracles, and stood as an eyewitness to the resurrected Lord, Paul was flesh and blood like you and me. The fog of discouragement he felt was so powerful that he could not see through it.

Why did God allow Paul to go through this situation? Fortunately, Paul directly answers this question in the last half of 2 Corinthians 1.9 - "But that was to make us rely not on ourselves but on God who raises the dead." Remember, Paul had just said that he felt he had "received the sentence of death." Even Paul, with all his spiritual maturity, needed a reminder of God's ability to do what is impossible for man to accomplish. There are few events that so clearly show the exclusive hands of God more than the resurrection accounts in Scripture. Dead people come back to life only through the power of God (1 Kings 17.17-24, 2 Kings 4.32-37, Luke 7.11-17, Mark 5.34-43, John 11.39-44, etc.).

Situations like Paul's have the potential to teach us valuable lessons we could not receive any other way. It is liberating to know that I don't have to be strong enough to withstand the forces of life because I serve a God who is. Thank God that he does give us more than we can handle, because in those those occasions he wants to give us himself.
