The Board of Health would like to announce that we have renewed our Trash and Recycling Contract for another 3 years with G.W. Shaw & Son with no increase in the subscription fee. This will be the 4<sup>th</sup> year that we have been able to keep the fee at \$300.00.

Your yearly subscription with the Town of Dunstable for the Curbside Trash and Recycling program will expire on June 30, 2021. Three renewal options are available.

You can mail a \$300.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827, or you can drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00 p.m. or use the mail slot in the side door of the Town Hall any time. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope. You may also pay on line on the town webpage <u>www.dunstable-ma.gov</u> and choose on line payments. Scroll down half way to Trash-Board of Health. New subscribers can use the same options.

We also sell overflow bags for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Those can be purchased on line or at the Town Hall. If you pay online you will have to come to the Town Hall to pick the bags up. Although there is not a specific spot to purchase the bags on line, just fill in the amount and we will recognize the amount is for the purchase of bags.

Please send your payments in as soon as possible to avoid an interruption in service.

It has been a busy year for **the Groton Dunstable Education Foundation** due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and its impact on our education system. #### LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED!!

The Trustees of the **Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship Trust** are pleased to announce the six graduating seniors from the town of Dunstable who have been chosen to receive this year's awards.

As a community, we are fortunate to have this trust that has been financially awarding Dunstable seniors since 2005. The benefactor of this scholarship, Helene Morgan Babcock, was one of seventeen children raised in Dunstable. Her family's home was destroyed by a fire in 1923, four years before she was born. Residents of Dunstable welcomed the family into their homes while the Morgan home was rebuilt. The gesture of community kindness was never forgotten by Helene's mother; she reminded her children "to never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable." #### **PROBLEMS WITH** SPRINGING POWERS OF ATTORNEY By Edward H. Adamsky, Attorney at Law

Your Durable Power of Attorney is one of your most important planning tools. It will allow a trusted person to handle your financial and legal affairs if you cannot do it yourself. Of course, you don't want your agent under the Power of Attorney to do anything now, you only want them to act when you cannot. So, this means many people think they only want a Power of Attorney that "springs" into effect upon their incapacity and not an "immediate" power. No one wants to give away any power until they have to, but there are major problems with Springing Powers of Attorney.

With a Durable Power of Attorney, you share your authority with the named Agent, who can be a family member, a friend, or any other trusted person. You do not give up any of your own authority to handle your affairs, you merely share it with the person named as your Agent. Most Powers of Attorney written by Elder Law Attorneys are immediately effective. That means the Agent has authority to act right away. Of course, the principal (the person signing the document) may not need or want the Agent to act right away, but an Elder Law Attorney knows it is best for the Agent to be able to act at a moment's notice.

Some lawyers write Powers of Attorney that are not immediate. Many forms you find online are like that too. Those forms have a clause that says the Agent's power only comes into effect upon the happening of an event such your incapacity. This is what we call a "Springing" power. The trouble is you then have to define that event and how you will prove the event has happened. Usually this is by saving that a Doctor must "certify in writing" that you are unable to handle your own affairs. This means that you have to be seen by a doctor, the doctor has to make the determination that you cannot handle your affairs, and then the doctor needs to be willing to put that in writing. All of this is logistically difficult and may delay or even totally stop the Agent from being able to get anything done.

If the Agent does get that letter or certificate signed by a Doctor, then the Agent will need to show that letter along with a copy of the Power of Attorney whenever he or she needs to act and to prove to a third-party that he has the power to act. That letter or certificate will probably be dated (as it should be) but that means that it will become "old" after a while and third parties may want to see a freshly dated letter which will require another meeting with the doctor and another attempt to get the doctor to sign a new certificate. This might repeat every few months for as long as necessary.

Any delay caused by needing to get the Doctor to sign off could mean that bills cannot be paid, money cannot be promptly moved from one account to another, or other legal documents, like a Medicaid application, cannot be signed and filed. These delays can cost money and limit the changes that could be made to account for a new and unexpected situation. You should discuss why an immediately effective Power of Attorney is right for you with your Elder Law Attorney.

#### Matt's Monthly Mechanical Memo By Matt Manning

Though small spaces, renovating a bath can be quite challenging as they contain more features than any other room besides a kitchen. Follow these simple tips for success. Plan the project first, to feel better about final results and costs. Make a list of likes and don't likes about the existing bath. Prioritize frequently touched items (such as faucets, toilets, shower valves), and those that support your lifestyle (dual vanity sinks). Put budget expectations into perspective while planning 10- 20% contingency for inevitable surprises.

Install a tub only if you actually take baths. If the home includes another family bath with a tub, omitting the tub in favor of a luxurious shower in the master makes sense.

#### "LET HIM HEAR"

#### By Nathan Combs

Imagine for a moment that you're a 1st century Jew in Roman Palestine. You have heard about an impressive young rabbi from the unlikely town of Nazareth. You've even met fellow Jews who have witnessed his miracles or heard him teach in their local synagogues. When you learn that he is coming to teach nearby, you decide to go see him for yourself. As you arrive at the edge of the Sea of Galilee, you join the massive crowd that presses around Jesus. You watch as he climbs into a boat and begins to teach.

To your surprise, however, everything Jesus speaks is in riddles. You start to get excited about his repeated talk about "the kingdom of heaven," but there is no follow-up declaration of war against the Roman oppressors. There is no impassioned political speech. There are no recruiters working the crowd to construct a rebel army. Instead, Jesus simply gives parables! He speaks about a strange farmer who indiscriminately throws his seeds everywhere, even in places where he knows it won't grow. He speaks about a treasure hidden in a field, which is found by a man who sells everything he has to buy that field to obtain the treasure. He speaks of a tiny mustard seed which grows up to become a large shade tree for nearby birds. As Jesus unfolds parable after parable, you never hear him offer any explanation for these cryptic teachings. As he wraps up and begins to dismiss the crowd, he simply looks around and says: "He who has ears, let him hear." As the crowd begins to dissolve, you can't help scratching your head at what you've heard. You now have a choice to make: either approach Jesus and ask for understanding or simply walk away like most of the others are doing.

This was the choice of many Jews that Jesus interacted with, since he always spoke to large crowds in parables only (Matthew 13.34). Privately he explained their meanings to his disciples and told them that the "secrets of the kingdom" were exclusively given to them and not to everyone else (Matthew 13.11). Why would Jesus purposefully withhold those explanations from the many and give them to the few? The answer is simple: the disciples were the only ones who pursued him with questions! All of the others were uninterested in further inquiry because "seeing they do not see, and hearing they do not hear, nor do they understand" (Matthew 13.13).

As we read the parables or any other part of God's word, we are faced with the same choice. Will we pay close attention and then ask questions from the text? Will we continually return to those words to dig out more treasure to enjoy and share with others? Or will we casually walk away from Jesus, too preoccupied by our own desires to care deeply about what he taught? He who has ears, let him hear.

#### **PREVENT TICK BITES**

Ticks can make you sick when they bite you. They are most commonly found in grassy, brushy, or wooded areas. They only attach when you come into direct contact with them — they cannot jump or fly. Follow these steps if you live, work, or spend time in areas where ticks are present:

• Check yourself for ticks once a day — it's the single most important thing you can do.

• Use repellents that contain DEET on your exposed skin and those that contain permethrin on your clothes.

• When walking or hiking, stick to main pathways and the center of trails if you can. Brushing against tall grass and bushes will increase your exposure to ticks.

• Weather permitting, wear long-sleeved, light-colored shirts and long pants tucked into socks. This will help keep ticks away from your skin and make it easier to spot ticks on your clothing.

• Because dogs and horses are particularly susceptible, talk to your veterinarian about the best ways to protect your animals from tick-borne disease.

#### **PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES**

Mosquitoes can spread diseases that make you sick. In Massachusetts, mosquitoes can give you <u>eastern equine encephalitis</u> (<u>EEE</u>) virus or <u>West Nile virus (WNV</u>). Only a small number of mosquitoes are infected at any given time, so being bitten by a mosquito does not mean you will get sick. However, the best way to avoid both of these illnesses is to prevent mosquito bites.

• Drain standing water in and around your house or yard to prevent mosquito breeding.

• Repair window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of your home.

- Use a mosquito repellent with an EPA-registered ingredient according to the directions on the label.
- Wear clothing to reduce exposed skin when weather permits. For more information about preventing mosquito and tickborne illness, visit <u>www.mass.gov/mosquitoesandticks</u>.
