Summary: The Clockmaker's Daughter is the story of a mysterious murder and a passionate love affair. Their shadows are cast across generations. ### Tyler's Timely Technical Tips

Bathing in cold water is no fun. Recognizing common signs of a failing water heater can help homeowners be prepared, and avoid unexpected -and costly- emergency repairs or replacements.

Discolored or Gritty Water: Rusty, gritty or muddy-looking water can mean the anode rod is gone, and the tank is corroding.

Water Smells or Tastes Off: Water that smells like sulfur or rotten eggs may indicate an interaction between bacteria in the water and the anode rod can create this problem.

Leaking Water: Water heater leaking can occur because of sediment buildup, lack of maintenance, or simply due to deterioration. The relief (TPR) valve dripping could be a sign of dangerous pressures developing inside the tank.

If you notice any of these, seek prompt help from a licensed plumber to identify the cause and to remedy the situation.

### NECESSARY HEALTH CARE DOCUMENTS By Edward H. Adamsky

With the current Covid-19 situation, we are all feeling worried about our potential health issues. There are several legal documents necessary to protect your health and wellbeing.

The first is the **Health Care Proxy**. This is a document that appoints an Agent to make medical decisions for you if you cannot do so yourself. You can name a primary Agent and an Alternate Agent. The power of your Agent comes into effect when your doctor determines that you cannot make your own medical decisions. The power would end if you recovered the ability to make decisions. Without a Health Care Proxy in place, your family would not be able to make decisions for you without a costly and time-consuming legal guardianship proceeding.

The next necessary tool is a **Medical Privacy Release** or **HIPAA Authorization**. This is a document that allows whoever you name to get your private medical information. Federal law prohibits access to your medical information unless you release it. You would obviously name your Health Care Agent and Alternate in this document, but you might also name a few other people that you would want to know about your medical issues, such as someone who helps you with doctor visits or who goes to the pharmacy for you. You might name your Agent under a Power of Attorney so that person could ask questions about medical bills if necessary.

Although not required, and not legally binding, some attorneys suggest that you also complete an **Advanced Directive** or **Living Will**. Some people call Health Care Proxies by this same name, so it can get confusing. An advanced directive is usually just a document that contains your wishes for future medical care. It can put in writing what you would want to happen in various situations such as your desire for life support and extreme medical measures, or your desire to avoid such things. You could also state your wishes for feeding tubes, breathing interventions such as ventilators and the like. You could also express your burial wishes.

If you are living with a serious medical condition, your doctor might ask you to consider completing a **MOLST** (also called a POLST) form. This is a medical order for treatment that can go with you from facility to facility. It contains several sections in which you and your doctor state your wishes for future medical care such as artificial nutrition and hydration, intubation, resuscitation, and a few other medical issues. The orders in this document will be followed by any medical facility in which you may be.

You should discuss all of these planning tools with your family and your legal advisor. By having the discussion and getting the tools in place, you can ease the emotional burdens on your family should you need medical care and be unable to make decisions. You and your chosen Agents should keep copies of all of these documents handy in case you need them. And we all hope that you never do.

### NEW HELP TO QUIT MENTHOL TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Smoking and vaping may put people at higher risk of complications from COVID-19, especially because they can weaken the immune system and damage the lungs. With menthol tobacco products unavailable and COVID-19 risks continuing, the Massachusetts Department of Public Health has found a new way to help people quit. The Massachusetts Smokers' Helpline is offering up to three gift cards totaling \$50 to people who use menthol tobacco products and the Helpline's free coaching services. Helping people who use menthol products guit is especially important because the tobacco industry has strategically and successfully targeted Black, Latinx and LGBTQ+ people with menthol products. As a result of aggressive marketing practices and pressures related to discrimination and daily stressors, menthol tobacco use is high in these communities.

### PET HEALTH DUNSTABLE ANIMAL CLINIC





So you have decided on getting a new feline friend, but can't decide cat vs kitten. First of all congratulations, felines make great pets. Second of all make sure everyone in the family is ready emotionally and financially for a potentially long commitment. It is not unusual for a cat to live into its late teens or even early twenties now a days. Now, let's decide cat vs kitten. Both have positives and negatives so think carefully and be honest about which would fit into your lifestyle better.

**Kittens: Pros** They are cute. Can be easier to train to use a scratching post or have their nails trimmed or even have their teeth brushed. They are super entertaining. You really don't need a television for a few months after getting a kitten, or even better - get two. Generally an adult cat is more likely to accept a kitten rather than another adult cat.

**Cons** They can be quite destructive, they love to climb and therefore scratch curtains and furniture, not to mention your pant leg. They need to play and if they are left alone all day they tend to sleep all day and are up all night. Their inquisitive nature can lead to trouble, like eating things they shouldn't or getting stuck in the couch. It's hard to predict their adult personality, so if you need a super friendly or super lazy or super tolerant cat you won't really know if that's what you've got until they grow up.

**Cats: Pros** Their temperament is set, you can tell what you're getting. They are less energetic and therefore demand less of your time and don't mind being alone for longer periods of time. They are cute too, and what you see is what you get, not all cute kittens end up being cute cats.

**Cons** If they have an undesirable behavior trait, it can be hard to change it. If you already have a cat it can be harder for him/her to accept another adult cat.

So consider what will be best for your family at this moment in time (and up to 20 years from now). We, of course, would recommend you get your new pet from a shelter. With a little time and looking around you can generally get whatever you are looking for. Plus the shelters generally really know their cats' personalities and can help match you up with the perfect feline friend.
