### **DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK**

A state law effective January 1, 2020 created a new program for automatically registering eligible voters, known as Automatic Voter Registration (AVR) and its purpose is to register voters automatically when applying for services at the RMV, MassHealth and Health Connector agencies. The agencies are required to collect and transmit the appropriate voter information to the Secretary of the Commonwealth. Under the former way when you registered to vote or change your party at the RMV, an applicant would have to check "yes" to the voter registration question and then could pick a party of political designation. AVR changes this. Instead of being asked if you want to register and having to select "yes", applicants will only see a box that allows you to opt-out of registering. Under AVR, at both the RMV and health agencies, if you do not opt-out, your transaction will be forwarded to the town/ city clerk for processing. Under the way the AVR law was written. applicants are NOT offered the opportunity to pick a political party or designation. If you are registered in a political party, you will remain in that party because AVR does NOT recognize party affiliations. You will have to change your party online (you must hold a valid Massachusetts driver's license) at www.sec.state.ma.us/ovr/ or fill out a Change of Enrollment card available at town hall. Additionally, the AVR law as enacted, requires the notices you receive to be bilingual in English and Spanish. Bottom line - you can no longer change your party at the RMV.

February 12 is the deadline to register to vote or change your party. I cannot urge you enough to check your voter status and party BEFORE coming to the polls. You cannot register to vote or change your party on the annual street listing. You should update the information if necessary, sign and return the form to Town Hall.

The presidential primary is Tuesday, March 3. Polls are open 7:00 am - 8:00 pm at the Dunstable Free Public Library.

There will be Early Voting at the Town Hall on February 24, 25, 26 and 27. Hours will be Monday 3:00 – 6:30 pm; Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday 9:00 am – 1:30 pm.

**The official population for 2019** as reported by the Office of the Town Clerk is 3,268, a decrease from 2018 (3,307).

**Dog licenses are due!** All dogs 6 months or older are required to be licensed in accordance with Massachusetts state law. We must have a current license on file in order to issue a license. If ordering by mail, please remember to include a SASE so we can return it to you.



### THE GROTON DUNSTABLE **EDUCATION FOUNDATION (GDEF)**



Our first grant cycle concluded in October. We were thrilled to award 6 Major Grants of about \$15,000 to all five of our schools. At Boutwell, we are supporting the building of a library that celebrates diversity. At Swallow Union & Florence Roche, we are supporting teaching civics through picture books to our young learners. At the Middle School, we are providing Nooks to create digital equity in the school library. At the High School we are helping to set up a new innovative class about sustainable living, and purchasing a touch IT board for the math department. Our second Major Grant cycle deadline is February 28th and we can't wait to see what else we can do for our schools.

This year we have also funded nine mini-grants (\$1,000 or less) thus far. We accept mini-grants all year. Six mini-grants were provided to teachers at the High School. They included books for English classrooms, sponsorship of the Robotics team, a trial of an online reading program, a film screening of a powerful movie about justice, and conference fees for two teachers. At our elementary schools, we funded a mini-grant for whiteboard tables at Florence Roche, and mini-grants for teachers at Swallow Union to expand their understanding of Ancient Civilizations.

If our community would like to contribute to the funding that we use to provide grants, our annual giving campaign is still underway. Every little bit makes a positive impact directly on our students.

### TOWN OF DUNSTABLE TRASH AND RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM

New and existing residents can sign up for trash and recycling pickup anytime during the year. The program is voluntary and by subscription. The subscription runs from July 1-June 30 each year. The fee is \$300.00 but is prorated \$25.00 each month. The subscriber will receive a 35 gallon trash container and a 65 gallon recycling container. On those occasions when you may have extra trash that does not fit in the container, the Board of Health sells overflow bags at \$3.00 each in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. ## ATTENTION 2020 HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!
We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene
Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and
invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your
education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one time basis.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

### **OPEN BURNING SEASON**

**January 15<sup>th</sup> through May 1<sup>st</sup>**Dunstable Fire Chief, Brian Rich announced that Open Burning season began on January 15th and will end on May1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

### Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling

### Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.



When Christians consider the Biblical character of Lot, Abraham's nephew, we correctly note the foolishness of his decision to move his family to the vicinity of Sodom and Gomorrah and then into the city of Sodom itself. In 2 Peter 2.7-8, however, the apostle Peter gives us additional insight into Lot's character beyond what's revealed in the Genesis account. "He [God] rescued righteous Lot, greatly distressed by the sensual conduct of the wicked (for as that righteous man lived among them day after day, he was tormenting his righteous soul over their lawless deeds that he saw and heard).' Not only is Lot called "righteous" (three times!), his righteousness is specifically tied to the pain and anguish he felt over the actions of

wicked lifestyle around him, Lot maintained a horror of sin. In Ezekiel 9, Ezekiel saw a vision in which the population of unrighteous Jerusalem was destroyed by angelic executioners. Just before that occurred. God commanded a man clothed in white to pass through the city and mark the foreheads of the people God would spare. They were people "who sigh and groan over all the abominations that are committed in it" (Ezekiel 9.4). The defining characteristic of the saved ones was their anguish over evil, not just their abstinence from it.

Sodom's population. Although his family became desensitized to the

In Jeremiah 23.9-10, Jeremiah reflected on the lives of men in Judah: "My heart is broken within me; all my bones shake; I am like a drunken man, like a man overcome by wine, because of the Lord and because of his holy words. For the land is full of adulterers; because of the curse the land mourns, and the pastures of the wilderness are dried up." These are not simply the musings of an overemotional man. Jeremiah attributed his broken heart to the fact that he viewed his fellow Israelites through the eyes of God.

Are we pained by the sins around us or do we simply shrug with resignation? For example, as our culture attempts to fundamentally redefine gender and marriage for the first time in recorded history, are we truly grieved by this frontal assault on God's created order? If righteousness must be passionately practiced, wickedness must be rejected with equal zeal. Certainly our fellow men must be treated with the inherent respect due to people created in God's image (Genesis 1.26-27), regardless of their beliefs, but that does not prevent us from living with grief about their sin. Certainly Christians are supposed to live with joy in their hearts over God's triumph in Christ, but that joy is also mixed with groaning over the current state of the world (Romans 8.20-23). It is not enough for us to simply refrain from participating in the darkness around us. God's holy people are called to feel the weight of sin as He does so we can become intercessors like Jesus.

### THE SECURE ACT

Congress just passed the SECURE Act and like most laws the name is sort of misleading. The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 went into effect January 1st. One good thing the law does is delay required withdrawals from IRAs until age 72 (unless you already turned 70 1/2 under the old rule). One bad thing it does is eliminate the "stretch" under IRAs where your children or others could take withdrawals over their lives, now they have to do it within ten years.

For anyone inheriting an IRA after 2019 they will now be required to completely withdraw all plan assets within 10 years of the date of death. No withdrawals have to be made during the 10-year period, but at the end of 10-years from the date of the plan holder's death the entire balance in the plan must be withdrawn. This eliminates the so-called Stretch for an IRA where those assets could grow for many years with a young beneficiary.

Some Estate Planning trusts took this into consideration and might have had provisions prohibiting withdrawals of more than the Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). With the new law this language makes no sense and could result in situations where the Trustee cannot distribute anything at all until the tenth year after the death of the IRA owner. If you have any retirement funds that name a Trust as beneficiary, you must review the terms of the Trust to see what might happen under the new law.

There are exceptions to the death of the Stretch provisions for certain disabled and chronically ill beneficiaries. If you have a trust written for such a beneficiary it may still be fine, but you should probably have your lawyer review it and update it as necessary. The Stretch will still work for a spouse. They can roll the IRA over to their own name and use their own lifetime for distributions, but the next generation will have only the ten-year time frame for withdrawals. Minor children can also withdraw using their age for RMDs but the ten-year period starts when they become an adult (18 in most places).

The Act increases the age at which retirees must begin taking RMDs from 70½ to 72. With taxpayers living longer they can now leave assets to grow tax deferred for a bit longer. You are always free to withdraw from a plan starting at age 59½ but now you don't have to until age 72. This may affect anyone who wanted to give their RMD to a charity. They will have to wait until age 72 to do so. If you have done any planning with your IRA or other retirement funds using a trust, you should contact your attorney to review your documents to see if they need to be changed based on this new law.







### EXHIBIT TITLE: THE POWER OF ONE, THROUGH FEB. 22, 2020

Lowell, MA -- Glenn Szegedy started this series by observing the people around him. Using his pocket camera, he began collecting images of everyday folks: students, artists, grocery clerks, and teachers. He focused on uniqueness—not only their physicality, but what they projected from inside. Each had a story that made them who they are. As he continued painting, it became obvious that we all have something that is overlooked by others. His paintings began to show the inner beauty in us all. There is a glimpse of the power we have as individuals—a sense of who people really are behind their everyday masks.

Szegedy is a Lowell area artist who has been making art for about twenty years. Retiring early from a Human Services career, he went back to school at age forty and received his BFA in Drawing and Sculpture from the University of New Hampshire. His creative work has varied over the years from sculpture, to ceramics, printmaking and other media.

A longtime resident of Lowell, Szegedy now lives in Dracut MA. After being a resident of Western Ave Studios for ten years, he now prefers the privacy and quiet of working from his home studio. He has a long history of exhibiting work throughout New England and has many works in private collections.

He has had the opportunity to curate several exhibits in Lowell including a curatorial position at the Loading Dock Gallery. Teaching art has also been a passion and he now teaches at the YouthBuild Lowell program through Community Teamwork, Inc.

Szegedy has spent the last three years developing his portrait work. While creating the images from The Power of One show, he said "I began to see the importance of each individual, not beauty queens, nor billionaires or movie stars, but everyday people who create the rich diverse communities we live in."

He plans on continuing to divide his time between his two loves... gardening and art. His portrait work will continue, and he hopes to continue to try and capture the person behind the face.

The Brush Art Gallery and Studios is located in the Lowell National Historical Park across the courtyard from the Visitor Center. This dynamic and captivating place was originally founded by the Lowell Historic Preservation Commission, U.S. Department of the Interior in 1982. The Brush presents museum quality exhibitions, educational programs, and has collaborated with many other nonprofit groups. Artists occupy studio spaces to interact with and educate the public on a weekly basis. Currently, nine studio artists produce paintings, illustration, photography, jewelry, sculpture, ceramics, quilts, and handwoven items. Associate artists display work in the common area. The Brush Art Gallery and Studios is a nonprofit, 501(c)(3) organization, and is supported by Lowell National Historical Park and Eastern National, a partner of the National Park Service.





### PET HEALTH **DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC CATS ARE NOT SMALL DOGS**

In fact dogs and cats can be polar opposites of each other, including several diseases. The following are a few examples. Both dogs and cats get diabetes mellitus, however dogs get Type I - they stop making insulin and therefore ALL dogs need shots of insulin as treatment. In human medicine this is often called juvenile diabetes. Cats get Type II - they are making insulin, but it doesn't work as well anymore. This is similar to the diabetes that overweight adult humans get. Cats can often be managed with diet and pills.

Another difference is their desire to live with others. While both dogs and cats can live in houses with multiple pets, dogs tend to enjoy this more. Most species of wild dogs live in packs, while most species of wild cats live alone (except lions).

Both dogs and cats can be finicky eaters, but dogs will usually give in and eat their dog food if you wait them out. Cats, however, can hold out almost to the point of starvation. This can even create a very serious disease called fatty liver, especially in overweight cats. Therefore if you have a picky eater (but otherwise healthy pet) you can be stubborn with your dog, but not as stubborn with your cat. Another interesting disease in which cats and dogs are polar opposites is thyroid disease. Cats get HYPERthyroidism, where their thyroid gland produces too much hormone so they usually eat but lose weight. Dogs get HYPOthyroidism where their thyroid gland stops producing thyroid hormone so they tend to gain weight. While some of us have dogs that are basically cats that bark (like my dog Ajax) and cats that act like dogs (including all of our technician Jackie's cats), medically Ajax will get hypothyroidism and Jackie's cats will get hyperthyroidism. Hopefully I did not just jinx our pets. I'll keep you posted.


