#### Holiday Spirit \*\* RECYCLE YOUR UNWANTED STRING LIGHTS AT TOWN HALL

We are once again collecting holiday string lights for recycling. Look for the bin outside the town hall entrance \*\*

As you plan your holidays, we encourage you to take a fresh look at your traditions, looking for ways you can incorporate a few more sustainable practices. *Maybe these statistics from The Center for Biological Diversity will give you some motivation:* 

 According to a national survey, more than 3 in 4 Americans wish that holidays were less materialistic.

• Nearly 9 in 10 believe holidays should be more about family and caring for others, not giving and receiving gifts.

• A 2021 analysis conducted by the Center for Biological Diversity shows that Americans generate 23% more tons of waste in December than in other months of the year.

• Each person generates 36 more pounds of waste in December than in other months of the year. That's the equivalent of throwing away 58 teddy bears.

• The United States creates 5.8 million tons more waste in December than in other months of the year. That's equivalent to 28,713 Boeing 747 airplanes.

• Americans use around 8,000 tons of wrapping paper each year during the winter holidays, equal to roughly 50,000 trees.

 More than 2.65 billion holiday cards are sold each year equal to around 8 cards per person in the United States. Cutting this down by just one card would save over 50,000 cubic yards worth of paper.
 66% of holiday shoppers will pay more for sustainable

products, with younger generations leading the way.

Simplifying the holidays doesn't mean you have to stop giving or receiving gifts. It's about seeking meaningful alternatives that don't harm the planet. Often, these alternatives are more memorable, unique and economical than mass-produced items. If you visit the Center's website at <u>www.simplifytheholidays.org</u> you can find all sorts of ideas for making your holidays more sustainable and maybe even more meaningful.

#### **CLOSED LID POLICY FOR TRASH CARTS**

Reminder, Tyngsborough has a closed lid policy for trash carts and *"trash will not be collected if the lid is not completely closed."* This is stated in our contract with Republic Services and is now being enforced more consistently.

Residents with extra trash have three options, depending on how often they find themselves in this situation: put excess trash in a bag and save it for the next week's collection, use an extra trash sticker, or lease an additional trash cart.

*If too much trash happens for the first time* and you are not prepared, you could put your excess trash in a bag and hold it for the next week's collection.

If too much trash happens only once in a while, we recommend that you purchase "extra trash" stickers from the Board of Health (\$5 per sticker). You then would put a sticker on your own trash bag and place it next to your trash cart on collection day. You might want to purchase a few now, even before you have extra trash, especially with the holidays around the corner. Stickers may be obtained by visiting the Board of Health office during Town Hall hours, or online (see "Board of Health" page at <u>www.tyngsboroughma.gov</u>), or by sending in a check with a selfaddressed stamped envelope to the Board of Health, 25 Bryants Lane, Tyngsborough, MA 01879.

If you find your household frequently has more trash than will fit into the cart with the lid closed, you might want to consider leasing an additional cart. The cost is \$200 per year. Please call the Board of Health (978-649-2300 x118) if you are interested in this option.

## WHAT TO DO WHEN A LOVED ONE PASSES AWAY

It is a shame that paperwork often takes precedent over emotions. If you have just lost a loved-one, you are suffering trauma, sadness, and a bewildering array of other feelings and confusion. If your loved-one went through a prolonged period of illness you may feel a sense of relief that they finally passed, with a corresponding feeling of guilt that you feel that way. This is normal, and you should seek whatever help and counseling you may need to get through this period.

But you will almost immediately be bombarded by legal issues and paperwork that you have to deal with. You can put some of it off, but there are some tasks that you cannot delay. The Funeral Director will prepare a death certificate and will need to know vital statistics about your loved-one such as date and place of birth, education level, the names, and places of birth of the parents of the deceased, and some other facts. It would be best if your loved-one had written these out or left you a copy of a birth certificate, but that's not always the case.

You will then need to deal with the assets and bills. If you are named as the Executor or Personal Representative in the Will of the deceased, then you will have to prepare the proper paperwork and file it with the Probate Court to be officially named to handle that task. Keep in mind that a Will only "nominates" you as Representative of the Estate, you have to get officially appointed by the Probate Court.

You may need to (even before officially appointed) secure the home of the deceased to make sure their possessions don't disappear. You will need to deal with pets, house plants, and also make sure the heat and lights stay on (especially in Winter). But you can probably wait a little while to deal with most bills, especially since you cannot do much until you are appointed by the Court. If necessary, you may have to use your own funds to pay a heat or light bill. You can be reimbursed later by the Estate.

When you are ready, you should meet with an attorney to review the steps necessary to administer the will. While the exact rules differ from state to state, the key actions include Filing the Will and a Petition for Probate with the Probate Court, collecting the assets and making an Inventory of them, paying all bills, and filing all tax returns and paying any tax due. Keep in mind if there is an Estate-Tax return required, it is due within nine months of the date of death. After the bills are all paid and the assets assembled, then you can distribute those assets to the rightful heirs of the Estate (as named in the Will or by law if there is no Will). You may need to prepare a Final Accounting to show to the heirs to explain how you determined their shares.

Your loved-one may have used a Trust that might avoid some of the above steps, but many of them will be required no matter what. It will really help if everyone sees their Estate-Planning attorney and gets their planning and affairs in order well in advance of a death.



Nearly a quarter of all children in the communities we serve currently live in poverty and lack access to critical items that are essential to their physical and emotional well-being.

The need has never been more dire and widespread than at this time in our world when no community, regardless of how affluent, is left without families who face a world of challenges meeting their children's most basic and essential needs.

As we approach the end of year, we're preparing to serve more students and families who desperately need immediate support. The late fall and winter season is most challenging for our students and for our organization.

The late fall and winter months create the most hardship for our students as cold temperatures increase their need for specific winter gear, schools close for breaks causing a nine-day loss in supportive resources, and they lack a warm place to go.

From November through at least March, so many students are up against extremely cold weather and snow without warm clothing or a safe place to turn. In the area we serve, there are over 28,000 homeless students that will be experiencing a winter without proper gear.

This has a huge impact on their physical, mental, and emotional well-being. Without essential winter items, they are more likely to miss school. This school year is vital to protecting our students' educational futures.

Students across our local districts are experiencing a major loss in their educational progress due to last year's school closures and transition to remote learning. They need support to get them back on track.

For students in poverty, school performance has always been more challenging when compared to their more affluent peers. It's critical that they have access to the items they need so they can get to school and participate confidently.

Our students' growing needs, as well as our expansion into new schools and communities, increases our demand for winter coats, hats and gloves, boots, and socks substantially.
