TYNGSBOROUGH BOARD OF HEALTH NOTICE FROM THE MassDEP

<u>The Massachusetts Department of Environmental</u> <u>Protection</u> (MassDEP) has published the final <u>2030 Solid Waste</u> <u>Master Plan</u> and announced the following amendments to the waste ban regulations, which will be effective on November 1, 2022 Mattresses will be banned from disposal. Textiles will be banned from disposal.

The Commercial Organics Disposal Ban will apply to businesses and institutions generating one-half ton or more food material per week (it currently applies to those generating one ton or more food material per week) For more information, please refer to MassDEP's page on <u>Waste Disposal Bans</u>

GET RID OF YOUR MATTRESS NOW!

Effective November 1st, MassDEP will add mattresses, boxsprings, and textile to the WASTE BAN. The Town will not be able to accept mattresses as part of the Bulky Items List. **Currently, you can get rid of mattresses and boxsprings with a bulky sticker for \$15.** Effective November 1st, mattresses and boxsprings will need to be recycled. The cost to remove mattresses will significantly increase.

If you have mattresses and boxsprings in your attic or basement, dispose of them as soon as possible with a \$15 bulky sticker. If you are buying a new mattress, ask the company to haul away your old mattress.

AGING ALONE By Edward H. Adamsky

About a quarter of all seniors live on their own without a spouse, partner, or adult children nearby. They are Aging Alone! Those who are aging alone really need to plan well for a safe and happy future. You will need to plan where you are going to live as you age. This is true for everyone. You need to think about whether or not you can stay in a single-family home or if you will need or want to move to an apartment, or an Assisted Living community, as you get older. If you want to stay at home, you house must work for you if you start to have mobility issues and are less able to take care of things. You need good lighting, safety devises such as grab rails and motion detector lights. You need wide hallways and doorways, accessible closets and cabinets, and no stairs or steps.

Even if you stay at home for quite a while, there may be a time in the future when you cannot any longer and you will have to choose some other option. You should start researching them long before you are forced to move. Check out your local Assisted Living, and Independent Living communities. There are many options available these days and you may need to get yourself on a waiting list for the most popular places. You may also want to spend some of your time cleaning and reducing your level of possessions so a future move will be easier. You might want to hire a professional organizer to help you with that task.

Someday you may need help with your personal needs such as cooking, cleaning, and self-care. You should research the local home health agencies to see what services they offer and what those might cost. Many of those agencies are having a tough time finding employees these days so it might be hard to find an agency in the future. You have to be prepared for that possibility. It's important to have social connections and a network of friends and professionals who can help you when you need it. If you don't have family to do all of the little things for you, when you cannot do them yourself anymore, then you are going to have to have help from others. You may want to stay local if you have lots of friends nearby, or if you move, you may need to cultivate new friends in the new location. You should have an Attorney who can help you with legal issues, a Financial Advisor for money issues, and other professionals such as a Care Manager or Professional Organizer that you know you can call on for assistance. If you belong to a church or other such organization, you will want to keep up your relationship so you can have some of those resources available to you. Many seniors isolate themselves from the community and are forced into a nursing home when they have no other alternative available.

Planning for aging is important for everyone but even more important for those who are aging alone!

TEXTILE RECOVERY: ALMOST NEW, WORN OR TORN, DONATE IT ALL!

Don't throw that single sock or ripped towel in the trash! Massachusetts residents and businesses dispose of approximately 230,000 tons of textiles annually. Nearly 6% of the waste delivered to incinerators for disposal is made up of clothing, curtains, towels and other fabrics.

Did you know that 95% of unwanted textiles can be reused or recycled for other purposes? Helpsy, the Town's Textile Recovery partner, is working to keep usable textiles out the waste stream. A ripped towel will likely find a new life as an industrial wiping rag, while your gently used jeans will be sent to a thrift store to be worn again.

Clothing reuse is a big deal. It reduces the enormous environmental burden of the second most polluting industry in the world.

Waste Ban updates now include textiles.

MassDEP has added textiles to the state-wide list of waste ban materials. This means that clothing, rags and other fabrics are no longer allowed to be landfilled or incinerated under state law and must be diverted from the trash. You can help by keeping these materials separate and donating them.

I HAVE TOO MANY PASSWORDS!!!! By Dean Lotito

Everyone has too many passwords in their lives these days. Banking, email, shopping - all require accounts with passwords.

The worst way to get around this problem is to use the same password in all your accounts. Even the most careful companies sometimes get hacked and passwords stolen. If your password is stolen from an online shopping site, hackers will try that password at EVERY banking site to see if they can get access to your money.

The most common solution is a notebook of your passwords. This is a better solution. However, that book should be hidden in your home. It would be best to not write "Passwords" on the cover of the notebook. Lastly, consider keeping financial passwords in a different location. One that is harder to find. It would be a good idea to tell a close friend or family member where these passwords are kept.

The best solution is a tool called a password manager. While password managers are the safest choice, they can be a chore to set up. Some well-known password managers are DASHLANE, BITWARDEN and LASTPASS. A password requires you to remember just one password to get access to all your individual passwords.

FINANCIAL FOCUS LOOK CLOSELY AT OPEN ENROLLMENT CHOICES

It will soon be open enrollment season — the time of year when you can review your employee benefits and make changes as needed. What areas should you focus on?

One to consider is health insurance. If you're still satisfied with your coverage, and it hasn't changed since last year, you may want to keep the same plan. But some employers are now offering high-deductible plans, which may give you access to health savings accounts that can offer tax benefits.

Next, look at life insurance. Is your employer's group coverage sufficient for your needs? If not, you may need to consider a private policy. And the same is true for your employer's disability insurance.

Finally, consider your 401(k) or similar retirement plan. While you can typically make changes to your plan throughout the year, why not take this opportunity to see if you need to adjust your investments? You might also consider boosting your contributions.




