DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

The 2020 annual street listing is being prepared, usually I try to mail it right after New Year's. If you are new to Massachusetts, this is a legal document of the Commonwealth, you are required to sign and return it annually to remain on the active voter list. If you do not return it, you can still vote if you are qualified but will have to stand in a separate line, fill out an affidavit of current and continuous residency and provide an ID with the address for which you list as your residence. If you cannot provide an ID, you can cast a provisional ballot which means further research will be done to determine whether your ballot will count.

<u>Presidential Primary – Tuesday, March 3, 2020</u>. The Governor is expected to sign the supplemental budget which includes five (5) days of early voting prior, beginning February 24 but more on this later. The deadline to register to vote OR change your party affiliation is Wednesday, February 12, though you can register anytime before then. If you have a valid MA driver's license, you can register online at www.sec.state.ma/ovr

<u>I am now accepting absentee ballot applications for 2020</u>. You can download an application from the town clerk's website or obtain one at town hall. The House and Senate have different versions of the date for the September primary and whether it will include Early Voting so until it's resolved, I will hold off publishing information. The Annual Town Election is Tuesday, May 19; the September primary TBD and the November State Election is Tuesday, November 3. If you will be out of the country or active military, you can file an absentee application on www.fvap.gov

The report of the October 15, 2019 Special Town Meeting is online. 73 voters checked in. Articles included (in part, the full report is online or available for inspection at the Clerk's office) amendments to the general bylaws (Junk and Unregistered Vehicles), adopting the Stretch Energy Building Code (A requirement of becoming a green community), appropriations from the CPC Housing Reserve to assist the Affordable Housing Trust Fund. Also amendments to the zoning bylaws (Solar B-3 Expanded Commercial District), Solar Energy Overlay Zoning District Bylaw, rezone a parcel on Pleasant Street as B-2 and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to petition the General Court for special legislation that would allow for the issuance of alcoholic beverage licenses for on-premises consumption (pouring) and off-premises consumption (retail).

The amendment to the Town of Dunstable General Bylaw adopted under Article 25 of the warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of May 13, 2019 (Memorials and Monuments Bylaw), was approved by the Attorney General on October 3, 2019 and is hereby published by posting in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 32 as amended. A copy of these amendments and bylaws may be examined or obtained at the Offices of the Town Clerk during regular business hours at the Dunstable Town Hall. Carol A. 



WHAT IS THE GOSPEL?

There are many words in our Bibles that aren't like the words we use every day, words that seem like part of a special spiritual vocabulary. Gospel is one of those words. It's a word that describes the message that Jesus taught and the early Christians believed. It's a word that's used as the title of the first four books of the New Testament (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John). It has a simple meaning in the original language, "good news," but that leads us to another question: what is this news and why is it good?

This gospel is a message about many things, but this is the core truth: Jesus of Nazareth is the king over all. Consider what Jesus himself said as He began to travel around Israel preaching and collecting disciples: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matthew 4.17). Throughout the rest of Jesus' story, we see a very different king than the average human ruler. Jesus spent His time healing people's bodies of all their diseases and casting out their demons. Most importantly, He healed people's souls by teaching them the way of heaven and forgiving their sins. On His road to becoming king, Jesus rolled back the power of Satan and the destruction, death, and sin he brought into God's good world. In short, Jesus brought heaven to earth.

This came to a climax when Jesus freely laid down His life. Usually, when someone becomes a king, that person is put on a throne and crowned in front of adoring crowds. When Jesus became king, He was enthroned, but it was on a Roman cross. A crown was put on His head, but it was a crown of thorns. Instead of cheering supporters, He faced a mob of mockers and died beneath a sign that read: "This is Jesus, the king of the Jews." Even though this looked like Jesus' moment of defeat, His death and resurrection three days later made Him the glorious king He now is! Now, "all authority in heaven and on earth" belongs to Jesus (Matthew 28.15) and His people have gone everywhere preaching this message for two

Why is it good news for us that Jesus is king? Because you and I face chaos that we can't rule over. We were born into a sinful, broken world and we've all contributed to its brokenness. We've hurt other people and we've been hurt ourselves. We live in bodies that eventually fall apart. We experience pain in many forms and we've all come under the power of Satan. But if we submit to Jesus as our king, He will free us and count us as righteous. He will give us a new life purpose: spreading the way of heaven to earth. One day, He will raise our bodies from the grave and give us new ones, so we can live and work with Him in a renewed world. The king has come! Will we repent and join the kingdom of heaven?



PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC

GOOD BYE GWEN

Tara M. Sacramone, DVM



"I wrote this article 12 years ago and one of my clients recently discovered it on our web page. She is struggling with the hard decisions we all have to go through toward the end of our pet's lives and was kind enough to let me know this article was helpful for her. It still makes me cry, but it is as true today as it was 12 years ago. And I still miss Gwen."

I remember going to get Gwen from a farm in St. Michael, Minnesota on a September day in 1992. She was the last of the litter and cute as a button. I remember when she was too small to jump on or off of the couch; she didn't do stairs till she was 5 months old. I remember when she ate \$17 cash off the coffee table. I remember the first time we tried to leave her out of her crate. She was 6 months old and we were only gone for an hour. You would have thought a tornado hit the kitchen, and she ate the lapel off the suit Jay had just bought 2 weeks before. I remember the countless hours of throwing the tennis ball. I remember the time she touched an electric fence at a friend's farm.

Sadly, last month my husband and I decided to put Gwen to sleep. She was 14 years old, she had a great life, and it was time. We knew it was coming for a while. She had a bad back and she had some trouble getting around. She was also getting a little forgetful. We agonized over the decision. Everyone, myself included, always hopes their animals will die peacefully in their sleep after a long happy life. Unfortunately that does not often happen, and it didn't for us. We were thankful, however, that we did not have to watch her suffer.

Being a veterinarian is a great career, but because dog and cat life spans are relatively short, death is, unfortunately, something I deal with on a regular basis. My personal experience has given me an even more empathetic view to the tough decisions my clients face every day. There are many things that come into play when making this decision. From the quality of life of the pet, to the people at home, to the diagnosis and prognosis of the illness, to financial considerations.

Quality of life can be difficult to assess. Some clinical signs that your pet is nearing the end are not eating, not drinking, not greeting you when you come home, not sleeping, shining, panting, having trouble getting into a comfortable position, not moving much, or anything that stops your pet from doing the things he/she loves. One of the things I tell many clients is if you wake up every day hoping your pet has died in the night, it may be time to let them go. If your pet has had a slow, gradual decline it becomes difficult to actually set a time (i.e. what makes today different then yesterday?) Sometimes it's helpful to think back to a time when your pet was at his/her happiest; what things did they love to do? Can they still do those things, or do they even want to? Are they happier for more hours than sad in their daily life?

The other side of the coin is that you cannot go back to change your mind. The decision is final, therefore it is important that every in the house is in agreement.
