DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

The 2021 official population as reported by the Town Clerk is 3,395. This represents a small increase from 2020 where 3,364 was reported.

- The Annual Street listing will be mailed the first week of January 2022. It will include a dog license application. In case you are new to Massachusetts, the annual street listing is a legal document of the Commonwealth and must be returned each year to remain on the active voter list. Pursuant to MA law, your name can then be removed from the voting list for failure to return the street listing after 2 years. If you do not receive one by the end of January, please contact this office.
- Are you interested in running for a town board position? A list of open offices will be certified and published after the New Year. The legislation to change the position of Town Clerk from elected to appointed has passed the House and is with the Senate. We remain hopeful it will be resolved before the registrars certify vacancies for 2022. If it has not passed, the vacancy will be certified as an elected position. I am retiring in May (I'm not ready to say goodbye just yet....). If the position remains elected, the candidate must be a resident of Dunstable. If appointed, they can interview candidates from outside of town.
- 2022 is a busy election year. The date of the September primary is still being debated as is the Vote by Mail program and identification requirements at the polls so stay tuned to this section and the town website for updates.

Dog licenses will begin in early January. All dogs, 6 months and older must be licensed. If you reserved a personal dog tag number, your dog must be licensed by the end of January or the number will be passed on (I'm not sure whether the new Town Clerk will offer this program). We have to account for the dog numbers each month with the Accountant (monies in). Seniors, age 70 and older, have the fee waived pursuant to a town meeting vote. The dogs must still be licensed.

• Town Clerk Office Hours – Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays from 9:00 am – 1:00 pm and working remote one day, usually Wednesday, depending on what deadlines, etc., I'm working with that particular week. It is best to call ahead. This office will be closed for vacation December 27 – January 10 but Lynn DeNyse will be here issuing dog licenses, hours and days are still to be determined.

WILD AND SCENIC RIVERS STEWARDSHIP COUNCIL ANNOUNCES 2022 COMMUNITY GRANTS AVAILABLE

The Nashua, Squannacook, and Nissitissit Rivers Wild and Scenic Stewardship Council announces the second year of their Community Grants program. The program aims to engage municipalities and local organizations in protecting the rivers' resources and building strong local stewardship of the rivers.

Applications will be accepted from the communities along the Wild and Scenic designated rivers (in MA: Ayer, Bolton, Dunstable, Groton, Harvard, Lancaster, Pepperell, Shirley, and Townsend; in NH: Brookline and Hollis). *Applications are due by February 1, 2022 with awards announced in March, 2022.*

Projects funded in the 2021 program included signs for Ayer's waterways and ponds, a connecting trail in Bolton, riverside tree planting in Brookline, a management plan and training on invasive plants in Pepperell, riverbank stabilization in Townsend, and support for restoring a historical cooperage in Townsend.

OPEN BURNING SEASON BEGINS JANUARY 15TH

Dunstable Fire Chief, Paul Zbikowski announced that Open Burning season will soon begin and will end on May1st. Permits are available daily from 9:30am to 12:30pm at the Fire Station on Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65".

Agricultural Permits are \$15. Call for more info.

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION
You must follow all the rules and regulations
that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.



TOWN OF DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH TRASH & RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM

The Town offers a trash & recycling pickup program for all residents. The fee is \$300.00 per year valid July through June of each year. The fee drops by \$25.00 each month. As an example, if you join in August the yearly fee will be \$275.00. All subscriptions expire on June 30th each year. The subscription includes a 35-gallon trash container and a 64-gallon recycling container.

We also offer overflow bags for sale for \$3.00 each in rolls of 5 for \$15.00 for those weeks that you cannot fit all your trash in the grey trash container. Our pickup day is every week on Thursday. There are 6 holidays that will change that date to Friday. That list will be given to you when you sign up. On occasion the weather might also change that day to a Friday. That announcement will appear on the town website cover page under news.

If you would like to sign up for pickup you may do so at www. dunstable-ma.gov and go to online payments. Scroll down halfway down the page for Board of Health - trash. You may also purchase overflow bags at the same website by filling in the amount and we will recognize the amount is for bags. THE FOOLISHNESS OF JESUS

You and I are naturally attracted to well-built, stylish, accomplished people who exude an air of command. We are drawn to eloquent messages that dwell on human potential and achievement. We long to become part of elite groups of people that draw the admiring gaze of others.

Surprisingly, Christianity does not cater to any of these inclinations, despite man's repeated attempts to make it fit our molds. Think of the chief architect, Jesus of Nazareth. After he was born, he was not laid in a jewel-encrusted crib, but in an animal trough (Luke 2.7). Although he descended from King David, Jesus was born into a lowly family of construction workers (Matthew 13.55), he came from a backwater town (John 1.46), and there was nothing impressive about his physical presence (Isaiah 53.2).

Additionally, Jesus' gospel (good news) was unsophisticated. He frequently spoke to crowds with confusing parables without publicly explaining them. His cryptic sayings disturbed and repelled his audiences - "eat my flesh and drink my blood!" (John 6). When he did speak clearly, he taught his disciples that lowliness defines the citizens of his heavenly kingdom. "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted" (Matthew 23.12).

With a few notable exceptions, the men Jesus selected to preach this message were not highly-educated, successful men in the worldly sense. They were fishermen and common people, just like their rabbi. When the apostle Paul wrote to the Corinthian church, a group used to elegant traveling rhetoricians, he reminded them of both the nature of the gospel as well as its proclaimers. "For Christ... [sent me] to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power. For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Corinthians 1.17-18). Was all of this foolishness accidental on God's part? On the contrary - "God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God" (vss. 27-28). A lowly message will attract a lowly people. "Not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth" (vs. 26).

All of these thoughts fit perfectly into the scope of Bible history. God has always selected leaders who were clearly deficient in some obvious way. God has always issued commands that seemed counter-intuitive to the people who received them. God has always raised up a minority people who were inferior to the strong nations around them. Why? To make it clear where the true power of salvation lies. It does not lie in the intelligence, strength, and glory of mankind. The power of God is in a painful, humiliating Roman cross. Are we content to embrace it ourselves?

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis.

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the Russell G. and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a one-time award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection criteria.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

TRUSTS FOR ESTATE PLANNING

Trusts are a useful yet misunderstood tool of Estate Planning. The problem is that there are so many different kinds of trusts. Trusts can be **Revocable**, which means they can be changed, or **Irrevocable**, which means they cannot be changed. There are many specialized trusts for particular purposes like **Irrevocable Life Insurance** Trusts (ILITs), **QTIP** Trusts (for estate-tax planning), **Special Needs** Trusts (to handle assets for a person with a disability), and many others. Your particular situation will determine which type of trust you need, if any.

With all the variations, many things are common from trust to trust. The Trust document is the rules of how the trust will operate. The Grantor is the person who creates the Trust, and the Trustee is the person who will run the trust (they can be the same people). The Beneficiaries are the people who will benefit from the assets that the trust holds (the Grantor can be a beneficiary and so can the Trustee, but there need to be other beneficiaries besides just the Grantor). Every Trust has to have assets that it holds and manages for the benefit of the beneficiaries. In the past, you could not have a trust without assets so older trusts often state something like "ten dollars" or might even have a dollar bill or something stapled to a last page. Modern trust law allows a trust to exist without assets as long as there is some way in the future that it will get assets (by being named beneficiary of life insurance, for example).

If you create a trust, you will need to change the title on bank accounts, or real estate, or investment accounts from yourself to your Trust. If you don't, then the Trustee won't be able to manage those assets. I often write a Will along with a Trust and name the Trust as the heir in the Will, so even if the Trust isn't funded right away, it will be funded from the Probate estate. Of course, if one of your goals is to avoid probate, then you must put the assets into the Trust during life and not wait for your Will to do it.

Since trusts don't die, the assets in a trust pass (by the Trust terms) without need for probate. Individually owned assets have to go through probate if the owner dies. Trusts can be used to take care of you if you become incapacitated. You can be the lifetime beneficiary of your own Trust and have a standby Trustee lined up to handle those assets for you if you cannot do so due to physical or mental incapacity. Once the Grantor has died and the trust becomes Irrevocable (which happens automatically when the Grantor – who is the only one who could amend or revoke the trust dies) the Trust terms can protect the assets from the creditors of the new beneficiaries (depending on the Trust terms) and can handle assets for young people until the time at which the Grantor thinks they can handle them on their own (age 25, or 30, or 50!).

This article only touched the tip of the Trust iceberg. You really need to have a thorough discussion with your Estate Planning attorney about whether a trust is right for you or not.




