

REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS AVAILABLE

You may be eligible to receive a property tax exemption if you fall into any of these categories: Legally blind person; Veteran with a service-connected disability; Surviving spouse of a disabled veteran or veteran who died from active-duty injury or illness; Senior citizen age 65 and older who meets income and asset requirements. You must have owned and occupied your property as of 7/1/2022. Supporting documentation is required for all exemption applications. Applications are available at the Assessors Office in Town Hall, or at www.tyngsboroughma.gov/departments/assessors. Applications for FY2023 are due to the Assessors Office by April 1, 2023. If you have questions, please call 978-649-2300 x 121.

I just wanted to share a couple of items that might make your December and little more enjoyable, especially in this time of inflation • The first is the availability of the Base Commissary at Hanscom AFB in Bedford to any Veteran that has a service connect disability, and this includes surviving spouses who have not remarried. My wife and I shop there all of the time and we do indeed save quite a bit of money. Of course there is a small requirement, in that you need a Veteran Health Identification Card, or a letter from the VA along with your Passport or Drivers License. AVOID MISTAKES WHEN USING A TRUST

Many people create trusts for their young children, or for a child with a disability, or for various other reasons. Trusts are a useful tool to reach the goals of protecting assets and children, but there are many mistakes that can happen when using a Trust. You should know and understand how to avoid these problems.


With many trusts you want and need your assets to be within the trust (held in the name of the Trust) so that the Trustee and the terms of the Trust will control the handling of those assets. You can move the title of your home and bank accounts into the name of your trust during your life, but for many assets that isn't possible. For those with retirement funds and life insurance, it is imperative to update your beneficiary designation and name your trust as the beneficiary.

You must also consider the terms of your trust carefully. If the trust is designed for your young children (in case both parents die while they are minors) you probably don't want the terms to say that the children get all of their share of the money when they turn 18. That's too young to receive a large amount of money. Your Trust should probably hold back the share of younger children until they are 25 or even 30 years old.

It's also crucial that you choose the right person to be the Trustee. For most people, they name themselves as the original trustees and then they name their oldest child as the first successor Trustee. This may be the right thing to do in many situations, but not in all. You want to make sure that you choose a person who can handle that job. Someone who is financially educated and completely trustworthy. Your Trustee also needs to have moral fortitude to properly follow your instructions even when others might urge them to do otherwise.

Funds in a Trust for a young adult may be countable for financial assistance at college, so you should keep that issue in mind when setting up the Trust. There are ways to make it non-countable for financial aid purposes, or the size and terms of the Trust may need to be considered with an eye to paying for college, if necessary. The key is to consider the possibilities for the future and to try to plan for various options.

You are not done when you sign the documents at your attorney's office and take them home with you. You should update all of your planning documents whenever there is some large change in your life and in any case review them every three or four years to make sure they still make sense with your family and life situation. If you have any questions, you should always contact your attorney and ask if you should update your planning tools.



The Town of Dunstable Board of Health and Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation and CMRK has created a new partnership to allow residents to easily donate their clothing, textiles and small household items. CMRK has been collecting these items across Massachusetts for over 35 years.

The average person gets rid of 85 pounds of clothing a year. 95% of that clothing can be reused or recycled. Congratulations on your pending graduation!

We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the Russell G. and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a one-time award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection criteria.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.






