

DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

 As of December 15th, the temporary no-excuse vote by mail provisions in state law have expired. The SOC did ask the Legislature to pass another extension of the law while we wait for them to pass something permanent, but that has not happened. This means that right now there is NO early voting by mail and NO option for early voting in person for your upcoming local and special elections. The only option for voting by mail is an absentee ballot for those who qualify. Absentee voters can vote in person in your office, but unlike with early voting, they will need to fill out the absentee ballot application before doing so. The deadline to apply for a mailed absentee ballot is still 4 business days before Election Day, as that change to the law was permanent. Voters who are voting absentee in person still have until 12 p.m. on the day before Election Day to apply.

• 2022 is a busy election year. The date of the September primary is still being discussed so stay tuned to this section and the town website for updates.

· The Annual Street listing was mailed the first week of January 2022. It included a dog license application. In case you are new to Massachusetts, the annual street listing is a legal document of the Commonwealth and must be returned each year to remain on the active voter list. Pursuant to MA law, your name can then be removed from the voting list for failure to return the street listing after 2 years. If you do not receive one by the end of January, please contact this office.

• Are you interested in running for a town board position? A list of open offices will be certified and published on the town website, www.dunstable-ma.gov, or call my office for the full list. In includes Selectman, Assessors, Board of Health, Library Trustee, Cemetery Commissioner, Comm. Of Trust Funds, Planning Board, Advisory Board and Constable. The Governor signed the legislation to appoint the Town Clerk so that will no longer be an elected position.

• Dog licenses began in early January. All dogs, 6 months and older must be licensed. If you reserved a personal dog tag number, your dog must be licensed by the end of January or the number will be passed on (I'm not sure whether the new Town Clerk will offer this program). We have to account for the dog numbers each month with the Accountant (monies in). Seniors, age 70 and older, have the fee waived pursuant to a town meeting vote. The dogs must still be licensed.

• Town Clerk Office Hours - Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays from 9:00 am - 1:00 pm and working remote one day, usually Wednesday, depending on what deadlines, etc., I'm working with that particular week. I am sure all of you have at least received your annual census request and if you are a veteran or spouse of a veteran please annotate as such. Also I am sure you saw the flier noting the upcoming 350th anniversary of Dunstable. There is a document that describes the first 200 years of our small town when it was not so small. It is written by Rev Elias Nason in 1877 and covers our growth from 1673 to 1873. Sometimes as you drive through Dunstable you may wonder how many of the streets were named. Most of them were from members of the Dunstable Militia and the 6th Middlesex Regiment and fought in the French and Indian War, Revolutionary War, including Bunker Hill, and the War of 1812. Their names are all listed in the book and they also used to meet almost on a weekly bases here in Dunstable at the house directly across from the Central Cemetery on Rt 113, currently owned by Mr and Mrs Carl Davis.

You should be able to find an online copy of the book for free if you Google it by putting in "History of the Town of Dunstable by Elias Nason". I do encourage all of you to read it so you have a better understanding and appreciation for our little town of Dunstable.

AVOIDING WILL CONTESTS By Edward H. Adamsky

Your Will is the basic estate planning tool. In it you say who should get your assets after you die. If you die without a will your property will be distributed according to the intestacy laws of your home State, without regard to your wishes. Even if you have a Will, if some of your family members are not happy with what they get, they could "contest" the Will to try to get more.

A Will contest can be a long affair that will delay the settlement of your estate and add costs such as lawyer's fees and court charges. A fight amongst your family members will forever leave a scar on the family relationships. You should do your best to avoid Will contests by making sure you have a good Estate Planning Attorney and that everything is done just right.

In general, only an interested party can contest your Will. They have to have legal standing, so your neighbor cannot dispute your Will as they have no relation to you and your estate. Only your spouse, heirs and creditors can dispute the terms of your Will (creditors rarely do so, but they could).

Even those who have a right to challenge a Will cannot do so without legal grounds. Your Will could be held invalid if it wasn't technically correct. If there were a missing witness or signature it might fail. Also, if you were not competent to understand and sign the Will it would fail. Or, if someone used "undue influence" to coerce you into signing a Will you didn't really want to sign, or if someone defrauded you and had you sign a document that you didn't even know was a Will, then it could be held invalid. Only if one of these valid justifications was alleged could someone get a Court to look at whether or not your will was valid.

To avoid fights you should explain your planning to your family members. If someone is left out or gets more or less than others, you should tell them why. Fights often happen when people don't understand the situation. Clear communication can often stop a fight before it happens. Perhaps if you discuss the situation while still alive you might get the family to agree to your decision or they may convince you to do things another way.

You can also use a "No Contest" clause in your Will if you think someone may try to challenge it. This works best if that person gets something in the Will but due to the No Contest clause, they will lose that amount if they challenge the Will. If what they are getting is substantial enough, they might be dissuaded from a challenge if they will lose it all. A No Contest clause may not stop a challenge when someone gets nothing at all at first.

A Will can be challenged if the person who signed it was not competent to do so when it was signed. This is a common allegation when someone isn't happy with what they get in a Will. You can, if you suspect this might happen, have a doctor examine you and provide a written opinion that you are competent to understand and sign a Will. Make sure the examination is very close in time to the signing of the Will, otherwise this might not work.

TOWN OF DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH TRASH & RECYCLING PICKUP PROGRAM

The Town offers a trash & recycling pickup program for all residents. The fee is \$300.00 per year valid July through June of each year. The fee drops by \$25.00 each month. As an example, if you join in February the yearly fee will be \$125.00. All subscriptions expire on June 30th each year. The subscription includes a 35-gallon trash container and a 64-gallon recycling container.

We also offer overflow bags for sale for \$3.00 each in rolls of 5 for \$15.00 for those weeks that you cannot fit all your trash in the grey trash container. Our pickup day is every week on Thursday. There are 6 holidays that will change that date to Friday. That list will be given to you when you sign up. On occasion the weather might also change that day to a Friday. *That announcement will appear on the town website cover page under news.*

If you would like to sign up for pickup you may do so at <u>www.</u> <u>dunstable-ma.gov</u> and go to online payments. Scroll down halfway down the page for Board of Health – trash. You may also purchase overflow bags at the same website by filling in the amount and we will recognize the amount is for bags. You will have to pick them up at the town hall Monday-Friday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Please bring your confirmation sheet with you. You may also sign up for trash pickup or purchase bags at the town hall Monday-Friday 9:00 a.m.– 4:00 p.m. and pay by cash or check.

ATTENTION 2022 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation! We are delighted to announce the availability of the <u>Helene</u> <u>Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship</u>, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis.

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the Russell G. and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a one-time award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection criteria.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

Agricultural Permits are \$15. Call for more info. FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION

You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

 You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
 Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
 The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-

6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.

4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.

5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.

2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.

3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.

4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.

I WILL ALLURE HER

Nathan Combs

Ancient Israel was like an unfaithful spouse. During the days of the prophet Hosea, God's people had abandoned him for the worship of foreign gods. The Canaanite fertility god, Baal, was especially popular. Despite the fact that King Jehu had wiped out the temple of Baal in Samaria and slaughtered every priest and worshipper of Baal he could find (2 Kings 10), Baal was thriving roughly one hundred years later. Hosea even spoke of the people confusing God with Baal - "no longer will you call me 'My Baal'" (Hosea 2.16)!

In order to help his unrepentant people understand the personal devastation he felt by their idols, God instructed his prophet to intentionally marry a "wife of whoredom" and start a family. Hosea married Gomer, had three children with her, but their life quickly unravelled when she became adulterous. However, instead of discarding his wife to find a more faithful one, Hosea's story takes an unexpected turn. God tells him to go search for Gomer, pay off the debts she's accumulated, and accept his wife once again. This too was designed to picture God's relationship with his people.

Through their idolatry, Israel shattered the covenant God made with the nation at Mt. Sinai when the law was given through Moses. But after a period of punishment, God's ultimate intentions were restoration. He promised to vigorously pursue her like a young man woos the lady of his affections. "I will allure her, and bring her into the wilderness and speak tenderly to her. And in that day, declares the Lord, you will call me 'My Husband.' And I will betroth you to me forever. I will betroth you to me in righteousness and in justice, in steadfast love and in mercy. I will betroth you to me in faithfulness. And you shall know the Lord." (Hosea 2.14, 16, 20). The power of this message is just as potent today as it was then because you and I are Gomer. Unbelievably, despite all of our sins, God wants to call us "my people," as Jesus' apostle Paul explained in Romans 9. He vigorously pursued us by sending his own Son into our world to buy us back from spiritual debts we could never begin to repay. And he expects us to pursue others the same way.

Seeing the heart of God through Hosea can alter the shape of our hearts. When we feel wronged, our natural response is to retreat instead of pursue our offender in love. After we are hurt in a conversation, we're tempted to refrain from future conversations with that person or even sever the friendship altogether. We live in a culture where covenant relationships are ended easily and frequently. And restoration work can certainly involve prolonged labor and complications, as the story of God and Israel demonstrates. But the scope of Scripture shows us the peace and glory found in the temporarily harder path. May he give us the strength to take it.
