DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

- Dog licenses are due! All dogs 6 months or older are required to be licensed in accordance with Massachusetts state law. We must have a current license on file in order to issue a license. If ordering by mail, please remember to include a SASE so we can return it to you.
- Are you interested in running for a town office? Nomination papers are available during my business hours (it is recommended you call first since I am out of the office during my posted hours and do not have an assistant). You can find a list of open offices on the town website or contact me, I will be happy to provide you with a list. the deadline to obtain papers is March 26. Papers must be returned by 5:00 pm on March 31.
- Business certificates must be filed and/or renewed every 4 years pursuant to state law MGL 110:5. The town voted to amend the General bylaws, approved by the Attorney General. A business certificate does not give permission to conduct the business or protect your business name. Section 1. Filing and renewal of certificate required. Any person conducting business in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under any title other than the real name of the person conducting the business, whether individually or as a partnership, whose office is situated in the Town of Dunstable shall file in the office of the Town Clerk a certificate stating the full name and residence of each person conducting such business, the place, including street name and number, where, and the title under which it is conducted, and shall amend and/or renew said certificate from time to time, and pay the appropriate fee, as required by M.G.L. c. 110, § 5. Section 2. Violations and penalties. Violations of this bylaw shall be subject to a fine of \$300 for each offence and enforced by noncriminal disposition of the offence by the Police Department pursuant to the Non-Criminal Disposition Bylaw.






NDA ANNOUNCES Q2 HIGHEST HONORS

TOWN OF DUNSTABLE TRASH AND RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM

ATTENTION 2020 HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation! We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one time basis.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time



TAX SEASON TIPS - 2020

Tax Season 2020 is underway. To keep on top of things, consider **IRS2Go** the official mobile app of the IRS. With the app you can check your refund status, make a payment, and find free tax preparation assistance. You will need to enter your Social Security number and filing status and amount of anticipated refund to get a notice on your refund status. The app is updated once a day so you can check daily to see the status of your refund. You can use the app to find volunteer tax assistance in your area by entering your zip code. You can get free tax software on your phone and also find mobile-friendly payment options like the IRS Direct Pay system with the app.

If you are expecting a big income-tax refund, you might be wanting a way to get that sooner. Many of the big tax services offer Refund Anticipation Loans (RAL) to meet that desire, but they come with a cost. The interests rates and fees can be very high in terms of percentage. Read the disclosures carefully before you take out an RAI

It might not help this year, but there are options to deal with your refund next year. Make sure to review and adjust your withholding. If you are getting a big refund, that means you are paying too much in withholding taxes and are giving the government an interest free loan for a year. It might be better to get more in each paycheck. Of course, if you spend that extra, then you don't have the big lump-sum that a tax refund provides. Consider an automatic savings plan with your paycheck so those extra dollars go into your savings account where you earn interest rather than giving the government a loan or paying interest with an RAL.

If you want to borrow this year, consider something other than an RAL. You may be able to get a zero-interest loan with a credit card or draw on a home equity line of credit (if you have one in place). The rate you pay will be less and the fees may be less as well. Also, review your tax return carefully and make sure you have used every deduction and credit that you are allowed. If you rush to get a refund with an RAL you may use a tax preparation system that will hurry you and you may not look for every legal option to reduce your taxes. Use good tax software, or better yet hire a local professional to prepare your taxes. You may pay more for the service, but your local CPA or Accountant will work hard to ensure you pay as little as the law allows. They may ask you questions and get information from you that you didn't even know would help reduce your taxes. Spend the time to find a good tax preparer and it may well be worth it.

Home bible studies in Nashua, Tyngsboro, Dracut, and Lowell. WHY DID GOD DESTROY SODOM AND **GOMORRAH?**

Many destructions of ungodliness are described in the Bible, but one of the most vivid is Sodom and Gomorrah's annihilation in Genesis 19. After years of patience, God consumed these Canaanite cities with fire and sulphur. Why would God do something that drastic for a few towns? Genesis reveals in general terms that "the men of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the Lord" (Genesis 13.13). We're also told that "the outcry" against the cities was great and their evil was "very grave" (Genesis 18.20). Certainly, we see evidence of that evil in the horrific way the men of Sodom attempted to homosexually rape the angelic visitors who came to their city. However, there is nothing in Genesis that specifically reveals why God chose to remove these places from the map. We must look to other Scriptures to give us more insight.

After Genesis, Sodom and Gomorrah are referenced in thirteen books of the Bible, signifying the importance of their downfall in world history. In the book of the prophet Ezekiel, God shared more perspective on that ancient event with the people of Judah as He worked to convict them of sin. "Behold, this was the guilt of your sister Sodom: she and her daughters had pride, excess of food, and prosperous ease, but did not aid the poor and needy. They were haughty and did an abomination before me. So I removed them, when I saw it" (Ezekiel 16.49-50). The sexual deviance on display in Genesis 19 is appalling, but it is a symptom of deeper issues. Extreme self-indulgence (in all of its manifestations) is always driven by a heart saturated with pride. And when people make their lives about their own physical comfort and pleasure, it inevitably comes at the cost of the comfort and security of others.

Because Sodom and Gomorrah are such a key part of the Biblical storyline, God calls us to hold up these cities as a life mirror and stare hard without dropping our gaze. Who are the "poor and needy" around you in your daily life? Are you able to consciously identify a list of individuals? They could be people with monetary needs, wrecked by bad financial circumstances. They could be people who require help navigating their past experiences and emotions in the light of Scripture. They could be dependent children who need an astonishing amount of attention - not only to provide for their physical needs, but also to train the way they view life. Do we spend our lives limping towards the weekend or the next little pleasing moment, or do we take genuine delight in giving away whatever we possess?

Our decadent culture alarmingly resembles the culture of Sodom in the areas of "pride, excess of food, and prosperous ease." May God help us to resist its pull through the power of Jesus' cross!

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION

You must follow all the rules and regulations
that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.

2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.

- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.




