ATTENTION 2021 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!
We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene
Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and
invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your
education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

SPECIAL NEEDS TRUSTS

You may have heard the term "Special Needs Trust" or "Supplemental Needs Trust" both of which are often abbreviated as "SNT." But do you know what an SNT is, or if you even want or need one? Here is a rather simple explanation of a complex issue. An SNT is a trust that is designed so the beneficiary will stay or become eligible for certain means-tested government benefits such as Medicaid that require the individual to have less than \$2000 in assets.

There are two major types of SNTs. One is created and funded by someone like the parents of the person with a disability. That is called a "third-party" trust. Sometimes a person with a disability comes into money like inheritance or lawsuit proceeds. A trust established with that person's own money is called a "first-party" trust. The rules for how those two types of trust can be created and the terms required of them are quite different.

Sometimes people can be confused by these terms. The Social Security Administration calls only a First-Party Trust a Special Needs Trust. If you are planning on creating an SNT and Social Security is or may be involved, you better call it by the right name or confusion could be the result. If it is a Third-Party trust you might want to use the name "Supplemental Needs Trust," or just call it a Trust.

Most third-party Trusts give the Trustee discretion on how to spend, or not spend, the trust money. Since the Trustee cannot be forced to give it to, or spend it on, the beneficiary, and the beneficiary cannot demand the money, then the assets in the Trust do not count as the beneficiary's assets for benefits eligibility purposes. If the Trust said that the Trustee had to give money to the beneficiary, then that money might be countable for eligibility purposes and would ruin the whole plan of trying to keep that person on government benefits. So, these types of Trusts have to be written correctly.

The Social Security laws allow an individual to set up a Special Needs Trust with their own money. This is sub-section d(4)(A) of 42 USC Section 1396p. Lawyers often call these "d(4)(A)" trusts. This type of trust is most commonly used when a disabled person comes into funds through a lawsuit or inheritance and wants to retain eligibility for certain benefits. At that time, the individual can set up a Trust and put those funds in the Trust and remain eligible. But the Trust must contain a "payback" provision that allows the government to get at those trust assets after the person has died to payback the government for what it paid out in benefits.

If you think an SNT might be something you need, see you local Elder Law Attorney.

DUNSTABLE VETERAN SERVICES OFFICE

For those Veterans and families who love to see nature at its best the National Parks, wildlife refuges and other federal lands is now free for veterans and Gold Star family members to use as of <u>Veterans Day</u>.

The change extends to veterans and Gold Star families. The existing free admission policy is already in play for active-duty troops and their families, as well as Guard and Reserve members. It waives both entrance and day use recreation fees for lands managed by the Department of the Interior nationwide. Disabled veterans qualify for the Access Pass, which gives free admission and a 50% discount on some costs such as camping or boat launch fees. To gain access, veterans can present a DoD ID card; a Veteran Health Identification Card; a Veteran ID card; or a state-issued card displaying veteran status, according to the release. So now you have one more reason to get out and enjoy this beautiful country of ours.

No one wants to start the year with boiler troubles. How do you know whether to repair or replace? Let's looks at some of the factors to consider in making a decision.

Age: On average, boilers have a service life between 10 and 15 years. Older boilers are more prone to problems such as leaks and malfunctions, as well as increased energy use.

DO NOT DIVIDE OVER SUBJECTS THAT DO NOT MATTER TO GOD

When you listen to news anchors, politicians, coworkers, and fellow Christians, it is not uncommon to hear someone lamenting the deeply divided state of our culture. At every turn, there is a seemingly endless supply of subject matter to fight about and plenty of people willing to charge into a war of words. Christians, sadly, are tempted to mimic the rancorous language of the world and spend their energy brawling about issues that do not advance the kingdom cause of Jesus.

For example, it is irrelevant to God whether our country (or any other, for that matter) is a socialist or communist or capitalist society. In other words, since Jesus reigns supreme over all the nations, He will sow His message and reap His souls regardless of secular politicians. After all, the good news of Jesus was first preached in the shadow of a repressive empire. With few exceptions, all the cultures we read about in the Bible were ruled by monarchies. Under adverse conditions, Jesus' church thrived to such an extent that even household members of the Roman emperor submitted their lives to Jesus (Philippians 4.22)! While the empire boiled with bloodshed and political intrigue, God's everlasting kingdom quietly, but relentlessly, conquered the world.

We will search the New Testament in vain for instructions on good economic policies or the ideal configurations of human government. Honoring the emperor, paying your taxes, and praying for your leaders were clear teachings of Jesus and His apostles (1 Timothy 2.1-2, Romans 13.7, 1 Peter 2.17). However, changing or maintaining an earthly political system was simply not a focus of the early Christians. It should not be our focus.

Although modern-day levels of division seem unprecedented (to use a recently popular word), divisiveness is an ancient problem rooted in sin. The New Testament documents are filled with specific teachings and warnings about divisions, warning that they come from a worldly mindset, rather than a proper focus on Jesus' priorities. The apostle Paul warned the Galatian churches in his letter: "But if you bite and devour one another, watch out that you are not consumed by one another" (Galatians 5.14). The churches in the Roman province of Galatia were embracing a distorted gospel of ethnic division lines. God did not care about circumcision under His new covenant, but false teachers came to Galatia and attempted to separate Christians who kept the works of the law (like circumcision) from those who did not. As the Galatians bound their new regulations on each other, Paul erupted: "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel" (Galatians 1.6).

When our spiritual unity with others is determined by whether they conform to issues that do not concern the kingdom of Jesus, we put ourselves and others in grave danger. Do not divide over

subjects that do not matter to God!
