Town Hall has reopened partially to the public, but it will continue to be staggered hours by departments until further notice. It is highly recommended you contact the office you want before coming in to be sure they are here to help you. Because of the vote by mail program and several election deadlines, I will not have regular office hours until late November and open by appointment only. I am in constant touch with my email and voice mail. Be well, we look forward to seeing you soon!

By the time you read this, we will be past the September primary and onto the November election. The Secretary of State's Election Division will be conducting another round of vote by mail postcards for voters who are not already in the system for absentee voting for the November 3 election. This does not mean you have to vote by mail. The polls will be open from 7:00 am – 8:00 pm and booths and pens will be sanitized after each use. There will be VERY MINIMAL Early Voting hours at the Town Hall. I'm keeping the hours short as we are overwhelmed by the vote by mail and the general administration of an election. There will be no in-person over the counter absentee voting other than Early Voting. Know before you go, check your voter registration. So many problems at the polls can be resolved beforehand. Are you registered, are you inactive, etc.?

A state law effective January 1, 2020 created a new program for automatically registering eligible voters, known as Automatic Vote Registration (AVR) and is purpose is to register voters automatically when applying for services at the RMV, MassHealth and Health Connector agencies. The agencies are required to collect and transmit the appropriate voter information to the Secretary of the Commonwealth. Under the former way when you registered to vote or change your party at the RMV, an applicant would have to check "yes" to the voter registration question and then could pick a party of political designation. AVR changes this. Instead of being asked if you want to register and having to select "yes", applicants will only see a box that allows you to opt-out of registering. Under AVR, at both the RMV and health agencies, if you do NOT opt-out, your transaction will be forwarded to the town/ city clerk for processing. Under the way the AVR law was written, applicants are NOT offered the opportunity to pick a political party or designation. Additionally, the AVR law as enacted, requires the notices you receive to be bilingual in English in English and Spanish. Please check your voter status and party affiliation (if any) before you come to vote. You cannot register to vote or change your party on the annual street listing.



FROM THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Friday, August 28, 2020

To all residents of the Town of Dunstable from the Board of Selectmen:

On March 16, 2020, the Board of Selectmen met in emergency meeting and declared a local state of emergency in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic. Dunstable Town officials and Emergency Management Team will continue to meet and to implement the Town's response to the situation concerning COVID-19. They are responding using the most recent and frequently updated guidance issued by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH), the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Board of Health (BOH). The Town is currently clear of reported cases.

Dunstable Fire, Police, and Highway Departments also remain operational and prepared to address issues that may arise regarding the COVID-19 threat. Dunstable police department is available to conduct welfare checks and address imminent needs for local residents, please contact them at 978-649-7445 if needed.

Town Hall is currently open with requirements for visitors and staff to sign in for the purposes of contact tracing, with hygiene, masks, distancing, and other measures in place. The Town Hall is currently opened Monday-Thursday generally from 8 am to 5 pm. This schedule will be reevaluated during the later phases of the Governor's Phase 3 approach which is currently on hold due to a resurgence of cases in certain areas of the State.

We also appreciate all who came in support of Annual Town Meeting last month. Go to <u>dunstable-ma.gov</u> for updates.

Our public health nurses are on the front line of this situation as they monitor the State's communicable disease surveillance system – MAVEN for our community. There are 0 individual(s) in town who have a laboratory confirmed positive test for COVID-19.

Residents are reminded of the following preventative measures recommended by the state that they should take: * Practice social distancing - There is currently no vaccine to prevent COVID-19. Another way to prevent the illness is to avoid being exposed to the virus. The virus is thought to spread mainly from person to person: 1. Between people who are in close contact with one another (within 6') 2. Through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person sneezes or coughs. * Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer * Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth * Cover your mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze

* Stay at home if you are sick * Keep children off public playgrounds and away from congregating with other groups of children

This is advice is especially true for older adults and those with health issues are urged to avoid large crowds and events. Individuals who live in households with vulnerable people, like elderly parents, should also consider avoiding crowds.

Please be cognizant of the State's travel restrictions and testing/ quarantine requirements if you are planning to travel out of state or you are returning from out of State. There are an increasing numbers of test sites for rapid testing that do not require you to have symptoms, a doctor's referral, or an appointment. BENEFICIARY DESIGNATION MISTAKES TO AVOID

By Edward H. Adamsky Remember that your Will or Trust only controls assets that are not controlled in some other way. Many of your assets pass by Beneficiary Designation rather than through the terms or your Will or Trust. The common ones are Life Insurance and Retirement Accounts. You can also name beneficiaries on bank accounts with the ITF designation (a misnomer as it stands for "In Trust For," but is really just a beneficiary designation) and you can have your brokerage accounts Transfer on Death (TOD) to named beneficiaries.

Most people choose their spouse as primary and name their children as contingent beneficiaries. Some forms have a designation like "issue per stirpes" or "issue by right of representation." Those mean the same thing using Latin or English. What they mean is that the assets will pass down your bloodline and be divided equally at each generation, among those of that generation. Sometimes folks are confused on who to name as a beneficiary or whether or not they should name one person or multiple people, and many people make bad mistakes when filling out the beneficiary designation forms.

One common mistake is to just name one beneficiary and assume that person will properly split the assets among family members. It might cause tax issues with retirement accounts, or discord if that family member did not properly share with others. If you name one child as a beneficiary on an account, then that account will legally belong to that child when you die. If that child were in the midst of a financial issue like divorce or bankruptcy, that child might not be able to share the assets with siblings even if she wanted to.

Sometimes people designate different beneficiaries for different accounts. For example, a mother might have three IRAs each with one of her three children named as beneficiary. Only if the three accounts were exactly equal in value when she died would the children benefit equally. If she had to spend some money and withdrew it from only one account, then the children will receive unequal amounts. This might cause fights among the children, especially if one of the children (as Agent under a Power of Attorney) made the decision to withdraw assets from only one of the three accounts.

You cannot override your beneficiary designations by terms in a Will. If you had life insurance and named your brother as beneficiary, a clause in your Will that said "I give my life insurance proceeds to my three children" would not work. The life insurance company will follow your directions on the beneficiary designation form and will not even look at your Will.

You should coordinate your beneficiary designations with your Will or Trust. If there is a reason to update your Will (such as the death of a family member) then you should update your beneficiary designations too. You should make a list with all of your assets that are controlled by beneficiary designation and be sure to update them all when there are changes in your life.

FACE COVERING MANDATORY



TEARING OPEN THE HEAVENS

In Isaiah 64.1, Isaiah the prophet uttered an anguished prayer to God: "O that you would *tear open the heavens* and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence" (NRSV). Such words are hardly surprising, considering the difficult time in which Isaiah lived. God's people had splintered into two rival kingdoms (Israel and Judah) and often warred against each other. The moral character of the kings who ruled Judah, Isaiah's country, was a jarring sequence of good (Uzziah, Jotham), horrific (Ahaz), then excellent (Hezekiah). The people they led did not have hearts for God: "There is no one who calls on your name," Isaiah says later in Isaiah 64.7. Additionally, Judah faced repeated invasions from foreign armies intent on devastating Judah (2 Chronicles 28.5-6, 17-20, 32.1). God's people desperately needed Him to come down in a powerful way and teach His people to fear Him, as He did in the time of Moses at Mt. Sinai.

Roughly 700 years later, God answered Isaiah's prayer. At the beginning of Jesus' work to spread His good news, when He was baptized by John in the Jordan river, Mark records this: "And just as he was coming up out of the water, *he saw the heavens torn apart* and the Spirit descending like a dove on him" (Mark 1.10, NRSV). God did rip open the sky and descend, just as Isaiah asked. However, instead of shaking mountains covered in terrifying smoke and lightening, God's Spirit came like a gentle bird onto His Son. Jesus was the one Isaiah longed for, the divine presence Who brought ordered righteousness to the chaotic wickedness of the world.

2020 is a year of difficulty. Many are disturbed by the bitter division within our country, similar to the division between the Israelites of Isaiah's time. Many are fearful for the physical health of their loved ones and themselves. Many are feeling the effects of sudden economic disruption. Many are angry at acts of unjust violence. Many are frustrated at a lack of effective and godly leadership. Perhaps you long for God to dramatically descend and fix it all, just as Isaiah did.

How comforting it is to know that God has *already* descended in the person of Jesus of Nazareth! He has already crushed the power that Satan once enjoyed over humankind (Luke 10.18). He has already disarmed mighty spirits who subjugated us, and He did it through an act of profound weakness: dying on a cross (Colossians 2.14-15). Jesus is returning to earth someday to raise the dead, judge His enemies, and abolish death forever (1 Thessalonians 5, 1 Corinthians 15). Therefore, whatever gathering darkness appears in our culture or our personal lives is actually the last gasp of an already defeated enemy. When God seems remote and silent, let's remember that He has torn open the heavens. He has done "awesome deeds that we did not expect" (Isaiah 64.3). Glory to His name!


