TOWN OF TYNGSBOROUGH UPDATES

The Town of Tyngsborough continues to closely monitor and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact it has had on our community. To date, we have completely re-opened Town Hall back to its normal schedule. While some staff continue to work remotely on some days to reduce the number of people in the building, *Town Hall has resumed in person hours Monday through Thursday from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM and on Fridays from 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM.*

The Town of Tyngsborough recently launched push notifications on its website to allow residents to sign up for alerts anytime meeting minutes, meeting agendas, news posts, or new events are posted. This will help residents stay even more connected with local government especially during these difficult times.

The Library is now open a limited number of hours for browsing the collection and computer use. The Children's Room is restricted to adults only. Programs will remain virtual until further notice. Please see the Library's website, tynglib.org, for hours, safety protocols and guidelines for use. Curbside pickup of materials will continue on the same schedule.

The Board has set the date for the Annual Town Meeting as Saturday, September 26, 2020 at 9:00 AM. This will be held at the Tyngsborough High School Football Field.

TYNGSBOROUGH VETERAN'S AGENT

Over the past few years this office has seen a sharp increase in Veterans benefits claims. This is a result of legislative changes and many other demographics. Those affected by the Vietnam "Blue Water" rule as well as amendments to V.A. laws have opened the door for Veterans to receive more of what they deserve.

Do you know a neighbor or friend who may be a Veteran, Veteran widower, widow or dependents of a Veteran, that may be eligible for financial assistance from my office. I may be able to help them with basic living expenses, rent or mortgage heating cost, prescriptions, hearing aids, monthly healthcare premiums and hospital/ doctor bills not covered by your Medicare or other insurance. Even if the applicant lives with their son, daughter or other family member or friend they may still qualify.

I can also help with filing or questions about V.A. disability and pension claims. The Veteran's Office is a confidential office where your identity is completely confidential. Please call or email the office to schedule an appointment. If I cannot personally assist you I will direct you to the resources available to you.

GROW FOOD, NOT YOUR HOUSEHOLD WASTE

In July 2019, the Sustainability Committee met for the first time. We set our priorities for the year, including an ambitious goal of reducing the Town of Tyngsborough's waste by 30% over three years. We plan to do this by focusing on organics diversion - composting.

Tyngsborough generated 3,702 tons of trash in FY2019, nearly 1 ton per household served at that time. MassDEP estimates that 31%, or about 1/3, of household trash could actually be composted. If we had composted the 1,100 tons instead of sending it to incineration, we would have saved our town budget \$80,000 in trash fees.

Following our first meeting, the Sustainability Committee got to work, reaching out to industry folks in the organics field and consulting with Town staff about how we could potentially bring a Community Compost site to Town. We quickly learned that an old definition within our Town bylaws prohibited such a use by lumping it in as the same activity as a landfill. If we wanted to bring this new town service to residents, we would need to propose a change at Annual Town Meeting.

In an online survey, 75% of residents polled were in favor of exploring options for composting. The Committee worked with the Planning Board to hold Public Hearings on the proposal. We heard positive feedback from residents eager to have a place to bring their yard waste outside of the four dates a year offered by our waste hauler. We heard from others who would be interested in a service that picked up food scraps curbside and created free high quality compost for residents to return to their gardens to grow more food.

We also heard from residents who were here when the old Charles George Landfill became toxic because they had accepted hazardous industrial waste and were concerned that this proposal would be similar to the old Charles George Landfill. Composting is very different than landfilling. MassDEP regulates composting activity, including the types of organic materials allowed at such a site. Any operator of a composting facility must be permitted both locally and by MassDEP under CMR 310 16.00 and subsections. The organics diversion sector is vibrant, with small companies like Lowell-based OffBeet Compost and Black Earth Compost, which operates a municipal site for the town of Manchester-by-the-Sea, working to create high quality compost and keeping valuable resources out of the waste stream. These industry folks are committed to being good partners wherever they do business. They live and work in our communities, too.





Apply Insect Repellent when Outdoors. Use a repellent with an EPA-registered ingredient DEET (N,N-diethyl-m-toluamide), permethrin, picaridin (KBR 3023), oil of lemon eucalyptus [p-methane 3, 8-diol (PMD)] or IR3535) according to the instructions on the product label. DEET products should not be used on infants under two months of age and should be used in concentrations of 30 percent or less on older children. Oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under three years of age.

<u>Be Aware of Peak Mosquito Hours</u>. The hours from dusk to dawn are peak biting times for many mosquitoes. Consider rescheduling outdoor activities that occur during evening or early morning in areas of high risk.

<u>Clothing Can Help Reduce Mosquito Bites</u>. Wearing long-sleeves, long pants and socks when outdoors will help keep mosquitoes away from your skin.

Mosquito-Proof Your Home

<u>Drain Standing Water</u>. Mosquitoes lay their eggs in standing water. Limit the number of places around your home for mosquitoes to breed by either draining or discarding items that hold water. Check rain gutters and drains. Empty any unused flowerpots and wading pools, and change the water in birdbaths frequently.

Install or Repair Screens. Keep mosquitoes outside by having tightly-fitting screens on all of your windows and doors.

Protect Your Animals

Animal owners should reduce potential mosquito breeding sites on their property by eliminating standing water from containers such as buckets, tires, and wading pools – especially after heavy rains. Water troughs provide excellent mosquito breeding habitats and should be flushed out at least once a week during the summer months to reduce mosquitoes near paddock areas. Horse owners should keep horses in indoor stalls at night to reduce their risk of exposure to mosquitoes. Owners should also speak with their veterinarian about mosquito repellents approved for use in animals and vaccinations to prevent WNV and EEE. *If an animal is suspected of having*

WNV or EEE, owners are required to report to the Department of Agricultural Resources, Division of Animal Health by calling 617-626-1795, and to the Department of Public Health by calling 617-983-6800.

• Information about current mosquito activity in Massachusetts is updated daily and can be found https://www.mass.gov/mosquitoes-and-ticks

NOTE: A hard or killing frost will kill virtually all exposed mosquitoes. A hard frost is defined as 2 consecutive hours at a temperature below 28 degrees Fahrenheit. A female mosquito can live up to 100 days and lay anywhere between 200 and 300 eggs, so she is continually feeding.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATION MISTAKES TO AVOID

Remember that your Will or Trust only controls assets that are not controlled in some other way. Many of your assets pass by Beneficiary Designation rather than through the terms or your Will or Trust. The common ones are Life Insurance and Retirement Accounts. You can also name beneficiaries on bank accounts with the ITF designation (a misnomer as it stands for "In Trust For," but is really just a beneficiary designation) and you can have your brokerage accounts Transfer on Death (TOD) to named beneficiaries.

Most people choose their spouse as primary and name their children as contingent beneficiaries. Some forms have a designation like "issue per stirpes" or "issue by right of representation." Those mean the same thing using Latin or English. What they mean is that the assets will pass down your bloodline and be divided equally at each generation, among those of that generation. Sometimes folks are confused on who to name as a beneficiary or whether or not they should name one person or multiple people, and many people make bad mistakes when filling out the beneficiary designation forms.

One common mistake is to just name one beneficiary and assume that person will properly split the assets among family members. It might cause tax issues with retirement accounts, or discord if that family member did not properly share with others. If you name one child as a beneficiary on an account, then that account will legally belong to that child when you die. If that child were in the midst of a financial issue like divorce or bankruptcy, that child might not be able to share the assets with siblings even if she wanted to.

Sometimes people designate different beneficiaries for different accounts. For example, a mother might have three IRAs each with one of her three children named as beneficiary. Only if the three accounts were exactly equal in value when she died would the children benefit equally. If she had to spend some money and withdrew it from only one account, then the children will receive unequal amounts. This might cause fights among the children, especially if one of the children (as Agent under a Power of Attorney) made the decision to withdraw assets from only one of the three accounts.

You cannot override your beneficiary designations by terms in a Will. If you had life insurance and named your brother as beneficiary, a clause in your Will that said "I give my life insurance proceeds to my three children" would not work. The life insurance company will follow your directions on the beneficiary designation form and will not even look at your Will.

You should coordinate your beneficiary designations with your Will or Trust. If there is a reason to update your Will (such as the death of a family member) then you should update your beneficiary designations too. 

TEARING OPEN THE HEAVENS

In Isaiah 64.1, Isaiah the prophet uttered an anguished prayer to God: "O that you would *tear open the heavens* and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence" (NRSV). Such words are hardly surprising, considering the difficult time in which Isaiah lived. God's people had splintered into two rival kingdoms (Israel and Judah) and often warred against each other. The moral character of the kings who ruled Judah, Isaiah's country, was a jarring sequence of good (Uzziah, Jotham), horrific (Ahaz), then excellent (Hezekiah). The people they led did not have hearts for God: "There is no one who calls on your name," Isaiah says later in Isaiah 64.7. Additionally, Judah faced repeated invasions from foreign armies intent on devastating Judah (2 Chronicles 28.5-6, 17-20, 32.1). God's people desperately needed Him to come down in a powerful way and teach His people to fear Him, as He did in the time of Moses at Mt. Sinai.

Roughly 700 years later, God answered Isaiah's prayer. At the beginning of Jesus' work to spread His good news, when He was baptized by John in the Jordan river, Mark records this: "And just as he was coming up out of the water, *he saw the heavens torn apart* and the Spirit descending like a dove on him" (Mark 1.10, NRSV). God did rip open the sky and descend, just as Isaiah asked. However, instead of shaking mountains covered in terrifying smoke and lightening, God's Spirit came like a gentle bird onto His Son. Jesus was the one Isaiah longed for, the divine presence Who brought ordered righteousness to the chaotic wickedness of the world.

2020 is a year of difficulty. Many are disturbed by the bitter division within our country, similar to the division between the Israelites of Isaiah's time. Many are fearful for the physical health of their loved ones and themselves. Many are feeling the effects of sudden economic disruption. Many are angry at acts of unjust violence. Many are frustrated at a lack of effective and godly leadership. Perhaps you long for God to dramatically descend and fix it all, just as Isaiah did.

How comforting it is to know that God has *already* descended in the person of Jesus of Nazareth! He has already crushed the power that Satan once enjoyed over humankind (Luke 10.18). He has already disarmed mighty spirits who subjugated us, and He did it through an act of profound weakness: dying on a cross (Colossians 2.14-15). Jesus is returning to earth someday to raise the dead, judge His enemies, and abolish death forever (1 Thessalonians 5, 1 Corinthians 15). Therefore, whatever gathering darkness appears in our culture or our personal lives is actually the last gasp of an already defeated enemy. When God seems remote and silent, let's remember that He has torn open the heavens. He has done "awesome deeds that we did not expect" (Isaiah 64.3). Glory to His name!


