DUNSTABLE TOWN CLERK

• Nomination papers are available for the position of Greater Lowell Regional School Committee, Dunstable representative. They may be obtained at the Office of the Town Clerk. Candidates must submit nomination papers to local registrars of voters for certification no later than 5:00 pm on Tuesday, July 26. Candidates must obtain a minimum of 50 signatures throughout the district (Dunstable, Tyngsborough, Dracut and Lowell). It is recommended to obtain more in case any are disqualified. It is the candidate's responsibility to get the certified papers from the local registrars and deliver them to the clerk of the regional school district on or before the filing deadline. A candidate must be a registered voter in the Town of Dunstable and must obtain a certificate of voter registration from the Town Clerk. The Greater Lowell Regional School Committee positions are a 4-year term, elected on the State Ballot in November.

- Because this is a Primary year, I strongly recommend you check your voter status <u>before</u> going to the polls. The last day to register to vote and/or change your party affiliation before the Primary is Wednesday, August 17. If you have a valid Massachusetts drivers license or state issued ID, you can do this transaction online. <u>www.sec.state.ma.us/ovr/</u>. Massachusetts has four (4) political parties, Democrat, Republican, Green-Rainbow and United Independent Party. If you are "unenrolled", you can choose any party ballot. If you are registered in a party, you can only take a ballot from that party. November is a general election, which means everything is on one ballot.
- Results of the Annual Town Election are posted online but the summary recap was 211 ballots cast (8% voter turnout). The ballot question was 100 "No" and 96 "Yes" with 15 blanks.
- The Board of Selectmen has called a special town election for the ballot question on Tuesday, July 19 (see sample ballot under News and Announcements on the town website along with absentee ballot information, etc.
- After 22 years, my retirement went into effect May 24. But I was appointed Interim Town Clerk through June 30 or until a replacement is hired. (Note: Now Interim Town Clerk through July 31, I'm not able to hold regular office hours and any in-person voting during the day or other business is by appointment only.) It has been an honor and a privilege to serve you. We are moving out of town and will miss Dunstable, it has been our home for 34 years, but are excited for the future. I wish all of you the best!

TRASH & RECYCLING YEARLY SUBSCRIPTION RENEWAL NOTICE

The yearly subscription with the Town of Dunstable for trash and recycling pickup expired on June 30, 2022. Once again for the 5th year, we will not be raising the fee; it remains at \$300.00/year.

Three renewal options are available. New subscribers can use the same options.

- Mail a \$300.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827.
- Drop off a check or cash to the Town Hall Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan Trash Payment on your envelope.

Overflow bags can also be purchased on line or at the town hall. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Although there is not a specific spot to purchase the bags on line, just fill in the amount on the trash & recycling renewal page and we will recognize the amount is for the purchase of bags. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you paid on line.

COMMISSIONERS OF TRUST FUNDS

For Those In Need

Are you a Dunstable resident who is experiencing financial hardship? We may be able to help. A century ago, various residents of Dunstable willed funds to the town to help those in need. Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds are responsible for disbursing funds from the interest on these accounts each year. MEDICAID PLANNING TECHNIQUES

How can you protect your assets from the costs of nursing home care (and Medicaid estate-recovery)? The biggest asset most people have is their home. There are two main strategies for protecting your home: a Life Estate Deed and an Irrevocable Trust.

A Life Estate Deed is a deed that transfers your home from your name to that of your children (or whoever you choose) who will receive ownership at your death. You keep the right to live in the house for the rest of your life. You remain responsible for Property Taxes, insurance, and utilities. The ownership will pass at your death outside of probate. After five years have passed, if you enter a nursing home and apply for Medicaid, they cannot force you to sell the house and they cannot make an after-death (estate-recovery) claim against your house or your children.

A Life Estate Deed is only appropriate if you want to stay there for the rest of your life. There are consequences to selling during your lifetime. Your children will get a share of the sale proceeds and will have income-tax liabilities. And the share of the proceeds that goes to you will no longer be protected from Medicaid. If you don't plan to stay in your home for the rest of your life, then a Life Estate Deed may not be right for you.

The other option is an Irrevocable Medicaid-Planning Trust. This is a trust designed to protect the assets in it from the cost of nursing home care. Like the Life Estate Deed, it has to be in place for at least five years before you apply for Medicaid in order to work. But the Irrevocable Trust is more flexible in the future. You can sell the house and purchase a new one or keep the cash proceeds safe within the Trust at any time during your life. The house does not have to be held until you die.

If you ever go into a nursing home and have to apply for Medicaid, your home will not count as your asset. It will pass to your children (or other beneficiaries) after your death outside of Probate and any Medicaid estate-recovery claim. You will need to name someone as Trustee of this Trust. That will probably be one of your children, but it could be anyone. You should not be the Trustee of your own Irrevocable Medicaid-Planning Trust.

While the Life Estate Deed is fairly rigid, the Trust allows for changes. The named owners in a Life Estate Deed cannot be changed after it is done. But the named beneficiaries in an irrevocable Trust can be changed at any time (if you feel a need to do so) and you can fire the Trustee and appoint someone else to that job if they are not doing the job the way you think they should be. This provides a lot of future flexibility and gives you some measure of control over the Trust.

Of course, with both tools, you do have to irrevocably give up the ownership of your home in order to protect it from nursing home costs. You cannot be allowed to get it back, under any circumstances, or the tool will not work for Medicaid Planning. It is a very serious thing to put assets out of your reach in order to protect them, so you should have an in-depth discussion about this with your Elder Law Attorney before you decide to go forward.



SUMMER SAFETY: STEPS YOU SHOULD TAKE TO HELP STAY OUT OF HARM'S WAY

The American Red Cross wants everyone to have a safe summer and offers tips and resources for the entire family.

Download the Red Cross Swim app, sponsored by The ZAC Foundation, for safety tips, kid-friendly videos and activities, and take the free Water Safety for Parents and Caregivers online course.

WATER SAFETY

Before going in, on or around the water, every family member should become "water smart." This starts with learning to be safe, making good choices, and learning to swim to at least achieve the skills of water competency. Everyone should be able to enter the water, get a breath, stay afloat, change position, swim a distance and then get out of the water safely. A variety of water safety courses and resources are available to help.

To help keep your family safe, the Red Cross offers these tips:

- 1. Prevent unsupervised access to water. Fence pools and spas with adequate barriers and keep a constant eye for any water dangers such as portable splash pools/slides, buckets and bathtubs.
- 2. Adults should actively supervise children and stay within arm's reach of young children and new swimmers. Kids should follow the rules.
- 3. Designate a "water watcher" to keep a close eye and constant attention on children and weaker swimmers in and around the water until the next water watcher takes over.
- 4. Always wear a properly fitted U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a boat and if in a situation beyond someone's skill
- 5. Swim as a pair near a lifeguard's chair everyone, including experienced swimmers, should swim with a buddy even in areas supervised by lifeguards.
- 6. Always maintain constant attention and actively supervise children even when lifeguards are present.
