#### TYNGSBOROUGH BOARD OF HEALTH HOUSEHOLD YARD WASTE COLLECTION

If you missed the collection on Saturday, November 6th, remember you can get your bags ready for pick up on Saturday, November 20th

Place all yard waste in open barrels or yard waste bags. Twigs and sticks (less than 4 inches in diameter) may be tied and bundled. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected.

Leaves and grass clippings *must be placed* in compostable PAPER LEAF BAGS (available at local stores such as Home Depot. Walmart, Market Basket, True Value Hardware stores, etc.), dry cardboard boxes or trash barrels. Boxes and barrels will be emptied and left at the curb.

..Do NOT place yard waste in plastic bags! .. Leaves and grass clippings in plastic bags or wet cardboard boxes will not be collected. ..Flower and vegetable garden waste may also be included. Grass clippings may be included with leaves or may be bagged separately. .. Pinecones, pine needles and small twigs that are raked up with leaves may be included. .. Paper leaf bags do not need to be closed at the top, but please do not let them stand in puddles of water.

# CHEMICAL RESTRAINTS IN NURSING HOMES

Every resident of a nursing home is entitled to appropriate physical and medical care. Each person should be treated as an individual and given only the care that meets their needs. But in the real world, some nursing homes are understaffed and overcrowded, and cannot keep up with the needs of the residents. This leads to the overuse of antipsychotic drugs, not to treat a medical diagnosis such as Schizophrenia or Bipolar Disorder, but to control behavior (often called "chemical restraints" as physical restraints have been outlawed for many years). The use of drugs helps to "calm" the residents allows the staff to handle them more easily. This isn't the proper use of medication and violates the rights of the residents. Many antipsychotic drugs are contraindicated for elders with dementia and can lead to an increased risk of death.

Sometimes those with dementia are unable to find the words to express themselves and so act out their needs. A person might moan to show pain, or shout to show anger or frustration. These actions should not be dismissed as meaningless and should be evaluated and dealt with appropriately. Actions such as distress, agitation, screaming, hitting, confusion, fear, crying or anger may all indicate that the person needs care, not shutting up.

Sometimes medical conditions or other medications might show up as adverse behavior. The behavior needs to be reviewed and the cause determined so the person can get the right treatment. But in many cases, the choice is to just give drugs that will calm the patient down and stifle the behavior rather than finding the cure to the actual problem. This is not an appropriate treatment of the resident.

You can try to determine if your loved-one is a victim of over-medication by looking for the following symptoms (among others): Difficulty waking to eat or to speak; disordered thinking, hallucinations, depression, or delusions; dry mouth, decreased appetite; repetitive, and involuntary movements of the head, tongue, fingers, and toes.

You should review your loved-one's medication list and ask why any particular medicine was ordered and what symptoms or behavior prompted it. Ask if the medication is specifically directed to the symptom or cause of the illness and if there are other nondrug options. Ask what might have been done to treat the symptom before trying the medication in question. Ask for the plan of use and ending the use.

Some of the common antipsychotic medications are (brand name/generic name): Risperdal/Risperidone; Zyprexa/Olanzapine; Seroquel/Quetiapine Fumarate; Abilify/Aripiprazole; Haldol/Haloperidol; Clozaril/Clozapine; Depakote/Divalproex; Ativan/Lorazepam; Paxil/Paroxetine. Many come with a "black box" warning that says they should not be given to patients with dementia.

If you suspect your loved-one in a nursing home has been given drugs for an inappropriate reason you should speak with the medical director of the facility and consider contacting the state ombudsman for nursing homes. In Massachusetts call (617) 727-7750.

No one wants to start the year with boiler troubles. How do you know whether to repair or replace? Let's looks at some of the factors to consider in making a decision.

# THE MERCY OF GOD'S CORRECTION By Nathan Combs

It is often uncomfortable to receive reproof, especially in our American culture which focuses so much on the autonomy of the individual. For a variety of reasons, it is easy for us to view correction as inherently unkind, unnecessary, and oppressive. How can the Scriptures unashamedly declare that God disciplines the hearts of those who submit to his lordship? Why should we submit to the Lord's correction? Hebrews 12.7-11 reveals three main ideas.

First, God's discipline demonstrates his love. Perhaps this seems counter-intuitive at first. Surely love means allowing people to exercise their free will, not interfering with their choices. However, the Hebrew Christians are told in verse 7: "God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline?" As a father of a young toddler, I would not show love to my son if I allowed him to naively choose playing in a busy road rather than in the safety of our yard. Therefore, out of concern for his wellbeing, I must prevent him from carrying out his choice and teach him a better way, despite his momentary disappointment. In the same way, God does not allow me to continue in character traits or beliefs that are harmful to me and to the lives of others.

Secondly, God always disciplines perfectly. Verses 9 and 10 tells us: "Besides this, we have had earthly fathers who disciplined us and we respected them. Shall we not much more be subject to the Father of spirits and live? For they disciplined us for a short time as it seemed best to them, but he disciplines us for our good." Although it's a no-brainer for me to gently teach my son not to play in the

road, there are a myriad of other parenting decisions that are not as straight-forward! Despite good intentions, I have certainly made many parenting mistakes, as my father also made with me. But fortunately for us, the training which the heavenly Father provides is always the best possible discipline. He never temporarily loses his temper, abuses his authority, or forgets his perspective on what we need. He is always moving us towards the goal of "sharing his holiness" (vs. 10).


Third, the end result of God's discipline is beautiful. Verse 11: "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it." Perhaps you can still remember painful moments as a child when your disrespect or disobedience was addressed. Now, I regard the imperfect efforts of my parents as a mercy. I'm now thankful for the training, the chores, the schooling, and the many long conversations that shifted my perspective in needed ways. Likewise, the discipline of God is a mercy in far greater ways than we have the capacity to understand. Let's rejoice in it.

#### FOOD WASTE AND SUSTAINABILITY

Food waste is an extremely important sustainability issue. According to FoodPrint (https://foodprint.org/) Americans waste roughly 40 percent (125 to 160 billion pounds) of their food. Food waste causes unnecessary greenhouse gas emissions and water consumption as well as energy waste.

<u>Greenhouse Gas Emissions</u>: According to FoodPrint, only five percent of food waste is composted in the US and as a result, uneaten food is a large component of municipal solid waste. In landfills, food gradually breaks down to form methane, a greenhouse gas that's up to 86 times more powerful than carbon dioxide.

<u>Water Consumption</u>: Food waste is responsible for more than 25% of all freshwater consumption in the US each year, and is among the leading causes of freshwater pollution.

<u>Energy Waste</u>: Household food losses are responsible for eight times the energy waste of farm-level food losses due to the energy used along the food supply chain and in preparation.

How to Reduce Food Waste: Try not to over-buy. This will help eliminate food spoilage and the amount of food you would dispose of. Try not to over-prepare. The upcoming holiday season means holiday dinners with friends and family. We also know that means a lot of leftovers. Can you reduce leftovers by reducing how much you prepare? If you do end up with more leftovers than you anticipated, turn them into new meals. Homemade soups, stews, and casseroles are very popular dishes that use leftover food.

What to do with your Food Waste: Turn food scraps and food waste into rich compost! Consider beginning your own composting effort. You can purchase a compost bin from the Board of Health. If you aren't able to compost, you could subscribe to a curbside food waste collection service from a company such as Black Earth Compost (blackearthcompost.com). With services like this, you receive compost in return. A win-win situation!






