Tyler's Timely Technical Tips

No one wants to start the year with boiler troubles. How do you know whether to repair or replace? Let's looks at some of the factors to consider in making a decision.

Age: On average, boilers have a service life between 10 and 15 years. Older boilers are more prone to problems such as leaks and malfunctions, as well as increased energy use.

Safety: For any decision regarding an existing system, safety needs to be top priority. Repairs may be an option, but may not improve the safety of the boiler.

Repair Needs & Costs: If the cost of repairing is relatively low, or the repair is simple, then this may be the best choice.

Efficiency & Energy Costs: Wear & tear over the years reduces efficiency & performance. New, high-efficiency units use much less fuel.

Taking these factors into account, If an old boiler breaks down often, energy bills are higher, and your home doesn't feel as warm as it should, it might be time to consider boiler replacement.



NEW HELP TO QUIT MENTHOL TOBACCO PRODUCTS



Smoking and vaping may put people at higher risk of complications from COVID-19, especially because they can weaken the immune system and damage the lungs. The Massachusetts Smokers' Helpline is offering up to three gift cards totaling \$50 to people who use menthol tobacco products and the Helpline's free coaching services. Helping people who use menthol products quit is especially important because the tobacco industry has strategically and successfully targeted Black, Latinx and LGBTQ+ people with menthol products. As a result of aggressive marketing practices and pressures related to discrimination and daily stressors, menthol tobacco use is high in these communities.

Massachusetts residents who use menthol tobacco products who speak with the Helpline's supportive coaches can receive a \$10 gift card after completing the first coaching call, a \$15 gift card after the second and a \$25 gift card after the third coaching call. In addition, up to 8 weeks of FREE nicotine patches, gum or lozenges are also available to residents who speak with a coach (with medical eligibility). 

MAKING THE HOLIDAY MORE SUSTAINABLE

Are you looking to see how you can be more sustainable during the holidays? Here are some ways to integrate sustainability into your celebrations.

<u>Gifts</u> -- Gifts of memberships, restaurant cards, or experiences express your thoughtfulness without adding more "things." For example, a gift of membership to the nearest zoo would be ideal for a child who wants to be a wild animal vet. Local businesses will especially appreciate the support!

Gift Wrap – Metallic inks, glitter and waterproof coatings make most commercial wrapping paper non-recyclable. Consider ecofriendly options instead. Wrappily.com is one source (they also carry eco-friendly ribbons and twine). For tape, Scotch brand's Magic Greener Tape is a good option. Use the comic section of print newspapers to create fun-to-peruse gifts. Using and reusing gift bags is another option. Some have adopted the Japanese tradition of wrapping gifts in cloth, with the receiver then reusing that cloth on future gifts.

Live Christmas Trees – Leave your tree to compost in your yard (be sure it is at least 30 feet from any wetlands or culvert) to provide a natural habitat for birds. If yard space is limited, the Town offers free drop-off at the Highway Department and the Community Center on Lakeview Ave. For a donation, the Boy Scouts will pick up your tree.

<u>Holiday Lights</u> – Please don't throw your old light strings in the garbage! Collection bins will be available at Town Hall again this year for unwanted light strings.

<u>Electronics</u> – If it's still working but you no longer need it, place your electronics in a Simple Recycling bag (pink bags). If it is not working, recycling is best. Watch for the Boy Scouts' electronics collection announcement or use the MassDEP Beyond the Bin Directory to locate e-waste recyclers <u>https://recyclesearch.com/profile/</u> <u>ma</u>.

Packaging – Cardboard gift boxes and shipping boxes can be flattened and added to your blue recycling cart. Save gently used gift boxes to reuse again next year. Packaging materials like styrofoam peanuts, air pillows and bubble wrap are not curbside recyclable but can be taken to The Postal Center on Middlesex Road (near AMC Theater) for reuse.

TYNGSBOROUGH VETERAN'S AGENT

For Veterans and families who love to see nature at its best the National Parks, wildlife refuges and other federal lands is now free for veterans and Gold Star family members to use as of <u>Veterans Day</u>. The change extends to veterans and Gold Star families. The existing free admission policy is already in play for active-duty troops and their families, as well as Guard and Reserve members.

It waives both entrance and day use recreation fees for lands managed by the Department of the Interior nationwide. Disabled veterans <u>qualify for the Access Pass</u>, which gives free admission and a 50% discount on some costs such as camping or boat launch fees.

To gain access, veterans can present a DoD ID card; a Veteran Health Identification Card; a Veteran ID card; or a state-issued card displaying veteran status, according to the release. So now you have one more reason to get out and enjoy this beautiful country of ours.

SPECIAL NEEDS TRUSTS

You may have heard the term "Special Needs Trust" or "Supplemental Needs Trust" both of which are often abbreviated as "SNT." But do you know what an SNT is, or if you even want or need one? Here is a rather simple explanation of a complex issue. An SNT is a trust that is designed so the beneficiary will stay or become eligible for certain means-tested government benefits such as Medicaid that require the individual to have less than \$2000 in assets.

There are two major types of SNTs. One is created and funded by someone like the parents of the person with a disability. That is called a "third-party" trust. Sometimes a person with a disability comes into money like inheritance or lawsuit proceeds. A trust established with that person's own money is called a "first-party" trust. The rules for how those two types of trust can be created and the terms required of them are quite different.

Sometimes people can be confused by these terms. The Social Security Administration calls only a First-Party Trust a Special Needs Trust. If you are planning on creating an SNT and Social Security is or may be involved, you better call it by the right name or confusion could be the result. If it is a Third-Party trust you might want to use the name "Supplemental Needs Trust," or just call it a Trust.

Most third-party Trusts give the Trustee discretion on how to spend, or not spend, the trust money. Since the Trustee cannot be forced to give it to, or spend it on, the beneficiary, and the beneficiary cannot demand the money, then the assets in the Trust do not count as the beneficiary's assets for benefits eligibility purposes. If the Trust said that the Trustee had to give money to the beneficiary, then that money might be countable for eligibility purposes and would ruin the whole plan of trying to keep that person on government benefits. So, these types of Trusts have to be written correctly.

The Social Security laws allow an individual to set up a Special Needs Trust with their own money. This is sub-section d(4)(A) of 42 USC Section 1396p. Lawyers often call these "d(4)(A)" trusts. This type of trust is most commonly used when a disabled person comes into funds through a lawsuit or inheritance and wants to retain eligibility for certain benefits. At that time, the individual can set up a Trust and put those funds in the Trust and remain eligible. But the Trust must contain a "payback" provision that allows the government to get at those trust assets after the person has died to payback the government for what it paid out in benefits.

If you think an SNT might be something you need, see you local Elder Law Attorney.
