DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

The amendments to the Town of Dunstable General Bylaw adopted under Article 22 of the warrant for the Annual Town Meeting of May 15, 2021 (Advisory Board) and Article 23 (Stormwater Management), were approved by the Attorney General on August 30, 2021 and are hereby published by posting in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 32 as amended. A portion of the Advisory Board bylaw, approved by the voters, was disapproved by the Attorney General with the following comments: Article 22 - Except for the text in Section 1 establishing the quorum as a majority of the Advisory Committee then serving on the Board, as indicated below in bold and underline, we approve the changes adopted under Article 22. "There shall be an Advisory Board consisting of six legal voters of the town, each of whom shall be elected for a term of three (3) years on the Official Ballot of the Annual Town Meeting. No elective town officer shall be eligible or qualified to serve on said Board. A quorum of the Board shall be a majority of the members then serving on the Board, but in no event shall the quorum be less than three (3). An affirmative vote of the Board shall require a majority of the members present and voting at a meeting. but in no event less than three (3)." We disapprove and delete the text in bold and underlined above because, in the absence of a statutory restriction, the general rule is that a majority of a council or board is a quorum. Merrill v. Lowell, 236 Mass. 463, 467 (1920); see also Clark v. City Council of Waltham, 328 Mass. 40, 41 (1951). The by-law text that provides "A quorum of the Board shall be a majority of the members then serving on the Board" lowers the quorum requirement for the Advisory Board. For example, if only 5 members are serving on the 6-member Advisory Board, a quorum would be 3 members (a majority of the 5 members then serving) rather than 4 (a majority of the 6-member board). Because the Town cannot by by-law impose a quorum requirement different from what is required under state law, we disapprove and delete the text in bold and underlined above from Section 1.

A copy of these amendments and bylaws may be examined or obtained at the Offices of the Town Clerk by appointment at the Dunstable Town Hall.

Let's look at some common signs of a water heater failing. Recognizing them can help homeowners be prepared, and avoid costly, unexpected emergency repairs and untimely replacements. Bathing in cold water is no fun!

Discolored or Gritty Water: Rusty, gritty or muddy-looking water can mean the anode rod is gone, and the tank is corroding.

Water Smells or Tastes Off: Water that smells like sulfur or rotten eggs may indicate an interaction between bacteria in the water and the anode rod can create this problem.

Leaking Water: Water heater leaking can occur because of sediment buildup, lack of maintenance, or simply due to deterioration. The relief (TPR) valve dripping can be a sign of dangerous pressures developing in the tank.

If you notice any of these, seek prompt help from a licensed plumber to identify the cause and to remedy the situation.

THE SANDWICH GENERATION STUCK IN THE MIDDLE

Caring for an aging parent, while also caring for your own children, can bring the strongest person to their knees. Just when you thought you might get parenting right, you now have to be the good child and "do the right thing" for your folks. How are you supposed to do it all, and what is it that you are supposed to do?

The first thing to keep in mind is that your adult parent is not a child and is used to being in control and autonomous. It's difficult for them to admit they need help, and they may resist you. The reversal of roles is hard for them as well as you. Second, you must set realistic goals and define your role as a helper to your parent. You may not want or need to be an actual caregiver; you may just need to coordinate care.

If you have siblings, have a meeting, and work out the structure of what needs to be done and who will do what. If there are paid caregivers, one person should be the liaison with the care agency so conflicting orders are not given. If one of the children will be paying the bills, then that person needs a Power of Attorney to show to third-parties and should have bills sent to their attention.

Consider your parent's health issues and ensure they get to the right medical providers, that their prescriptions are filled, and that medicines are taken on time and in the right dosage. Make sure there is a completed Health Care Proxy and HIPAA medical privacy release and copies are provided to the medical providers. The Health Agent should coordinate these issues.

You must look at physical limitations and your parent's living conditions. Is their home accessible and safe for their needs? You might need to hire someone to make some modifications to the home. Or you might need a discussion about your parent moving to a place that is safer. All of the family members should be part of this difficult discussion.

If your parent has cognitive issues, then you may need to ensure that caregivers are in place to help with medication management, meal preparation, and personal hygiene. You will need to make sure your parent is safe at all times which may require constant attendance by an aid or a move to Assisted Living. Consider your parent's mental health issues as well. Folks get depressed with all of these changes. Seek professional help to ensure your parent's social and personal needs are fulfilled.

Keep your own family in mind. Don't neglect your spouse or children's needs. Strive to achieve a balance between your parents and your own family. Don't overdo it with one and forget the other. Keep in mind that you don't have to do it all. Ask for help from all of your family and utilize professional assistance as necessary to ensure that you and your family are not neglected while trying to care for your parents. If your children are old enough, you can enlist them with the situation. The companionship of a grandchild can be just what your parents may need the most to help them to continue enjoying life to the fullest.



The Board of Health would like to announce that we have renewed our Trash and Recycling Contract for another 3 years with G.W. Shaw & Son with no increase in the subscription fee. This will be the 4th year that we have been able to keep the fee at \$300.00.

If you are new to the program, and are signing up in October the amount due is \$225 for the rest of the year. You can mail a check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827, or you can drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00 p.m. or use the mail slot in the side door of the Town Hall any time. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope. You may also pay on line on the town webpage www.dunstable-ma.gov and choose on line payments. Scroll down half way to Trash-Board of Health.

Residents who are new to the program will need to arrange to pickup their trash and recycling containers at Town Hall with the Board of Health after initial signup. Board of Health asks that such pickup be arranged for Tuesdays from 12pm to 4pm and Wednesdays & Thursdays from 9am to 2pm. Other times available by appointment. We also sell overflow bags for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. FALL HUNTING SEASONS

As the air cools, the leaves change, and hopefully the rain stops more people take to fields and forests surrounding Dunstable to enjoy the resources that we have. That includes those participating in the sport of hunting.

The first of the fall hunting seasons opened on Sept. 1st, many other seasons open in the following weeks.

While Dunstable has a firearms discharge ordinance that requires the permission of the land owner, or the board of Selectmen for public property, this ordinance does not apply to the various Wildlife Management Areas in town that are owned by the Commonwealth.





TYNGSBOROUGH POLICE OFFER HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

During Halloween festivities, Chief Richard D. Howe and the Tyngsborough Police Department ask that the community put safety first, especially for those who plan on trick-or-treating or who will be out at night. Halloween, which is celebrated on Oct. 31, falls on a Sunday this year. "This holiday is sure to be a fun time for all, whether you're out in your neighborhood gathering candy, or celebrating with friends at home," Chief Howe said. "No matter your choice of activity, always remember to put safety first."

The Centers for Disease Control provides best practices for Halloween trick-or-treaters by asking that people follow the "Safe Halloween" motto.

• Swords, knives and other costume accessories should be short, soft and flexible. • Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult. • Fasten reflective tape on costumes and bags to help drivers see you. • Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before you eat them. • Hold a flashlight while walking to ensure that you are visible. Walk and don't run from house to house. • Always test make up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eye irritation. • Lower your risk of serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses. · Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible. • Only walk on sidewalks wherever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe and to prevent accidents or injury. • Wear well-fitting masks, costumes and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls. • Eat only factory-wrapped candy. Avoid eating homemade treats offered by strangers. • Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Don't accept rides from strangers. • Never walk near lit candles or devices with open flames. Be sure to wear flame-

Those who are planning on attending a party should remember:

- Many young children are out for the evening, especially during the peak hours of 6:00-8:00 p.m., so drive slowly!
- Not to drive a vehicle while wearing any sort of mask. Your visibility could be obscured.
- To have a designated driver if attending an adult Halloween party where alcohol is served.

BUYING A FIXER-UPPER: 5 THINGS TO KNOW

In today's busy market, many homebuyers have found themselves weighing options they would normally pass by.

One of the more common compromises is to consider a home that needs some work.

On the plus side, fixer-uppers often come with lower prices, less competition and a lower-pressure sale on the whole. Still, they're not without challenges.

Are you considering a fixer-upper? Here are five things to think about first

- **1. You may need an alternative mortgage program.** If you want to finance the home purchase and the renovations and repairs the property needs, you might consider loans like the FHA 203(k) loan or the Fannie Mae HomeStyle loan. Your loan officer can help you choose the best option for your purchase.
- 2. There may be appraisal and inspection issues. If the home is in disrepair, you might face challenges with your inspection or appraisal. This is especially true if you're using an FHA, USDA or VA loan, as properties must meet strict requirements with these programs.
- **3. You should have a backup living space.** You might not want to end your lease or sell your existing home just yet. If the property needs serious repairs or renovations, you'll probably need to live off-site until they're complete.
- **4.** You may want to bring a contractor along when you tour the home. This will help you gauge what repairs might be necessary and how much they'll likely cost.


