#### **DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK**

 Governor Baker has signed Chapter 5 of the Acts of 2021 which extends temporary changes to certain election laws that were implemented last fall. In response to the pandemic, Chapter 45 of the Acts of 2020 was enacted which allowed municipalities to delay the date of their town election and also approved "Vote by Mail" which allows voters to use a vote by mail application or any form of written communication to request a ballot. This act extends these temporary changes through June 30, 2021. There is a link to the vote by mail application on the Town Clerk page though any WRITTEN form of communication is acceptable as long as there is a signature. Unlike last fall when eligible voters received a postcard from the Secretary of the Commonwealth, this will not be done and it is up to the voter to submit an application or other written form of communication (please do not send me an email requesting a ballot unless you can scan your signature). AS OF THIS WRIT-ING, I am not aware the election is being postponed and is still scheduled for the third Tuesday of May per our bylaw. This act reduces the number of days from 20 to 10 before town meeting for voter registration deadline. As always, I encourage you to sign up for News and Announcements on the town website to keep informed.

• Town Clerk Office Hours - I will have appointments available usually on Mondays and Thursdays (sometimes this will change) and working remotely on Tuesday and Wednesday as the Town Hall as to stagger employees to comply with Governor Baker' orders. Please call or email to schedule appointments. Town Hall has reopened partially to the public, but it will continue to be staggered hours by departments until further notice. It is highly recommended you contact the office you want before coming in to be sure they are here to help you. Please see the notice from the Board of Selectmen/Town Administrator under News and Announcements on the home page of the town website.

#### DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH TOWN OF DUNSTABLE TRASH AND RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM

To all who subscribe to this, your yearly subscription with the Town of Dunstable will expire on June 30, 2021. Renewal options for July 1st, 2021 to June 30th, 2022 are available. You can mail a \$300.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. You may also pay on line, on the town webpage <a href="https://www.dunstable-ma.gov">www.dunstable-ma.gov</a> and choose on line payments.

You may join any time. The fee is pro-rated monthly. To sign up to participate in the weekly curbside pickup program contact the Board of Health at Town Hall. health@dunstable-ma.gov or call 978-649-4514 Ext. 229.

We supply a 35 gallon trash cart, enough for 3 kitchen trash bags and a 64 gallon recycle cart. We also sell overflow bags for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Those can be purchased on line. You will be contacted to make arrangements for pick up of containers or overflow bags at Town Hall.



## NURSING HOME RESIDENTS AND STIMULUS CHECKS

If your loved one in a nursing home got a stimulus payment from the Government will it affect their Medicaid benefits? First of all, if the person is not on Medicaid (MassHealth) then it doesn't matter, it's their money and they can do with it as they please. But, if the person is on Medicaid, they are supposed to have less than \$2000 so the receipt of a large check could put them over that limit and affect their benefits. What should you do then? Well, the good news is that these payments will not affect the Medicaid eligibility of the elder. The law was written to protect their Medicaid eligibility.

The stimulus checks are designed to go to individuals and not institutions, so if your loved one is in a nursing home and somehow the nursing home got the payment of the stimulus money, they should turn it over to the resident or to you to manage for the resident. The nursing home cannot keep it. Usually, income is not an issue for a Medicaid recipient as long as they spend the money within the month of receipt of the income, but the stimulus checks have been granted a special status, so they don't have to be spent within a month. You now have one year to spend that excess stimulus money. Also, income is part of the eligibility for Medicaid and income is supposed to be paid to the nursing home each month, but the stimulus checks are also not going to be counted as income under the Medicaid rules, so once again, the individual gets to keep and spend that money as they see fit.

That money does eventually have to be spent (within a year) so here are some ideas for spending it: If there is a spouse at home it could be used for them; various items could be purchased to make the senior's life better such as new clothing, electronics or other comfort items; extra food items such as chocolate treats or other snacks not available in the nursing home; medical equipment or dental services are a good idea as they might not be covered by Medicaid; if there are any uncovered future funeral expenses a burial account of up to \$2500 can be established for the person and it will become non-countable for eligibility purposes.

The Medicaid rules are complex, and they are always changing especially with new laws, rules, and the Bills coming out of Congress. If you have any questions about Medicaid, please contact your local Elder Law Attorney.

#### **OPEN BURNING SEASON**

Open Burning season will run through May 1st. The fee is \$10 for the season and the fee is exempt for property owners 65 years of age and older. You can do online Permit and Payment or Or obtain a Fire Permit at the Fire Station, 28 Pleasant St., Mon-Sun 8am-4pm. Due to the COVID Pandemic we have set up permit applications and a dropbox at the front and rear doors of the fire station to allow you to obtain a permit. We are limiting the amount of outside vistors to the station.

## You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

#### **Rules and Regulations**

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

#### Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- **1.** The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials. **2**. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators. 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.







#### MIDDLESEX SHERIFF'S OFFICE URGES RESIDENTS TO BE ALERT FOR SCAMS

MEDFORD, Mass. – The Middlesex Sheriff's Office is once again urging residents to be alert for ongoing imposter scams.

"Across the nation, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and Better Business Bureau (BBB) – among others – are warning of scams tied to tax filing season, economic impact payments (EIP) and even COVID vaccinations," said Middlesex Sheriff Peter J. Koutoujian. "At the Middlesex Sheriff's Office we want community members to be on guard and be able to immediately recognize these scams."

- When it comes to COVID vaccinations, for instance, the BBB warns that some immediate tell-tale signs a communication is a scam are if the person contacting you wants you to pay to put your name on a waiting list or pay for the vaccination. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention CDC), the vaccine is being provided "free of charge to all people living in the United States, regardless of their immigration or health insurance status."
- The MSO is also warning of continuing scams involving the alleged suspension or deactivation of Social Security numbers (<u>listento audio</u>). (*If you read this online this link is active*) According to the FTC, Social Security numbers do not get suspended.
- In all of the scams mentioned above and their variations (arrest, jury duty, etc.) the perpetrators are trying to either obtain money in the form of direct payment through things like prepaid debit or gift cards, or to access critical personal information like Social Security numbers, bank or credit card accounts, and passcodes.
- Residents who receive communications similar to these, are urged to: Immediately hang up, Never provide any personal information (Social Security or bank account numbers, etc.),Contact government agencies directly to verify the veracity of calls, emails, texts or letters

If you or a loved one have lost money or had your personal information comprised due to one of these schemes you are urged to immediately contact local authorities. Individuals may also report cases of fraud to the FTC via <a href="reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/">reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/</a>.


