PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION is November 3rd. Voters in Precincts 1 and 2 vote at the Tyngsborough Middle School, 50 Norris Rd and voters in Precincts 3 and 4 vote at the Tyngsborough Elementary School, 205 Westford Rd. The hours are 7:00am to 8:00pm. Masks will be required. We will sanitize during voting hours.

The Secretary of the Commonwealth's Office will be sending the Vote by Mail applications for this election to any voter who did not request one previously. The application is also available on both the State and Town websites. **The deadline to register to vote is October 24**th. All Early Voting will be held at Town Hall. **In person early voting hours are as follows:**

TYNGSBOROUGH VETERAN'S AGENT

The Veterans Day program is still being discussed under the current circumstances. At this time, no final decision has been made with regards to putting on a public program or not. Please check with the Town web site for updates.

Over the past few years this office has seen a sharp increase in Veterans benefits claims.

This is a result of legislative changes and many other demographics. Those affected by the Vietnam "Blue Water" rule as well as amendments to V.A. laws has opened the door for Veterans to receive more of what they deserve.

Do you know a neighbor or friend who may be a Veteran, Veteran widower, widow or dependents of a Veteran that may be eligible for financial assistance from my office? I may be able to help them with basic living expenses, rent or mortgage heating cost, prescriptions, monthly healthcare premiums and hospital/doctor bills not covered by your Medicare or other insurance. The Massachusetts Chapter 115 program is a for low income applicants with an asset and income limit. Call or email and see if you qualify. I can also assist with filing or questions about V.A. disability and pension claims. The Veteran's Office is a confidential office where your identity is completely confidential. Please call or email the office to schedule an appointment. If I cannot assist you I will direct you to the resources available to you.

Items can be From the Workbench, From the Garage, From the House, From the Yard. Charged Items Pay with cash only for Tires and Propane Tanks. Items not to bring are also listed.

Latex Paint is non-hazardous and should be dried out in the can and put in your trash. Alkaline Batteries can also be put in your trash. Please read the note on how to safely transport your Hazardous Waste.

HOUSEHOLD YARD WASTE

Please mark your calendar. Collection will be held on two Saturdays in November. They will be Saturday, November 7th and Saturday, November 21st

Place all yard waste in open barrels or yard waste bags. Twigs and sticks (less than 4 inches in diameter) may be tied and bundled. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.

Leaves and grass clippings must be placed in compostable PAPER LEAF BAGS (available at local stores such as Home Depot, Walmart, Market Basket, True Value Hardware stores, etc.), dry cardboard boxes or trash barrels. Boxes and barrels will be emptied and left at the curb.

..Do NOT place yard waste in plastic bags! .. Leaves and grass clippings in plastic bags or wet cardboard boxes will not be collected. ...Flower and vegetable garden waste may also be included. Grass clippings may be included with leaves or may be bagged separately. ..Pinecones, pine needles and small twigs that are raked up with leaves may be included. ...Paper leaf bags do not need to be closed at the top, but please do not let them stand in puddles of water.

HOW IS YOUR RECYCLING IQ?

The Recycle IQ Program began in late July. Cart checkers have been consistently checking the recycling carts of the same roughly 600 houses and all multi-family developments served by the Town. After checking these carts, the checkers are getting to as many other carts across town as possible, putting a new informative sticker on the cart lid and checking to see if there are items that do not belong in the cart.

If yours is one of the carts we check consistently, you've learned what should not be going into your recycle cart. If you are not on our route, you might still be unknowingly putting in things that will not get recycled and thus become contaminants. Recycling contamination costs everyone money. When the wrong items arrive at the sorting facility, it is very costly and time consuming for the processor to deal with. These costs are passed on to the town and ultimately to the residents who pay taxes. We can all do our part to keep these costs down by making sure only clean recyclables are being sent for processing.

Top contaminants in Tyngsborough:

- 1) Plastic bags, film, wrap, air pillows, mailers
- Styrofoam, including large blocks, meat trays, takeout containers and to-go cups
- 3) Scrap Metal
- 4) Trash, including: snack packaging/bags, such as chip, cookie or Ziploc bags
- 5) To-go Beverage Trash: straws and to-go paper cups
- Single Use Food Items: paper plates, napkins, paper towels and plastic utensils
- 7) Cartons: juice, milk, broth
- 8) Electronics/Small Appliances: Anything with a plug or batteries!
- 9) PPE: Disposable masks, gloves

Please keep these items out of your recycling bin!

Another common practice we observe is putting a paper or plastic bag filled with recycling into the cart. This makes it hard for the materials to get sorted properly at the facility. Collecting your items in a bag? *Empty the bag into the cart*.

Recycling is a good thing. It reduces the use of natural resources. But recycling is getting more expensive. We can rein in our costs by ensuring each item we put in our recycling cart is clean and dry. The correct materials that are prepared properly for recycling will be sorted and sold in a secondary market and actually recycled into new things. If you are just starting out, keep it simple and stick to the basics - bottles, jars, jugs and tubs, metal cans, plus paper and cardboard. We meet the third Tuesday of every month, beginning at 6:30pm, in Meeting Room #1 if Town Hall is open, or via Zoom if Town Hall is closed. 



HEALTH CARE AGENTS AND ANTIPSYCHOTIC MEDICATIONS

The Massachusetts courts have a procedure to deal with people with mental health issues for whom the medical professionals would like to prescribe anti-psychotic medications. Based on the 1983 case of *Rogers v. Commissioner of Department of Mental Health*, the system provides for a Guardianship proceeding. The Court may appoint a person with authority to consent to extraordinary medical procedures such as anti-psychotic medications to treat the mental health issues. The so-called Rogers proceeding uses the "substituted judgment" standard and requires yearly reviews at a minimum.

Massachusetts also has a Health Care Proxy law that allows a person (while competent) to appoint a person who will have authority to make medical decisions for them when they are no longer competent. The two systems were in conflict for many years as it was not clear if you needed a Rogers proceeding if there was an appointed Health Care Agent who could make those decisions. The Massachusetts Chapter of the National Academy of Elder Law Attorneys sought an answer in 1997 and received a letter from the Attorney General of Massachusetts who stated that Health Care Agents can consent to treatment without a Rogers proceeding. Some confusion still existed though, as civil commitment proceedings took place in District Court while Rogers Guardianship proceedings took place in Probate Court. The Probate Court often went through a careful analysis of the patient's condition and the need for medications. The District Courts could order a civil commitment to a state hospital or other locked facility, along with administration of anti-psychotic medications, if it determined that a person was a danger to self or others.

The question still remained whether or not the Health Care Agent could make the medication decisions even if there was a civil commitment. In a recent case, the District Court determined a person required commitment to the hospital and ordered the administration of anti-psychotic medications. The person had a valid Health Care Proxy and the named Agent argued in Court that the Health Care Proxy superseded the commitment proceeding. This case went to a higher court level where the Appeals Court ruled that the civil commitment by the District Court was a valid exercise of the Court's power, but that the Health Care Proxy was superior to the Court's order of administration of medications. Thus, the Agent under the Health Care Proxy was the person who would make the final decision on medications and not the Court.

The Massachusetts Health Care Proxy statute protects the right of a patient to autonomy with regard to the administration of antipsychotic medication even after the patient has lost the capacity to make personal decisions. By executing a health care proxy, an individual can determine in advance that a competent person of the individual's choice, rather than a judge or Court, will make such a decision on the individual's behalf.





LIPOMAS IN DOGS

Tara M. Sacramone. DVM



Lipomas are benign tumors made up of fat cells. They are extremely common in dogs, especially older female dogs, but are very rare in cats. They start off as small masses under the skin and grow slowly over time. They are soft, often oval-shaped and usually freely moveable. They can occur anywhere on the body, and most likely if your dog gets one, s/he will get others.

Lipomas are a benign form of cancer, meaning they do not spread to lymph nodes, lung or liver and tend to grow slowly over time. They can, however, bother your dog, either because of location, or because they grow too large. There are two other tumors that arise from fat; infiltrative lipoma, and liposarcoma. These are much less common, but are more aggressive cancers. They tend to be more firm, grow more guickly, and are not freely moveable.

Lipomas are diagnosed based on appearance, palpation, and sometimes fine needle aspirate (FNA). FNA involves inserting a needle into the mass and aspirating out some of the cells, which are then spread on a microscope slide. The material aspirated from a lipoma looks like clear droplets that do not dry. All lipomas float in water when removed from the body, so it is not usually necessary to submit them for histopathology. Submission to a lab is, however, the only way to definitively determine the nature of the tumor.

If your dog has one or more lipomas, you have two options. You can leave it on the dog and monitor for changes, or remove it surgically, which involves general anesthesia. Sometimes the best choice is to leave them alone, as some of you with very lumpy, bumpy dogs can understand. I generally advise leaving them alone, unless one of the following applies: 1. The lump grows quickly (e.g. doubles in size in a month or two). 2. The mass is bothering the dog, either because it is in an annoying location, such as on the leg, or in the armpit area or it is affecting how something else functions, such as a mass near the anal area, or ear. 3. The mass changes from being moveable to being attached to underlying tissues. When they are removed surgically they have a very distinctive appearance and float in water. I recently removed some relatively small ones from a patient at Dunstable Animal Clinic. I removed them because one of them was in a very poor location and it was much easier to remove while it was still small. We actually put a picture on our Facebook page if you want to see them for yourself. Of course we think they are cool looking, but not everyone agrees.

If you suspect your dog has one or more lipomas go to your veterinarian and you can both decide which course of action is appropriate for your dog.



NEW HELP TO QUIT MENTHOL TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Smoking and vaping may put people at higher risk of complications from COVID-19, especially because they can weaken the immune system and damage the lungs. With menthol tobacco products unavailable and COVID-19 risks continuing, the Massachusetts Department of Public Health has found a new way to help people quit. The Massachusetts Smokers' Helpline is offering up to three gift cards totaling \$50 to people who use menthol tobacco products and the Helpline's free coaching services. Call the Helpline 1-800-QUIT NOW (1-800-784-8669) about the program and for free coaching and support 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Or enroll online at makesmokinghistory.org. Helping people who use menthol products quit is especially important because the tobacco industry has strategically and successfully targeted Black, Latinx and LGBTQ+ people with menthol products. As a result of aggressive marketing practices and pressures related to discrimination and daily stressors, menthol tobacco use is high in these communities.

Massachusetts residents who use menthol tobacco products who speak with the Helpline's supportive coaches can receive a \$10 gift card after completing the first coaching call, a \$15 gift card after the second and a \$25 gift card after the third coaching call. In addition, up to 8 weeks of FREE nicotine patches, gum or lozenges are also available to residents who speak with a coach (with medical eligibility). 
