- The Town Hall is open by appointment only. Most services can be provided through the mail including birth, death, marriage and business certificates. Voter registration and party changes can be completed on-line at Mass.gov and searching for voter registration. Applying for a marriage license is one of the few things that still requires the applicants to appear in person. Please call the office to set up an appointment.
- 2021 Dog Licenses are now available at the Town Clerk's office or by mail. Based on the current restrictions on residents entering the building, you are encouraged to renew your dog licenses by mail. Male/female licenses are \$11.00 and spayed/neutered licenses are \$7.00. Current rabies vaccination is required. If renewing by mail, please send to Tyngsborough Town Clerk, Town Hall, 25 Bryant Lane, Tyngsborough, MA 01879. If renewing by mail, please enclose a stamped envelope for the license.

SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH UPDATES

Free Home Energy Audit for all Tyngsborough Residents The Tyngsborough Sustainability Committee is partnering with HomeWorks Energy, a partner of the Mass Save® program, to help

people access no-cost home energy and HVAC assessment appointments. HomeWorks Energy is committed to helping residents save money on their utility bills. One way to take action is through a home energy assessment performed at no cost through the Mass Save® program. Homeowners and renters are eligible for an assessment every three years.

Program benefits include:

- Air-sealing selected areas of your home at no-cost
- 75% off the cost of approved insulation for single family homes
- Rebates of up to \$2,750 on qualifying heating and cooling system upgrades
- Eligible LED light bulbs, thermostats, showerheads, and power strips at no-cost
- · Mass Save® has also increased rebates for landlords and residents of multi-family houses.
- Renter-occupied units are now eligible for a 100% incentive
- Multi-family homes up to 4 units are now eligible for a 100% incentive if every unit moves ahead with recommended insulation measures

For every home energy or HVAC assessment appointment, HomeWorks will donate \$25 to the town. These funds will be used by the Sustainability Committee to support efforts to make our town more sustainable.

2/28/21 TOWN HALL PLASTIC FILM COLLECTION ENDED

Over the past year, residents have brought 1,200+ pounds of plastic bags and film to Town Hall for proper recycling. In return, the Town is receiving two benches from Trex. The benches will be placed at Long Pond Trails as part of the trail improvement project. The Sustainability Committee wishes to thank everyone who participated in this program.

As of February 28, 2021, the Town stop accepting plastic bags or film at Town Hall. This was a volunteer program, aimed at reinforcing the messaging that flexible plastic is not accepted for curbside recycling and instead should be brought to a special collection drop off. Volunteer Sustainability Committee members have made hundreds of trips, sorting out any non-recyclable bags, weighing the plastic and delivering it to a partner retailer. Residents are encouraged to continue to recycle these plastic films by bringing them to a participating retailer, such as Market Basket, Hannaford, Shaw's, Target and Walmart. Look for a collection bin at one of the entryways.

Information About COVID-19 Vaccine for Veterans

If you are currently going to, or if you have ever received treatment at a VA facility, you are considered enrolled. If you want to go to the Bedford VA Hospital to be vaccinated, and you have never received treatment there, you need to tell them at what VA facility you have received treatment. They will then pull your records from there so you can receive the Vaccine at Bedford. This especially includes all of you Vets out there who have a disability but have not been to a VA facility in the past 20 or 30 years or since you received your disability assessment. You can call 1-781-687-4000

Do you know a neighbor or friend who may be a Veteran, Veteran widower, widow or dependents of a Veteran that may be eligible for financial assistance from my office? I may be able to help them with basic living expenses, rent or mortgage heating cost, prescriptions, monthly healthcare premiums and hospital/doctor bills not covered by your Medicare or other insurance.

I can also help with filing or questions about V.A. disability and pension claims.

The Veteran's Office is a confidential office where your identity is completely confidential. Please call or email the office to schedule an appointment.





We are still in this pandemic and closed to the
general public. We are providing Meals on Wheels to homebound
seniors, van service for medical (including appointments for the

As you all may be aware, I had been working on my Director Certification through the Massachusetts Councils on Aging. The certification program was on hold for several years so that the process could be revamped. The new process was introduced in the fall of 2018 with letters of intention due in January 2019. The entire process was time consuming and very educational. I worked with my board and others to develop long range goals, strategies and more.

I submitted my final notebook in December of 2019 and in December 2020 I received a phone call letting me know that my certification was complete and has been accepted

I would like to share some statistics with you all. At the time the new program was announced, there were 12 Certified Directors in Massachusetts (of all the 350+ cities and towns in the state). There were 41 cities/towns that expressed an interest in getting certified. Of the 41, the committee received 15 certification notebooks, only 5 received certification of which I am one of them.

It is truly an honor to serve this community as a "Certified" Director of Elder Services. I will continue to look for ways to improve programs, services and activities through partnerships.

MOVING IN WITH ADULT CHILDREN

If you are realizing that it is getting difficult to live alone as you age, should you ask to move into the home of your adult child? Or, if you notice your parents are having a hard time alone, should you ask them to move in with you? This is a difficult and delicate topic. There are many things to consider.

How will the living arrangements work? Is there room for everyone? How will a new person in the house change the dynamics of those living there now? Will everyone get along? Are their lifestyles compatible? Does one smoke while the others don't? Does one make a lot of noise while the others might want quiet? Will someone lose living space? There's a lot to think about.

Is the home compatible with the needs of the elders? Is the house accessible for those with mobility issues who might use a cane, walker, or wheelchair? Or can it be made accessible? Are there adequate bathroom facilities that meet the needs of elders (walk-in showers with handholds and seats)? Will there be enough room for everyone's furniture and other belongings? Will someone have to give up some things to make it work?

Is the new neighborhood good for elders? Are there safe sidewalks and outdoor areas? Are there neighbors and people with whom the elder can socialize? What will happen to the elder's social life if they leave their current home and friends?

What sort of financial arrangements have you considered? Will the elders pay the children rent or share in expenses? How will that be accounted for? If upgrades are necessary to the house, who will pay? Will this make another sibling upset or lead to accusations of financial abuse? Financial issues often lead to fights among siblings when one starts dealing with the parents' money and perhaps even getting paid for services provided to the parents.

The care needs of the elders need to be considered. Is it something the children can do, or will there need to be paid caregivers? How does that fit into the financial plan? How will even more people in the house effect others' lives? What if the care needs of the elder change?

Are there other choices instead of moving in with an adult child? You should look at senior house options such as apartments, assisted living, and retirement communities. There are many new offerings today with various costs and amenities that make senior living possible without needing to move in with adult children. The old-fashioned extended family has great benefits for everyone involved and should be considered. Elders living with children and grandchildren can provide a great life experience for everyone involved. But it can be stressful and perhaps even a source of tension and strife for a family. The negative and positive aspects should be considered before you make such a big change in everyone's life.

Who Is Jesus?

Even during Jesus' own time, people were asking themselves this question. "Who then is this?" his disciples asked as they watched him wake from his nap and calm a violent Galilean storm with a simple rebuke (Mark 4.41). "Who is this?" the Jews asked themselves as they watched him forgive the sins of a woman who wept at his feet (Luke 7.49). Even officers sent to arrest him came back empty-handed, sheepishly telling their superiors that "No one ever spoke like this man!" (John 7.46). Clearly, Jesus was a man unlike any the Jews had experienced. But who was he?

Interestingly, that was a question Jesus himself asked his disciples. "Who do people say that I am?" (Mark 8.27-29). They gave him the various incorrect answers they had heard amongst their friends and acquaintances: "John the Baptist; and others say, Elijah; and others, one of the prophets." When Jesus asked them a follow-up question, "But who do YOU say that I am?," Peter correctly identified his teacher by declaring, "You are the Christ." Indeed, Jesus was the anointed deliverer that the Jews had long expected. But contrary to common expectations of the time, the kingdom Jesus created was never designed to conquer the world at the point of a sword. In fact, when Peter pulled out a sword on the night Jesus was arrested and attempted to fight with it, his master promptly told him to put it away (John 18.11). Because Jesus' kingdom is not of this world, his servants did not physically take up arms to fight (John 18.36).

Instead, Jesus set his eyes on conquering a much more formidable foe than the armies of Rome. Ironically, through the temporary humiliation of dying naked on a Roman cross, Jesus caused eternal humiliation to the devil and his followers. He "disarmed the rulers and authorities [in the spiritual realm] and put them to open shame" (Colossians 2.15). Because Satan is defeated, our spiritual debt of sin is now cancelled when we accept Jesus' lordship. Instead of simply spending his time addressing the surface problems of the world (poverty, disease, etc.), Jesus attacked the root cause of all suffering: sin and the one who brought it to Earth. This was precisely what God promised to do at the very beginning of Scripture after Adam and his wife committed the first sin. In speaking of the impending battle that would play out through the rest of time, God prophesied that a descendant of Eve would "bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel" (Genesis 3.14). Now, ever since his resurrection from death, Jesus has been sitting at the right hand of God, reigning as King and putting all his enemies under his feet (Hebrews 1.3).

Who is Jesus in your life? Is he simply a famous historical figure with his own particular spin on proper religious life? Or do you recognize him as the person he truly is: the conquering King of the universe, full of grace for his downtrodden creation? Have you surrendered yourself completely to this King?

CLOTHING SHED AT DUNSTABLE CHURCH IS OPEN!



The clothing donation shed at the Dunstable Evangelical Congregational

Church, **518 Main St, Dunstable MA,** which was temporarily closed due to global effects of the pandemic, is now open to the public.

If you're not familiar with the clothing donation shed, it's designed to give community members a uniquely clean, convenient, and well-cared-for option to donate their used clothing to. St. Pauly Textile Inc., the company that has provided the shed, partners with a network of businesses and various organizations to distribute donated items both here in the U.S. and worldwide, where they're ultimately re-worn by people who need them. The Dunstable Church additionally has the option to use donations to serve community needs.

With over 1,300 clothing drop-off sheds in place, St. Pauly Textile Inc. collects over 90,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries (including the U.S.) yearly. In 2019, the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills, which clothed an estimated 2.5 million people worldwide. 


