Applying for a marriage license is one of the few things that still requires the applicants to appear in person. *Please call the office to set up an appointment.*

2021 Dog Licenses are now available at the Town Clerk's office or by mail. Based on the current restrictions on residents entering the building, you are encouraged to renew your dog licenses by mail. Male/female licenses are \$11.00 and spayed/neutered licenses are \$7.00. Current rabies vaccination is required. If renewing by mail, please send to Tyngsborough Town Clerk, Town Hall, 25 Bryant Lane, Tyngsborough, MA 01879. Please enclose a stamped envelope for the license.

WILL A SIMPLE WILL MEET YOUR NEEDS?

For many people, a simple Will is all they need for Estate Planning purposes (a Power of Attorney and Health Care Proxy is still needed for lifetime planning). But is a simple Will enough for you? That is the key question. Many people think a Will avoids probate. That's a common misconception. If you have assets in your own name when you die, then Probate may be necessary whether or not you have a Will.

Assets that are solely in the name of a person who has died must be handled through the Probate process. This isn't as bad as some people say, and won't cost a fortune, but you do have to file the appropriate forms with the court, pay the required filing fees, and probably pay a lawyer to assist you in doing all this. It takes some time and has some delays. For simple situations, it may be fine to have to go through probate. Not everyone has to avoid probate.

There are many ways to avoid probate. You can have accounts with named beneficiaries, so they pass outside of probate. You can have joint accounts, or other jointly owned assets, and you can have assets that pass by beneficiary designation like life insurance and retirement funds. All of those methods avoid probate and are fairly easy. If most or all of your assets will pass outside of Probate then having a simple Will as a catch-all in case there is something you missed, may be all you need.

If you have a more complex situation, then a Trust or other Estate Planning tool might be right for you. If you own property in more than one state or have several parcels of real estate, or if you have a complex family with issues, then a Trust might be right for you. In that case, we would still write a Will for you, just in case, but it would not be the main planning tool.

A Trust is a complex tool that can be used to protect assets (if the trust is Irrevocable) or avoid probate (for the assets the trust holds) and hold assets for a person who should not directly get those assets (such as a person getting means-tested government benefits). The operation of a trust is private and stays out of the courts and public record, so many people want that privacy. Folks also enjoy the efficiency that a Trust can provide.

If you are not sure if a simple Will is enough for you, or if you should have a Trust or other planning tools, then you should consult with an attorney who can go over your situation and determine which is right for you. You may not need a Trust, but you won't know until a competent advisor reviews your situation and gives you the best advice on what is right for you.

NEW HELP TO QUIT MENTHOL TOBACCO PRODUCTS

Smoking and vaping may put people at higher risk of complications from COVID-19, especially because they can weaken the immune system and damage the lungs. With menthol tobacco products unavailable and COVID-19 risks continuing, the Massachusetts Department of Public Health has found a new way to help people guit. The Massachusetts Smokers' Helpline is offering up to three gift cards totaling \$50 to people who use menthol tobacco products and the Helpline's free coaching services. Call the Helpline 1-800-QUIT NOW (1-800-784-8669) about the program and for free coaching and support 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Or enroll online at makesmokinghistory.org. Helping people who use menthol products guit is especially important because the tobacco industry has strategically and successfully targeted Black, Latinx and LGBTQ+ people with menthol products. As a result of aggressive marketing practices and pressures related to discrimination and daily stressors, menthol tobacco use is high in these communities.

Massachusetts residents who use menthol tobacco products who speak with the Helpline's supportive coaches can receive a \$10 gift card after completing the first coaching call, a \$15 gift card after the second and a \$25 gift card after the third coaching call. In addition, up to 8 weeks of FREE nicotine patches, gum or lozenges are also available to residents who speak with a coach (with medical eligibility). TIERED FOCUSED MONITORING REVIEW TYNGSBOROUGH PUBLIC SCHOOLS

During the week of January 25, 2021, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's Office of Public-School Monitoring (PSM) will conduct a Tiered Focused Monitoring Review of Tyngsborough Public Schools. The Office of Public-School Monitoring reviews each district and charter school every three years to monitor compliance with federal and state special education and civil rights regulations. Areas of review related to special education include student assessments, determination of eligibility, the Individualized Education Program (IEP) Team process, and IEP development and implementation. Areas of review related to civil rights include bullying, student discipline, physical restraint, and equal access to school programs for all students.

Parent outreach is an important part of the TFM review process. The review chairperson from the Office of Public School Monitoring will send all parents of students with disabilities an online survey that focuses on key areas of their child's special education program. Survey results will contribute to the development of a report. During the TFM review, the Office of Public-School Monitoring will interview the chairperson(s) of the district's Special Education Parent Advisory Council (SEPAC). Other onsite activities may include interviews of district staff and administrators, reviews of student records, and onsite observations.

Parents and other individuals may call Samantha Alvarez, Public School Monitoring Chairperson, at (781) 338-3752 to request a telephone interview. If an individual requires an accommodation, such as translation, to participate in an interview, the Department will make the necessary arrangements.

Within approximately 60 business days after the TFM review, the review chairperson will provide the district with a report with information about areas in which the district meets or exceeds regulatory requirements and areas in which the district requires assistance to correct or improve practices. 



LARGE NUMBER OF HOME FIRES HIGHLIGHT IMPORTANCE OF WORKING SMOKE ALARMS, PREVENTION

MEDFORD, Mass., December 23, 2020 - The past 10 days have kept Red Cross volunteers busy responding to home fire across Massachusetts, assisting 84 people displaced or affected by 39 fires.

Daily, the Red Cross assists people affected by disaster with direct financial assistance, case work to ensure fire victims find new housing, and mental health counseling to ensure all family members can restart their lives and make progress toward recovery.

Home fires can affect anyone, and as weather turns colder, home fires surge. These safety guidelines can help keep you, your family and your home safe:

- · Cooking Safety "Keep an eye on what you fry." Stay in the kitchen when frying, grilling or using an open flame.
- Fireplaces, Space Heaters, Baseboards, etc. "3 feet from the heat." Furniture, curtains, dish towels and anything that could catch fire are at least 3 feet from any type of heat source.
- Smoking Safety Never smoke in bed.
- · Electrical and Appliance Safety Large and small appliances are plugged directly into wall outlets.
- Children Playing Matches and lighters are locked away.
- Smoke Alarms Make sure you have working smoke alarms. Different types of smoke alarms, ionization and photoelectric, detect fire in different ways. Experts recommend having both types in your home. • Change smoke alarm batteries every year unless it has a long-life battery. • Replace smoke alarms every ten years. • A combination of working smoke alarms and fire sprinklers decreases the risk of dying in a home fire.

Heat your home safely

- · All heating equipment needs at least three feet of space. Keep away children, pets and things that can burn, such as paper, matches, bedding, furniture, clothing, carpets and rugs.
- If you must use a space heater, look for a model that shuts off automatically if the heater falls over. Place it on a level, hard and nonflammable surface, such as a ceramic tile floor. Don't place it on rugs and carpets, or near bedding and drapes.
- Plug power cords directly into outlets and never into an extension
- Turn off portable space heaters every time you leave the room or go to sleep.
- Have wood and coal stoves, fireplaces and chimneys inspected annually by a professional and cleaned if necessary.
- Never leave a fire in the fireplace unattended. Use a glass or metal fire screen to keep fire and embers in the fireplace.
- · Never use a cooking range or oven to heat your home.
- · Carbon monoxide is an invisible, odorless and silent killer that claims hundreds of lives each year in the U.S. When a carbon monoxide alarm sounds, treat the alert as a real emergency each time.
- · Know the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning, which include headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, sleepiness and confusion.
- · If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning, get quickly to fresh air, and then call 9-1-1.

In addition, the free Monster Guard: Prepare for Emergencies App provides 7- to 11-year-olds with a fun, gaming environment to learn how to prevent emergencies, including home fires.
