

DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH RECYCLING NEWS

On November 1, 2022, the Mass. Department of Environmental Protection put a ban on textiles being disposed of in the trash. Textiles are described as clothing, footwear, bedding, towels, curtains, fabric, and similar products.

The Town of Dunstable Board of Health and Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation and CMRK has created a new partnership to allow residents to easily donate their clothing, textiles and small household items. CMRK has been collecting these items across Massachusetts for over 35 years. Donating is easy. Residents can schedule a free home pick up by calling CMRK 508-466-4590 or schedule online at BBBSFoundation.org.

The average person gets rid of 85 pounds of clothing a year. 95% of that clothing can be reused or recycled. CMRK 's new diversion program allows them to give clothing a second life in an easy and convenient way." Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation will pick up bagged clothing and textiles but also will accept boxed small household items such as pots, pans, small decor and more! At the new donation bins, you can drop off all bagged clothing, sneakers and textiles. CMRK also accepts non-usable clothing and textiles. Please be sure they are bagged and not wet, moldy or soiled.

Donating clothing helps the environment, helps save taxpayers money and helps clean out your closets. We look forward to forging a socially conscious and environmentally responsible partnership for years to come. Bins are located on Pleasant Street next to the Dunstable post office. Please drop off baged clothing, sneakers, etc. and textiles only. Do not leave any items, large or small, outside the bins. If you have small items, many items or large items, PLEASE CALL 508-466-4590 to arrange a pick up.

While numbers may surprise you, small water leaks in our homes can really add up.

Toilet flushes account for 30 percent of our average water use per day—when working correctly. A leaking toilet however, can lead to thousands of lost gallons every month, making detection vital. Slow leaks, from internal parts wearing out, can waste 30 gallons a day, while medium leaks can waste roughly 250 gallons a day.

Dripping faucets should be high on our priority lists to avoid high water bills. A very typical leak of 10 drips per minute wastes nearly one gallon per day, or 29 gallons per month. Leaky faucets that drip at a rate of one drip per second, can waste more than 3,000 gallons per year—about 180 showers worth of water.

If higher than normal water bills are observed, or fixtures are getting old, inspections by plumbing pros can help identify and address potential leaks.

REAL ESTATE SALES AND TAXES

My client signed a Life Estate Deed in 2009. In that deed she gave her house to her son, but retained the right to live there for the rest of her life. She died in late 2021 and her son sold the house in 2022. His accountant just prepared his tax return and he owed \$55,000 to the IRS. He called me in a panic to ask about this, and I had great news for him. One of the components of a Life Estate deed is that the "future owner" on the deed only comes into full ownership upon the death of the Life Estate holder, which is more like inheriting an asset rather than being given it.

The first thing to understand is that you must pay tax on any profit you make, on any purchase and sale. If you buy stock at \$10 a share and later sell it for \$20 a share, you will pay tax on your \$10 per share of profit. If you bought a house for \$150,000 and later sold it for \$300,000 you will pay tax on that \$150,000 of gain (with some exceptions). If you gave that \$10 stock, or that \$150,000 house, to your child, and then the child sold the stock or the house, he would pay the tax on the profit, just as you would have done if you sold it.

But there is a part of the Tax Code that we commonly call the "Step-Up" in basis, although its really called "adjustment" in basis. Basis is your purchase price (that \$10 stock or \$150,000 house). Your profit on which you pay the tax is the sales price minus the basis. If you bought the asset, your purchase price is your basis (with some adjustments). If someone gave you an asset, then your basis is whatever their basis was. But if you inherit an asset (that is, you get it from a deceased person through a Will or a Trust, or by some other method) then you don't use that person's basis, you get to use the fair-market-value upon that person's date of death. This is because of the Estate-Tax, and it doesn't matter if the deceased person had to pay Estate-Tax or not.

So, my client who got the house through the Life Estate deed only came into ownership upon the death of another person. He gets to adjust (or step-up) his basis to the market value when his mother died. That made the profit from the sale of the house zero, and he had no tax liability at all.

There is another big benefit in the tax code for homeowners. If you sell your "Principal Residence" you get to exclude up to \$250,000 of gain on that sale from your income and not pay tax on it. And that's per person so a couple can exclude \$500,000 from taxes. That means if you bought your home for \$250,000 and later sold it for \$500,000 you wouldn't pay any income-tax on the sale at all. To qualify as your principal residence you must have owned and lived in that home for at least two years out of the last five years. You can get this benefit every time you sell your principal residence. but with the rules, you cannot do it more than once every two years.



Are you protected from disability risk?

Like many people, you may try to stay healthy by exercising regularly, following a good diet and avoiding dangerous activities. But as we all know, life is unpredictable, and despite your best efforts, you may encounter an injury or illness that can leave you unable to work for several months — or longer. If this happened, would you have difficulty paying your bills? Or would you be forced to dip into investments meant to help you achieve long-term goals, such as a comfortable retirement?

To help prevent these outcomes, you may want to protect yourself against the possibility of a disability. One good move is to build an emergency fund containing up to six months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid account. Even if you never need this fund for a disability, it's hardly a wasted effort, because you could use the funds for other unexpected costs, such as a major repair to your home or car.

But to feel truly prepared for a disability that could threaten your financial situation, you may also need to consider disability insurance. If you work for a mid-size or large company, your employer may offer group coverage as an employee benefit. This coverage can be valuable, but it may not be sufficient. For one thing, many employer-sponsored disability policies won't fully replace your lost income. Also, some group policies may make you wait longer than you'd like before your benefits kick in. And these policies aren't always "portable," either — if you leave your job, you might also be leaving behind your disability plan.

For these reasons, you may want to consider purchasing a long-term disability insurance policy. However, the features of these policies vary greatly, so you'll want to be diligent in choosing the policy that's right for you.

What are the key features to compare among policies? For openers, look at the type of policy — is it noncancelable or guaranteed renewable? With a noncancelable policy, the terms and premiums can't be changed, but a guaranteed renewable policy can increase premiums.

Here are some other features to consider:

- Coverage amount How much will you receive in benefits? You may be able to replace up to 100% of your after-tax income.
- Waiting period How much time must pass from the onset of your disability until you start receiving benefits?
- Benefit duration How long will you receive benefits? To protect against a long-term disability, you might want a policy that replaces income until your planned retirement age.
- Inflation coverage How much will your benefits increase each year? Ideally, you'd like your benefits to keep pace with inflation and keep up with what you might receive from future salary increases or promotions.
- Definition of disability If you choose an "Own Occupation" policy, you'll receive benefits if you can't work at the job you had when you became disabled. With an "Any Occupation" policy, you'll receive benefits if you can't work at any job based on your qualifications.

Clearly, there's much to consider when choosing a disability policy. You might want to consult with a financial professional, who can help you pick a policy that fits within your overall financial strategy. But don't wait too long — you may never need to use this protection, but you might like having it available.


