<u>Mosquitos are still active.</u> Eastern Equine Encephalitis virus activity has been detected in Barnstable, Bristol, Essex, Franklin, Hampden, Hampshire, Middlesex, Norfolk, Plymouth and Worcester counties. 10 human cases of EEE have been confirmed so far this year. THERE'S A LOT TO LOVE ABOUT FALL LEAVES

The first hint of crisp air and blustery winds means its sweater and boot weather, but it also means the yearly leaf cleanup is on its way. This year, put your fall leaves to work instead of tossing them in the woods or bagging them and sending them off in the yard waste truck.

If you don't have a mulcher mower, you can run over fallen leaves a few times with your regular lawn mower or use a shredder to break them down into smaller pieces. Now you have four options for these shredded leaves:

Leave them on your lawn and spread lime over them. The lime will offset the acidity of the shredded leaves (and pine needles). This will enrich your lawn.

Use them as an insulating mulch layer for acid-loving plants like blueberries and evergreens.

Naturally enrich veggie beds by mixing shredded leaves, along with some garden lime, directly into the topsoil. This will increase the organic material and water holding capacity of your garden.

Add the leaves to your compost pile with grass clippings and other "green" materials to generate your own nutrient rich soil additive.

Leave the leaves that fall in your flower and veggie garden beds and delay your clean up until Spring. The leaves help preserve valuable habitat for overwintering butterflies, moths and native bees and provide an insulating layer for tender plants and shrubs.

Remember, you should never dump grass clippings, leaves or other yard debris within 30 feet of a wetland resource area, including stream banks or drainage culverts. These materials will eventually break down into soil, which will then fill in the wetlands. Filling wetlands negatively impacts storm water holding capacity and also contributes to nutrient runoff into our waterways and algae bloom downstream in our ponds. This is why dumping such organic matter within 30 feet of wetlands is illegal under state and local wetland protection laws.

Sustainable Tyngsborough is a subcommittee of the Board of Selectmen. We meet the third Tuesday of every month, beginning at 6:30pm, in Meeting Room #1. You are always welcome to join us and share your sustainability ideas and concerns.

ARE WE BORN IN SIN?

As a result of the sin of our first ancestors, Adam and Eve, have we all inherited their guilt? Do we enter life with an unrighteous spiritual status? Although it is impossible to fully address this ancient debate in the space of one short article, we can briefly explore one of the passages many consider central to this question: Romans 5.12-21. In this chapter, the apostle Paul is making the case that Christians can have confidence in their spiritual reunion with God based upon what Jesus did in his death and return from the grave. We were saved by him, and we now rejoice *through* him.

That's the context in which Paul begins to write his controversial words, starting in vs. 12: "Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men because all sinned..." It is beyond dispute from this verse that the curse of spiritual destruction grew from the garden of Eden and encompassed the world. But how exactly did it spread? Was it because it became an inherited human trait? Notice the last phrase of the verse carefully: "because all sinned." This echoes what Paul had already written in 3.9-23 and charges that every human has actively participated in the sinful brokenness of the world, whether they descend from Abraham or not. Adam certainly was the first to expose the world to evil and its consequences, but that evil was fed and perpetuated by every one of his descendants. This happened through conscious choice, not through the mere act of birth.

Consider what Paul writes in Romans 5.18-19: "Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for *all men*, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for *all men*. For as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous." If Paul is arguing that everyone automatically enters life as a sinner because of Adam's actions, then he's also saying in the same verse that all people will automatically be saved because of Jesus' work. Yet, Romans is very clear at the beginning of chapter 5 that we are "justified by faith." Therefore, Paul must mean that just as one man (Adam) opened the door to death for all people, the God man (Jesus) opened the door to life.

Not only that, but the grace that is now coming into the world is much stronger than the death that entered. Paul says as much in Romans 5.17 - "For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ." We are not born sinful, but we will all sin. However, the power of Jesus to rescue us is, as always, more powerful than the efforts of Satan.

HIPAA PRIVACY RULES

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") required new privacy standards to protect health care consumers. It took until 2003 to have those standards finalized and implemented. At first the rules caused confusion and fear as the law had severe penalties (fines and jail) for violations of patients' privacy. Providers changed their systems and became very rigid in what information they would release.

In the last sixteen years however, providers have become used to the system. No one has been punished for innocent infractions and no health workers have gone to jail. Some egregious and criminal violations have been sanctioned but the original fears of most providers did not come true.

Still, the standards are in place to protect everyone's privacy, and providers do follow them. You will not be able to get any "Protected Health Information" from a "Covered Entity" without a release by the individual patient. In most cases if the patient is present, they can give verbal approval for a provider to speak to or in front of another person. But, without a written privacy release, the provider will not speak to a third-party about a patient who isn't there to assent. Hospitals are comfortable telling you if someone is there or not, but they won't tell you the person's condition.

This means that if you want someone else to know about your situation, then you should sign a HIPAA Privacy Release so that third person can present that document to any provider from whom they need information. I am now having all of my clients execute a Privacy Release along with their other Life & Estate Planning documents. You may need HIPAA releases for your college-age children too.

One reason a third-party might need information is to pay a bill. If you have signed a Power of Attorney naming some trusted person to help you with paying bills, then that person has the power to handle your money and pay the bill. But, if it is a medical bill, and they have a question about it, the provider will not talk to them without the Medical Privacy Release. A medical bill contains Protected Health Information and the billing office of a provider will not talk to your Agent under your Power of Attorney without a signed HIPAA release.

Protected Health Information means information about an individual's physical or mental health condition; the provision of health care to the individual; and, payment for that health care. "Covered Entities" include most health care providers, health insurers, and affiliated organizations (Doctors, Hospitals and Labs).

Estate Planning and Elder Law attorneys have modified their planning documents to include language designed to help families properly use and share protected information. Older documents may not have the right language, so you should review your documents, and if necessary, see your attorney to have them updated.



DOG PARKS Tara M. Sacramone, DVM

Recently it seems more and more people have been bringing their dogs to dog parks. Each dog park is different. Some are very official, well maintained, requiring membership, proof of vaccination and even a DNA test on the dogs stool, insuring all feces will get picked up. Some are just places people with dogs tend to gather together to let their dogs play, some even without fencing. Much like everything in life there are good and bad things about dog parks.

First the good – let's face it, it's just plain fun to watch a dog run full throttle, especially if you don't have a fence at home. All that running is good exercise for weight control, many of the dogs I see are overweight. Also it is good socialization, dogs are a pack animal and most of them like to socialize with other dogs.

As a veterinarian I will admit that there are many things about dog parks that frighten me. Firstly contagious diseases, from viruses and bacteria to ringworm (skin fungal infection) to external parasites like fleas and mites and internal parasites like roundworm, whipworm, giardia, etc. Some of these diseases are also contagious to humans. I also worry about bad behavior both from other dogs and even my own dogs. Not all dogs like each other all of the time and not all dogs like all people all of the time either. Dog bites can be very serious, even life threatening. Not to mention how unpleasant it is to witness a dog fight. Even nice happy dogs can knock over an innocent bystander. Bad behavior can also come from the other dog owners. Some things are just annoying, like not picking up after their dog, and some things are more serious, like not taking responsibility if their dog becomes aggressive and injures either a person or another dog.

So if you are considering bringing your dog to a dog park, proceed with caution. If you have a smaller or an easily frightened dog proceed with extreme caution. Go to the park first, see how it seems to you. Maybe one with more rules is more your style or maybe a more casual approach will work for you. I will admit you won't see me at any dog parks. As well as all of the above concerns I have the added worry that one of the dogs will figure out I'm a veterinarian and convince all of the other dogs to gang up on me.




