TYNGSBOROUGH TO PARTNER WITH HELPSY FOR CURBSIDE TEXTILE PICK UP

Tyngsborough, Massachusetts- Town Administrator Matthew Hanson announced this month that effective October 1, 2021, the Town of Tyngsborough will partner with HELPSY to offer free curbside pick-up of clothing and household textiles to residents. Pickups will happen weekly. Residents can schedule their pickup online by visiting helpsy.co/tyngsboroughma. Clothing and other textiles should be bagged and left on the curb by 7:00 AM on the day of the scheduled pick up. HELPSY will begin pick up the first week of October. HELPSY is the largest clothing and textile collector in the Northeast and partners with municipalities and organizations across ten states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles. Through a combination of clothing drives, home pick-ups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles, HELPSY has helped communities divert nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills last year.

According to the EPA, textile waste is one of the fastest growing waste streams in the United States...occupying nearly 5% of all landfill space. The U.S. throws away 36 billion pounds of textiles each year which equates to nearly 100 pounds per person. Each pound that is discarded in Tyngsborough's waste stream costs the tax payers money by increasing our bill for trash removal. Using HELPSY to divert these textiles is not only the right thing to do for our environment, but for our wallets as well.

HELPSY accepts clean, dry, and bagged clothing and fashion accessories (stained, worn, and torn is fine). This includes dresses, shirts, pants, suits, coats, gloves, hats, belts, ties, scarves, wallets, purses, backpacks, totes, shoes, towels, bedding, costumes, curtains, placemats, tablecloths, and throw rugs. They will not accept breakable houseware or glass, electronics, furniture, building material, scrap metal, appliances, mattresses, encyclopedia sets, phone books, or magazines.

HELPSY will replace the current textile pick up program offered by Simple Recycling. All curbside pickup effective 10/1 will be handled through HELPSY at the link above.



MOSQUITOES WEST NILE VIRUS (WNV) AND **EASTERN EQUINE ENCEPHALITIS (EEE)**

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (DPH) on Sept. 1, 2021 announced the first human case of West Nile virus (WNV) in the state this year. The individual is a female in her 80s who was likely exposed to the virus in Middlesex County, an area known to be at moderate risk.

This is the first time that West Nile virus infection has been identified in a person in Massachusetts this year," said Acting Public Health Commissioner Margret Cooke. "Risk from West Nile virus has been slow to increase this year. This is an important reminder that we all need to continue to take steps to protect ourselves and our families from mosquito bites."

Although late in the season, the substantial amount of rain in the region in July and the recent hot weather have resulted in an increase in the population of the Culex species of mosquitoes, known to spread West Nile virus and breed in places where standing water accumulates.

People have an important role to play in protecting themselves and their loved ones from illnesses caused by mosquitoes.

Avoid Mosquito Bites

Apply Insect Repellent when Outdoors. Use a repellent with DEET (N, N-diethyl-m-toluamide), permethrin, picaridin (KBR 3023), oil of lemon eucalyptus [p-menthane 3, 8-diol (PMD)], or IR3535 according to the instructions on the product label. DEET products should not be used on infants under two months of age and should be used in concentrations of 30% or less on older children. Oil of lemon eucalyptus should not be used on children under three years of age.

Be Aware of Peak Mosquito Hours. The hours from dusk to dawn are peak biting times for many mosquitoes. Consider rescheduling outdoor activities that occur during the evening or early morning.

Clothing Can Help Reduce Mosquito Bites. Wear long-sleeves. long pants, and socks when outdoors to help keep mosquitoes away from your skin.

Mosquito-Proof Your Home

Drain Standing Water. Mosquitoes lay their eggs in standing water. Limit the number of places around your home for mosquitoes to breed by either draining or discarding items that hold water. Check rain gutters and drains. Empty any unused flowerpots and wading pools and change the water in birdbaths frequently.

Install or Repair Screens. Keep mosquitoes outside by having tightly fitting screens on all of your windows and doors.

Protect Your Animals

Animal owners should reduce potential mosquito breeding sites on their property by eliminating standing water from containers such as buckets, tires, and wading pools - especially after heavy rains. Water troughs provide excellent mosquito breeding habitats and should be flushed out at least once a week during the summer months to reduce mosquitoes near paddock areas. Horse owners should keep horses in indoor stalls at night to reduce their risk of exposure to mosquitoes. Owners should also speak with their veterinarian about mosquito repellents approved for use in animals and vaccinations to prevent WNV and Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE). If an animal is diagnosed with WNV or EEE, owners are required to report to DAR, Division of Animal Health by calling 617-626-1795 and to the Department of Public Health (DPH) by calling 617-983-6800.

More information, including all WNV and EEE positive results, can be found on the Arbovirus Surveillance Information web page at www.mass.gov/dph/mosquito or by calling the DPH Epidemiology Program at 617-983-6800.

NOTE: A hard or killing frost will kill virtually all exposed mosquitoes. A hard frost is defined as 2 consecutive hours at a temperature below 28 degrees Fahrenheit. A female mosquito can live up to 100 days and lay anywhere between 200 and 300 eggs, so she is continually feeding.

TEXTILE RECOVERY: WORN OR TORN, DONATE IT ALL!

Sustainable Tyngsborough

Don't throw that single sock or ripped towel in the trash, it has more life in it! Nearly 6% of the waste delivered to combustion facilities for disposal is clothing, curtains, towels and other fabrics. That's 230,000 tons of textiles, annually.

Did you know that 95% of unwanted textiles can be reused or recycled for other purposes? A ripped towel will likely find a new life as an industrial wiping rag, while your gently used jeans will be sent to a thrift store to be worn again.

Clothing reuse is a big deal. It reduces the enormous environmental burden of the second most polluting industry in the world.

Waste Ban updates now include textiles.

MassDEP has added textiles to the state-wide list of waste ban materials. This means that clothing, rags and other fabrics are no longer allowed to be landfilled or incinerated under state law and must be diverted from the trash. You can help by separating these materials and donating them for reuse or recycling.

Those affected by the Vietnam "Blue Water" rule as well as amendments to V.A. laws have opened the door for Veterans to receive more of what they deserve.

Do you know a neighbor or friend who may be a Veteran, Veteran widower, widow or dependents of a Veteran, that may be eligible for financial assistance from my office. MASSHEALTH ESTATE RECOVERY NOTICE

Over the Summer the MassHealth Agency, which is the part of the State that runs the Medicaid program, sent out notices to all those receiving benefits with copies often going to family members. These notices really frightened everyone who got one. What they were though was a standard review of the rules of "Medicaid Estate Recovery." There may have been some sort of provision in the recent Covid relief bills, or some new Federal rule, that made them send out the notices, but nothing about the Estate Recovery system was changed.

The rule is that if someone received MassHealth (Medicaid) benefits after the age of 55, and none of the exceptions apply, then whatever assets may be left in that person's name after their death will be subject to paying back the benefits received by that person. There is no recovery during life, it only happens after the person on

That means if your mother is in a nursing home on MassHealth, but she was allowed to keep her home, after her death, the Executor of her Estate will get a bill from MassHealth for whatever amount it paid the nursing home. That bill will need to be paid and the only way to pay it may be to sell the house. The bill might be bigger in value than the house value, but MassHealth can only get what there is and not more.

There are some exemptions and exceptions to the Estate Recovery rules. Certain people have protections after a family member has died that would allow them to avoid the recovery bill and to keep assets. The rules are complex, and the exceptions are very particular, so if you have a family member whose estate will be subject to possible Medicaid Estate Recovery, you will want to consult with an Elder Law Attorney to see if any of the exceptions might apply, and how to utilize the system to your advantage.

Do not worry that MassHealth is coming to take any assets away from you. They do not do that. They just send a bill and expect to be paid (and the estate of the deceased person may have to pay) but you won't have to pay with your own money if you weren't the one on Medicaid. If you need answers about Medicaid/MassHealth, please consult with an experience Attorney. Don't panic over a notice that you may have received in the mail.

The deadline is the 10th of each month, for the next month's issue.



"I FELL ON MY FACE"

History is full of human rulers who sat in majestic palaces and demanded the respect of those who entered their presence. But regardless of their ornate apparel and commanding voices, those human rulers were simply men. While men might have guivered in their throne rooms, they did not dissolve into dust by gazing at the glory of kings.

Beholding the Almighty King of the universe is a different matter entirely. When Moses asked to see the face of God, he was told: "you cannot see my face, for man shall not see me and live" (Exodus 33.20). The full glory of the King of Kings is such that mortal man is inherently unable to behold it without destruction. This point was so well understood that many in the Old Testament even feared to have conversations with angels (Genesis 32.20, Judges 6.22-23, 13.22). During the days of Moses, when God spoke to the people from Mount Sinai and revealed himself in a shrouded form of smoke and fire, the Israelites were amazed they lived to tell the tale: "Behold, the Lord our God has shown us his glory and greatness, and we have heard his voice out of the midst of the fire. This day we have seen God speak with man, and man still live" (Deuteronomy 5.24).

God gave several of his prophets diluted visions of his grandeur before sending them to preach his messages. Ezekiel is a good example of both the awesome glory of God and the proper human response. In Ezekiel chapter one, the prophet first saw a stormy wind coming from the north with flashes of fire and something like gleaming metal. Out of this ominous storm he saw four "living creatures" with wings and multiple faces. Beside the creatures was the appearance of wheels within wheels that were full of eyes. Above this remarkable picture was a throne, upon which God himself was seated in an appearance of fire, gleaming metal, and rainbow. All of this was described by Ezekiel as "the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord" (Ezekiel 1.28). As glorious as this vision was, it was still several steps removed from the truest form of God's glory. But what was the prophet's reaction? "And when I saw it, I fell on my face."

Do you and I fall on our faces, too? Some people tremble with excitement and fear to shake the hand of a human celebrity, but they think of the God of the Bible with a yawn. Some people pour over magazines and internet articles to gain juicy details about Ben Affleck's current relationship status, but they have not given attention to the messages of the Holy One. If we are living on his earth, we are standing in his throne room. Those who accept his son's sacrifice on the cross are allowed to "behold the glory of the Lord" with "unveiled face," as we are transformed to reflect His glory (2 Corinthians 3.18). Have you trembled before your King?
