OPEN BURNING SEASON BEGINS JANUARY 15TH

Dunstable Fire Chief, William Farrell announced that Open Burning season will soon begin on January 15th and will end on May1st.

Information and applications are available online at the town website www.dunstable-ma.gov/dunstable-fire-rescue

If you prefer, permits are available daily from 8am to 4pm at the Fire Station at 28 Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65". Agricultural Permits are \$15.

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.

WHAT'S GOING ON? Winter 2022

The goal of this newsletter is to share information from the town's municipal departments as well as volunteer boards & committees. Please note that some information could be subject to changes.

TOWN HALL EMPLOYMENT

The Town of Dunstable had several open positions this year. After many hours of interviews over the past 9 months, we have hired a new Town Clerk - Ellen Faiella; Treasurer/Collector - Erin Caton; Administrative Assistant for the Planning Board and the Conservation Commission - Carol Rock; as well as Acting Police Chief Hoar and Fire Chief Farrell.

The Board has hired Mr. Jason Silva as our permanent, full-time Town Administrator. Jason lives in Beverly, MA with his wife and 3 sons. Jason comes to us with a background of diverse experience, notably, having served as Town Administrator in Marblehead for over 3 years, Chief of Staff in the State Senate in the office of Senator Joan Lovely, Chief of Staff and Director of Municipal Operations and Capital Improvements in Salem MA, and Executive Director of the Salem YMCA, among other things. He has a Master's Degree from Suffolk University in Public Administration. We are excited to have Jason join our team and looking forward to working with him!

The Board extends a huge THANK YOU to David DeManche who served as our Interim Town Administrator since March. His expertise and knowledge were truly needed throughout this past year. It has been a pleasure working with David, we wish him a happy retirement!

We are currently accepting applications for an Executive Secretary to the Town Administrator and Board of Selectmen.

Thank you everyone for your patience while we went thru this year of transition. We are pleased to now have a (almost) fully staffed Town Hall!

PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES

Dunstable Fire Department has hired a new part-time Fire Chief. After several years of interim Chiefs, we are pleased to introduce Chief William Farrell. Please stop in the department and welcome him! The Department also has 2 fire fighters working from 8 am -4 pm, seven (7) days a week. We hope this will increase visibility and provide the best service we can to the residents.

Dunstable Police Department: The Board of Selectmen wishes to congratulate Chief James Dow on his retirement and thank him for his long, devoted service to the Town. To lead the Police Department, we have appointed Eric Hoar as the Acting Chief of Police. Congratulations to Acting Chief Hoar.

ROUTE 113 HIGHWAY PROJECT

Route 113 project is continuing on with the installation of the utilities and roadway construction, and will continue as long as weather conditions allow. The water line replacement has been completed from Hillcrest Street to McGovern's wall. Currently the overall project is going according to schedule but please continue to be patient with traffic delays, road detours, and reduced access to the town. Construction workers and police officers are working to guide traffic.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMMITTEE UPDATE

The RFP (Request of Proposal) received 3 responses for the MUD/Affordable Housing project at 164 Pleasant St (behind the Post Office). The Affordable Housing Committee is working through its project criteria to determine next steps. Criteria aspects were defined by the group to find a developer that can accommodate size, scope, character of Dunstable to help us achieve the most impactful benefits to Dunstable.

The Town of Dunstable is updating our 2016-2020 Housing Production Plan to guide decisions on how to create affordable housing and how we can work toward making sure all people can afford a home that meets their needs. As part of this effort, the Dunstable Affordable Housing Committee in conjunction with the Northern Middlesex Council of Governments (NMCOG) developed a short survey on the needs, goals and future for housing in Dunstable. *The survey should take less than 5 minutes to complete. Surveys were accepted through December 23rd.*

GAS LINE UTILITY WORK

Work is happening on Hall Street with the construction of a natural gas line. Boston Gas is overseeing the work. Please be on the lookout for various detours (as needed) and utility workers just past the Hall / School / Lake Street connection.

SPECIAL ACT FOR TOWN ADMINISTRATOR

We held a Special Fall Town Meeting in November. One of the warrant articles was the Special Act for Town Administrator. This was a document to create and solidify the authority and responsibilities of a Town administrator for the Town by a Special Act Legislature. After a lot of lively debate, the article was defeated, 53 yes to 57 no. The Board has noted the concerns and criticisms, and will be reconvening with the Governance Committee to further discuss this Special Act. UNION BUILDING

The Groton Dunstable Regional School Committee has determined that they no longer have use for the Union Building as of the Spring 2024. They are looking to exit the lease agreement and return the responsibility of this building back to the Town. A committee is being appointed to consider the future use of this historic town building.

As most homeowners purchase less than two heating systems in their lifetime, I'd like to share some key considerations to have in mind if your furnace is due for an upgrade.

Fuel. Gas furnaces have higher efficiency, but are priced higher than oil furnaces.

Size. Critical for comfort, efficiency, and longevity as too much cycling leads to poor performance and early system failure.

Stage. Two stage furnaces make two sizes of flame; smaller for mild weather, and larger for colder. Variable models efficiently modulate flames to meet set temps

Ductwork. Necessary to distribute heat, older ductwork may be undersized, leaking, or damaged, requiring updates.

Venting. Directing flue gases outside of homes, these may need to be replaced to safely conform to code.

Installation. Choose experienced, licensed, reputable contractors that always pull permits. Cheaper is not better.

ATTENTION 2023 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation!

We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue your education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis (the main scholarship for 4 year full time only).

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the *Russell G.* and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a one-time award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection criteria.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.

GETTING ORGANIZED FOR THE INEVITABLE

The New Year is when we make resolutions and plans for the future. Getting organized is a good goal. But it is one we rarely live up to. As motivation to get organized, your goal should be to save your family from a lot of work after you have died. If you have ever had to figure out the affairs of a deceased family member, you will understand this.

You should have a list of all of your assets, debts, and other important financial issues. Have your bank statements and brokerage statements available for your family to find and use (either on paper in a good clean filing system, or electronically in an accessible way). Don't leave things locked behind passwords or online if your family can't get at them. You may need to write down some passwords, or save documents in a way they can access online.

Think about the things you do often and if they will need to keep getting done even without you. Make lists of those things and leave instructions on how to keep doing them. Or you might have recurring things that need to be cancelled. For instance, if you have a pest service that shows up at your house once in a while, your family will need to know if they should cancel that service, or keep it going (and how to do that).

You will want your family to find all of your essential documents, like your Will, your Marriage, and Birth Certificates (which you almost never need until some event like death happens), Divorce agreements, Social Security card/number, Passport, Military Record (DD214), Insurance Cards, and others.

If you live alone, someone needs a key to your house. If you have pets and house plants, they will need to be cared for if you are gone temporarily or permanently. You must make plans for who will deal with these things.

You need to make arrangements so your family or chosen representative can deal with your assets if you are sick (a Power of Attorney) or if you die (a Will and a Trust). You need to have a system in place so the right person can step in easily to handle your bills, income, debts, and property management. Make lists or charts of all that needs to be done.

And of course, you need to consider funeral arrangements. As anyone who has done it knows, making the funeral plans for a loved-one who died a few hours ago is a horrendous task. Make your funeral plans ahead of time, pay for it ahead of time, and let your family know about it so they know who to call when the time comes.

If you are organized and ready, then the pain of your loss to your family will not be compounded by tedious and annoying work to figure out how to deal with all that you have left behind. Do a big favor for your family, get organized for today and for the inevitable future.

SHERBURNE NATURE CENTER & TRAILS



HOME INTERNET TUNE-UP

There are several factors that affect the internet speed you experience at home. The primary factor is the bandwidth and type of service you purchase from your Internet Service Provider (ISP). Verizon, Comcast and Spectrum are some of the ISPs in our area. Verizon currently offers 300Mbps, 500 Mbps and 1 Gig (1,000 Mbps) plans. Xfinity seems to have 400, 800 1,000 Mbps. Spectrum offers 500Mbps and 1,000Mbps. (These options may vary in your area.) 1 Gig (1,000 Mbps) is generally the top speed available. The number of devices in use at your house at one time, as well as the high-demand applications such as video streaming and computer gaming, may require higher speeds.

Since most devices attach via a wireless network, the wireless router that you use is also very important. You can have 1 Gbps service, but if your TV or computer is far away from the wireless router you get from your ISP, your internet performance will not be satisfactory. Third party routers that can be purchased at stores like Best Buy that provide higher wireless network speeds and much better coverage in a larger home.

An analysis of your current internet bandwidth can be performed. This includes the speeds provided by your ISP as well as the performance of your wireless router. This will put you in the best position to determine the performance of your home internet, and if any improvements would help.







