FROM THE DUNSTALE POLICE CHIEF

Chief Hoar is pleased to announce that a team of assessors form the Massachusetts Police Accreditation Commission is scheduled to arrive on Tuesday May 23 2023, to begin examining various aspects of the Dunstable Police Department's policies and procedures, operations and facilities.

Verification by the Assessment Team that the Department meets the Commission's standards is part of a voluntary process to gain state Accreditation that is a self-initiated evaluation process by which police departments strive to meet and maintain standards that have been established for the profession, by the profession.

The Massachusetts Police Accreditation Program consists of 257 mandatory standards as well as 125 optional standards. In order to achieve accreditation status, the Department must meet all applicable mandatory standards as well as 55% of the optional standards.

Achieving Accreditation is a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence. Anyone interested in learning more about this program is invited to call Chief Hoar or the Departments Accreditation Manager Sgt. Darrell Gilmore.

Beginning July 1, 2023, the Board of Health will be increasing the yearly subscription to \$360.00 This is an increase of an additional \$5.00 per month. The additional cost will allow us to continue to bring you the best service available at a still affordable price. This is the first increase since the beginning of our program five years ago.

To renew your subscription please see below: Beginning May 1, three renewal options are available. You may pay on line on the town webpage www.dunstable-ma. gov and choose online payments. Scroll down halfway to Trash-Board of Health. New subscribers can use the same options. You may mail a \$360.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email are included. You may drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday (upper level) 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email address are included.

Overflow bags can also be purchased online or at the town hall for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you paid online.

If your subscription is not paid by June 27th your last pickup will be on Thursday, June 29, 2023.



OPEN BURNING SEASON ENDS MAY 1st

Dunstable Fire Chief, William Farrell would like to remind you that Open Burning season that began on January 15th, ends on May1st. *Information and applications are available online at the town*

website www.dunstable-ma.gov/dunstable-fire-rescue

If you prefer, permits are available daily from 8am to 4pm at the Fire Station at 28 Pleasant St. Permits cost \$10 and are free to "over 65". Agricultural Permits are \$15.

FEE AND PERMIT INFORMATION You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.

 Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
 The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.

4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.

5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.

2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.

3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.

4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.



DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH RECYCLING NEWS

On November 1, 2022, the Mass. Department of Environmental Protection put a ban on textiles being disposed of in the trash. Textiles are described as clothing, footwear, bedding, towels, curtains, fabric, and similar products.

The Town of Dunstable Board of Health and Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation and CMRK has created a new partnership to allow residents to easily donate their clothing, textiles and small household items. CMRK has been collecting these items across Massachusetts for over 35 years. Donating is easy. Residents can schedule a free home pick up by calling CMRK 508-466-4590 or schedule online at BBBSFoundation.org.

The average person gets rid of 85 pounds of clothing a year. 95% of that clothing can be reused or recycled. CMRK 's new diversion program allows them to give clothing a second life in an easy and convenient way." Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation will pick up bagged clothing and textiles but also will accept boxed small household items such as pots, pans, small decor and more! At the new donation bins, you can drop off all bagged clothing, sneakers and textiles. CMRK also accepts non-usable clothing and textiles. Please be sure they are bagged and not wet, moldy or soiled.

Donating clothing helps the environment, helps save taxpayers money and helps clean out your closets. We look forward to forging a socially conscious and environmentally responsible partnership for years to come. Bins are located on Pleasant Street next to the Dunstable post office. Matt's Monthly Mechanical Memo

Ductless mini-split systems can be a flexible solution for heating and cooling your home. Is it a good choice for you? Here's a quick primer to help you decide.

Ductless refers to the systems not requiring ductwork. Split references there are outdoor and indoor units, while "mini" refers to the individual indoor units, or "heads" being smaller than traditional air conditioners (A/C).

Traditional A/C distribute air throughout homes from a single unit. Mini-split indoor units service a single room or area, with each unit having a fan/evaporator coils. Units functioning separately allows for heating or cooling only where its wanted.

FAMILY & MEDICAL LEAVE ACT AND ADULT CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES By Edward H. Adamsky

Did you know that you might be eligible for time off from work to care for an adult child with a disability? The Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) has been around for thirty years, but few people understand how to utilize the law. Today the Government is providing new resources to help family caregivers who need time away from work to support an adult child with a disability.

The U.S. Department of Labor has launched: <u>www.dol.gov/</u> agencies/whd/fmla/family-caregiver, a webpage with fact sheets, frequently asked questions, and other materials to help workers know their rights under the Family and Medical Leave Act with a special focus on how it applies to caregivers of those with disabilities. The law entitles you to take unpaid leave without risk of losing your health insurance and other workplace benefits. The right to take this leave hinges on your need to deal with your own medical issues or those of a family member, which includes adult children with disabilities.

In the case of adult children with disabilities, conditions including autism, cerebral palsy, and intellectual disability almost always qualify as disabilities. But determining whether an employee is eligible for FMLA can be nuanced. The fact-sheets at the DOL website say that employees can use FMLA leave to care for an adult child with a serious health condition who is incapable of self-care due to mental of physical disability. A child can include a biological child, as well as an adopted child, and a foster child. In some cases siblings, grandparents, and some other relatives may qualify for FMLA leave to care for someone if they serve in the same role as a parent for that person.

The point of the law is that workers should not have to choose between their job and dealing with a serious health condition for themselves, or caring for a family member with a serious health condition. The FMLA gives an opportunity for some workers to take unpaid leave so they can help their family members. Of course, this only works well when the potential caregiver can afford to take unpaid time. The FMLA is not going to work for everyone.

WINDOWS SYNC TO PERSONAL ONEDRIVE IS NOT THE SAME AS FILE BACKUP

Starting with Windows 10, Microsoft integrated file synchronization to the cloud if you subscribe to a cloud storage service such as Microsoft 365. The purpose of file synchronization is to allow you to create a file on your computer, and then seamlessly access that file from your phone or second computer. Anytime you edit a file, those changes are immediately copied to your cloud storage. Likewise, if you delete a file, it is immediately deleted from cloud storage.

Backup is different. When you back up your files, you take a snapshot of those files at that time and store them away. As you continue to edit your files, you still have the versions from that snapshot in time available to restore if needed.

File Synchronization can help you if you buy a new computer and sign in with the same Microsoft Account. However, a good backup routine is still recommended for critical personal files.

With file synchronization, Microsoft changed the way you save your work. Auto synchronization is done as you type in your document or spreadsheet. This prevents the dreaded problem and making a lot of needed changes, but then forgetting to save your file before exiting the program or shutting down your computer. On the other hand, if you make changes it is much harder to discard those changes and start over. In the past you would make a lot of changes and then "Save As" with a new file name. Now the process is to "Save a Copy" with a new file name, and then make your changes.





Show: Fire and Fiber Show dates: March 29-April 30, 2023 Tarja Cockell joins Carol Rissman at the Loading Dock Gallery to present Fire and Fiber, a show of color, texture, and form in contemporary weaving and ceramics.

Cockell's work begins on the loom. She pushes dimensional possibilities of an initially flat form, using structural manipulation and layers with a variety of media to achieve elegant and painterly art. Trained in Finland, Cockell emphasizes subtle colorways and clean, simple shapes.

Rissman explores how clay can respond to and take on the characteristics of cloth. Her work is woven and tied. It flows and ripples. She pushes clay's boundaries to create fabric-like pieces: quiet, minimal, and meditative. The finished surfaces have a burnished glow.

Cockell lives in North Andover, Rissman in Bedford. Both artists work out of Western Avenue Studios in Lowell.



Tyngsborough-Dunstable Historical Society (TDHS)



Perhaps you know us as the Little Red Schoolhouse on Route 113 by the town line.

The Little Red Schoolhouse is actually the Sarah Tyng Winslow Schoolhouse, named after its benefactor, Sarah Tyng Winslow. The schoolhouse, originally built in Tyngsborough in 1790, rebuilt after a fire in 1798, served two generations of students until 1864. After 1864, the schoolhouse was primarily used as storage. In the 1960's, Mr. Wilbur Farrow, needing the schoolhouse land for his store parking lot, donated the old school building to the Tyngsborough-Dunstable Historical Society.

With a generous donation from Mrs. Margaret Larter of a four-acre field on Main Street in Dunstable, close to the Tyngsborough town line, volunteers disassembled, moved, and rebuilt the schoolhouse.

Since the restoration, the Little Red Schoolhouse has been the home of the Tyngsborough-Dunstable Historical Society. We are a non-profit group whose mission is to preserve and promote wider interest in the histories of Tyngsborough and Dunstable.
