# FLINT POND BOAT RAMP AND PARKING LOT CLOSED FOR DAM REPAIRS

The parking area and boat ramp off Flint Pond Road in Tyngsborough will be closed to the public from now until April 2022 to allow for dam repairs. The water level of Flint Pond will be lowered substantially during this time. Public access to these areas will be restored after the project is completed next spring.

The Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife (MassWildlife) is conducting the dam repairs as ordered by the Office of Dam Safety. The dam was deemed in poor condition due to overtopping and erosion of the earthen berm. During the construction period, areas near the dam and parking lot will be closed.

#### TOWN BEACH ON LAKE MASCUPPIC

In case you have been wondering. Work to renovate the Town Beach on Lake Mascuppic is now underway.

The project includes the installation of an ADA compliant walkway, the replacement of existing beach sand, restoration of the existing grass area, the installation of an irrigation system, and the construction of a retaining wall to separate the beach from the grass area. This project is funded largely by Community Preservation funds approved by the Community Preservation Committee and Town Meeting as well as a small amount from the Recreation Committee's revolving fund. The Town Beach is under the care and control of the Recreation Department.

The project is slated to be complete by early May 2021.

# NURSING HOME RESIDENTS AND STIMULUS CHECKS

If your loved one in a nursing home got a stimulus payment from the Government will it affect their Medicaid benefits? First of all, if the person is not on Medicaid (MassHealth) then it doesn't matter, it's their money and they can do with it as they please. But, if the person is on Medicaid, they are supposed to have less than \$2000 so the receipt of a large check could put them over that limit and affect their benefits. What should you do then? Well, the good news is that these payments will not affect the Medicaid eligibility of the elder. The law was written to protect their Medicaid eligibility.

The stimulus checks are designed to go to individuals and not institutions, so if your loved one is in a nursing home and somehow the nursing home got the payment of the stimulus money, they should turn it over to the resident or to you to manage for the resident. The nursing home cannot keep it. Usually, income is not an issue for a Medicaid recipient as long as they spend the money within the month of receipt of the income, but the stimulus checks have been granted a special status, so they don't have to be spent within a month. You now have one year to spend that excess stimulus money. Also, income is part of the eligibility for Medicaid and income is supposed to be paid to the nursing home each month, but the stimulus checks are also not going to be counted as income under the Medicaid rules, so once again, the individual gets to keep and spend that money as they see fit.

That money does eventually have to be spent (within a year) so here are some ideas for spending it: If there is a spouse at home it could be used for them; various items could be purchased to make the senior's life better such as new clothing, electronics or other comfort items; extra food items such as chocolate treats or other snacks not available in the nursing home; medical equipment or dental services are a good idea as they might not be covered by Medicaid; if there are any uncovered future funeral expenses a burial account of up to \$2500 can be established for the person and it will become non-countable for eligibility purposes.

The Medicaid rules are complex, and they are always changing especially with new laws, rules, and the Bills coming out of Congress. If you have any questions about Medicaid, please contact your local Elder Law Attorney.



  - HOUSE NUMBERS Is Your house Number Clearly Visible from the Street? Use Large Visible Numbers. Numbers need to be at least 4inches in height and facing the street. Put the numbers under lighting, and use numbers with a contrasting background so they will be visible at night. Be sure to use the E-911 address for the property. If your driveway is long, post your house number on both sides of a mailbox or sign pole at the end of the driveway near the road. Be sure to keep the numbers visible by trimming trees and bushes.

Hi there former Camp Kiwanis staff and campers! This is "Rainbow" (Paula Sweeney) one of the Camp Program Directors during Scottie (Muriel Lafond's) tenure as Camp Director. I have exciting news!

"Hmm, I want to linger". Many scouts found a place to linger at Camp Kiwanis. Many friendships were made that have lasted a lifetime. One of the people instrumental in these lasting friendships was Muriel "Scottie" Lafond. She served as director of Girl Scout Camp Kiwanis from 1978-1994 at which time the Girl Scout Camp was closed. As the director, she often worked at least nine months out of the year, putting a team of staff together who would present a program that girls have remembered for decades. She would pull the team together in January and develop the theme, which was used to develop the special events. She hired and trained the staff. She attended many Neighborhood Meetings and Open Houses to promote the camp. Scottie mentored and guided many women into important leadership roles.

In August, 1994, we were no longer allowed to linger at Camp Kiwanis. Our friendships, for some, were moved to Camp Machagamee in Pelham, NH. Our hearts will forever be filled with fond memories of "our camping days and friendships true" made at Camp Kiwanis. The Camp has been converted to Open Space. 



**Noel Soucy** creates abstracts in acrylics and alcohol inks. Her work is organic, full of energy. Making art offers Soucy a way to stay positive and healthy during difficult times. Swirling forms fill her canvases, inspired by ebb and flow of forms in nature. Eddies of color evoke clouds, water, even magnified images of cells.

For Soucy, each painting starts with a feeling or memory she wants to express. Image and texture evolve freely as she layers color and texture. She develops areas as they emerge, rubbing back and building up, scratching into the surface and working with palette knives plus various drawing tools and brushes to create a diversity of marks and colors. Soucy lives in York, Maine, and teaches at the Lane House Art Center in Hampton, New Hampshire, where she has a studio.

#### MIDDLESEX SHERIFF'S OFFICE URGES RESIDENTS TO BE ALERT FOR SCAMS

MEDFORD, Mass. – The Middlesex Sheriff's Office is once again urging residents to be alert for ongoing imposter scams.

"Across the nation, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and Better Business Bureau (BBB) – among others – are warning of scams tied to tax filing season, economic impact payments (EIP) and even COVID vaccinations," said Middlesex Sheriff Peter J. Koutoujian. "At the Middlesex Sheriff's Office we want community members to be on guard and be able to immediately recognize these scams."

- When it comes to COVID vaccinations, for instance, the BBB warns that some immediate tell-tale signs a communication is a scam are if the person contacting you wants you to pay to put your name on a waiting list or pay for the vaccination. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention CDC), the vaccine is being provided "free of charge to all people living in the United States, regardless of their immigration or health insurance status."
- The MSO is also warning of continuing scams involving the alleged suspension or deactivation of Social Security numbers (<u>listento audio</u>). (*If you read this online this link is active*) According to the FTC, Social Security numbers do not get suspended.
- In all of the scams mentioned above and their variations (arrest, jury duty, etc.) the perpetrators are trying to either obtain money in the form of direct payment through things like prepaid debit or gift cards, or to access critical personal information like Social Security numbers, bank or credit card accounts, and passcodes.
- Residents who receive communications similar to these, are urged to: Immediately hang up, Never provide any personal information (Social Security or bank account numbers, etc.),Contact government agencies directly to verify the veracity of calls, emails, texts or letters

If you or a loved one have lost money or had your personal information comprised due to one of these schemes you are urged to immediately contact local authorities. Individuals may also report cases of fraud to the FTC via <a href="reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/">reportfraud.ftc.gov/#/</a>.


