

THE MEDICARE ALPHABET

Medicare is government health insurance for people aged 65 and older, and for those with certain illnesses and disabilities. Today, more than 60 million people in the U.S. are covered by Medicare. The system can be confusing though. If you are about to turn 65, you need to know what to do and how to deal with the Alphabet of Medicare.

Part A is hospital insurance. It covers your care in a hospital. You paid for it during your working years, so it won't cost you anything to have it. You must apply and get into the system a few months before you turn age 65.

Part B is "outpatient" medical insurance that covers services of doctors and other medical care outside of a hospital. You have to pay a monthly fee for this insurance. It is set and changes each year, so the cost will depend on when you turn 65. You are required to get and pay for Part B unless you have some other insurance that is comparable and meets the requirements. If you haven't retired yet at 65, you might have work insurance that is comparable. Now don't get confused, we're going to skip Part C.

Part D is prescription drug coverage. Unless you have comparable coverage, you have to buy and pay for this part too. There are many various plans to choose from, so you have to look them up, figure out which meets your needs and budget, and then sign up for

Okay, back to Part "C." It isn't really Part C but that is what many folks call it. There are various privately offered insurance plans that are called Medicare Advantage Plans. Those plans combine everything in Part A, B and D, and for one fee give you those benefits and more. But the Advantage programs are like a Health Maintenance Organization, and you are required to use specific providers in order to have your insurance cover it. The prices and extra benefits vary, so you have to look into those plans carefully to see if they meet vour needs.

You need to contact Medicare a few months before you turn 65 and enroll in Part A. If you don't have any other coverage you will need to enroll in Part B and Part D too, or choose an Advantage (Part C) plan instead. If you don't enroll in Part B and D and you didn't have any other coverage, there is a penalty if and when you later sign up. The penalty is really bad, so you don't want to be subject to it. Your monthly fee will be higher (10% for each year you waited) for the rest of your life. (1% for Part D).

Also, a good idea, but not required, is a Medicare Supplement ("Medigap") plan. Medicare has significant deficits that will require you to pay quite a lot of money for various services. Most people can avoid that by buying extra private insurance that covers those gaps in Medicare coverage. You will have to find the right plan for you and sign up for it separately from Medicare.

You can look online to figure out the various optional and extra plans you might want, or you can find a professional advisor to help you. There are companies around that help people choose their Medicare plans. Most don't charge you as they get a commission from the insurance company. Those brokers usually know a lot and can be helpful, but you should do some of your own research too to make sure you are really getting what you want.

HONORING THOSE WHO SERVE

TV stations all across the U.S. stopped their regular programming abruptly— sitcoms, cooking shows, and action-packed movies— to break a series of terrible news to Americans across the country. NBC news scrambled to change the subject from an interview on Richard Hack's new book to the devastating sight of airplanes crashing into the World Trade Center towers.

Amidst the destruction, men and women rushed to save all they could. More than 8,600 firefighters ran to the collapsed and smoke-filled building, helping as many people as they could even though they were risking their lives by doing so. Police officers helped to get civilians away from the World Trade Center, and comforted those during the aftermath. Medical professionals helped the wounded, watching as a plethora of patients entered the hospitals in New York City

But why were so many willing to risk their lives?

Maybe it was adrenaline from the sight of the attacks or the thought that someone they knew was in that building. Or, it was just merely the desire to save lives. Finding the motivation of heroes like this can be answered by Project 351's mission statement— 'Why do you serve?'

I'm Emma Nguyen, Dunstable's Project 351 Ambassador. This organization inspires kids to lead community service projects all across the state. Over the past few months, we've held clothing drives for the non-profit organization, Cradles to Crayons. We've also helped to create hygiene kits for the needy. During September, one of our most meaningful service projects highlights the men and women who've served, fallen heroes, first responders, and our community heroes for a 9/11 National Day of Service and Remembrance.

People of all ages— elderly and gray, young and impressionable— will remember this event forever. Even for those that weren't able to experience the nervousness of trying to call their loved ones, the reminders still live on. While I wasn't born in 2001, just the memories of people alone helped me to realize how significant and impactful this event was for our country. It also helped me to see how important the people who serve their communities are.

As a way to contribute to my 9/11 tribute project, I went into town to highlight the officers and their role in our community. What they do is critical to keeping our community safe, and I wanted to show my gratitude to them. Richard Nault, an officer at the Dunstable Police Station, showed me how much they contributed. Before he was patrolling the town, he was an assistant principal at an alternative school in Lawrence, Massachusetts helping students who wanted to make the most of their lives.

"The kids who I was able to have daily contact with really wanted more for themselves," Officer Nault told me from across the table. "So, whether it was me kind of being hard on them in a particular situation, or showing them that there's a light at the end of the tunnel, I really felt like I made a bit of an impact on them."

But it didn't just make 'a bit of an impact' on the kids he helped each day, it also helped to encourage him to make an important decision. After the events of 9/11, which he distinctly remembers being in the school's office as one of his coworkers watched the second plane crash on television, Officer Nault felt as though he could do more with his life. And while there were many moments that influenced him to become an officer, the kids he helped, helped him.

"Even though I was in education at that time, I felt a need and a responsibility to do more. Most Americans were angry, and mad, and passionate about what had just happened, and I think wanting to do more was a common feeling for everyone. In education, there's not a whole lot I can do, protecting our people and our country. But I remember a strong desire like, 'this isn't enough, I got to do more.' And ironically, twenty years later, I became a police officer."

The same goes for Officer Pietroforte, who's been serving in Dunstable since 2014. "Just seeing and hearing the stories of those people— whether they were firemen, policemen, or civilians— impacted my life. Honoring those who've come before me by doing the job to the best of my abilities is important to me."

Before serving as an officer, Officer Pietroforte worked as a construction worker, and in the field of security with no idea of what the future held once out of college. "After high school, I didn't really have a direction. So it was the structure that kind of drew me to being a police officer, where it would give me a purpose. That was kind of big for me— having a purpose in life and being bigger than myself; and that's what sparked my interest," he stated.

But it's one thing for something to spark a person's interest, and another thing to continue working. What often helps people continue is the desire to make a change. Without this feeling, the days might seem longer, every conversation less fruitful, and life less colorful. So what helps these two men to continue to be where they are now?

Why do they serve?

I asked both Officer Nault and Officer Pietroforte this question in their office, and both came up with the same consensus: They serve to help their community one person at a time.

Officer Nault told me first, "I serve because I consider myself a people-person. And I think with my mindset, keeping people safe, building relationships, having people live a life where they can do so at ease, and not have to worry about simple things is important to me." He went on to explain that it was inevitable that he couldn't stop every crime in Dunstable, but he would try nonetheless. "I do think, as police officers, that if I can do one thing to make one person's day a little bit better than the day before, I think I'm making an impact in the community. I'm not going to be able to touch the lives of over 4,000 people in the community. But if day by day, I can impact someone's life, one person at a time, I think that's a positive thing. And I also like the responsibility of holding people that aren't good people accountable. I believe in people conducting themselves in a certain way, and treating other people kindly. And when I see that individuals are not doing those things, it motivates me to do more.'

Officer Pietroforte said something similar when I asked. "I feel like I had a lot to offer somebody on their worst day. I think I find gratitude in knowing that someone is having the worst possible day of their life, and I can hopefully make it better in some way, or at least be empathetic and understanding of how horrible a situation can play out. And I want somebody who had a traumatic incident to think back and say, 'That police officer, he helped me through that.' That's what I enjoy most about serving."

If serving in your community is something that you'd like to do, Officer Nault has a few words for you.

"If you are a person that wants to make a difference, and wants to make a positive impact on the lives of other people, I think this is a great way to do it. So my message to young people is that there is a strong need for young people who want to make an impact in their community. And while, right now at this point in time, it's not a popular thing to be a police officer, I believe that time will change in the years to come. And I encourage any young person who wants to protect and serve others to be strong enough, and brave enough, immensely tough enough to make that process happen."

Thank you to Officer Nault and Officer Pietroforte, as well as everyone else who helped me along the way.

"We are grateful for your leadership, inspired by your devotion, and proud of your resolve to unite, act, lead. Through your service, you bring hope, healing, and assurance that we will "never forget" 9.11. You are testimony that love and the spirit of community endures."

NOTICE FROM THE MASSDEP

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (Mass-DEP) has published the final 2030 Solid Waste Master Plan and announced the following amendments to the waste ban regulations, which will be **effective on November 1, 2022**

<u>Mattresses will be banned from disposal.</u> <u>Textiles will be banned from disposal.</u>

If you have *old mattresses and boxsprings* in your attic or basement, dispose of them as soon as possible. *They will be banned from disposal effective on November 1, 2022.* If you are buying a new mattress, ask the company to haul away your old mattress. Check with the Town Board of Health to see how they recommend you dispose of your mattress and boxspring if you use the town service. If you subscribe to a different Trash Hauler please give them a call, or check their website to see what the fee is and to schedule a pick up.

TRASH & RECYCLING YEARLY SUBSCRIPTION RENEWAL NOTICE

The yearly subscription with the Town of Dunstable for trash and recycling pickup began on July 1, 2022. Once again for the 5th year, we will not be raising the fee; it remains at \$300.00/year.

Three renewal options are available. New subscribers can use the same options.

- Pay on line on the town webpage <u>www.dunstable-ma.gov</u> and choose online payments. Scroll half way down the page to Trash-Board of Health.
- Mail a \$300.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. You may want to call or email for the amount due, as they deduct \$ for each month gone by.
- Drop off a check or cash to the Town Hall Monday-Thursday 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan Trash Payment on your envelope.

Overflow bags can also be purchased on line or at the town hall. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Although there is not a specific spot to purchase the bags on line, just fill in the amount on the trash & recycling renewal page and we will recognize the amount is for the purchase of bags. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you paid on line.

WHAT DOES (AND DOESN'T) **COME WITH A HOME**

When you tour a house for sale, it's often staged, complete with appliances, window dressings, furniture and decor.

These items can certainly make a place look appealing, but the reality is that most of them won't come with the house if you decide

So, what exactly do you get when you purchase a house from its previous owners? Do you know which items stay and which ones go? Here's what you should know:
Only "attached" fixtures tend to come with the

house. This means ceiling fans, security systems, built-in appliances, window screens, storm doors, blinds and similar items should remain part of the home. Removable items — like curtains or furniture, for example — aren't attached and probably wouldn't be included.

Outdoor items that are fixed to the property are in-

cluded. The mailbox, a built-in fire pit, plants, shrubbery and an in-ground pool would all be examples of items that stay. Portable things, though — like a hot tub or unattached grill — typically would not come with the house.

Almost everything is up for negotiation. If there's a certain item you saw and loved in the home, we can discuss it to negotiate with the seller and their agent. Depending on how in-demand the property is (and how special the item is), the seller may ask for more money — but, in some cases, they may be willing to throw it in for free.

Sometimes, sellers will specifically call out items they don't want included in the sale — even some attached items. We'll talk about negotiating and comparing these elements of an offer as we go.
