TYNGSBOROUGH BOARD OF HEALTH

MassDEP is offering free PFAS water testing to 84 towns in Massachusetts. Tyngsborough is one of those towns. PFAS have been linked to adverse health effects.

CLOSED LID POLICY FOR TRASH CARTS

Reminder, Tyngsborough has a closed lid policy for trash carts and "trash will not be collected if the lid is not completely closed." This is stated in our contract with Republic Services and is now being enforced more consistently.

Residents with extra trash have three options, depending on how often they find themselves in this situation: put excess trash in a bag and save it for the next week's collection, use an extra trash sticker, or lease an additional trash cart.

If too much trash happens for the first time and you are not prepared, you could put your excess trash in a bag and hold it for the next week's collection.

If too much trash happens only once in a while, we recommend that you purchase "extra trash" stickers from the Board of Health (\$5 per sticker). You then would put a sticker on your own trash bag and place it next to your trash cart on collection day. You might want to purchase a few now, even before you have extra trash, especially with the holidays around the corner. Stickers may be obtained by visiting the Board of Health office during Town Hall hours, or online (see "Board of Health" page at www.tyngsboroughma.gov), or by sending in a check with a selfaddressed stamped envelope to the Board of Health, 25 Bryants Lane, Tyngsborough, MA 01879.

If you find your household frequently has more trash than will fit into the cart with the lid closed, you might want to consider leasing an additional cart. The cost is \$200 per year. Please call the Board of Health (978-649-2300 x118) if you are interested in this option.

KNOW YOUR RECYCLING NO'S: TANGLERS

Tyngsborough Sustainability Committee The holiday season is filled with string lights, ribbons, new clothing and lots of electronics with cords. But did you know that these items - collectively called "Tanglers" by recycling industry folks - really muck up the sorting process for single stream recycling?

Our recyclables are brought to a Materials Recovery Facility (or MRF, pronounced "murf") to be sorted. At the MRF, spinning screens are used to sort the different types of materials. These screens look nothing like a window screen and instead look more like a rolling luggage conveyor belt at the airport that moves materials uphill. These sorting screens become jammed when cords, chains, clothing, ribbons or hoses get wrapped around them. This can slow down the sorting process or even stop the lines entirely. That's why we say "No" to tanglers in curbside recycling.

This holiday season the Sustainability Committee will once again collect broken or unwanted string lights at Town Hall. This program keeps valuable material out of the trash stream and brings awareness to the issues caused by tanglers mistakenly thrown into curbside recycling carts. Beginning mid November and running through January 15, 2023, drop your unwanted light strands into the collection box at Tyngsborough Town Hall, 25 Bryants Lane. Light strands only - no mesh animals or other holiday decorations please.

Sustainable Tyngsborough is a subcommittee of the Board of Selectmen. We meet the third Tuesday of every month, beginning at 6:30pm. You are always welcome to join us and share your sustainability ideas and concerns. Like us on Facebook @ Sustainable Tyngsboro.

Thank you to all who came to Zero Waste Day this year. What an incredible turnout we had. The scrap metal, textiles, books, CDs, toys, furniture, mattresses, household goods and appliances, electronics, bikes, small engines, skis, golf clubs, license plates, wooden bats, eye-glasses and more that you brought to be reused or recycled added up to around 6 tons - that's 12,000 pounds - that did not go into the wastestream. Way to go, Tyngsborough! Now let's get those string lights to recycling (see above).

Tyler's Timely **Technical Tips** By Tyler Denommee

This time of year we gather and spend more time together indoors where the air is more polluted, so let's take a look at how home heating systems can be used to significantly improve indoor air quality.



AVOID MISTAKES WHEN USING A TRUST By Edward H. Adamsky

Many people create trusts for their young children, or for a child with a disability, or for various other reasons. Trusts are a useful tool to reach the goals of protecting assets and children, but there are many mistakes that can happen when using a Trust. You should know and understand how to avoid these problems.

With many trusts you want and need your assets to be within the trust (held in the name of the Trust) so that the Trustee and the terms of the Trust will control the handling of those assets. You can move the title of your home and bank accounts into the name of your trust during your life, but for many assets that isn't possible. For those with retirement funds and life insurance, it is imperative to update your beneficiary designation and name your trust as the beneficiary.

You must also consider the terms of your trust carefully. If the trust is designed for your young children (in case both parents die while they are minors) you probably don't want the terms to say that the children get all of their share of the money when they turn 18. That's too young to receive a large amount of money. Your Trust should probably hold back the share of younger children until they are 25 or even 30 years old.

It's also crucial that you choose the right person to be the Trustee. For most people, they name themselves as the original trustees and then they name their oldest child as the first successor Trustee. This may be the right thing to do in many situations, but not in all. You want to make sure that you choose a person who can handle that job. Someone who is financially educated and completely trustworthy. Your Trustee also needs to have moral fortitude to properly follow your instructions even when others might urge them to do otherwise.

Funds in a Trust for a young adult may be countable for financial assistance at college, so you should keep that issue in mind when setting up the Trust. There are ways to make it non-countable for financial aid purposes, or the size and terms of the Trust may need to be considered with an eye to paying for college, if necessary. The key is to consider the possibilities for the future and to try to plan for various options.

You are not done when you sign the documents at your attorney's office and take them home with you. You should update all of your planning documents whenever there is some large change in your life and in any case review them every three or four years to make sure they still make sense with your family and life situation. If you have any questions, you should always contact your attorney and ask if you should update your planning tools.


