TYNGSBOROUGH BOARD OF HEALTH NOTICE FROM THE MassDEP

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental
Protection (MassDEP) has published the final 2030 Solid Waste
Master Plan and announced the following amendments to the
waste ban regulations, which will be effective on November 1, 2022
Mattresses will be banned from disposal.
Textiles will be banned from disposal.

The Commercial Organics Disposal Ban will apply to businesses and institutions generating one-half ton or more food material per week (it currently applies to those generating one ton or more food material per week) For more information, please refer to MassDEP's page on Waste Disposal Bans

GET RID OF YOUR MATTRESS NOW!


Effective November 1st, MassDEP will add mattresses, boxsprings, and textile to the WASTE BAN. The Town will not be able to accept mattresses as part of the Bulky Items List. Currently, you can get rid of mattresses and boxsprings with a bulky sticker for \$15. Effective November 1st, mattresses and boxsprings will need to be recycled. The cost to remove mattresses will significantly increase.

If you have mattresses and boxsprings in your attic or basement, dispose of them as soon as possible with a \$15 bulky sticker. If you are buying a new mattress, ask the company to haul away your old mattress.

THE VALUE OF OUR RECYCLABLES

When you put your clean and dry recyclables into your recycling cart, you are helping the environment and you are helping to reduce the cost of waste disposal for the Town.

The commodity market for recyclables has gained strength. New industries have emerged to take our recyclables and turn them into new products for industrial or commercial use. Tyngsborough's contract with Republic Services includes a provision to share in the net revenues that come from the value of our recyclables. Back in August of 2019, our recyclables had a commodity value of \$11.86/ ton and the processing fee was \$105/ton, which meant that the cost to dispose of our recyclables would have been \$93.14/ton of our recyclables (the Town actually paid \$60/ton, the maximum price established in our contract). This past May, our recyclables had a commodity value of \$123.19/ton and the processing fee was \$130/ton, which meant the Town paid \$6.81/ton to dispose of our recyclables. So, while we had to pay a total of \$4,930 to dispose of 82.17 tons of recyclables for the month of August, 2019, that same tonnage of recyclables would have cost the town only \$560 to dispose of this past April. \$4,930/month compared to \$560/month: that's a drastic improvement!

By way of comparison, Tyngsborough pays \$90/ton of trash so if those recyclables had been put in the trash, that would have cost the Town \$7,395. Here is the list of recyclables' commodity values on May 31, 2022:

\$140 OCC #11 (Cardboard)

\$ 80 Mixed paper

\$2,100 Aluminum beverage cans

\$ 270 Steel/Tin Cans

\$1,140 Natural HPDE (clear/white thick plastic jugs/bottles)

\$ 680 Colored HPDE

\$1,000 PET (plastic water/drink bottles)

\$ 800 Tubs and Lids

-\$65.55 Glass

-\$90 Residue (contamination in our recycling)

As you can see, aluminum cans, plastic bottles and thick white or clear jugs (for example, laundry detergent jugs) have the highest commodity values, whereas glass costs more to dispose of than its value, and contamination, or non-recyclable material like plastic bags, cost the same as we pay to dispose of our trash.

Thanks to all you recyclers out there who put your clean and dry recyclables into your blue cart, we are helping to build and strengthen the recyclable commodities market which, in turn, reduces the Town's overall cost of waste disposal.

MEDICAID PLANNING TECHNIQUES

How can you protect your assets from the costs of nursing home care (and Medicaid estate-recovery)? The biggest asset most people have is their home. There are two main strategies for protecting your home: a **Life Estate Deed** and an **Irrevocable Trust**.

A Life Estate Deed is a deed that transfers your home from your name to that of your children (or whoever you choose) who will receive ownership at your death. You keep the right to live in the house for the rest of your life. You remain responsible for Property Taxes, insurance, and utilities. The ownership will pass at your death outside of probate. After five years have passed, if you enter a nursing home and apply for Medicaid, they cannot force you to sell the house and they cannot make an after-death (estate-recovery) claim against your house or your children.

A Life Estate Deed is only appropriate if you want to stay there for the rest of your life. There are consequences to selling during your lifetime. Your children will get a share of the sale proceeds and will have income-tax liabilities. And the share of the proceeds that goes to you will no longer be protected from Medicaid. If you don't plan to stay in your home for the rest of your life, then a Life Estate Deed may not be right for you.

The other option is an Irrevocable Medicaid-Planning Trust. This is a trust designed to protect the assets in it from the cost of nursing home care. Like the Life Estate Deed, it has to be in place for at least five years before you apply for Medicaid in order to work. But the Irrevocable Trust is more flexible in the future. You can sell the house and purchase a new one or keep the cash proceeds safe within the Trust at any time during your life. The house does not have to be held until you die.

If you ever go into a nursing home and have to apply for Medicaid, your home will not count as your asset. It will pass to your children (or other beneficiaries) after your death outside of Probate and any Medicaid estate-recovery claim. You will need to name someone as Trustee of this Trust. That will probably be one of your children, but it could be anyone. You should not be the Trustee of your own Irrevocable Medicaid-Planning Trust.

While the Life Estate Deed is fairly rigid, the Trust allows for changes. The named owners in a Life Estate Deed cannot be changed after it is done. But the named beneficiaries in an irrevocable Trust can be changed at any time (if you feel a need to do so) and you can fire the Trustee and appoint someone else to that job if they are not doing the job the way you think they should be. This provides a lot of future flexibility and gives you some measure of control over the Trust.

Of course, with both tools, you do have to irrevocably give up the ownership of your home in order to protect it from nursing home costs. You cannot be allowed to get it back, under any circumstances, or the tool will not work for Medicaid Planning. It is a very serious thing to put assets out of your reach in order to protect them, so you should have an in-depth discussion about this with your Elder Law Attorney before you decide to go forward.
