CHANGES TO RETIREMENT PLAN LAWS

Congress has made several changes to the Retirement fund rules in the last couple of years. Some major changes were made in 2020, and then the Secure Act of 2022 made even more changes to the laws. This article outlines some of the changes, but of course, not all of them.

A huge new rule is that employer retirement plans (401k's and the like) will now enroll participants automatically. It used to be up to the employee to choose to join but too few people were participating so Congress decided to make it automatic. The new rules make a 3% contribution minimum and have automatic increases for future years. There are also new provisions allowing extra employer contributions to match student loan payments, and certain low-income employees can get a tax credit for making plan contributions.

A big change for older folks is that required minimum distributions have been pushed out to age 73 as of now, going up to age 75 in 2033. It was only increased to age 72 a couple of years ago, from the prior odd age of 70½, and now it has been increased again. Plus those who are 50 or over and those 60 to 63 can make extra contributions to their plans to "catch up" to what they should have been contributing over their lifetimes.

If you have a financial advisor, you should discuss a distribution plan from your IRA and 401k. Many people can benefit by taking distributions prior to their required minimum distribution age so they can spread the income out over more years. With the increased age for required withdrawals more folks may be stuck with large distributions that they cannot change if they wait too long to take any distributions.

There are also some new rules for exceptions to the early withdrawal penalties. Now retirement funds can be used for more emergency expenses or for unforeseeable financial needs. This is limited to \$1000, and it has to be repaid, but it allows emergency access to retirement funds for more reasons.

In this modern era of computer databases and virtually unlimited information, former employers and employees sometimes cannot find each other to pay out or receive benefits. The new law allows the Department of Labor to create an online and searchable database for retirement plans so you can look up who to contact to get your benefits.







(There are chargers at Town Hall, DPW, and First Parish Meeting House, which the Town had charged **nothing** for almost a decade until Billy (and the prior Finance Committee) rectified the disparity 3 years ago.)

Many of you have noticed an increase in your recent RE Tax bills associated with the new Tyngsborough Middle School. (Note: If not for the TMS project, our taxes would have been significantly **reduced**.) Some of us raised concerns at the Town Meeting that the \$83M TMS cost was underestimated. We're sad to report that we were right! Mere months after passing, the Middle School Costs now anticipate overages of ~\$4.3M, with some expected changes to reduce to \$2.5M. These overages are going to hit our Tax Bills. **Be prepared and be vigilant!**



SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH

** NOTE: Thank you Tyngsborough residents for keeping your holiday string lights out of your trash and recycling. All together, you brought 580 pounds of string lights to Town Hall for scrap metal recycling. Great job! **

Great news! After hosting 4 successful Zero Waste Days for Tyngsborough, the Sustainability Committee decided to lock in a regular schedule for these events. Going forward, **Zero Waste Days will be offered the first Saturday of every May and the first Saturday of every November.** They will run from 9am-noon in the parking lot at the Tyngsborough Elementary School (205 Westford Road). Now you can collect your unwanted items year round, knowing that the next Zero Waste Day is coming.

At Zero Waste Days, we typically collect the following items: Scrap metal, bikes and bike parts, lawnmowers and other small engine equipment, electronics and appliances, vacuum cleaners, wires and cables, video games, cell phones, stereos, radios, speakers, dorm-size (not full size) refrigerators, gently used furniture and household goods (including mattresses with no rips, tears or stains), books, CDs, DVDs, clothing in all conditions, draperies, suitcases, purses, stuffed animals, towels and bed linens, shoes, sneakers, bats, golf clubs, license plates, eyeglasses, skis and snowboards.

Lent for Eastern Orthodox churches begins on Monday (called Clean Monday) and Ash Wednesday is not observed. The Bible does not mention Ash Wednesday or the custom of Lent, however, the practice of repentance and mourning in ashes is found in 2 Samuel 13:19; [Esther](#) 4:1; Job 2:8; Daniel 9:3; and Matthew 11:21."



IS YOUR COMPUTER "SLOWER" THAN WHEN YOU FIRST BOUGHT IT?
