
UNWIND Check your library's free e-books and audiobooks you can borrow without leaving home. Consider joining a virtual book club to connect with others enjoying the same book.



MEDICAID MISCONCEPTIONS By Edward H. Adamsky

Medicaid – called MassHealth in Massachusetts – is the government program that pays for nursing home care for individuals who cannot pay themselves. It is a "welfare" program for the "poor" and thus has financial eligibility requirements. Generally, you must have less than \$2000 in assets to qualify for Medicaid. There are many common misconceptions regarding the rules of Medicaid.

• My house is in a trust, so isn't it protected from a Medicaid lien and estate recovery?

Most people who have a Trust have a Revocable Trust, which provides no protection for your home from liens or estate recovery under the Medicaid rules. Only if you have created an Irrevocable Trust specifically designed by an Elder Law Attorney to provide you with Medicaid protection will your house be safe. Of course, an Irrevocable Medicaid Trust is not for everyone, so this is something you should carefully discuss with your attorney.

• Doesn't Medicaid only work in a nursing home? I want care at home.

If you qualify financially (and medically) for Medicaid benefits, there are care programs that work at home. The Merrimack Valley now has access to the Program for All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly or PACE. This program can provide at home care as well as medical care and day programs. It is administered by a couple of private agencies and is often enough to allow a senior to stay at home rather than go to a nursing home. The eligibility rules are somewhat different for at-home programs, so it is worthwhile to look into them to see if you qualify.

• If my spouse needs care won't we lose everything before Medicaid kicks in?

There are specific rules for married couples under Medicaid. There are protections for the spouse still at home that allow him or her to keep the home and a significant portion of the assets and there are tools that Elder Law Attorneys utilize to protect other assets even within the five-year look-back period.

• I've heard about the five-year look-back rule. Does that mean there is nothing that can be done if I need nursing home care in the near future?

The look-back is a rule for eligibility purposes. If you have given away any money or assets in the five-years prior to your application for Medicaid, that gift or transfer might make you ineligible for Medicaid benefits. But there are several exceptions to the rule. You might be able to give your house to a child who has lived there with you and cared for you for several years thus keeping you out of a nursing home. You can give assets to a disabled child or to a trust for any person with a disability. You can transfer assets to your spouse at any time. And, the rule only applies to gifts or transfers without consideration. Purchases do not count as a disqualifying transfer as long as they were for your own benefit.

The Medicaid laws are complex with exceptions and particular rules for odd situations. If you may need long-term-care anytime in the near future, then you should consult with an Elder Law Attorney who can advise you on how the rules will work with your unique situation.

FROM THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

On 4/29/20 the Board of Selectmen moved to close the Town Hall until 5/18/20. This is in conformance with Governor Bakers latest orders. Town Hall employees will continue to work remotely and remain available via email and by phone where possible. Contact information for officials and departments may be found on the appropriate corresponding pages of the town website <u>www.</u> <u>dunstable-ma.gov</u> The Board has also determined to postpone the Annual Town Meeting and the Annual Town Elections. On 4/13/20 the Board formally set a new date for the Annual Town Election. The election has been called for 6/16/2020. However, per State guidelines, nomination papers for local office were still due by 3/31/2020. No date has yet been determined for the Annual Town Meeting. We appreciate your patience during this time.

The Board of Selectmen, Board of Health, and Emergency Management Team continue to meet on a weekly basis, remotely, to continue to respond to the COVID-19 situation and guidance issued by the Governor and public health agencies. They are responding using the most recent and frequently updated guidance issued by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH), the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Board of Health (BOH). Meeting agendas will continue to be posted on the town website. This updated notice is being provided based on the latest information. Dunstable Fire, Police, and Highway Departments also remain operational and prepared to address issues that may arise regarding the COVID-19 threat. The Dunstable Police Department is available to conduct welfare checks and address imminent needs for local residents, please contact them at 978-649-7445 if needed. Our public health nurses are on the front line of this situation as they monitor the State's communicable disease surveillance system - MAVEN for our community. There are 9 individual(s) in town who have laboratory confirmed positive tests for COVID-19. Residents are reminded of the following preventative measures recommended by the state that they should take: Practice social distancing -There is currently no vaccine to prevent COVID-19. Another way to prevent the illness is to avoid being exposed to the virus. The virus is thought to spread mainly from person to person: 1. Between people who are in close contact with one another (within 6') 2. Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person sneezes or coughs.3. Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer 4. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth 5. Cover your mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze

6. Stay at home if you are sick 7. Keep children off public playgrounds and away from congregating with other groups of children

BARUCH'S ATTITUDE ADJUSTMENT

The prophet Jeremiah had a helper named Baruch the son of Neriah. Baruch took part in important prophetic acts, like conserving a sealed land deed of purchase in an earthenware vessel as a sign that God's people would return to their land after Babylonian exile (Jeremiah 32.14-15). He diligently copied Jeremiah's prophecies onto a scroll and read them in the temple (a place from which Jeremiah himself was banned), facing the abuse of his stubborn countrymen. After his scroll was burned by the king, Baruch went into hiding and painstakingly copied it out again (Jer. 36.32). Eventually, he was taken to Egypt with the band of rebellious Israelites who refused to listen to God's instructions to stay in their land (Jer. 43.6).

Just as Jeremiah did not enjoy the job of prophet (Jer. 20.7), Baruch apparently did not enjoy his job as Jeremiah's helper! Note the personal message he received from God through the mouth of his mentor: "Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, to you, O Baruch: You said, 'Woe is me! For the Lord has added sorrow to my pain. I am weary with my groaning, and I find no rest.' Thus shall you say to him, Thus says the Lord: Behold, what I have built I am breaking down, and what I have planted I am plucking up - that is, the whole land. And do you seek great things for yourself? Seek them not, for behold, I am bringing disaster upon all flesh, declares the Lord. But I will give you your life as a prize of war in all places to which you may go" (Jer. 45.2-5).

It is evident from the Lord's message that Baruch had big plans for himself. Since he was a scribe, an upper-class occupation, he was evidently intelligent and highly-educated. Under normal circumstances he could have claimed important positions in Jewish society, perhaps even in the royal court. His country was crumbling, however, and his fate was tied to an extremely unpopular prophet. He required an attitude adjustment, to focus more on what the Lord was doing in the world than his own personal plans. The security of his life was assured, but his ideas about the future were not.

How we need this message in our lives! Have you made plans for your life that can no longer be fulfilled in the way you envisioned? Like Baruch, do you "seek great things for yourself" in this world? We can look for strength in our economy, the stock market, our healthcare system, and governmental leadership, but none of these things have proven worthy of our unshakable trust. We are tempted to focus on carving out our own niche in our culture and forget that every country crumbles into ash and a new one rises to take its place. May we look to Jesus, who rules an unshakable kingdom (Hebrews 12.28) and will give His followers indestructible spiritual life.

NOW IS AN IMPORTANT TIME TO CONSIDER QUITTING SMOKING AND VAPING

We all know that smoking is harmful to one's lungs. As our lives are disrupted by the coronavirus, this fact raises concerns about the damaging impact the coronavirus (COVID-19) may have on those who smoke or vape. Dr. Nora Volkow, director of the National Institute on Drug Abuse, says, *"Because it attacks the lungs, the coronavirus that causes COVID-19 could be an especially serious threat to those who smoke tobacco or marijuana or who vape."* While the long-term impact of vaping is not clear, there is evidence coming out that vaping, like smoking, harms the ability of the lungs to fight infection.

Despite the stressful times we're living in, people who smoke or vape may want to quit to improve their ability to fight the coronavirus. The stress may have led others to relapse and start smoking or vaping again. It's never too late to try to quit, People who smoke and vape know how hard it is to quit because nicotine, the drug in tobacco and vaping products, is highly addictive. Repeated tobacco and nicotine use is not a habit, it's an addiction and quitting can takes several tries before one can quit for good. Many tobacco users say quitting is the hardest thing they've ever done; however, with planning, support, and dedication, many people quit for good.

Now may be a good time for those who smoke or vape to call the Massachusetts Smokers' Helpline at 1-800-QUIT NOW (1-800-784-8669) for free coaching and support 24 hours each day, seven days a week. Enroll online, access quit planning tools, peer support and motivational text messages at KeepTryingMA.org.

Up to eight weeks of FREE nicotine replacement help from patches, gum or lozenges are available through the Helpline (with medical eligibility). With coaching and quit medication people can be twice as likely to quit for good compared to those who try to quit on their own.

Quitting improves one's health right away; lungs start to heal, and the body starts to repair its ability to fight infection. For more information, call 1-800-QUIT-NOW or visit KeepTryingMA.org.





As I write this article the Dunstable Animal Clinic is open and we are all healthy. However things are not business as usual. We have adjusted our protocols based on the recommendations of the CDC and AVMA.

The biggest change is that staff only are allowed in the building. When you come for an appointment call the office (978)649-6513 and a staff member will come out to get your pet with a slip lead that will be disinfected between pets. If you do not have a cell phone, call before you leave your house with an ETA and what car to look out for.

For medication/food pick up we are asking that you call with requests and payments over the phone first. Again, call the clinic when you arrive and a staff member will bring it out to you.

We have been doing the new protocol for 6 weeks now and we have 2 recurring problems. One is that the phone is often busy, in addition to its usual uses we also need it before/after each appointment. If the usual number is busy you can also try 978-649-0222 (that might be busy too). Our second problem is that appointments are taking longer so we are falling behind in our schedule and we can't fit as many appointments as we usually do. We are trying our best.

We have also delayed doing elective surgeries at this time. We are doing our best to stay open to serve all of our clients. This is an evolving situation we will try to keep you updated as things change.
