• Governor Baker signed a bill to set the date of the State Primary to Tuesday, September 6. More information will be published, please keep an eye on this column and sign up for news and announcements on the town website to keep informed.

 Nomination papers have been received from the Secretary of the Commonwealth for the position of Greater Lowell Regional School Committee, Dunstable representative. They may be obtained at the Office of the Town Clerk. Candidates must submit nomination papers to local registrars of voters for certification no later than 5:00 pm on Tuesday, July 26. Candidates must obtain a minimum of 50 signatures throughout the district (Dunstable, Tyngsborough, Dracut and Lowell). It is recommended to obtain more in case any are disqualified. It is the candidate's responsibility to get the certified papers from the local registrars and deliver them to the clerk of the regional school district on or before the filing deadline. A candidate must be a registered voter in the Town of Dunstable and must obtain a certificate of voter registration from the Town Clerk. The Greater Lowell Regional School Committee positions are a 4-year term, elected on the State Ballot in November.

DUNSTABLE VETERAN AGENT

Wow! June is already upon us. I do hope that you were able to attend the Memorial Day Parade last month. We hope to have pictures posted on Facebook for you shortly.

One interesting item came across my desk last month that I need to share with all of you vets out there who were in the Middle East wars. I am reaching out to inquire if you would be willing to support our DoD funded research study "BBRAIN: Boston Biorepository, Recruitment and Integrative Network for Gulf War Illness" by sharing this information with your community. This study lead by Dr. Kimberly Sullivan aims to produce data to be stored for doing future research on 1991 Gulf War veterans' health outcomes. They have collaborative study location sites at the VA in New York, Miami and San Francisco. Their lead study site is at Boston University. Visits typically last from 9am to 12:30pm and entail a fasting blood draw, saliva collections, a brief physical and cognitive testing.



COMMISSIONERS OF TRUST FUNDS For Those In Need

Are you a Dunstable resident who is experiencing financial hardship? We may be able to help. A century ago, various residents of Dunstable willed funds to the town to help those in need. Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds are responsible for disbursing funds from the interest on these accounts each year. If you, or someone you know, is a resident of Dunstable and could use some one-time help with medical, pharmacy, grocery, or fuel bills, let us know. Requests can be submitted by emailing the Commissioners of Trust Funds at www.dunstable-ma.gov/user/53/contact. All inquiries are confidential.



With cooling season in full-swing, let's look at SEER ratings which measure the maximum efficiency for air conditioners, similar to the miles-per-gallon (mpg) for cars. A car might get 28 mpg at highway speeds, but get much lower in stop-and-go traffic. So, how does the SEER rating impact air conditioning choices?

Higher is better. A higher rating means greater energy efficiency. The minimum SEER rating for air conditioners is 13. ENERGY STAR qualified systems must have a rating of 14.5 to qualify, with many rating up to 21.

Greater comfort. Higher SEER units often have 2 components that provide greater indoor comfort; 2-stage or variable-speed compressors and variable-speed blowers.

Control settings. Proper system design, installation, and operation settings ensure peak performance & efficiency are achieved.

More savings. In addition to lower operating costs, high SEER HVAC systems qualify for large rebates and tax breaks.

Your yearly subscription with the Town of Dunstable for trash and recycling pickup will expire on June 30, 2022. Once again for the 5th year, we will not be raising the fee; it remains at \$300.00/year.

Beginning May 1, three renewal options are available. New subscribers can use the same options

Pay on line on the town webpage www.dunstable-ma.gov and choose online payments. Scroll half way down the page to Trash-Board of Health.

Mail a \$300.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827.

Drop off a check or cash to the Town Hall Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope.

Overflow bags can also be purchased on line or at the town hall. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Although there is not a specific spot to purchase the bags on line, just fill in the amount on the trash & recycling renewal page and we will recognize the amount is for the purchase of bags. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you paid on line.

This year we were glad to provide about \$18,000 to the GDRSD. As usual, we held our two regular major grant cycles in August and January, as well as accepting mini-grants year-round.

During our major grant cycles, we were thrilled to provide funding for five innovative and inspiring opportunities for our school community. These were: huge whiteboards for 7th-grade math classrooms to promote collaborative thinking, access to the Thinker Analytics course for high school students to develop logic and reasoning skills, funding for a social justice mural project at the high school to help create an environment of acceptance and support, Digi-Blocks manipulatives for elementary students to enhance the math curriculum, and decodable texts for kindergarteners to promote reading development.

Through mini-grants, we sponsored clubs and provided durable goods for teachers to expand their instruction. We supported projects such as marble runs to teach about potential and kinetic energy, portable EKG Monitors for students in the GDRHS's Anatomy Class, and much more! We are always happy to provide opportunities for students that deepen their understanding and create handson learning as part of regular instruction.

As a community group, we hosted a booth at Grotonfest and decorated a tree at General Field for the Winter Tree Stroll! We were so happy to see people in person again! In March we hosted the annual GDEF Trivia Night, which was a great success with many laughs. Thank you to all the participants, and congrats to the team, 'May The Facts Be With You' who won the coveted GDEF trophy which is proudly on display at Middle School!

GDEF is actively recruiting members to help us with our work! Volunteering for GDEF is a rewarding and fun way to contribute to the GDRSD. Board meetings are held on the 2nd Tuesdays of the month at 7:30 pm. This year we are particularly looking for 'teacher parents' who have knowledge about curriculum, a parent of a preschooler at Boutwell, and a parent of a middle schooler!

FOUR REASONS TO CREATE AN ESTATE PLAN

Everyone needs to plan for the future. Few like to think about dying and many don't think they have an "estate" that needs planning. But there are several good reasons to plan, and whatever you call it (your "estate" or your "affairs") you need to plan.

If you see your Elder Law or Estate Planning attorney, you can set up your plan and it will accomplish several goals. Here are five major goals of Estate Planning.

- 1. Have a Will that says what you want: in your Will you get to say who gets what assets when you die, nominate a guardian for your minor children (if necessary), and designate the right person as your personal representative (executor) to administer your estate and make sure that your assets are distributed according to your written wishes.
- 2. Have a Trust, which can accomplish several other goals:
- Avoid probate: Trusts, unlike wills, allow for the swift and easy transfer of assets to your beneficiaries without having to go through probate. Although probate isn't always the nightmare nor big expense that you might have heard about, it can be annoying dealing with a government bureaucracy so avoiding that is usually a good idea.
- Providing for family members with special needs: If you have a family member living with a disability, and most especially if that person is getting any means-tested government benefits, then you need a trust with special-needs terms to protect the continued eligibility of your family member for those government benefits. That person might also need someone to manage their assets for them and a Trust is just the right tool to accomplish these goals.
- Protecting assets: As people age, they sometimes are less able to deal with their own assets and to keep them safe and protected. You can set up a Trust and choose a trusted person to handle those assets and keep them from predators, so they are available to you for the rest of your life.
- **3. Avoid fights among your loved ones:** With a written plan (Will or Trust or both) that specifies exactly what everyone should get and puts a trusted person in charge to make sure that happens properly, you can reduce the chances that your family members will fight over the money and objects you leave behind. You should communicate clearly with your family in person and in writing, so they all know what you want and what they are getting.
- **4. Prepare for incapacity and end-of-life care:** you must plan for your eventual passing, and it isn't always easy. You should specify you desires for medical care at end-of-life and name the right people to handle decision-making regarding health care, and final disposition of your body. Putting your wishes in writing and using a Power of Attorney and Health Care Proxy will allow everything to move smoothly and will lesson the burden on your family.



DID YOU KNOW?

This May 8th of last, was the 15 year anniversary of the late John (Jack) P. George's passing. For those of you new to town or if you didn't know him, Jack was a family man and the patriarch of his 3 wonderful kids: Jennifer, Pete Jr and Nicole. Jack and his wife Kathy resided on High Street for over 20 years. I grew up on High St., almost across from the Georges family so I was lucky to know them and proud to call them my friends.

"Jackie" Georges was a 20 year veteran of the Tyngsboro police dept. He honorably served as their k-9 officer and was past President of the International Brotherhood of Police Officers, as well as a Marine Corps veteran. Jack's life was cut short at the age of 48 due to a blood clot which developed as the result of a previous leg injury. That injury was sustained while saving a civilian who had been severely injured in a car accident. This blood clot caused his untimely death His valiant sacrifice earned him a place on the National Law Enforcement Memorial Wall in Washington D.C. In short, John Peter Georges not only died a hero, he lived like one. Thank you for your honorable service J.P.G...you are missed by many.

Lastly, DID YOU KNOW that upon Jacks passing people like Dunstable resident Mitchell Gruziejcka, owner of Wyndmere Landscaping of historic Lowell, stepped up and did what he could to help out? Mitch was the first person to rush to Jack's parents along with his crew to landscape their yard. He then revamped the 1888 Jonas H. French watering trough just across from the Union school. He did this because Jack's funeral procession would be driving by and he wanted it to look nice. Well, that was 15 years ago and Mitch is still maintaining it. You may see him there in one of his signature green pickup trucks mowing the lawn, planting flowers, blowing out the irrigation he installed or placing American flags on the trough perimeter.

The French triangle isn't the only monument Mitch diligently takes care of. He now manicures the triangle by Simmons' greenhouse as well as the Veterans of Foreign Wars triangle on Thorn-dike and Forest Streets dedicated to Gerald J. Dumont. Gerald was a WWII prisoner of war during the Battle of the Bulge.

While the three town parcels Mitch maintains and beautfies are in different areas of town the one common denominator is that he has never submitted a bill or asked to be paid for his services. Personally, when I drive through the center of town and see that green lawn and vibrant flowers with the American flag proudly displayed I think of Jack Georges. And much of that has to do with the generosity and kindness of Dunstable resident Mitch Gruziejcka. So, thank you Mitchell, you deserve to be recognized.

If you happen to see him at a triangle toiling away, take a second and thank him....l believe he has earned it.



BONE BUILDERS AT TYNGSBOROUGH SENIOR CENTER

Researchers at Tufts University, led by Bess Dawson-Hughes, MD, Director of the Bone Metabolism Laboratory at Tufts' Human Nutrition Research Center on Aging, are engaged in extensive research on acid-based balance in the body and how it impacts bone health.

Along with calcium and vitamin D, Dr. Dawson-Hughes suggests that we consume dairy products including milk, yogurt and cheese and plant sources of calcium such as leafy greens and almonds. Also reduce the intake of grains (particularly refined grains) and increase intake of fruits and vegetables. Then be active. Engage in regular weight -bearing and muscle-strengthening exercise, including walking or jogging, stair climbing, yoga, dancing, and weight training. Stop or do not start using tobacco products.



EARS TO HEAR

By Nathan Combs

Jesus used various parables to teach his disciples and the crowds, but his constant drumbeat was this: "He who has ears to hear, let him hear" (Matthew 11.15, 13.9, 43, etc.). We see this phrase repeated in Revelation 2-3, as Jesus gave messages to seven congregations in the Roman province of Asia. Because of pride, disinterest, preoccupation, or some other reason, we humans can be poor listeners. Jesus not only wants his hearers to understand his words, he also desires action in response.

This phrase "ears to hear" has deep roots in the Old Testament Scriptures. In Moses' last address to the Israelites before he died, he told them that "to this day the Lord has not given you a heart to understand or eyes to see or ears to hear" (Deuteronomy 29.4). God's people saw the ten plagues fall on Egypt, lived in the wilderness for forty years while wearing clothing that never wore out, won dramatic military victories over ferocious foes, and experienced God's provisions in countless other ways. They received the law at Mount Sinai and were listening to Moses expound on its importance. Yet, because they lacked devoted hearts, the words of God did not penetrate them.

During the prophet Jeremiah's time, he said to his fellow Israelites in Jeremiah 25.4 "You have neither listened nor inclined your ears to hear, although the Lord persistently sent to you all his servants the prophets." In fact, Jeremiah said that he himself had repeatedly spoken God's words to them for twenty-three years up to that day, but to no avail. The dire consequences for Judah was destruction by Babylon, followed by seventy years in exile.

At the same time as Jeremiah, far away in Babylon, the prophet Ezekiel was working with the Israelites already in exile. In Ezekiel 12.2, God comments on the spiritual condition of the people: "Son of man, you dwell in the midst of a rebellious house, who have eyes to see, but see not, who have ears to hear, but hear not, for they are a rebellious house." Although their capture and removal from the promised land should have humbled their hearts, the people remained obstinate.

Although God is repeatedly faithful to his promises, his people repeatedly closed their ears. That continued into the days of the first century. The Pharisees looked with horror at what their ancestors did to God's messengers – "If we had lived in the days of our fathers, we would not have taken part with them in shedding the blood of the prophets" (Matthew 23.9). And yet, they went on to murder Jesus, the prophet of prophets.

Are we any better? Do we wag our fingers at the hard-hearted characters of Scripture while failing to change our thinking and behavior? Are we better at expressing our own religious opinions than we are at listening humbly to teaching from the Word? All of us have ears capable of hearing, but are we using them the way God intended?
