# TYNGSBOROUGH MIDDLE SCHOOL BUILDING PROJECT



Built-in 1968, as the original Jr. Sr. High School, TMS has also served as an elementary school (1992) and now as the Tyngsborough Middle School (2002). Despite renovations and extensive maintenance efforts, over time, the building has reached the end of its useful life. Due to space limitations, and antiquated systems and equipment, the facility can no longer support today's instructional models and programmatic expectations for middle school students.

Throughout 2021, the School Building Committee performed an extensive, in-depth feasibility study in conjunction with the MSBA; the study concluded that the most cost-effective, educationally beneficial, and sustainable long-term solution is to build a new school. At this time the construction estimated price is around \$82.9 million. Partnering with the MSBA, the anticipated grant will be about \$28 million, which will result in a district share of approximately \$55 million.

To be successful, the community will need a ¾ majority vote at the annual town meeting on May 3rd and a majority vote on a ballot question on May 17th. To view more information and renderings of the proposed Middle School Building Project, please scan the QR codeor go to

#### **ELECTRIC VEHICLES Q&A SERIES - PART 1**

Have you noticed more electric vehicles (EVs) around? For environmental reasons, and because they are fun to drive, demand for EVs is increasing rapidly. In response, most established and several new automakers now offer EVs. Ford and GM have even announced plans to be making only electric vehicles within two decades. Through a multi-part series, we will answer some of the most commonly asked questions about EVs so you can decide if you're ready to make the switch:

#### How much do EVs cost to buy and maintain?

You can purchase an EV at just about every price point of traditional internal combustion engine (ICE) cars and there are federal and state programs aimed at encouraging the switch to EVs that offer up to \$7,500 in tax rebates from the federal government and \$2,500 from the MOR-EV program in Massachusetts. Because EVs don't have a combustion engine, transmission, spark plugs, etc. - meaning no oil changes and fewer parts that can break over time, they cost less to maintain than ICE cars. One member of our committee has had an EV for 3.5 years and has only had to change the windshield wipers and the tires!

#### How do I charge an EV?

Most owners plug in their EV at home and charge overnight. You can plug into a standard 120-volt outlet (aka Level 1), and it will charge at 2-3 miles/hour. If you plug into a 240-volt outlet (Level 2), your EV's battery will charge at 20-30 miles/hour. If you have an electric dryer, that is a 240-volt outlet. Depending on the EV, you can get 100-350 miles on a full battery. For longer trips, where you need to recharge your battery to get to your destination, public chargers are available at convenient locations, along highways, at malls, in town centers and in hotel and business complex parking lots. Around Tyngsboro, for example, there are level 2 chargers at the First Parish Meeting House, level 2 and level 3 (charge at 200-1200 miles/hour!) chargers at the Pheasant Lane Mall and Tesla Superchargers are planned for the old TJMaxx Plaza.

Sustainable Tyngsborough is a subcommittee of the Board of Selectmen. We meet the third Tuesday of every month, beginning at 6:30pm. # COMMON MISTAKES OF EXECUTORS By Edward H. Adamsky

If you ever become the Executor of an Estate, you may feel overwhelmed by the responsibility. (Massachusetts Probate now uses the term "Personal Representative" instead of Executor.) Being an Executor can be a lot of work and you can get in trouble if you don't do the job right.

There are common mistakes that Executors make, and you should avoid them. First, never mix your own money with the Estate money. Like running a business, the affairs of the Estate should be kept separate from your personal affairs. You might have to "loan" some money to yourself as Executor in order to start the process (to pay a lawyer or for court filing fees) and you can later pay yourself back for that loan, but otherwise keep your own money away from the Probate matter.

You should keep careful and detailed records and share them with the heirs of the Estate. You have a duty to do things right and to keep the heirs informed of your actions. If there are valid debts of the Estate, they should be paid promptly, and any questionable claims should be researched to ensure they are proper. You may have to file an income tax return for the Decedent (a 1040 personal) and the Estate (a 1041 entity), so make sure you file them on time. If the Estate is large enough, you might have to file an Estate-Tax return within nine months of the date of death.

When you have completed dealing with all of the assets and debts, you should promptly distribute the assets to the rightful heirs. This is usually done a little after one year from the date of death, as creditors can still make claims until that time. But it should not take place too long after that one-year time period. The heirs can hold an Executor liable for late payment of their inheritances.

Make sure you have the newest Will when you file for Probate. Make sure you notify any creditors of which you are aware to give them time to make their claims. Do not distribute the assets to the heirs until the creditor claims period has expired. You might have a debt to pay and no money to pay it if you did that. On the other hand, if there is not enough money to pay all of the creditors, then you don't want to pay any of them too soon. If the estate does not have enough money to pay all creditors there is a special procedure for figuring out how much to pay each creditor. You must follow that procedure properly.

You don't have to accept the job as Executor if you don't want to. If you need help with your duties as Executor, you should hire an Attorney who can explain everything to you.

## IF JESUS IS KING, NO ONE ELSE IS By Nathan Combs

God never wanted his people to have a human king. Sure, He gave some instructions, in the law of Moses for what an Israelite king would need to do (Deuteronomy 17), because he knew the inevitable future. Human kingship, however, was conspicuously absent when the covenant was forged between God and Israel at Mount Sinai. In 1 Samuel 8, when God's people clamored to appoint a human head so they could imitate the surrounding nations, God told his prophet that "they have rejected me from being king over them." Redeeming the darkness of that sin, God promised David, Israel's second king, that He would make one of his descendants sit on an everlasting throne (2 Samuel 7). It was always God's plan that Jesus be our king. What are the implications of this for us? Let's consider two points.

First, if Jesus is King, he must be the very center of the organization of his people, the church. Because he is the undisputed conqueror of Satan and creator of all things, he is "the head of the body, the church" (Colossians 1.18). Although he laid a foundation of many apostles and prophets, Jesus himself is the cornerstone of his church (Ephesians 2.19). Some religious groups claim to follow his gospel, but if a human man sits at the hub of their organizations, it is a different church from the one we read about in the New Testament. If Christians wanted to imitate the surrounding nations (like the Israelites from 1 Samuel 8), we could develop a world-wide headquarters and a fancy human hierarchy like we see in corporations and national governments. We could introduce all kinds of organizational changes in the name of efficiency and convenience. But like the Israelites of old, those plans would be a rejection of the King we already possess. And our King does not tolerate attempted coups on his throne (see Psalm 2)!

If Jesus is King, he should be our method of changing the world. When Christians in the book of Acts did their work, they had no interest in infiltrating the power structure of Rome's government. Their strategy for proclaiming the gospel was not to get Christians into the Roman senate or the emperor's throne. They already had a King, to whom they kept referring in their teachings and addressing in their private prayers (Acts 2.33, 4.24-26, 6.31, etc.). Therefore, if Christians today become focused on moving political levers as a way of spiritually fixing our culture, we have exchanged the glorious message of an eternal King for a pitiful substitute. We have forgotten that shining the "light of the world" (Matthew 5) has nothing to do with "our side" seizing the megaphone of politics. We are not tasked with out-voting our spiritual enemy, using the methods of the world, in the hope of getting "our man" into office. The right Man is already in office, sitting forever on his throne! If Jesus is King, we must not seek for another.






